"Commencing at a point on the right bank of the Goulburn River bearing west about 27 chains 15 links from the northwest angle of allotment 1 of section L, bounded thence by lines bearing respectively east 1 chain 75 links, S. 21deg. E. 5 chains and west 2 chains 5 links to the aforesaid river, and thence by that river downwards to the point of commencement."

4. No person shall bathe at or from the said place so set apart for bathing as aforesaid except between the hours of five o'clock p.m. and eight o'clock a.m.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Rannockburn made under the 213th section of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 5, for the prevention of obstruction to streets and roads by wandering eattle, &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bannockburn, order as follows:—
That from and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation, Sections 41, 42, and 43, Subdivision 9, Part 1 of the 13th Schedule of the "Local Government Act 1874," are hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Bannockburn.

Obstructions, &c., to streets, &c., by cattle, &c.

11. If any cattle shall be found upon any land not being a common and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding twenty shillings for every head of such cattle and the proper officer of the Council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody; and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said and the the osts awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing keeping and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money shall not be sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and suns adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the council the amount of such penalty and costs if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known then the provisions of the last preceding sections of any an an ecessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction shall apply.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Broadford, made under section 213, of "The Local Government Act, 1574," and numbered 1, for regulating the due management of the business of the Shire of Broadford and the conduct of their officers and servants, and adopting "The Police Officeces Statute 1856," enumented hereunder.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Broadford, order as follows:—
That Bye-law No. 1, hereinbefore referred to, and Part 1 of "The Police Officees Statute 1855," be adopted in and for the whole of the Shire of Broadford.

1. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Council.

2. At every meeting of the Council the first business thereof

2. At every meeting of the Council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and upon their being confirmed, or amended and confirmed, as the case may be, the said minutes of the preceedings of the previous meeting shall be signed, as required by "The Local Government Act 1874."

3. After the signing of the minutes aforesaid, the order of

Local Government Act 1874."

3. After the signing of the minutes aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but, for the greater convenience of the council, at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

(1.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.

thereon.

(2.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
(3.) Reading and ordering on reports of committees and officers.
(4.) Payments.
(5.) Orders of the day.
(6.) Extraordinary business under new rules and regulations.
(7.) Motions of which previous notice has been duly given.
(8.) Notices of motion.
(9.) Tenders.
And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result declared by the chairman; and, if requested by any councillor present at the meeting when such division takes place, the names of the councillors voting on the division shall be recorded on the minutes of the said meeting. And any councillor present not voting—not being disabled by law—shall be guilty of an offence.

ADDRESSES TO GOVERNOR.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the president and secretary of the shire, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

PETITIONS AND MEMORIALS.

FETITIONS AND MEMORIALS.

6. No petitions shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day. And every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that its contents does not violate any byelaw or provision hereof, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.

7. No debate shall take place upon any petition or memorial except as to its being received and taken into consideration as an order of the day, or at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

ORDERS OF THE DAY.

8. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council; any business which the president may think fit to bring under consideration; and any matter arising out of the correspondence, reports, memorials, read or presented during the same day, if by special motions ordered to be considered.

9. No councillor shall make any motion initiating a subject for

9. No councillor shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of a notice openly given at a previous meeting of the council and duly entered on the minutes.

10. Every member in giving a notice of motion shall read aloud, and deliver to the secretary a copy of such notice, fairly written, together with his name and the day proposed for bringing on such motion.

11. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

shall be struck out.

12. No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

13. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the

paper. 14. Any motion not seconded shall not be further debated, but

paper.

14. 'Any motion not seconded shall not be further debated, but shall lapse.

15. A question may be superseded by the adjournment of the council on the motion of a member.

16. The council may order a complicated question to be divided.

17. A question being once made and carried in the affirmative or negative cannot be questioned again in the same municipal year during which it has been so resolved unless a call of the council be made for that purpose.

18. No question or amendment which is the same in substance as any question which, during the same municipal year, has been resolved in the affirmative or negative, shall be a resolution of the council unless carried by two-thirds of the members present upon a call of the council.

19. It shall be competent for any councillor, by notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any subject at the next meeting or any subsequent meeting, and due notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each councillor, by post or otherwise, of the day for which this order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made, is set down for consideration, and any councillor not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made, is set down for not in attendance at the voting upon such question or any amendment thereof, shall be guilty of an offence, unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the council.

20. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand up while addressing the council.

21. The president's ruling shall be final in all matters of order or practice.

22. Any councillor desirous of making a motion, or amend ment, or taking part in a discussion, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down, until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

23. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

24. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

25. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

26. A councillor moving or seconding a motion or amendment shall not be held to have spoken thereon.

27. The councillors in meeting of council assembled shall designate each other by the official titles, namely, that of president or councillors as the case may require.

28. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

29. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to roply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

30. A councillor called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

31. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under

discussion.

32. The mover of every original proposition and amendment shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

33. One amendment only shall be discussed at a time, but, if lost, one other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment thereon.

31. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an amendment, shall be taken into

31. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

35. When amendments have been made, the main question, as amended, shall be put.

36. When amendments have been proposed and negatived, the question is put as originally proposed.

37. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on the motions moved and seconded, or on any order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the council at the point at which it was so interrupted.

Interrupting the business of the council by asking questions as to what has been previously transacted.

Using offensive language, imputing improper motives, or making personal reflections on a member or officer.

Any member, after taking his seat, who wilfully absents himself without permission of the council.

39. Any person not being a councillor who having been admitted to any meeting of the council shall Speak without permission of the council, Interrupt the council or officers,
Verbally censure a councillor or officer,
Use offensive language, impute improper motives, make personal reflections on any councillor or officer, or be guilty of any improper or disorderly conduct,
Disobey the lawful orders of the chairman, shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and may be forthwith removed on the order of the chairman.

40. Minutes of all proceedings of committee shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the chairman of committee, shall be presented to the council.

PROTESTS

41. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall be given forthwith, on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council, by the protesting councillor, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given, previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful of the council.

APPOINTMENTS, ETO.

42. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the shire, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

43. The salary or allowance attached to the offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

44. The rate collector shall attend all council meetings and shall furnish written reports every month, giving full particulars of rates collected and outstanding.

45. Complaints against any officer will not be entertained unless set forth in writing, and such written complaints shall be referred, if considered necessary, to a special meeting.

MISCELLANEOUS.

46. No public works exceeding the value of £5 shall be ordered upon except in pursuance of notice duly given at a previous meeting. Except in cases of unforcesen and pressing emergency no public works shall be undertaken excepting those detailed in the estimate of expenditure prepared for the purpose of striking

47. No payment shall be made on account of any contract, nor shall any claim for payment thereon be entertained, unless on the written recommendation of the engineer.

48. No reduction shall be made in rates or valuations excepting on the recommendation of the valuer.

49. The secretary of the council shall have the custody of the common seal of the corporation, and shall be responsible for the same, and verify each impression by his signature, except in cases of power of attorney and other legal documents not relating to the corporation, signatures to which require to be verified before the president by declaration; and in any such case the said seal shall and may be affixed by the secretary to the president's certificate accompanying the same.

50. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this Bye-law may be suspended pro tem. in case of emergency, and with the consent of two-thirds of the councillors present at any meeting.

51. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or mis-feasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission, con-trary to any provision contained in this Bye-law, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, which penalty may be sued for by any councillor or officer in any court of competent jurisdiction.
