The said Commission shall be composed of a President and two British and two French Naval officers: the said Officers to be named by any person having commission for that purpose from the British and French Governments respectively. From the date of the first composition of the Commission the President shall be in alternate months the Commanding Officer of the British and French Naval Forces respectively, present in the group; it being decided by lot which of the two officers shall first act as President. The Commission shall assemble at the request of either Commanding Officer. In the absence of the President for the time being, the other Commanding Officer shall preside, and the Commission shall have power to act if two other members be present, of whom one is British and the other French.
- 3. The Commission shall carry out its duties in comformity with the Regulations annexed to this Declaration, and with any further Regulations which may from time to time be agreed upon between the two Governments.

Regulations for the Guidance of the Joint Naval Commission.

- 1. In the event of a disturbance of peace and good order in any part of the New Hebrides where British or French subjects may be settled, or in case of danger menacing the safety of life or property, the Commission shall forthwith assemble, and take such measures as it may think best under the circumstances for repressing the disturbance, or, for the protection of the interests endangered.
- 2. No British or French Naval Commander shall take independent or isolated action, except as hereinafter mentioned.
- 3. Military force shall not be resorted to unless the Commission shall consider its employment to be indispensable.
- 4. In the event of the landing of a naval or military force, such force shall not remain longer than may be considered necessary by the Commission.
- 5. Where the circumstances may not admit of any delay, and the urgency of the case may call for immediate action before the assembling of the Commission, the British and French Commanders nearest the scene of action shall, in concert if possible, or separately if such concert be not practicable, take the necessary measures for the protection of the interests endangered, and shall report such action forthwith to their Senior Naval Officers on the Station, and await the further orders of the Commission. Each Senior. Naval. Officer, on 'receiving such report; shall at once communicate it to the other.
- 6. The Commission shall have no further or other powers than are expressly delegated to it by these Regulations, and shall not interfere in disputes concerning the title to land, or dispossess of their lands any persons, natives, or foreigners.

Regulations under which Commissions in the British Army may be obtained by Officers of Colonial Local Military Forces.

  1. Commissions in the Cavalry or Infantry of the Line will be granted to Officers who are bond fide colonists) of the Local Military Forces of certain colonies, to be specified from time to time, under the conditions hereinafter prescribed as to age, physical, and moral fitness, length of service in the Colonial Forces, literary and military qualifications, and general eligibility for the position of an Officer in Her Majesty's Regular Forces.
- 2. A candidate will be required to have served at least fifteen months as an Officer in the Local Military Force of the Colony from which he is nominated, and must have attended two annual trainings, or have seen active service in the field. A certificate to this effect from his commanding officer must be attached to the candidate's papers. the candidate's papers.
- 3. The candidate must be between the age of 19 and 22 on the 1st-January of the year in which he is allowed to present himself for the examination hereafter specified. A certificate of birth, or a declaration of his exact age, made by the candidate's parents or guardian before a magistrate, must be attached to his papers when forwarded to the War Office.
- 4. He will be required to undergo an inspection by a Medical Board, to be convened by the Governor of the Colony, or other proper authority, and will not be allowed to proceed further with his candidature unless certified by such Board to be physically qualified, in all respects for a commission in the Army.
- 5. An intending candidate must apply for a nomination to the Governor, through his Commanding Officer, or such other channel as the Governor may prescribe, in sufficient time to allow of arrangements being made for his undergoing the military examination before he has exceeded the limit of ago specified in para. 3.
- 6. A candidate will not be allowed to enter upon his examination until he has satisfied the Governor of the Colony in which
  he is serving, that he is actually a colonist, that he is of good
  moral character, and, in all other respects, a fit and proper person
  to hold a commission in Her Majesty's Army. A certificate from
  the Governor to this effect must be attached to the candidate's
  papers when they are forwarded to the War Office.
- 7. The candidate will be required to undergo a qualifying literary examination in the following subjects:
  - examination in the following subjects:—

    (2.) French, German, or some other modern language; the examination being limited to translation from the language and grammatical questions.

    (3.) Writing English correctly, and in a good legible hand, from dictation.

    English composition, tested by the power of writing an essay, letter, or précis.

    (4.) The elements of geometrical drawing; including the construction of scales, and the use of simple mathematical instruments.

    (5.) Geography.

In addition to the foregoing, the candidate will be required to select and qualify in two, and not more than two, of the following subjects:—

- (a.) Mathematics viz., algebra, up to and including the binomial theorem; the theory and use of logarithms; Euclid, Books I. to IV. and VI.; plane trigonometry, up to and including the solution of triangles; and
- mensuration.
  (b.) Classics (Latin or Greek).
  (c.) English history:—General.
  (d.) Freehand drawing.
- 8. The candidate will be exempted from the above examination, except in geometrical drawing, if he can produce a certifi-

cate from the proper University authority that he has taken his degree in Arts, or has passed the examination for the degree of B.A. or M.A., at one of the following Universities, viz.:—

An equivalent examination at one of the chartered Colonial Universities will likewise be accepted as a sufficient ground for exemption.

9. The subjects of the Military Examination and the maximum marks obtainable in each subject will be as follows:—

In order to qualify for a commission, a candidate will be required to obtain 25 of the marks in each subject, and 5 of the aggregate.

The scope will be that embraced by the Synopsis of the Course of Instruction (in the subjects specified in paragraph 9) at the Royal Military College.\* There will, however, be no practical out-of-door examination in any subject. The text books will be those in use at the time at the Royal Military College, Sandhurst, which, for the present, are as follows:—

10. Sets of papers for the examination in both the literary and military subjects will be forwarded in due course, in sealed envelopes, to the Governors of the respective colonies, who will convene Boards, the duty of which will be to see that the papers are fairly worked by the candidates. The papers will then be returned without delay to the Director-General of Military Education, War Office, London, for adjudication.

The Governor of the Colony will notify to the War Office, through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, as early as possible in each year, whether he has any duly qualified candidates to nominate, and will, at the same time, state how many sets of papers he will be likely to require for their examination.

The literary examination will be held in the month of July.

11. Until further notice, two Army commissions will be allotted to each of the undermentioned colonies annually:—

New South Wales. South Australia. Victoria. Queensland. New Zealand. Cape of Good Hope.

12. In the event of the number of candidates nominated by the Governor in a colony at any time exceeding the allotted number of commissions, the selection will be decided by competition in the military portion of the prescribed examination.

- 7. The judges will be required to communicate to the Minister of Agriculture their decisions; also to report on the merits of the whole of the farms selected for competition.

Every owner or occupier of land in, adjoining to, or near any street or road, if such land be so situated that surface or storm water from or upon the same overflows or tends naturally, if not otherwise discharged, to overflow any footway of such street or road, shall within seven days next after the service of notice by the council for that purpose, construct and lay from such point upon such land being near to the footway as shall be specified in such notice by plan appended or otherwise, and higher in level than the bottom of the channel at the outer edge of the footway to the said channel, and through under and transversely to the footway and keep in, good condition such covered drain or trunk as and subject to the inspection of such officer as the Council shall have appointed in that behalf; and in default of compliance with any such notice within the poriod aforesaid, or with the provisions of this section, such owner or occupier shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day during which he shall make default. shall make default

shall make default.

It shall be lawful for the Council to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that it say):—

For regulating the materials, and the size, the level, and the fall of any drain or trunk to be laid or constructed under any footway, either absolutely or with relation to the level or fall of the footway, or channel, or otherwise, in like manner; and so if they please that such size he variable within limits prescribed in the regulation, according to the discretion of such officer as the Council shall thereby direct.

Crossings over footcays and channels.

Every person who wilfully, and without lawful excuse, rides or drives any horse or other animal, or drives or wheels any carriage, eart, or other vehicle upon, along, or across any footway, or any water channel or gutter, herein called channel, by the side of any street or road, save in each such case upon and by or at some crossing to be made as hereinafter mentioned, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and shall also pay to the Council such sum, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of compensation for any damage done by him to the footway or channel as the justice adjudicating upon the information shall, on the hearing thereof, order.

If any land shall front to adjoin or abut two the form

for any damage done by him to the footway or channel as the justice adjudicating upon the information shall, on the hearing thereof, order.

If any land shall front to, adjoin, or abut upon the footway of any street or road, and if access with horses and vehicles from such street or road to such land or to some sufficient way appure tenant thereto cannot be had without riding, driving, or wheeling the same respectively upon or across the said footway or the channel (if any) lying along the outer edge thereof, and if the owner of such land shall desire that a crossing for horses and other animals and for vehicles be made as herein provided over such footway and channel, and shall give a notice in writing of such his desire to the Council, and in such notice describe the land in question and the proposed work by reference to the specification deposited as hereinafter mentioned, such specification being in accordance with the provisions hereof and with such regulation as may be force in that behalf, it shall be lawful for such owner, after seven clear days from the giving such notice, and not before (with no unnecessary delay or obstruction), at his own cost, and under the inspection of such officer as the Council shall have appointed for the purpose, to make such crossing according to the tenor of such notice and specification, and not otherwise, and the owner of such land shall afterwards in like mainer insaintain the same.

Every such owner who desires, as aforesaid, that any such crossing shall be made, shall, before giving notice to the Council as heroin provided, deposit with the municipal clerk a specification, describing the proposed work with respect to each of the several matters hereby or by any such regulation in force in that behalf required or provided.

In streets or roads in which, at the site of any such proposed crossing, there is a curb of stone or wood along the outer edge of the footway, the crossing, so far as the footway extends, shall have, on both sides a curb of stone or wood along the ou

If any private street or road shall meet at an angle the footway of any public street or road, and there shall be no crossing upon and across such footway and the channel adjacent thereto from such private street or road to such public street or road, it shall be lawful for the Council, if they shall see fit, to make, in accordance with any regulation in force in that behalf, a crossing upon and over such footway and channel of the description hereinbefore provided with respect to other crossings, and to recover from the owner of each of the tenements abutting on such private street or road such portion of the expenses of such making as shall bear to the whole of such expenses the same proportion as the rateable value of such tenement bears to the whole rateable value of all the tenements so abutting.

If any crossing shall be out of repair, and the person liable herounder to maintain or repair the same shall, for seven days after notice from the Council to that effect, neglect properly and completely to repair the same, he shall forfeit for every day that such crossing shall remain so unrepaired a sum of Forty shillings, and the Council may, if they shall see fit, effect such repair, and recover the same from such person before any justice.
