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REGULATIONS OF THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Act, the sum of Five hundred pounds, a shire: And it was also enacted that every Order constituting any new municipality should constitute the same as either a borough or a shire, and should—1. Assign a name to such borough or shire. 2. Describe the boundaries thereof. 3. Determine of how many members the council should consist. 4. Determine whether the municipal district constituted should be subdivided or not; and every such Order constituting any new municipality having for its municipal district portion of a previously existing municipal district, should operate to sever such portion from such previously existing municipal district; and that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition, signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Shire of Wimmera, has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, praying that the area therein described might be severed from that shire and constituted a separate municipality under the designation of the "Shire of Arapiles": And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth by this present Order sever from the Shire of Wimmera the portion described therein, and forming the West Riding thereof, and doth direct that the portion so severed be constituted a separate municipality under the name or title of the "Shire of Arapiles," as hereinafter defined; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth re-define the boundaries of the Shire of Wimmera, as hereby reduced, in manner following, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF ARAPILES CONSTITUTED AND DEFINED.

Bounded by a line commencing at the most northern bend of the River Glenelg, county boundary of Lowan; thence south-westerly by said river to a point opposite the north-east angle of the parish of Daahil; thence by the north boundary of that parish to the east boundary of the parish of Toolondo; thence north by the east boundary of that parish and west by the north boundaries of said parish and the parish of Toolongbrook to the east boundary of the parish of Turandurey; thence north by the east and west by the north boundaries of said parish to the north-west angle thereof; thence north by the west and east by the north boundaries of the parish of Kalingur to the west boundary of the parish of Toan; thence north by part of the west boundary of the parish of Toan to its north-west angle; thence north-easterly by part of the boundary of St. Mary's Lake Run to the Wyn Wyn Run, and thence by the western and northern boundaries of Wyn Wyn Run to the Wimmera River; thence southerly by that river to its junction with McKenzie Creek; thence south-easterly by that creek to its source, and thence by a direct line westerly to the commencing point.

WIMMERA SHIRE REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the Wimmera River opposite the south-west angle of the parish of Dimboola; thence east by the boundary of that parish and the parish of Kewell West to the south-east angle of the latter parish; north by the east boundary of the parishes of Kewell West, Wallup, and Cannum to the north-west angle of the parish of Werrigar; thence east by the north boundary of that parish to the Yarrambiack Creek; thence southerly up that creek to the Wimmera River; thence continuing southerly up that river to a point east of the northern boundary of the parish of Ledcourt; thence west by that boundary to the north-west angle of allotment 23; thence south by a one-chain road to its intersection with the two-chain road at the south angle of allotment 191; thence south-westerly by said road to the north-west angle of allotment 212; thence south-easterly by the south-west boundary of the said parish of Ledcourt to a point bearing north-east magnetic from Briggs' Bluff, Grampian Range; thence in a direct line to said bluff, and south along the watershed of the Grampians to the head of the Glenelg River; thence north-westerly by that river to the most northerly point of same at the parish of Repcha; thence easterly by a direct line to the source of the McKenzie Creek; thence north-westerly by that creek to its junction with the Wimmera River; and thence westerly and northerly by that river to the commencing point, excluding the borough of Horsham.

Wherever the line so described runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be the boundary line.

And it is hereby determined that the Council of the said newly constituted Shire of Arapiles shall consist of nine members, and that it be not subdivided at present.

No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Seymour has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act, and no counter petition received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order abolish the present subdivisions of the Shire of Seymour and doth re-subdivide such shire into the four subdivisions or ridings, to be named the Avenel Riding, the Seymour Riding, the Kobyboyn Riding, and the Tallarook Riding, hereinafter described, that is to say:—

SEYMOUR RIDING.—Commencing at a point on the shire boundary where it is intersected by the Sugarloaf Creek; thence northerly by that creek to its junction with the Goulburn River; thence southerly by that river to a point on same opposite the south-west angle of allotment 6, section 2, parish of Tallarook; thence east to, and by the road forming the south boundary of that allotment and the east boundaries of allotments 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 of section 11; thence continuing northerly by that road to the north angle of allotment 32; thence south-east and easterly by the road on the north side of that allotment, and of allotments 53 and 54A to the south-east angle of the racecourse (allotment 14b); thence north by the east boundary of the racecourse and allotments 14A, 14, and 23 to the north-east angle of the allotment last named; thence south-westerly to the south-west angle of allotment 43c; thence north by the west boundary of that allotment to the north boundary thereof; thence east by the north boundary to the south-east angle of allotment 67, parish of Mangalore; thence north by the road forming the east boundary of said allotment 67 to the south boundary of the Avenel Riding in allotment 38, said parish; thence west by the said Avenel Riding to the Goulburn River; thence north by that river to its intersection with the northern boundary of the shire; thence following that boundary south-westerly and southerly to the point of commencement.

KOBYBOYN RIDING.—Commencing at a point on the Goulburn River at the south-west angle of allotment 6, section 2, parish of Tallarook; thence following the eastern boundary of the Seymour riding, as above described, to the south boundary of the Avenel riding; thence following that boundary east to a point due south of the south-east angle of Jones' pre-emptive section; thence north to and by the eastern boundary of the said pre-emptive section, to the southern boundary of the township of Avenel reserve; thence easterly by the southern boundary of said township reserve, to Hughes' Creek; thence up that creek to the eastern boundary of the shire; thence following the shire boundary southerly, westerly, and southerly, to the Goulburn River; thence by that river north-westerly to the commencing point.

The shire boundary above referred to is that described in the *Government Gazette* of the 25th January 1884.

Wherever the line so described as aforesaid runs beside or along a creek or road, whether such is specifically mentioned or not, the centre of such creek or road shall be taken to be the boundary-line.

The Avenel and Tallarook ridings remain unaltered.

No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Act, the sum of Five hundred pounds, a shire; and it was also enacted that the Governor in Council might make Orders, altering, for the purpose of adjusting the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts, being shires, without any notice; and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Shire of Narracan, praying that a certain area described in such petition, and comprising the south ridings, be severed from the said shire and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the Shire of Woorayl: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make Orders constituting a shire to be named the Shire of Woorayl, the proposed boundaries of which, as also those of the said Shire of Narracan, as reduced, are hereunder set forth and described: It is also further ordered that the said new Shire of Woorayl be subdivided into two ridings, to be named the east riding and the west riding, the several boundaries of which are also set forth and described hereunder, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF WOORAYL CONSTITUTED AND DEFINED.

Commencing at the north-west angle of the parish of Korumburra; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Korumburra, Koorooman, and part of Mardan to the most southern angle of allotment 85, parish of Allambie east; thence north-easterly by road forming the south-eastern boundaries of allotments 85, 86, and 87, all of the said parish; thence north-west by the road forming the north-eastern boundary of allotment 87 to the southern angle of allotment 88; thence north-easterly by the boundaries of allotments 88 and 90, and north-westerly by the eastern boundary of the said allotment 90 to the south-west angle of allotment 91; thence north-easterly by the south-eastern boundaries of allotments 91, 92, and part of 93 to the west angle of allotment 95; thence east by the south boundary of the last-named allotment to the west boundary of allotment 96 (all in the parish of Allambie east); thence south by the west boundary and east by the south boundary of the last-named allotment to the road forming the west boundary of allotments 30 and 31, parish of Narracan South; thence south by same road to the south-west angle of the allotment last named; thence east by the south boundary of said allotment and a line in continuation thereof to the west boundary of the village reserve; thence south by the west boundary of said reserve to its intersection by the Morwell and Mirboo railway line; thence easterly by said railway line to the intersection thereof by the west boundary of the shire of Traralgon, as defined in *Gazette* of the 20th January 1888; thence by a direct line southerly to the north-west corner of Matthew Rout's selection, in the parish of Mirboo; thence southerly by the west boundary of said selection and of allotments 5, 6, 7, 14, and 15 to the south-west angle of the last-named allotment; thence west by a road on the south boundary of allotment 30 and part of allotment 34 to the termination of said road at Lydiard's Track; thence southerly by Lydiard's Track to the Tarwan River; thence south-west by the Tarwan River to the south-west angle of J. Cook's selection; thence by a line bearing magnetic west to its junction with the boundary between the counties of Mornington and Buln Buln; thence northerly by said boundary to the commencing point.

EAST RIDING.

Commencing at the north-west angle of the parish of Mardan; thence easterly, southerly, and westerly by the shire boundary as above described to a point on the southern boundary of the shire where it would be intersected by the western boundary of the parish of Mardan if said boundary were continued due south, and thence north from said point by the western boundary of the parish of Mardan to the commencing point.

WEST RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the shire boundary at the north-east angle of the parish of Koorooman; thence southerly by the

east boundary of that parish and a line in continuation thereof to a point where it would intersect the southern boundary of the shire; thence westerly, northerly, and easterly by the shire boundary to the commencing point.

NARRACAN SHIRE REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at the intersection of the Moo River with the northern boundary of the Gippsland Railway reserve; thence south-westerly up the Moo River to the centre of the road forming the east boundary of allotment 28A, parish of Warragul; thence south by that road and the east boundaries of allotments 28A, 28B, 111, 11, 86, 94, and 120 to McDonald's Track; thence north-westerly by that track to the centre of the road forming the west boundary of allotment 24, parish of Allambee; thence south by that road, being the west boundary of allotments 24, 25, and 26, to the south boundary of the last-named allotment; thence west by the road forming the said boundary and of the selection of T. Clancy and a continuation thereof to the east boundary of allotment 17; thence south by that boundary and west by the south boundary of 17, 16, and 15 to the east boundary of allotment 14; thence south by that boundary, west by the south boundary, and north by the west boundary to the south-east angle of C. S. Affleck's selection; thence west by the south boundary thereof to McDonald's Track; thence south by that track to the south boundary of the parish of Allambee; thence easterly by the south boundary of that parish and part of the parish of Allambee, east to the southern angle of allotment 85 of the parish last named; thence north-easterly by the road forming the south-eastern boundary of allotments 85, 86, and 87 to the south-east angle of the last-named allotment; thence north-westerly by the road on the north-east boundary of said allotment to the south-west angle of allotment 88; thence north-easterly by the boundaries of allotments 88 and 90 and north-westerly by the eastern boundary of said allotment 90 to the south-west angle of allotment 91; thence north-easterly by the south-eastern boundaries of allotments 91, 92, and part of 93, to the west angle of allotment 95; thence east by the south boundary of the last allotment to the west boundary of allotment 90, south by the west and east by the south boundary of the last allotment to the road forming the west boundary of allotments 30 and 31, parish of Narracan South; south by said road to the south-west angle of the allotment last named; thence east by the south boundary of the said allotment and a line in continuation thereof to the west boundary of the Village Reserve; thence southerly by the west boundary of said reserve to its intersection with the Mirboo Railway line; thence easterly by that railway to its intersection with the Morwell River; thence northerly by that river to its junction with the River La Trobe and the boundary of the shire of Rosedale; thence westerly, northerly, and north-easterly by the boundary of that shire to the Tyers River; thence by that river to its source; thence by a direct line to the summit of Mount Baw Baw and the southern boundary of the county of Evelyn; thence westerly by the said county boundary to a point on same true north of the commencing point; and thence by a line true south to the commencing point aforesaid.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

And it is hereby determined that the Council of the said newly constituted Shire of Woorayl shall consist of six members.

And the Honorable John Nimmo, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the persons whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Moorabbin has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act, and no counter petition received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order abolish the present subdivisions of the Shire of Moorabbin, and doth re-subdivide the said shire into four separate Subdivisions or Ridings, the boundaries whereof shall be as follows, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON.

BYE-LAW No. 4.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Shepparton made under section 213 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered four (4) for the regulation of bathing and preserving public decency.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874" the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Shepparton order as follows:—

1. No person shall bathe in the river Goulburn, nor in any creek, lagoon, swamp, or water hole at or from any place within the boundaries of the township of Shepparton except such place as is or may be from time to time set apart for that purpose by the said corporation, and there only at the times hereinafter prescribed.

2. No person shall at any place within the said boundaries of the said township of Shepparton in the vicinity of the banks of the said river, or of any creek, lagoon, swamp, or waterhole, wholly or so far as to be indecent, divest himself or herself or be or remain divested of his or her clothing, whether for the purpose of bathing or otherwise, except at such place to be so set apart for bathing as aforesaid, and there only at the times to be so prescribed for bathing as aforesaid.

3. The piece of land hereinafter described is hereby set apart for bathing purposes that is to say:—

"Commencing at a point on the right bank of the Goulburn River bearing west about 27 chains 15 links from the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section L, bounded thence by lines bearing respectively east 1 chain 75 links, S. 21deg. E. 5 chains and west 2 chains 5 links to the aforesaid river, and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement."

4. No person shall bathe at or from the said place so set apart for bathing as aforesaid except between the hours of five o'clock p.m. and eight o'clock a.m.

SHIRE OF BANNOCKBURN.

BYE-LAW No. 5.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Bannockburn made under the 213th section of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 5, for the prevention of obstruction to streets and roads by wandering cattle, &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bannockburn, order as follows:—

That from and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation, Sections 41, 42, and 43, Subdivision 9, Part 1 of the 13th Schedule of the "Local Government Act 1874," are hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Bannockburn.

Obstructions, &c., to streets, &c., by cattle, &c.

41. If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the Council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody; and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing keeping and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

42. If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the council the amount of such penalty and costs if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known then the provisions of the last preceding section so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction shall apply.

43. If any goat shall have been impounded under the provisions of either of the two last preceding sections or under the provisions of this bye-law relating to the impounding of cattle for trespass in the streets, and shall not after the expiration of twenty-four hours be released, and the penalty, costs, fees, and charges be paid by the owner thereof, any justice may by warrant under his hand directed to any constable authorize the destruction of such goat, and the same may be destroyed accordingly.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Broadford, made under section 213, of "The Local Government Act, 1874," and numbered 1, for regulating the due management of the business of the Shire of Broadford and the conduct of their officers and servants, and adopting "The Police Offences Statute 1865," enumerated hereunder.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Broadford, order as follows:—

That Bye-law No. 1, hereinafter referred to, and Part 1 of "The Police Offences Statute 1865," be adopted in and for the whole of the Shire of Broadford.

1. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Council.

2. At every meeting of the Council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and upon their being confirmed, or amended and confirmed, as the case may be, the said minutes of the proceedings of the previous meeting shall be signed, as required by "The Local Government Act 1874."

3. After the signing of the minutes aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but, for the greater convenience of the council, at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (2.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (3.) Reading and ordering on reports of committees and officers.
- (4.) Payments.
- (5.) Orders of the day.
- (6.) Extraordinary business under new rules and regulations.
- (7.) Motions of which previous notice has been duly given.
- (8.) Notices of motion.
- (9.) Tenders.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

DIVISIONS.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result declared by the chairman; and, if requested by any councillor present at the meeting when such division takes place, the names of the councillors voting on the division shall be recorded on the minutes of the said meeting. And any councillor present not voting—not being disabled by law—shall be guilty of an offence.

ADDRESSES TO GOVERNOR.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the president and secretary of the shire, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

PETITIONS AND MEMORIALS.

6. No petitions shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day. And every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that its contents does not violate any law or provision hereof, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.

7. No debate shall take place upon any petition or memorial except as to its being received and taken into consideration as an order of the day, or at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

ORDERS OF THE DAY.

8. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council; any business which the president may think fit to bring under consideration; and any matter arising out of the correspondence, reports, memorials, read or presented during the same day, if by special motions ordered to be considered.

MOTIONS.

9. No councillor shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of a notice openly given at a previous meeting of the council and duly entered on the minutes.

10. Every member in giving a notice of motion shall read it aloud, and deliver to the secretary a copy of such notice, fairly written, together with his name and the day proposed for bringing on such motion.

11. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

12. No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

13. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

14. Any motion not seconded shall not be further debated, but shall lapse.

15. A question may be superseded by the adjournment of the council on the motion of a member.

16. The council may order a complicated question to be divided.

17. A question being once made and carried in the affirmative or negative cannot be questioned again in the same municipal year during which it has been so resolved unless a call of the council be made for that purpose.

18. No question or amendment which is the same in substance as any question which, during the same municipal year, has been resolved in the affirmative or negative, shall be a resolution of the council unless carried by two-thirds of the members present upon a call of the council.

19. It shall be competent for any councillor, by notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any subject at the next meeting or any subsequent meeting, and due notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each councillor, by post or otherwise, on the day for which this order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made, is set down for consideration, and any councillor not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question or any amendment thereof, shall be guilty of an offence, unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the council.

ORDER OF DEBATE.

20. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand up while addressing the council.

21. The president's ruling shall be final in all matters of order or practice.

22. Any councillor desirous of making a motion, or amendment, or taking part in a discussion, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down, until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

23. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

24. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

25. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

26. A councillor moving or seconding a motion or amendment shall not be held to have spoken thereon.

27. The councillors in meeting of council assembled shall designate each other by the official titles, namely, that of president or councillor as the case may require.

28. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

29. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

30. A councillor called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

31. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

32. The mover of every original proposition and amendment shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

33. One amendment only shall be discussed at a time, but, if lost, one other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment thereon.

34. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

35. When amendments have been made, the main question, as amended, shall be put.

36. When amendments have been proposed and negatived, the question is put as originally proposed.

37. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on the motions moved and seconded, or on any order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the council at the point at which it was so interrupted.

38. Any or each of the following acts, words, or omissions shall constitute and be an offence unless the offending member, upon being called to order, do make a satisfactory apology to the council, viz.:

Addressing the council in any other than a standing posture without permission of the chairman.

Interrupting another councillor while addressing the council, except upon a point of order.

Presenting to the council any application disrespectfully worded.

Refusing to cease speaking when interrupted by a call to order.

Disobeying the lawful orders of the chairman.

Interrupting the business of the council by asking questions as to what has been previously transacted.

Using offensive language, imputing improper motives, or making personal reflections on a member or officer.

Any member, after taking his seat, who wilfully absents himself without permission of the council.

39. Any person not being a councillor who having been admitted to any meeting of the council shall

Speak without permission of the council,

Interrupt the council or officers,

Verbally censure a councillor or officer,

Use offensive language, impute improper motives, make personal reflections on any councillor or officer, or be guilty of any improper or disorderly conduct,

Disobey the lawful orders of the chairman, shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and may be forthwith removed on the order of the chairman.

COMMITTEES.

40. Minutes of all proceedings of committee shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the chairman of committee, shall be presented to the council.

PROTESTS.

41. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall be given forthwith, on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council, by the protesting councillor, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given, previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful of the council.

APPOINTMENTS, ETC.

42. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the shire, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

43. The salary or allowance attached to the offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

44. The rate collector shall attend all council meetings and shall furnish written reports every month, giving full particulars of rates collected and outstanding.

45. Complaints against any officer will not be entertained unless set forth in writing, and such written complaints shall be referred, if considered necessary, to a special meeting.

MISCELLANEOUS.

46. No public works exceeding the value of £5 shall be ordered upon except in pursuance of notice duly given at a previous meeting. Except in cases of unforeseen and pressing emergency no public works shall be undertaken excepting those detailed in the estimate of expenditure prepared for the purpose of striking a rate.

47. No payment shall be made on account of any contract, nor shall any claim for payment thereon be entertained, unless on the written recommendation of the engineer.

48. No reduction shall be made in rates or valuations excepting on the recommendation of the valuer.

49. The secretary of the council shall have the custody of the common seal of the corporation, and shall be responsible for the same, and verify each impression by his signature, except in cases of power of attorney and other legal documents not relating to the corporation, signatures to which require to be verified before the president by declaration; and in any such case the said seal shall and may be affixed by the secretary to the president's certificate accompanying the same.

50. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this Bye-law may be suspended *pro tem.* in case of emergency, and with the consent of two-thirds of the councillors present at any meeting.

PENALTY.

51. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission, contrary to any provision contained in this Bye-law, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds, which penalty may be sued for by any councillor or officer in any court of competent jurisdiction.


