HAINAN ISLAND—EAST COAST.

*Reported Sunken Rock.*

Information has been received through the Board of Trade, that on 3rd December 1887 the British steam-vessel *Lorne* foundered off the east coast of Hainan, after striking, in the middle of the night, what was supposed to be a rock, situated about 15 miles southward of Toncon Point, or approximately in lat. 19° 21' N., long. 111° 0' E.

The position must be regarded as very uncertain.

*Caution.*—This part of the coast has not been properly surveyed. There are several reefs nearly 2 miles from the shore. Vessels, therefore, proceeding along the land to avoid the strength of either monsoon should accordingly exercise caution, and the use of the lead is enjoined.

## RULES UNDER THE JUSTICES OF THE PEACE ACT 1887.

AT THE GOVERNMENT HOUSE, MELBOURNE, THE TWENTY-SIXTH DAY OF  
APRIL 1888.

*Present :*

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR.

**W**HEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Act 1887*, herein referred to as "the Act," it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time after the passing of the said Act make and when made rescind alter and add to rules in relation to the matters in the said Act mentioned: Now therefore I, the Governor in Council aforesaid, do hereby make the following Rules (that is to say):—

1. Where, on an information being laid, a warrant is issued in the first instance for the apprehension of any person, and where such person being apprehended is brought before a justice, and either by warrant committed to gaol or discharged on recognisance until the hearing of such information, the member of the police force who has executed such warrant shall forthwith transmit the original warrant of apprehension to the clerk of the court of petty sessions to which such person has been remanded or at which he has been bound by recognisance to appear.

2. Where a recognisance has been entered into before a justice conditioned for the appearance of a person before a court of petty sessions, or for the doing some other matter or thing in, to, or before a court of petty sessions, or in a proceeding in a court of petty sessions, such justice shall forthwith transmit the said recognisance to the clerk of such court of petty sessions.

3. Where a recognisance conditioned to keep the peace, or be of good behaviour, or to observe some forbearance has been entered into before a justice, a superintendent, inspector, sub-inspector of police, or keeper of a prison, such recognisance shall, if the same was directed by a court of petty sessions to be entered into, be forthwith transmitted by the person taking the same to the clerk of such court of petty sessions, and shall in all other cases be forthwith transmitted to the clerk of the nearest court of petty sessions in the bailiwick wherein the same was entered into.

4. Where, on an information being laid or complaint made, a summons is issued for the attendance of any person at a court of petty sessions, the member of the police force or other person who serves such summons, whether the same be served personally or by substituted service or otherwise, shall forthwith, after service has been effected, transmit such information and summons to the clerk of the court of petty sessions at which such summons is returnable.

5. Summonses shall be issued only on the application of the complainant or informant in person, or of a person in his sole employ, or of his counsel or attorney, or of the clerk of such counsel or attorney.

6. Where, on an information being laid or a complaint being made, a summons is issued as aforesaid, and an order for substituted service, or for the substitution for service of notice by advertisement, or otherwise, is made, such order shall be indorsed on or annexed to the original summons, and shall be signed by the justice or one of the justices making the same.

7. Where any document requiring a fee-stamp is issued by or acknowledged before a justice, such justice shall satisfy himself that the proper fee-stamp is affixed thereto, and has been cancelled by the officer whose duty it may be to receive the fee.

8. Every clerk of petty sessions shall keep the register required by the Act to be kept by him in the form and with the particulars set out in the Schedule hereto; and the register kept by each particular clerk shall be distinguished by the name of the place at which such court is appointed to be held, as in the said form prescribed.

9. The clerk of every court of petty sessions shall before each sitting of such court cause to be entered in such register the various informations and complaints to be heard at such sitting in the order in which the summonses or warrants issued on such informations or complaints have reached his hands, and the said informations and complaints shall be called on for hearing in the order in which they stand in the list; but the justices may, if they think fit, hear first in order the cases which may be more conveniently so disposed of.

10. Every clerk of petty sessions shall keep a suitors' cash book in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, in which he shall enter all moneys received from or on behalf of complainants or defendants, and all moneys paid to or on behalf of complainants or defendants; and such book shall be kept in such a manner that at the end of each month the balance of such moneys in court shall clearly appear.

11. Every clerk of petty sessions shall keep a security book, which shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto, and shall enter therein with respect to each security given in relation to any proceeding before the court the name and address of each person bound, showing whether he is bound as principal or surety, the sum in which each person is bound, the undertaking or condition by which he is bound, the date of the security, and the person before whom it is taken. The security book, and any certified extract therefrom, shall be evidence of the several matters hereby required to be entered therein, in like manner as if the security book were the register.

12. Every clerk of petty sessions shall keep an instalment book in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, in which he shall enter the register number and date of every order or conviction by which a sum of money is adjudged to be paid by instalments, the name of the person against whom the order or conviction is made, the manner of payment ordered, and each instalment as soon as it is paid.

13. Where a court of petty sessions by whose conviction or order any sum is adjudged to be paid allows time for payment of the said sum, or directs payment to be made by instalments, the clerk of petty sessions to whom the said sum or instalments shall have been paid shall account for such sums as shall have been paid in the usual manner.

14. The clerk of petty sessions or the justice before whom the complaint is made shall in all cases where particulars are given by the complainant under the Act or these rules stamp or initial such particulars, and likewise the copy of the defendant's particulars of set-off, if any.

15. Where the defendant in any complaint for a civil debt recoverable summarily intends to rely upon any set-off, he shall, in addition to the notice and particulars required by the Act to be given by him to the complainant, send by post or cause to be delivered to the clerk of petty sessions of the court at which the summons is returnable, a copy of such notice and particulars.

16. Such notice and particulars, and the copy of such notice and particulars, shall be delivered to the complainant and to the clerk of petty sessions respectively, or, if sent by post, shall be posted in such time that they may, in the ordinary course, reach the hands of the complainant and the clerk of petty sessions respectively, twenty-four hours before the summons is returnable.

17. Moneys may be paid into court, and the moneys to which complainants and defendants are respectively entitled shall be paid out on demand on every day on which the office is open between the hours of ten in the forenoon and three in the afternoon, except on Saturdays, when such payments may be made between the hours of ten and eleven in the forenoon.

18. Whenever money is paid into court by or on behalf of the defendant or complainant, the clerk of petty sessions shall give to the person paying the money an acknowledgment in writing of such payment in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto; and where money is paid out of court to or on behalf of the complainant or defendant, the person receiving such money shall sign in the suitors' cash book an acknowledgment thereof.

19. Any erasure or interlineation in a summons at the time of the issue thereof shall be stamped or initialed by the clerk of petty sessions who issues the same, if such summons is issued by a clerk of petty sessions; and, if such summons is issued by a justice, shall be initialed by him.

20. A complaint may be made or an information laid, and a summons may be issued thereon, against two or more persons liable or chargeable, whether jointly, severally, or in the alternative; and orders or convictions may be made against such one or more of such persons as the justices may find to be liable.

21. Where on the hearing of any such complaint as in the preceding rule mentioned an order is made against two or more defendants jointly, such order may be enforced by distress or otherwise against any one of the defendants affected thereby in the same manner as if the order had been made against him separately. Provided that, after the order is satisfied by performance or payment by, or distress on the goods of, any of such defendants, no further steps shall be taken to enforce the same against the other defendant or defendants. Provided also that nothing herein contained shall affect any right to contribution or other relief which may exist as between the defendants themselves.

22. Any two or more persons claiming or being liable as co-partners may join in making a complaint, or may be joined as defendants in a summons, in the names of their respective firms, if any.

23. Where by the Act it is required that particulars shall be indorsed on or annexed to the summons, such particulars shall be indorsed on or annexed to the same before it is served, and a copy of such particulars shall form a part of the copy of the summons which is delivered to the defendant; and where the demand exceeds the amount in which a court of petty sessions has jurisdiction, but the complainant desires to abandon the excess or admit a set-off, the abandonment of the excess or admission of a set-off shall be entered at the end of such particulars.

24. Where on any complaint for a civil debt recoverable summarily the defendant intends to rely upon any of the grounds of defence following, namely, set-off, infancy, coverture, Statute of Limitations, discharge under any Act relating to bankrupts or insolvent debtors, tender, payment into court, he shall forward to the complainant and to the clerk of petty sessions a notice stating therein his name and address, together with a concise statement of such grounds, twenty-four hours at least before the time at which the summons is returnable. Provided that in case of non-compliance with this rule, and the complainant not consenting at the hearing to permit the defendant to avail himself of such defence, the justices may, on such terms as they think fit, adjourn the hearing to enable the defendant to give such notice.

25. Where the defendant intends to rely upon a set-off of any debt or demand recoverable as such before a court of petty sessions by him from the complainant, his notice shall contain particulars of the account, including dates and items, upon which he contends that the set-off is due.

26. Where a defendant intends to rely on the defence of infancy he shall in his notice set forth, so far as he is able, the place and date of his birth.

27. Where a female defendant intends to rely upon the defence of coverture, she shall in her statement set forth, so far as she is able, the place and date of her marriage, together with the name and surname of her husband, and his address and occupation, so far as known.

28. Where a defendant intends to rely upon the defence of any Statute of Limitations, he shall in his notice state the date from which he contends that the Statute began to run.

29. Where a defendant intends to rely on the defence of a release under any Act relating to bankrupts or insolvent debtors, he shall in his notice set forth the date of the order of sequestration and of his certificate of discharge or final order and the court by which such order of sequestration, certificate of discharge, or final order was granted or made.

30. Subject to these rules, money may be paid into court, and such payment or tender of a sum of money may be relied upon as a defence to any complaint under the Act for an assault or sum of money due or to any claim of set-off.

31. Where the defendant wishes to pay money into court he shall pay the same twenty-four hours before the time fixed for the return of the summons, together with the cost of issuing and serving the summons; and the defendant shall forthwith after such payment send to the complainant notice thereof in the



form prescribed in the Schedule hereto. But when the complainant does not receive notice of such payment having been made before the sitting of the court at which the summons is made returnable, it shall be lawful for the justices to order the defendant to pay such additional costs as the complainant shall have in their opinion properly incurred in preparing for the hearing and in attending the court.

32. Where the defence to a complaint or claim of set-off is a tender, such defence shall not be available unless before the hearing, or by permission of the court at the hearing, the defendant pays into court (which may be without costs) the amount alleged to have been tendered.

33. Where money has been paid into court by the defendant with a defence of tender, or without a denial of liability, the money so paid in shall be paid out to the complainant at his request, unless the court of petty sessions otherwise order.

34. Where a defendant desires to pay money into court with a denial of his liability on the complaint, he shall lodge with the clerk of petty sessions, at the time of payment into court, a written notice in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and shall, in the notice which he sends to complainant, state in that case that such payment is made with a denial of any liability.

35. If the complainant elect to accept in full satisfaction of his claim, including costs, such money as shall have been paid into court by the defendant under the last preceding rule, he shall send or deliver to the clerk of petty sessions and to the defendant a written notice stating such acceptance, such reasonable time before the return of the summons as the time of payment by the defendant has permitted, and upon his doing so no further proceedings in the said complaint shall be taken, and the complainant shall not be liable for any further costs. But in default of such notices the complaint may go on for hearing, and the defendant shall be entitled to an order for such costs as, in the opinion of the justices, he shall have properly incurred after such payment into court, unless the complainant recover a sum larger than the amount paid into court.

36. Where under the last preceding rules money has been paid into court with a denial of liability, and the complainant has accepted the same in full satisfaction of his claim and has sent the notices required under the preceding rule, he shall be entitled to have the money paid out to him on request. Provided that such money shall not be paid out unless the clerk of petty sessions has satisfied himself that notice of acceptance has been duly sent or delivered to the defendant.

37. Where under the provisions of section seventy-seven of the Act a court of petty sessions adjourns the hearing of any information, complaint, or application to another court, the justices constituting such court, or any one of them, shall sign a memorandum in the form in the Schedule hereto; and the clerk of petty sessions at such first-mentioned court shall transmit such information, complaint, or application, if in writing, together with such memorandum, to the clerk of petty sessions at the court to which the same is adjourned.

38. Where a court of petty sessions has power under any Act of Parliament to deal with an indictable offence summarily, and has so dealt with it and dismissed the information, the order of dismissal shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

39. Where an application is made for a summons under section one hundred and fifteen of the Act, the applicant or his attorney shall sign an application in the form in the Schedule hereto, and shall state therein the ground or grounds on which he relies to obtain the committal of the person making default, and shall lodge the same with the clerk of petty sessions.

40. Every application for a summons under section one hundred and fifteen of the Act shall be supported by an affidavit verifying the same; and such affidavit may be made in the manner prescribed for making affidavits in proof of the service of summonses under section twenty-five of the Act.

41. The certificate of payment or satisfaction signed by the clerk of petty sessions, under section one hundred and twenty-one of the Act, shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto.

42. Any security given under the Act for the payment of any sum of money under any conviction or order shall be in the form of an undertaking, and may be in the form in the Schedule hereto, or in any other form to the like effect.

43. Where any such security is not entered into before the court but before some person specified by the court, the principal in such security shall make a return of it showing the particulars required by rule 10 to be entered in the security book to the clerk of petty sessions of the court at which the order directing security to be taken was made.

44. Not less than two clear days before a warrant of distress is issued for a sum due by a principal in pursuance of a forfeited security under the Act, the clerk of the court of petty sessions issuing the warrant shall cause notice of the forfeiture to be served on the principal. Service of the notice may be effected either personally or by letter sent to the address mentioned in the security.

45. Every application under section one hundred and twenty-five of the Act for an order for the oral examination of any person alleged to be indebted to the person against whom an order for the recovery or payment of money has been made, shall be supported by an affidavit in the form in the Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

46. Every clerk of petty sessions and every clerk of the peace shall demand, receive, and take for the use of Her Majesty the several fees allowed by and mentioned in the Schedule hereto and no more, and such fees shall be paid in the first instance by the person by whom or on whose behalf the act or proceeding (in respect whereof the same are payable) is required before such act shall be done or such proceeding shall be issued or taken (as the case may be).

47. The expression "the Act" wherever used in these rules means *The Justices of the Peace Act 1887*.

In all cases where practicable, witnesses and interpreters must travel by ship, coach, or railway, and in such part of the vessel, vehicle, or train as may be suitable to their station in life.

Any witness or interpreter paid ship, coach, or railway fares under the fifth\* clause will not be entitled to any allowance under any of the preceding clauses for the distance which he may travel by ship, coach, or railway.

**WHEREAS** by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the City of Fitzroy has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act, and no counter petition has been received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order subdivide the City of Fitzroy into five separate Wards, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

## FITZROY CITY—SUBDIVISIONS.

**WEST WARD.**—Commencing at a point in the centre of Victoria parade, due south of the centre of Nicholson street; thence north by the western boundary of the city to a point due west of the centre of Johnston street; thence east by the centre of Johnston street to its intersection with the centre of Young street; thence south by the centre of Young street to the southern boundary of the city; and thence west by the said southern boundary of the city to the commencing point.

**EAST WARD.**—Commencing at a point in the centre of Victoria parade, due south of the centre of Young street; thence north by the centre of Young street to its intersection with the centre of Johnston street; thence east by the centre of Johnston street to the eastern boundary of the city; and thence south and west by the boundary of the city to the commencing point.

**CENTRAL WARD.**—Commencing at a point in the centre of Nicholson street, due west of the centre of Johnston street; thence north by the western boundary of the city to a point due west of the centre of Freeman street; thence east by the centre of Freeman street to a point due north of the centre of Napier street; thence south by the centre of Napier street to its intersection with the centre of Heidelberg road (Queen's parade); thence north-easterly by the centre of the said Heidelberg road to a point due north of the centre of Smith street; thence south by the centre of Smith street, forming the eastern boundary of the city, to a point due east of the centre of Johnston street; and thence west by the centre of Johnston street to the commencing point.

**NORTH WARD.**—Commencing at a point in the centre of Nicholson street, due west of the centre of Freeman street; thence north by the centre of Nicholson street to the northern boundary of the city; thence east by the northern boundary of the city to the Merri Creek; thence by the centre of the Merri Creek to its intersection with the centre of St. George's road; thence southerly by the centre of St. George's road to its intersection with the centre of Brunswick street; thence south by the centre of Brunswick street to its intersection with the centre of Freeman street; and thence west by the centre of Freeman street to the commencing point.

**CLIFTON WARD.**—Commencing at the intersection of the centre of Brunswick street with the centre of Freeman street; thence north by the centre of Brunswick street to its intersection with the centre of St. George's road; thence northerly by the centre of St. George's road to the Merri Creek; thence south-easterly by the Merri Creek to a bridge south of High street, in the borough of Northcote; thence south-westerly by the centre of the Heidelberg road to a point due south of the centre of Napier street; thence north by the centre of Napier street to a point due east of the centre of Freeman street; and thence west by the centre of Freeman street to the commencing point.

And His Excellency the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby further order that a Council consisting of fifteen members be elected accordingly.

**WHEREAS** by the *Local Government Act Amendment Act 1888* it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, No. 38.—**APRIL 27, 1888.**—2.

St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge) when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf, upon the application of the council of the municipality, in compliance with the provisions of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the council of the municipality of the shire of Caulfield has made an application under the Common Seal of the said municipality, in accordance with the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder, for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal district of the municipality of the said shire of Caulfield: And whereas the Governor in Council being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said council of the said municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said council to make the said application, in which notice the routes proposed to be followed were described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the Regulations, has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and that no objections to the said application have been lodged within the time provided in the said rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, make the Order following, that is to say:—

That the council of the municipality of the shire of Caulfield shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the municipal district of the shire of Caulfield.

**Routes.**—That the routes of such tramway shall be as follows:—

**Section 1.**—From Elsternwick railway station to Glen Huntly railway station. Commencing at the Elsternwick railway station; thence east along the Glen Huntly road to the Glen Huntly railway station.

**Section 2.**—From Glen Huntly road to the Caulfield railway station. Commencing at a point on section 1 at the intersection of Glen Huntly road with Boundary road; thence north along Boundary road to its intersection with Glen Eira road; thence east along Glen Eira road to its intersection with Kambrook road; thence north along Kambrook road to its intersection with Station road; thence east along Station road to the Caulfield railway station.

**Section 3.**—From Hotham street to Boundary road. Commencing at the intersection of Hotham street with Glen Eira road; thence east along Glen Eira road to its intersection with Boundary road, where it will join section 2 before described.

**Gauge.**—That the gauge of such tramway shall be four feet eight and a half inches (4 feet 8½ inches), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications, numbered from one (1) to three (3) inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are endorsed with a memorandum of the Honorable the Minister of Public Works identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

**Motive Power.**—That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be horses.

**Maximum Speed.**—That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be ten (10) miles in the hour.

**Time of Completion.**—That the portion of the tramway comprised within sections one (1) and two (2) shall be completed and opened for traffic throughout its entire length within the period of two (2) years from the date of this Order. That the portion of the tramway comprised within section three (3) shall be completed and opened for traffic throughout its entire length within the period of three (3) years from the date of this Order.

**Passenger Traffic only.**—That such tramway shall be used for passenger traffic only. Necessary precautions for safety of passengers and public to be observed. That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets or roads upon the routes of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said council of the said municipality.

**Stoppages for taking up and setting down Passengers.**—That for the convenience of the public the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the several routes as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

**Tolls and Charges.**—That the charges to be made for every passenger on the said tramway may be, but shall not exceed, the following, that is to say, for each passenger:—

From Elsternwick railway station to Glen Huntly railway station, or vice versa, or any lesser distance between, Threepence.

From Elsternwick railway station to the Caulfield railway station, or vice versa, or any lesser distance between, Threepence.

From Hotham street to the Caulfield railway station, or vice versa, or any lesser distance between—Threepence.

**Governor in Council to be sole judge of breach of Order.**—That the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order; and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an enquiry into the facts of

each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 26 of the Regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the said Act, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the Regulations in the said Schedule.

If upon the report of the Governor in Council by the referee made under the said clause 26 of the Regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or compliance with or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred, by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall cease and determine, or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the council of the said municipality of the Shire of Caulfield shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets or roads along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

And the Honorable John Nimmo, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

#### REGULATIONS.

##### Depasturing Cattle in Timber Reserves.

1. Persons resident in Victoria and within twenty miles of the timber reserve in the parish of Ulupna, commencing on the Ulupna Creek, and adjoining allotments 12, 11, 10, 6A, 23, 24, 26, 36, 5, 4, 33, 30, 28, 29, 27, 24A, section A, of the said parish, and terminating at the Kynmerr Creek, may, subject to the conditions hereinafter specified, depasture in such timber reserve any number not exceeding in the whole thirty head of cattle.

2. All cattle so depastured must be the *bond fide* property of persons resident as aforesaid.

3. Depasturing shall be subject to the supervision and control of the forester in charge; and the forester shall be responsible for the registration of the cattle, and for the prevention of trespass.

4. The fee for depasturing cattle in the timber reserve before mentioned shall be paid half-yearly in advance, and shall be at the rate of Four shillings per annum for every head of cattle.

5. Every person desirous of depasturing cattle in the timber reserve before mentioned shall pay into the Receipt and Pay Office nearest to such reserve the full amount of the fees prescribed by these Regulations, and shall obtain a receipt for such payment in the form prescribed in the schedule hereto.

6. A place shall be set apart, as the necessities of the case may require, for branding all cattle prior to the same being depastured in the reserve; and all persons shall bring their cattle to such place to be branded by the forester or his assistant, on a day appointed by the forester for the purpose of branding cattle. The days appointed for branding cattle shall be notified by advertisement, authorized by the forester, in a newspaper circulating in the district.

7. All cattle depasturing in the timber reserve before mentioned shall be deemed to be trespassers unless the same have been duly branded by the forester or his assistant, and the fees for depasturing shall have been paid.

8. The brand in use for the Barmah and Yielina State Forest shall be used for the purpose of branding cattle depasturing in the timber reserve before mentioned, and shall be kept by the forester, and may be inspected by the public at the place set apart for branding on the days appointed for branding, or a description thereof may be obtained on application in writing to the forester.

9. The brand shall be liable to alteration at any time, on approval of the Minister. Notice of every such alteration shall be published in a newspaper circulating in the district, and every such notice shall specify a time when the owners of cattle depasturing under license in such timber reserve shall bring the same for the purpose of being branded with such altered brand. Every person disobeying such notice shall be deemed to be a person not licensed or otherwise authorized to depasture cattle within the meaning of the 109th section of *The Land Act 1884*, and may be dealt with accordingly.

10. For the purpose of these regulations the term "cattle" shall mean and include any gelding, mare, colt, or filly, any ox, steer, cow, or heifer, and any ass or mule.

11. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the before-mentioned timber reserve.

12. When the forester in charge of the timber reserve before mentioned shall consider that the said reserve is stocked to its full carrying capability, he shall notify the Receiver and Paymaster accordingly, who thereupon shall discontinue to issue licenses for such reserve until otherwise advised by the forester.

# COHUNA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST—CONSTITUTED.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of April 1888.*

WHEREAS by section 250 of *The Irrigation Act 1886* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, upon the application of any Trust or of any other body or persons authorized by the said Act to construct waterworks, and after any such Trust, body, or persons has or have by Order in Council been duly appointed or authorized, make additional Orders relating to such Trust, body, or persons not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act; but that no such additional Order shall in any manner whatever lessen or diminish any liability or obligation previously incurred or imposed upon any such Trust or body or person, or in any way release or discharge any such Trust, body, or person from any such liability or obligation; and that the Governor in Council may in such additional Orders in Council—

(a.) Make any Order which might have been made in the Order in Council originally appointing or authorizing such Trust, body, or persons;

(b.) Increase or diminish or otherwise alter, in accordance with and not inconsistent with the previous provisions of the said Act, the extent of the district of such Trust, body, or persons; and

(c.) Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Trust, body, or persons.

And whereas by a certain Order in Council bearing date the eighteenth day of July 1887 an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, known as the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, was duly appointed and constituted under the provisions of the said Act, having authority under the said provisions to construct and maintain certain specified waterworks for the irrigation of the lands comprised within a certain Irrigation and Water Supply District in and by the said Order in Council duly defined and limited: And whereas the said Trust has made application for an additional Order in Council under the said provisions of the now in part recited Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth upon such application, and in accordance with the provisions of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, order that seven clauses of the said Order in Council, numbered from 2 to 8 inclusive, together with the First and Second Schedules to such Order, shall be and the same are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof it is hereby declared and ordered.

(1.) That the limits and boundaries of the district within which such Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall have authority (and which district shall henceforth be an Irrigation and Water Supply District) shall be those set out and described in the First Schedule hereto.

(2.) That the name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District shall be the "Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply District," and the corporate name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be the "Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust."

(3.) That the scheme of works of the said Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be—The diversion of water from the River Murray and its effluents, and the distribution of such water upon the lands of the said Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply District; and that the works to be constructed and maintained are those set out in the Second Schedule hereto, all of which works shall be Trust works.

(4.) That the sources from which the said Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is to obtain its supply are the River Murray and its effluents, the Gunbower, Deep, Yarram, Barr, and Picinniny Barr Creeks, and McDonald's and the Red Gum Swamps; and that the quantities of water to be taken from the said River Murray by pumping is not to exceed in summer, that is to say, from the first day of November to the thirty-first day of May, both days inclusive, 6,000 cubic feet per minute, and in winter, that is to say, from the first day of June to the thirty-first day of October, both days inclusive, 5,000 cubic feet per minute; and that the quantities of water to be taken from the Gunbower, Deep, Yarram, and Picinniny Barr Creeks, and McDonald's and the Red Gum Swamps, shall be the total volume flowing or conserved therein; that the quantity of water to be taken from the Barr Creek is not to exceed two-thirds (2/3) of the volume of the flood waters thereof, in addition to the total volume of water brought into the said Barr Creek by means of pumping.

(5.) That the total amount proposed to be expended in Trust works is Fifty-eight thousand pounds (£58,000).

(6.) That the amount of money at present proposed to be advanced by the Board of Land and Works to the Trust, by way of loan, is Fifty thousand pounds (£50,000); that the rate of interest to be paid upon such loan is Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, being one-half per cent. higher than the rate paid by the Government upon the public loan out of which such moneys are to be advanced, the rate of such interest to be subject to reduction in accordance with section 146 of the said Act, in event of the interest paid by the Government upon such public loan being reduced.

(7.) That the number of persons to be elected as commissioners of the said Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be nine (9), and the period for which such commissioners shall hold office shall be three years.

(8.) That the amount of moneys which may be borrowed by the said Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall not at any time, together with any balances due from the Trust to the Board, or upon any Trust loan, exceed the sum of One hundred and fifty thousand pounds. And no rate made by the said Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall exceed the sum of £40 per centum upon the annual valuation of the property within the said Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply District.

(9.) That the maximum amount which may be paid out of a loan raised by the said Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust in defraying the preliminary costs and expenses of application for this Order shall be Six hundred pounds (£600) sterling.

(10.) For the purpose of the election of commissioners to be hereafter held, the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the said Trust shall be divided into three ridings, and three commissioners shall be elected in respect of each such riding, and the boundaries of the ridings shall be defined by any regulations made in that behalf under the provisions of the said Act.

A strip of land two chains wide on either side of the centre of Yarram Creek: Commencing at the effluence of the said creek from the River Murray; thence south-westerly along the said creek to its confluence with the Gunbower Creek.

Portion No. 6.

A strip of land two chains wide on either side of the centre of the Gunbower Creek: Commencing at a point on the said creek east of the most northern angle of allotment 18, section E, in the parish of Murrabit; thence easterly, south-easterly, north-easterly, and northerly along the centre of the said creek to a point in line with the north boundary of allotment 12, section V, parish of Gunbower.

Portion No. 7.

A strip of land two chains wide on either side of the centre of Barr Creek, and a line commencing at a point in the centre of the said creek in line with the most western boundary of T. Blain's 20-acre block, section A, parish of Murrabit West; thence south-westerly by the centre of the said creek to a point in line with the most western boundary of A. Henderson's 20-acre block in the same parish; thence south-westerly by a line to its intersection with the River Loddon, near the north-west angle of allotment 1, section C, of the said parish.

COHUNA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY  
TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION OF  
COMMISSIONERS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of April 1888.

WHEREAS by section 63 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any irrigation and water supply trust constituted under the said Act, for the purposes, among others, following:—

- (a.) For determining the period for which the commissioners of any trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office.
- (b.) For determining the manner in which elections of any such commissioners shall be held, and the manner of voting thereat.
- (c.) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners shall be filled up.
- (d.) For determining questions as to the due election of any such commissioner; and
- (e.) For prescribing, subject to the provisions of the said Act, any other matter necessary for giving effect to Part IV. of the said Act.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain irrigation and water supply trust duly appointed under the said Act, and known as the "Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust," make the regulations following, namely:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In these regulations "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the trust" or "the said trust" shall mean the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust; and "the district," "the said district," or "the irrigation and water supply district" shall mean the lands, as defined by Order in Council appointing the said trust, wherein the trust shall have authority.

2. *Repeal of previous regulations.*—The regulations made on the 20th day of April 1886 (and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 30th day of April 1886, pages 1116-18), providing for the election of Commissioners of the Cohuna Irrigation Trust, shall be and the same are hereby repealed. Provided always that the commissioners of the said trust, elected in pursuance of the said regulations, and holding office upon the date hereof, shall, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in such regulations, continue to hold office until commissioners shall have been elected under the provisions hereof. But nothing herein shall be deemed to disqualify the persons now holding office as commissioners for election as commissioners under the provisions herein-after contained.

3. *Period for which commissioners shall hold office.*—Subject to the provisions in reference to the first election of commissioners hereinafter contained, for securing the annual retirement of commissioners, the period during which the commissioners of the said trust shall hold office shall be three years.

4. *Annual retirement of commissioners.*—Certain commissioners, as hereinafter provided, shall retire annually, but the retiring commissioners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be eligible for re-election.

5. *District to be divided into three ridings.*—For the purpose of the election of commissioners, the district of the said Trust shall be divided into three ridings, numbered respectively 1, 2, and 3, and the same shall be severally bounded as set forth in the First Schedule hereto.

6. *Number of commissioners to be elected for each riding.*—Three persons shall be elected as commissioners for each of the said ridings.

7. *Term of office of persons elected commissioners at first election.*—For the purpose of securing the retirement, annually, of a commissioner of each of the said ridings, it is hereby provided that, of the said number of persons elected commissioners at the first election, the terms for which such persons shall hold office as commissioners for each of the said ridings respectively shall be the following, namely:—

No. 1 Riding.—One person for three years, one person for two years, and one person for one year.

No. 2 Riding.—One person for three years, one person for two years, and one person for one year.

No. 3 Riding.—One person for three years, one person for two years, and one person for one year.

And the particular term for which each such person so elected a commissioner of the said trust for any of the said ridings shall hold office shall be determined in the manner following, that is to say:—

(a.) *How term of office is ascertained when no poll taken.*—If in the case of all or any of the said ridings, the first election is made without a poll, as in these regulations provided, then the particular term, as aforesaid, for which each candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office shall, immediately upon such election, be publicly determined by lot by the returning officer, in such manner as to him may seem fit, and the returning officer shall thereupon immediately, and publicly, announce the term for which each individual candidate elected a commissioner shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

(b.) *How term of office ascertained when poll taken.*—If at the first election a poll shall be taken as in these regulations provided, then of the three candidates for each riding respectively elected as commissioners, the candidate who shall have received the highest number of votes shall hold office as commissioner for a term of three years, the candidate who shall have received the next highest number of votes shall hold office for a term of two years, and the remaining candidate who shall have been elected shall hold office for a term of one year.

If, in the case of any riding, two or more than two candidates elected shall have obtained the same number of votes, then the returning officer shall determine by lot (as hereinbefore provided in the case of the first election if decided without a poll) the term or terms of three, two, or one years, or year, during which such candidates shall respectively hold office. But so that no candidate elected shall hold office for a shorter time than the term during which any other candidate who shall have obtained a less number of votes shall hold office. And the returning officer shall publicly declare the respective terms during which the several candidates shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

8. *Extraordinary vacancies, how filled, and term of office.*—Should any vacancy in the office of commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy, and the provisions contained in these regulations, as to the nomination of candidates, the manner in which elections shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat, shall apply to any election in respect of such vacancy, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

9. *Date for first election of commissioners.*—Date of ordinary annual election.—The first election of commissioners of the said trust, under these regulations, shall be held on the sixth day of June 1888, and the ordinary annual election shall be held on the sixth day of June in each succeeding year. Provided that whenever such date shall fall upon a Sunday, or upon any day set apart as a public holiday, such election shall be held upon the day next following.

10. *Voters' lists to be prepared.*—For the purpose of the first election of commissioners of the said trust, under these regulations, a voters' list shall be prepared in respect of each of the said ridings by the officers of the trust, and the said voters' lists shall be forwarded to the Minister.

11. *Form of voters' list.*—*Second Schedule.*—Such voters' lists shall be in the form of the Second Schedule hereto, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence, and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address, so far as these may be known, of each owner of not less than ten acres of land situate within the riding for which such list shall have been prepared, and shall also specify the extent of the said land of each such owner, and indicate the parish wherein the same is situate, and shall also state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such owner is entitled in respect of such land.

12. *How owners of lands in several ridings entitled to vote.*—Owners having lands within two or more than two of the said ridings shall, anything in the last preceding clause to the contrary notwithstanding, be enrolled in respect of such lands in the voters' lists as follows, that is to say:—

(a.) If any person shall be the owner of lands within two or more than two of the said ridings, the land within each riding being of a less extent than ten acres, but the aggregate extent of such lands being not less than ten acres, such person shall be entitled to have his name entered, as hereinbefore provided, upon the voters' list for any one (but not for more than one) riding wherein any part of the said lands may be situate, as if he were the owner of lands within the riding for which the said list shall have been prepared, equal in extent to the aggregate extent of such lands, and such person shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

(b.) If any person shall be the owner of less than ten acres of land in any riding of the said trust, and shall also be the owner of more than ten acres of land in any other such riding, for the purpose of determining the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, such owner is entitled, the area of the lands less in extent than ten acres shall be added to the area of the land exceeding in extent ten acres, and such owner shall be entered on the voters' list for such said other riding as the owner of land equal in extent to the aggregate area of such lands as so determined, and shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

(c.) If any person shall be the owner of lands within two or more than two of the said ridings, the extent of land within each riding being sufficient, under the provisions of the said Act, to entitle such owner to one, or more than one, vote in respect thereof, the name of such owner shall be placed upon the voters' list for each of the ridings wherein such lands may be respectively situate, but the number of votes to be set opposite the name of such owner on the voters' list for any one riding in respect of lands situate therein shall not exceed a number which, when added to the total number of votes that the said owner appears by the voters' lists for the other ridings to be entitled, will amount in the aggregate to not more than six, and such owner may vote accordingly. Provided always that, if any owner shall, by notice in writing, desire any amendment consistent with the provisions of the said Act, and of these regulations, to be made in the manner of the distribution of his votes among the voters' lists for the said ridings, such amendment shall be made accordingly when the said lists are being revised, as hereinafter provided, but nothing herein shall be deemed to authorize the placing of the name of any such owner upon the voters' list for any such riding wherein a part of his lands shall not be situate, or to authorize such owner voting at any election in respect of such riding as last aforesaid.

13. *Voting in respect of lands jointly owned.*—In the case of joint owners of land, the name of any one of such owners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list or voters' lists, in the case may be, in like manner as if such land were owned solely by such one owner, and the owner so placed upon the said list or lists shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list or lists shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list or lists shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

14. *Copies of voters' lists to be available for inspection.*—*Third Schedule.*—Objections to lists to be in writing and forwarded to Minister.—A copy of each such voters' list for each riding shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, in some convenient place within or near to the riding of the district for which the list shall have been prepared, for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Third Schedule hereto, setting forth the times and place at which such voters' lists may be so inspected, shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said lists must be forwarded in writing to the Minister within the time mentioned in the said notice.

15. *Grounds of objection to be stated.*—All objections to the said lists, or to any of them, shall be forwarded in writing to the Minister within nine days after the first day of publication of such notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

16. *Minister to revise and certify lists.*—The Minister shall revise the said lists, and consider all objections thereto, and make such alterations and amendments therein as to him may seem just, and shall certify the lists under his hand as correct, and no objections to the lists, or to any of them, when so certified, shall be allowed.

17. *Certified lists to be voters' rolls.*—The lists so revised and certified shall be the voters' rolls for the purposes of the first election, under these regulations, of the commissioners of the

trust, but shall also be available for any election in respect of any extraordinary vacancy occurring within twelve months next after the date of the said first election.

18. *Voters' lists to be prepared annually.*—Before the thirty-first day of March in each year the officers of the trust shall prepare a voters' list for each such riding, in the form of the Second Schedule hereto, and such lists shall contain, in regular numerical sequence, and in alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of each owner of not less than ten acres of land situate within the riding for which such list shall have been prepared, and shall also specify the extent of the said land of each such owner, and indicate the parish wherein the same is situate, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such owner is entitled in respect of such land.

19. *How owners of land in more than one riding entitled to vote.*—In the preparation of the voters' lists last aforesaid, owners having lands within two or more than two of the said ridings shall, anything in the last preceding clause to the contrary notwithstanding, be enrolled in respect of such lands in the said voters' lists in accordance with the provisions contained in such one of sub-clauses a, b, and c of clause twelve of these regulations as may apply to the circumstances of each such owner.

20. *Voting in respect of land jointly held.*—In the case of joint owners of land, the name of any one of such owners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list or voters' lists, as the case may be, in like manner as if such lands were owned solely by such one owner, and the owner so placed upon the said list or lists shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners in any manner that they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list or lists shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list or lists shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

21. *Copies of lists to be available for inspection.*—*Fourth Schedule.*—A copy of each such voters' list for each riding shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, in some convenient place within or near to the riding for which the list shall have been prepared, for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Fourth Schedule hereto shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the district; and such notice shall state that all objections to the said lists, or to either of them, must be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the trust within the time mentioned in the said notice.

22. *Grounds of objections to lists to be forwarded in writing to the chairman of trust.*—All objections to the said lists, or to either of them, shall be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the trust within the time mentioned in the said notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

23. *Special meeting of trust to be held to revise lists.*—*Lists to be certified.*—In the month of April of each year a special meeting of the trust shall be held for the purpose of revising the said lists, and all objections which may have been forwarded to the chairman under the preceding clause shall be considered by the commissioners then present, and the chairman may make such alterations and amendments in the said lists or in any of them as the commissioners or a majority of the commissioners present may determine to be just and necessary, or such as they are by these regulations required to make; and the lists, when so revised, altered, and amended, shall be certified as correct under the hand of the chairman, and no objection to the lists or any of them when so certified shall be allowed.

24. *Revised and certified lists to be voters' rolls.*—The lists so revised and certified shall be the voters' rolls for the purposes of any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) of trust commissioners to be held within one year from the sixth day of June then next, the said day inclusive.

25. *Appointment of returning officer.*—*First election.*—For the purpose of the first election under these regulations the Minister may appoint some fit and proper person, not being the owner of land within the district, to be the returning officer; and such returning officer may appoint a deputy or deputies to assist him or to act in his stead at such election, and such deputy or deputies may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

26. *Chairman of trust to be returning officer.*—For every subsequent election, whether ordinary or extraordinary, the chairman of the trust for the time being shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of chairman of the trust shall be vacant, the commissioners of the trust may, by resolution, appoint one of their number to be returning officer until the office of chairman of the trust shall again be filled; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy or deputies to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy or deputies may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

27. *Returning officer not to be candidate.*—No person who acts as returning officer or deputy returning officer at any election shall be or become a candidate for the office of commissioner at such election.

28. *Notice of election.*—*Nomination of candidates.*—*Fifth Schedule.*—Twenty-one clear days before any election of commissioners under these regulations the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the said district, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said district, to be named in such notice, in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon and four o'clock in the afternoon on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than seven nor more than ten days after the time of

giving such notice, and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid, to the returning officer, a nomination paper in the form, or to the like effect, of the Fifth Schedule, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than four persons duly qualified to vote at such election, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate, in token of his assent to being so named.

29. *Qualification of candidates.*—No person shall be eligible for election as a commissioner for any riding of the trust unless he be the owner or occupier of land within such riding.

30. *Candidate to lodge deposit.*—At the time of the delivery to the returning officer of any such nomination paper as aforesaid, the candidate named therein, or some person for him, or on his behalf, shall pay into the hands of the returning officer the sum of Five pounds (£5), to be dealt with as hereinafter provided; and no person who has not been nominated as aforesaid, or by whom or on whose behalf such payment has not been so made, shall, within the subsequent provisions of these regulations, be or be deemed to be a candidate at any election of commissioners.

31. *Deposit, how dealt with.*—Where a poll takes place for any election of commissioners for any riding, the moneys so paid as aforesaid to the returning officer by or on behalf of any candidate in respect of the riding who may not afterwards have received at the said election a number of votes equal at least to one-fifth part of the votes given to such one of the persons declared elected at such election as has had the least number of votes thereat, shall be forfeited to the corporate funds of the trust; and the returning officer shall forthwith after such election repay to each of the candidates who has so received at least such fifth part, whether declared elected or not, or who has been returned elected without a poll, or who has retired as herein provided, the moneys so paid by or for them respectively.

32. *Where number of candidates does not exceed number of commissioners to be elected.*—If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nomination of candidates, the number of persons who have become candidates for election as commissioners for any riding as aforesaid does not exceed the number of commissioners to be elected for the same, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

33. *Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners to be elected.*—Notice of poll.—Hours of polling.—If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates, the number of candidates for any riding exceeds the number of commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full, in the form of the Sixth Schedule hereto, and shall also forthwith give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the district, stating the names of the persons so nominated and that a poll will be taken for the election of such commissioners on the day named in such notice, at such place within the said riding as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint, and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at ten o'clock in the forenoon and close at four o'clock in the afternoon.

34. *Retirement of candidates before polling day.*—If at any election after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid any candidate for such election, and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid, are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer, not later than four clear days before the day of polling, a notice in the form of the Seventh Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires; and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the district a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication as aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election, shall on the day appointed for the election declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and if the said number is not so reduced shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and if such papers are already printed shall erase such name therefrom, and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

35. *Polling-booth may be hired.*—At such election the returning officer, deputy returning officer, or some other person appointed as hereinbefore mentioned, shall provide a suitable place or suitable places in each riding for taking the poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling-booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at either of the places appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to the returning officer, or his deputy, or the said other person so appointed, may seem most convenient.

36. *Returning officer or deputy to preside at polling-booth.*—The returning officer or his deputy or some one to be appointed by writing under the hand of the returning officer or his deputy shall preside at each polling-booth for taking the poll, and the returning officer may appoint poll-clerks to attend in each booth at such election.

37. *Scrutineers may be appointed.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in each polling-booth, and the said returning officer, or his deputy, or the other person appointed as aforesaid together with the scrutineers, poll-clerks, and any voters, not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling-booth.

38. *Pencils, &c., to be provided.*—The returning officer, his deputy, or the other persons so appointed, shall provide pencils in each polling-booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers; and such box shall be opened and

exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins; and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand upon a table opposite the returning officer, deputy returning officer, or the other person so appointed, who shall keep the key of such box.

39. *Mode of voting.*—Where voter is illiterate.—Sixth Schedule.—The returning officer, or his deputy, or the other person so appointed, shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being in the form of Schedule Six hereto, and initialed by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer or deputy, or other person so appointed, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate; and after such name or names have been so struck out the ballot-paper or ballot-papers, as the case may be, shall be forthwith deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling-booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time; and no person, having once demanded and received such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.

40. *Ballot-papers to be numbered.*—Before delivering any ballot-papers to the voter, the returning officer, his deputy, or the other person so appointed, shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number corresponding to the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll; and shall thereupon upon a copy of such roll check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

41. *Informal ballot papers.*—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

42. *What questions may be asked.*—At any election of commissioners, the returning officer, or his deputy, or the other person so appointed, may if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, shall put to any person tendering his vote the questions or any of the questions following:—

“(1) Are you the person whose name appears as (A. B.) in the roll now in force for this riding, being enrolled therein in respect of land in the parish of \_\_\_\_\_ and comprising (here specify the area of the land as given in the roll)?”

“(2) Have you already voted at the present election for this riding?”

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer either of the questions, or who shall not answer the first of such questions absolutely in the affirmative, and the second of such questions absolutely in the negative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

43. *False answer, polling twice, and personation.*—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to any of the questions aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once, or offer to poll more than once at the same election for the same riding, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from the polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as hereinbefore mentioned, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

44. *Result of polling, how ascertained.*—Returning officer to have casting vote.—Immediately upon the close of the poll, the returning officer, his deputy, or the other person so appointed as aforesaid shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer, deputy, or other person shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll publicly declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of commissioners to be elected or vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes, to have been duly elected commissioners; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote.

45. *Ballot-papers, how disposed of.*—In the case of the said first election of commissioners the returning officer shall forthwith after the declaration of the poll endorse with a description of the contents thereof and sign the sealed parcels of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Minister, who shall as soon as may be after the first meeting of trust commissioners shall have been held forward such sealed packet to the secretary to the trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three commissioners of the trust; but in all subsequent elections the parcel or parcels of ballot-papers so sealed, endorsed, and signed shall be delivered by the returning officer to the said secretary, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months after such delivery, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three of the commissioners of the trust.

46. *Minister to determine questions arising upon first election.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at the first election under these regulations the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question in writing to the Minister, who shall decide the same and such decision shall be final and binding.



47. *Questions arising upon subsequent elections to be determined by trust.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at any subsequent election, whether ordinary or extraordinary, such question shall be determined by the commissioners of the trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner, or at any time, to act as a commissioner until such question shall have been so determined; and the majority of the commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

48. *Appeal to Minister from determination of trust.*—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal from such decision to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such enquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary; and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just, and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

49. *Failure to elect deemed to create extraordinary vacancies.*—If at any election of commissioners no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are so not filled up shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the commissioners eventually elected to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

50. *Penalty for breach of regulations.*—These regulations shall also be deemed to be regulations under section 250 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, and any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.

51. *Interpretation.*—In these regulations the words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

**BYE-LAW No. 64.**

**T**HE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law, and all previous Bye-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

**CHARGES BY PASSENGER TRAINS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—**

1. The Sea-side Excursion Fare from Melbourne to Frankston is reduced to 4s. 8d. 1st Class and 3s. 3d. 2nd Class.
2. Members of the Legislature of Western Australia to be passed free over the Victorian Railways on production of the passes issued to them in their own colony.

**CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—**

3. Straw Envelopes for Bottles and Glass Preserving Jars in cases to be charged 1st Class Rates.
4. Boats for regattas to be charged 3d. per truck per mile, at owner's risk; minimum 10s. Safety trucks not to be charged when fully loaded with other goods; when containing 2 tons, 1½d. per truck per mile to be charged; under 2 tons, Full Rate. To be returned Free to sending station on production of the usual certificate from the Secretary of the Regatta Committee.
5. The minimum for Soap in cases in the Miscellaneous Class is reduced to 2 tons for distances of 36 miles and upwards.
6. The minimum for Victorian Honey in the Miscellaneous Class is reduced to 5 cwt.
7. Colonial Wine in cases to be charged Miscellaneous Class Rates with 2nd Class minimums.
8. The minimum for Fruit between Melbourne and Adelaide is reduced from 1 ton to 10 cwt., the proportion due to the Victorian Railways being 11s. 7½d.
9. Wheat from Country Stations rejected at the Williamstown or Port Melbourne Pier to be returned to the sidings at Kensington, Newmarket, or Moreland at 1s. per ton.
10. Meal, Pease, Wheat, Oats, or Maize, sent in small quantities with Flour, to be charged Flour Rates and one minimum to cover the lot.
11. Wool from the Goods Shed or Brougham-street Crossing, Geelong, to Geelong Railway Pier, to be charged 6d. per bale.
12. Horses sent from Gippsland to Melbourne for sale, but not all sold, the balance to be returned to sending station at a proportionate rate of the freight for the whole on the up journey, on production of certificate that they are a portion of the original consignment.
13. Skins packed in a Wool Press and not larger than ordinary sized bales of wool to be charged 6d. per bale from Melbourne to Williamstown or Port Melbourne Pier for shipment.
14. New Machinery and Cast Iron Pipes, manufactured up country and sent to Melbourne and thence to any station out of Melbourne, to be carried at a Class lower than Classification Rates.
15. Blasting Powder manufactured at Golden Square to be charged special B Rate, minimum 2s. 6d. per consignment to Footscray.
16. The following drawbacks in carriage will be allowed on Wheat conveyed by Rail from the undermentioned stations and shipped at Geelong for places outside Victoria:—

## SHIRE OF OXLEY.—PUBLIC HEALTH BYE-LAWS.

## BYE-LAW No. 2.—AS TO NUISANCES.

**T**HE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Oxley, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being bye-law No. 2 of the said local board of health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire.

4. *Definitions*.—In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say—

“House” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging houses, or other buildings or premises.

“Cesspool” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground; and “earth-closet” shall include a pan closet of any description.

“Street” shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

“Slaughter-yard” shall include any place where slaughtering takes place.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word “person” shall include a corporation.

## Part I.—General Cleanliness.

5. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and the ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dust, filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be, once at least every week, removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon, to be effectually deodorized and to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

7. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter in any street, road, lane, right-of-way or place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health, or in any way contrary to the directions of the local board or officer of health.

8. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water, or drinks, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

## Part II.—As to Stables, Cow-yards, Pig-sties, &amp;c.

9. The occupier of any land on which is erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty, or on which land is any building wherein any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine are kept, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; or once at least in every week should the quantity not amount, in that time, to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

10. Every occupier of a building or premises wherein or whereon any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine may be kept shall provide, in connexion with such building or premises, whenever required by the local board or officer of health, a suitable receptacle for dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may from time to time be produced in the keeping of any such animal in such building or upon such premises, and cause such receptacle to be constructed so that the bottom or floor thereof shall not in any case be lower than the surface of the ground adjoining such receptacle, and in such a manner and of such materials and to be maintained at all times in such a condition as to prevent any effluvia therefrom, or any escape of the contents thereof, or any soakage therefrom, into the ground or into the wall of any building, and to be furnished with a suitable cover, and, when not required to be open, to be kept properly covered.

11. He shall likewise provide in connexion with such building or premises, if required by the local board or officer of health, a sufficient drain constructed in such a manner and of such materials and maintained at all times in such a condition as effectually to convey all urine or liquid filth or refuse therefrom into a proper receptacle.

## Part III.—As to Manure.

12. Nothing herein contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil (not being night-soil), or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any bye-law of the local board of health, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or contrary to any directions of the local board or officer of health.

13. Every person placing, depositing, or spreading, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any liquid manure of which night-soil, urine, or any similar offensive matters form a part, night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness, and shall keep and use the same in such a way only as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health. And before doing so such person shall obtain the written permission of the local board or officer of health, subject however to any general regulation or directions which the Central Board, by publication in the *Government Gazette*, may make or give. But such permission shall be no defence in any complaint or prosecution for having kept or used such liquid manure, night-soil, offal, blood, or other matter in such a way as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

## Part IV.—As to Earth-closets, &amp;c.

14. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the content whereof does not exceed one cubic yard, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

15. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

16. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight and with handles thereto and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and provided with a closely-fitted cover of pattern to be approved by the inspector of nuisances.

17. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

18. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of eleven p.m. and five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, chloride of lime, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

19. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

20. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

21. Where in any municipality any nightman is licensed by the municipal authorities, such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same.

22. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

23. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of eleven p.m. and five a.m., unless otherwise permitted by the local board (of which the proof shall lie on such person), or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed as soon as the same is emptied.

24. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

*Part V.—Prevention of Pollution of Water.*

25. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

26. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.

27. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within twenty-four hours of notice given by the local board or by one of its officers.

*Part VI.—Drainage of Buildings.*

28. Every person erecting, or causing to be erected, any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

29. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

*Part VII.—Penalties.*

56. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Oxley this sixth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

2. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies; and should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours, it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase at the contractor's risk, and to deduct from the contractor's account the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price.

3. The contractor will be bound to weigh the coal on delivery at such establishments as are provided with weigh-bridges. In other cases the tickets of the public weigh-bridges are to be accepted as the weight to be charged for. Coal to be delivered in the places set apart therefor.

4. As soon as the orders shall have been completed, the contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form, with the order attached thereto, to the department supplied. Accounts will be payable at the Treasury, Melbourne, Ballarat, or Geelong, as the contractor may require.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supply as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

6. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of station, will have the power to reject such articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged, as in condition 6.

8. A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or of refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

A BILL TO AMEND THE LAW RELATIVE TO  
ATTORNEYS, SOLICITORS, AND PROCTORS.

**N**OTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made in the next session of the Parliament of Victoria for leave to bring in a bill for the following purposes:—

1. To amend the law relating to attorneys, solicitors, and proctors, and for that purpose to repeal section 32 of Act 15 Victoria No. 10, so far as the same relates to attorneys, solicitors, and proctors, sections 24 and 25 of Act 27 Victoria, No. 223, and section 396 of Act 27 Victoria, No. 223.
2. To form the attorneys, solicitors, and proctors now or hereafter practising in Victoria into a corporate body by the name of the Law Society of Victoria.
3. To define the powers and regulate the management of the said society and of a council thereof, and to provide for the making of bye-laws.
4. To prohibit the admission, suspension, or striking from the roll of any attorney, solicitor, or proctor, except under the provisions hereof.
5. To license attorneys, solicitors, and proctors for the practice of their profession, and for that purpose to provide for the issue to them of annual certificates, and the payment and disposal of fees in respect thereof, and to prevent unlicensed persons from practising or maintaining actions in respect of professional work.
6. To regulate the admission of attorneys, solicitors, and proctors, and for that purpose to make provision for the examination of and service under articles of clerkship by persons desiring admission, and for the partial or total exemption from such examination and service of persons who have obtained certain academical degrees or who had been admitted to practise in other parts of the empire, and to provide for the registration of contracts of service.
7. To limit the number of clerks to be articulated at one time to any attorney, solicitor, or proctor, and to prohibit such clerks from engaging in any other employment except under prescribed conditions.
8. To provide for the examination of persons desiring to be admitted, and for that purpose to constitute a board of examiners and to define their duties and powers.
9. To provide for the issue by the board of examiners of certificates of competency to persons desiring to be admitted, and for an appeal from the decision of the board to the council and thence to the Supreme Court.
10. To provide for the payment of fees by persons desiring to be admitted and for the disposal thereof.

11. To provide for the admission and enrolment of persons as attorneys, solicitors, and proctors on the certificate of the Council that such persons are duly qualified hereunder, and to provide for the cancelling of any certificate obtained by fraud or misrepresentation, and the striking off the rolls of persons procuring themselves to be admitted or enrolled by such means.

12. To provide for the removal from the roll of any attorney, solicitor, or proctor convicted of felony.

13. To give powers to an absolute majority of the council, subject to an appeal to the Supreme Court, to strike from the roll or otherwise punish any attorney, solicitor, or proctor convicted of misdemeanour or guilty of dishonourable or dishonest conduct, and to cancel or annul such punishment.
