**MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST—REGULATION.**

**T**HE Governor in Council, under the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, has approved of the subjoined Regulation made by the Maryborough Waterworks Trust.

**REGULATION No. 6.**

**T**HE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the following Regulation, viz:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annus value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.
2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, used either partly or wholly as a domicile, an amount of five per cent. per annum on the annual value of such property.
3. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, not being a domicile, an amount of 3½ per cent. per annum on the annual value of such property. Provided that in any case the charge shall not be less than the sum of One pound.
4. For every water-tough One pound per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs shall be 8,000 gallons.
5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre.

For every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses.

In open sheds used for the above purposes each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.

6. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January 1888, and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1888, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first of January and on the first of July 1888. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time approve of for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover the said rate.

**W**HEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Rodney has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act, and no counter petition has been received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order subdivide the Shire of Rodney into three separate Ridings, the names and boundaries whereof shall be as follow, that is to say:—

**KYBRAM RIDING.**—Commencing at a point on the shire boundary at the north-west angle of the parish of Mooroopna West; thence east along the north boundary, south along the east boundary, and west along the south boundary of that parish to the north-west angle of the parish of Toolamba West; thence south along the west boundary of the last-named parish to the shire boundary at the south-west angle of said parish; thence following the shire boundary westerly, northerly, and easterly to the commencing point.

OMEO RIDING.—Commencing at a point on the shire boundary at Mount Hotham; thence north-easterly and easterly by that boundary to a point on same where it is intersected by the Mitta Mitta River; thence southerly by that river and Livingstone Creek to the north-west angle of the parish of Cobungra; thence east by the north boundary of that parish to Mount Sisters, on

the Great Dividing Range; south-westerly by that range till it intersects the shire boundary; and thence by the shire boundary north-westerly to the commencing point.

VICTORIAN PERMANENT NAVAL FORCES.—  
ADDITION TO REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it was provided that the Governor in Council might make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order the following addition to the Regulations for the Victorian Permanent Naval Forces made on the thirteenth day of April and seventh day of June 1886 respectively, that is to say:—

SECTION III.—DISCIPLINE.

Add after paragraph 21—Absence through illness—the following new paragraph:—

21a. All persons serving in the Permanent Naval Forces, when under medical treatment for disease resulting from their own indiscretion or misconduct, shall be mulcted of one-half of their daily pay during the time they are absent from duty, and the Medical Officer shall furnish the Commanding Officer with a certificate when such persons are under treatment from the effect, in his opinion, of such indiscretion or misconduct, and the said certificate shall be the authority of the Commanding Officer for placing such persons under stoppage of half-pay.

Any persons remaining unfit for duty from the above-mentioned causes for a period of two months may be discharged from the service.

TRAMWAY IN THE SHIRE OF SWAN HILL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fifteenth day of May 1888.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883* it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge) when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf upon the application of the council of the municipality in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the council of the municipality of the shire of Swan Hill has made an application, under the Common Seal of the said municipality, in accordance with the said Act, and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder, for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal district of the municipality of the said shire of Swan Hill: And whereas the Governor in Council being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder, have been duly complied with by the said council of the said municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said council to make the said application in which notice the route proposed to be followed was described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the regulations has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and that no valid objections to the said application have been lodged within the time provided in the said rules, and; being satisfied also, that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, make the Order following, that is to say:—

That the council of the municipality of the shire of Swan Hill shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the municipal district of the shire of Swan Hill.

Routes.—That the route of the said tramway, shall be as follows:—

Commencing in the yard of the Kerang railway station; thence passing in a north-easterly direction through allotments 13, 12, and 11, parish of Kerang, and also through Foster's Swamp timber reserve to the Pyramid Creek, crossing that creek and passing through allotments 37, 36, 21, 14, and 14A same parish to the three-chain road from Kerang to Koondrook; thence following that road in a north-easterly direction through the parishes of Gannawarra and Murrabit to the River Murray at the north end of the township of Koondrook, a total length of thirteen miles and seventy-three chains,

*Gauge.*—That the gauge of such tramway shall be five feet and three inches (5ft. 3in.), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from one (1) to thirty-one (31) inclusive, now deposited in the office of the Engineer-in-Chief of Victorian Railways, and which plans and specifications are endorsed with a memorandum of the Honorable the Minister of Public Works, identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

*Motive power.*—That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be steam.

*Maximum speed.*—That the maximum speed of the progression of the rolling stock upon the said tramway shall be fifteen miles in the hour.

*Time of completion.*—That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic throughout its entire length within the period of twelve months from the date of this Order.

*Nature of traffic.*—That such tramway shall be used for the purpose of carrying passengers, goods, live stock, and timber.

*Necessary precautions for safety of passengers and public to be observed.*—That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of the passengers passing along the streets or roads upon the route of such tramway shall be taken and ordered by the said council of the said municipality.

*Stoppages.*—That for the convenience of the public stoppages shall be made for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers, goods, timber, or live stock at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

*Tolls and charges.*—That the charges to be made on the said tramway may be but shall not exceed the following, that is to say:—From the Railway Station yard in Kerang to the terminus of the tramway at Koondrook, for each passenger Two shillings and sixpence, and *vice versa*, over such route. For every ton of goods or timber carried over such tramway as above, Four shillings. That the charges for carrying live stock shall be the same as those fixed by and paid to the Victorian Railway Commissioners at the date of this Order.

That the land to be acquired for the purpose of constructing the said tramway shall not exceed fifty acres.

*Governor in Council sole judge of breach of Order.*—That the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order; and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an enquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided by clause 26 of the regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the said Act before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the regulations in the said schedule.

If upon the report to the Governor in Council by the referee made under the said clause 26 of the regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge determine that there has been any failure of or compliance with or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited or shall cease and determine or shall be suspended or shall be otherwise dealt with as the Governor in Council shall direct, and in case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If, in such adjudication, the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the council of the said municipality of the shire of Swan Hill shall forthwith (unless otherwise directed) proceed to restore the streets or roads along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway.

And the Honorable John Nimmo, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PUBLIC HEALTH.—SHIRE OF KYNETON.

BYE-LAW No. 2.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Kyneton, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, do hereby make the following bye-law, being bye-law No. 2 of the said local board of health, that is to say:—

1. So far as relates to the riding hereinafter mentioned the following sections of the bye-law of the said local board made and ordered on the twenty-second day of April 1886, and confirmed on the eleventh day of June in the said year, that is to say, eight to fifteen both inclusive and eighteen, are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the Kyneton Riding of the said shire, and which was formerly the Borough of Kyneton.

*Definitions.*

4. In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

“House” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

“Cesspool” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground; and “earth-closet” shall include a pan-closet of any description.

“Street” shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word “person” shall include a corporation.

5. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

6. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

7. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and provided with a closely-fitted cover of pattern to be approved by the inspector of nuisances.

8. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

9. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of eleven p.m. and five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, chloride of lime, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

10. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

11. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

12. A nightman, licensed by the municipal authorities, shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same.

13. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

14. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of eleven p.m. and five a.m., unless otherwise permitted by the local board (of which the proof shall lie on such person), or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed as soon as the same is emptied.

15. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

*Penalties.*

16. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Kyneton this seventh day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, section 4, the Local Board of Health for the City of Fitzroy being the Municipal Council thereof doth hereby make the bye-law following for regulating the carriage of meat through the streets of this city, that is to say:—

BY-LAW No. 60.

From and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation no person shall bring, or cause to be brought, into the city of Fitzroy, or carry, or cause to be carried, through the streets thereof in any cart or other vehicle any butchers' meat or carcases of meat unless such cart or other vehicle be so constructed as that the rays of the sun and the rain and dust are not allowed to fall on or be capable of reaching such meat or carcases of meat, and that proper sitting accommodation be provided for the driver thereof; and every person acting in contravention of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds or less than Five shillings.

*Power of disposition.*—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, exchange, transfer, or deal with the whole or any part or parts of the land when and as the trustees or the major part of them shall, with the approval of the Victoria and Tasmania Conference, as defined by the *Victorian Wesleyan Methodists Act 1887*, think most advantageous. The authorized representative of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Victoria for the time being duly appointed under that Act shall have power to fill up all vacancies occurring in the trusteeship, to appoint new or additional trustees, and to register these trusts in the register of trustees under the *Victorian Wesleyan Methodists Act 1887*. Subject to such powers as aforesaid, but not in derogation thereof, the land, or such part as shall be undisposed of as aforesaid, shall be held upon the trusts of "The Wesleyan Methodist Model Deed of Victoria 1887," enrolled in the office of the Registrar-General of Victoria under the provisions of the said last-mentioned Act.

*Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.*—To such Wesleyan Methodist Church purposes in the neighborhood as shall be approved by a majority of the trustees and the superintendent minister for the time being of the circuit.

**F**OR the regulation of riding and driving of horses in the waters and on the shore of the Hobson's Bay:—

1. No persons shall ride or drive into the waters of the Hobson's Bay within the boundary of South Melbourne or of the Melbourne Harbour Trust, except at such places as may be set out by the Council and the Harbour Trust, and no persons in charge of such horses shall enter the water in a nude state.

2. No person having charge of horses for bathing shall ride or drive the horses along the shore of the sea within the boundary of South Melbourne or of the Harbour Trust at other than a walking pace.

Every person guilty of any breach of the provisions of the foregoing by-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings.

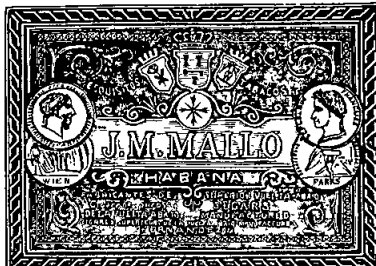

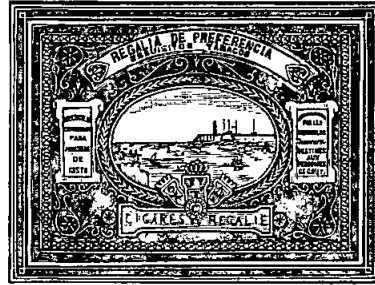

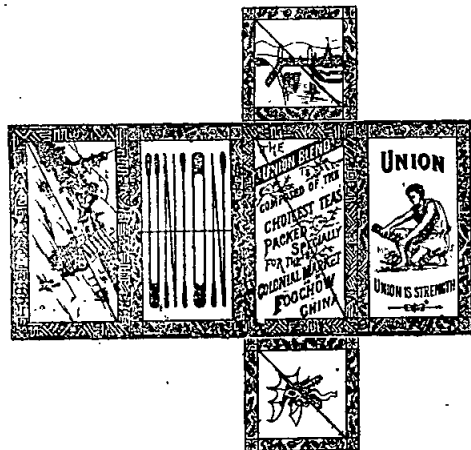

OF THE THIRTEENTH PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," stand prorogued until Tuesday the twenty-second day of May instant, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same, and to fix the time for holding the next Session thereof: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Tuesday the twenty-second day of May instant until Tuesday the nineteenth day of June next ensuing; and also I do hereby fix Tuesday the nineteenth day of June aforesaid as the time for the commencement and holding of the next Session of the said Council and Assembly, called the Parliament of Victoria, for the despatch of business, at Two o'clock in the afternoon, in the Parliament Houses, situate in Parliament place, Spring street, in the City of Melbourne: And the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and in the fifty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.
