That of the total sum of Forty-two thousand two hundred and eighty pounds eighteen shillings and seven pence (£42,280 18s. 7d.), advanced to the said Loddon United Water Trust by way of loan, the said Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be liable for the sum of Nine thousand one hundred and fifteen pounds four shillings and one penny (£9,115 4s. 1d.), and that such last-mentioned sum shall be transferred

WHEREAS by section 20 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887* it is enacted that when the waterworks district of any Waterworks Trust has been or is about to be increased or diminished, the Governor in Council may make such order as appears just for the purpose (among other things) of apportioning any debts or liabilities between the various localities affected or to be affected by the increasing or diminishing of such waterworks district, and that every such order should be in all respects binding on the Waterworks Trusts, ratepayers, and on all other persons thereby affected: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the seventh day of June 1886, the waterworks district of a certain Waterworks Trust, known as the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, was diminished by the excision therefrom of certain lands that are now included in and form part of the waterworks district of a certain other Waterworks Trust, known as the Loddon United Water Trust: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, and for the purpose aforesaid, doth order as follows:—

1. That of the total sum of Forty-six thousand one hundred and fourteen pounds eight shillings and threepence (£46,114 8s. 3d.), advanced to the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust by way of loan, the said Loddon United Water Trust shall be liable for the sum of One thousand two hundred and seventy-four pounds thirteen shillings and one penny (£1,274 13s. 1d.), and that such last-mentioned sum shall be transferred from the liabilities of the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust and be added to and form part of the liabilities of the said Loddon United Water Trust.

2. That the said Loddon United Water Trust shall be liable for and shall pay a sum of One hundred and fourteen pounds fourteen shillings and fourpence (£114 14s. 4d.) as and for interest (at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum) due and owing on the first day of January 1888 by the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust upon the said sum of One thousand two hundred and seventy-four pounds thirteen shillings and one penny (£1,274 13s. 1d.).

3. That the said Loddon United Water Trust shall be liable for and shall pay such interest (at the rate aforesaid) as may have accrued since the said first day of January 1888 on the said sum of One thousand two hundred and seventy-four pounds thirteen shillings and one penny (£1,274 13s. 1d.), or may hereafter accrue thereon; and further—

4. That the said Loddon United Water Trust shall make due provision, as required by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, for a sinking fund for and in respect of the said sum of One thousand two hundred and seventy-four pounds thirteen shillings and one penny (£1,274 13s. 1d.), and shall also, whenever required by the Board of Land and Works so to do, execute and give such mortgage or deed of charge, or deed of further charge, as will secure the payment of interest (as hereinbefore provided) and the repayment of the said principal sum of One thousand two hundred and seventy-four pounds thirteen shillings and one penny (£1,274 13s. 1d.).

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by section 18 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time, after any Trust has by Order in Council been duly constituted, make additional orders relating to such Waterworks or Irrigation Trust not inconsistent with the provisions of the now in part recited Act, and that the Governor in Council may in such additional Orders in Council (among other things) increase or diminish the extent of the waterworks district of such Waterworks Trust: And whereas by section 20 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946, it is enacted that when the waterworks district of any Waterworks Trust has been or is about to be increased or diminished, the Governor in Council may make such Order as appears just for (among other things) determining what persons shall cease or continue to be Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust thereof, and for how long the same shall so continue, and for determining all other matters or things which it appears desirable or proper so to determine: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 3rd day of July 1882, a certain Waterworks Trust known as the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust was duly constituted, having authority as such Waterworks Trust within certain lands, the limits whereof were in and by the said Order in Council, and by subsequent Orders in Council, duly proclaimed and defined: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 3rd day of July 1882, a certain Waterworks Trust known as the Loddon United Water Trust was duly constituted, having authority as such Waterworks Trust within certain lands, the limits whereof were in and by the said Order in Council, and by subsequent Orders in Council, duly proclaimed and defined: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order as follow, that is to say:—

1. That the extent of the waterworks districts of the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust and the said Loddon United Water Trust shall be diminished by the excision therefrom of such portions of the irrigation and water supply district of the Twelve-mile Irrigation and Water Supply Trust (such said irrigation and water supply district being limited and defined by an Order in Council bearing date the 29th day of June 1887, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st day of July 1887, page 1952) as may be respectively within the said waterworks districts.

2. That notwithstanding the excision from the said waterworks districts of the portions of the irrigation and water supply district of the said Twelve-mile Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust shall continue to consist of the Municipal Council of the Shire of Swan Hill for the time being, and John William Stranger, and the said Loddon United Water Trust shall continue to consist of two members of each of the councils of the municipal districts of East Loddon and Gordon, and one member from each of the councils of the municipal districts of Korong, Marong, and Swan Hill, and of one other commissioner.

**MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—  
REGULATION.**

THE Governor in Council, under the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, has approved of the subjoined Regulation made by the Maryborough Waterworks Trust.

REGULATION No. 6.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, used either partly or wholly as a domicile, an amount of five per cent. per annum on the annual value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, not being a domicile, an amount of 3½ per cent. per annum on the annual value of such property. Provided that in any case the charge shall not be less than the sum of One pound.

4. For every water-trough One pound per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs shall be 8,000 gallons.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre.

For every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses.

In open sheds used for the above purposes each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.

6. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January 1888, and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1888, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first of January and on the first of July 1888. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time approve of for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover the said rate.

The births of 1,319 children, viz., 671 boys and 648 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of April. In the month of March 1,227 births were registered, or 92 less than in the month under review. The births were 468 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 247 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in April numbered 664, viz., 379 of males and 285 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 655, or 99 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in March by 83, but exceeded the average of April during the previous ten years by 135. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than that average by 2.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.37, and of deaths registered 1.69.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 88.9° on the 6th, and the lowest was 34.8° on the 24th. The mean temperature of the month (58.1°) was nearly a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (39.6°) took place on the 5th, viz., from a maximum of 86.2° to a minimum of 46.6°. The least range (9.2°) was on the 21st, viz., from a maximum of 61.2° to a minimum of 52.0°. The mean daily range was 22.7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.443 inches on the 21st, and the lowest was 29.614 inches on the 10th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.177 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 8 days, the amount of rainfall being 0.83 inch. The average rainfall in April during the previous ten years was 2.11 inches, or 1.28 inch more than in the month under notice. Fog occurred on five days during the month.

Males contributed 57 per cent., and females 43 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 38 per cent. to that mortality, as against 39 per cent. in April 1887, 41 per cent. in April 1886, 39 per cent. in April 1885, 40 per cent. in April 1884, 33 per cent. in April 1883, 41 per cent. in April 1882, 36 per cent. in April 1881, 40 per cent. in April 1880, 43 per cent. in April 1879, and 38 per cent. in April 1878.

The deaths of persons of the age of 75 years and upwards numbered 30, viz.—Those of an ironmoulder, aged 75, and a printer, aged 76, who died of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 76, and a splitter (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), aged 77, of pneumonia; a female, aged 77, and one aged 78, of heart disease; a female, aged 77, of nephritis; a female, aged 78, and one aged 81, of dysentery; a miller, aged 79, of compound fracture of the thigh; a female, aged 81, of hemiplegia; a tailor (an inmate of the Yarra Bend), aged 82, of disease of the brain; a cabinet-maker, aged 83, was found drowned; a female, aged 84, died of bronchitis; a surveyor, aged 84, and a female, aged 99, of paralysis; a laborer (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), aged 88, of injury to the hip; a female, aged 78, a miner and a female, each aged 80, a mason (an inmate of the Immigrants' Home), and a female, each aged 82, a boatman, aged 83, a gentleman, aged 85, a master mariner and a female, each aged 86, a tea-hawker, aged 87, a draper, aged 88; a female, aged 99, and a female, said to be 100 years old, of old age.

Thirty-one deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 23 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 7 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A bootmaker, aged 26, died of rupture of the bladder, caused by falling whilst in a fit; a laborer, aged 33, of injury to the hip; a plasterer, aged 27, of fracture of the skull, occasioned by a fall from a ladder; a gardener, aged 43, of internal injuries through falling from his dray; a boy, aged 9, and a tailor, aged 73,

of injuries from tramcars; two carters, aged 45 and 61 respectively, from wheels of drays passing over them; a fireman, aged 27, from a train passing over him; a boy, aged 9, died of fracture of the skull; a carter, aged 63, of peritonitis; and a miller, aged 79, of compound fracture of the thigh—all due to kicks from horses. An upholsterer, aged 21, died of a gun-shot wound; a male child, aged 2, of injury to the head and tetanus, consequent on falling on a stick; a female child, aged 1, and a female, aged 52, of burns—the clothes of the latter catching fire whilst she was engaged in cooking. A boy, aged 7, was drowned whilst bathing; a moulder, aged 20, two males, of occupation unknown, aged 66 and 70 respectively, and a cabinet-maker, aged 33, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a female infant, aged 4 months, was overlain; and a male infant, aged 1, died of umbilical hæmorrhage. The homicidal death was that of a female infant, which was smothered at birth. Of the suicidal deaths—a laborer, aged 25, shot himself in the chest with a revolver; a blacksmith, aged 50, cut his throat; a chemist, aged 38, poisoned himself with prussic acid; a female, aged 25, poisoned herself with the preparation called "Rough on rats"; and a widow, aged 56, with chlorodyne; a laborer, aged 30, and a fish-hawker, aged 45, drowned themselves in the River Yarra.

One hundred and forty-nine deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—61 in the Melbourne Hospital, 29 in the Alfred Hospital, 8 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 8 in the Children's Hospital, 2 in the Women's Hospital, 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, 1 in the Industrial Schools, 1 in the Blind Asylum, 1 in the Infants' Asylum, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 253, of which 136, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 117, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 175 were under one year of age, 43 were between one and two, 17 were between two and three, 10 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 411. Of these, 243, or 59 per cent., were males, and 168, or 41 per cent., were females; 21 were between five and ten, 12 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 24 were between twenty and twenty-five, 44 were between twenty-five and thirty, 29 were between thirty and thirty-five, 21 were between thirty-five and forty, 38 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 34 were between fifty and fifty-five, 33 were between fifty-five and sixty, 33 were between sixty and sixty-five, 33 were between sixty-five and seventy, 14 were between seventy and seventy-five, 10 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 20 were upwards of eighty.

In April, as compared with the previous month, under the head of specific febrile or zymotic diseases, there was a decrease in deaths from typhoid fever from 54 to 43, and in those from diarrheal diseases from 60 to 29. On the other hand, under the head of constitutional diseases, there was an increase in deaths from phthisis from 65 to 84. Three deaths of child-bearing women occurred during the month, as against 9 in March. On comparing these numbers with the births registered, it is found that one mother died to every 440 children born alive in April, and one to every 136 such children in March.

DISPOSITION OF CHURCH LAND ALLOWED.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Church of England in the Diocese of Melbourne, in Victoria, under the provisions of the Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the twenty-ninth day of May 1888, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

*Description of land.*—Firstly. One acre and thirty-two perches, county of Mornington, township of Frankston, being allotments 8 and 9 of section 7: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 7: bounded thence by that allotment bearing S. 19° 32' W. six chains; thence by Nolan street bearing S. 70° 28' E. two chains; thence by allotment 10 bearing N. 19° 32' E. six chains; and thence by High street bearing N. 70° 28' W. two chains to the point of commencement. Secondly. Three rods four perches and a half, situated in the said county and township: Commencing at a point bearing N. 63° 2' E. four chains sixty-one links, N. 40° 22' E. sixty-two links, and S. 34° 2' E. two chains twenty-one links from the westernmost angle of the public park and recreation reserve; bounded thence by the said reserve bearing S. 34° 2' E. three chains forty-eight links, N.

55° 58' E. one chain eighty-five links, and N. 30° 12' W. four chains forty links; and thence by a line bearing S. 32° 58' W. two chains thirty-three links to the point of commencement.

*Names of trustees.*—The Church of England Trusts Corporation for the Diocese of Melbourne.

*Power of disposition.*—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, or exchange all or any part of such land subject to the approval of the Bishop of Melbourne for the time being, or during the absence of the Bishop from the diocese or the vacancy of the see, to the approval of the person for the time being administering the affairs thereof. The land, until otherwise disposed of, to be used for the purposes for which it was granted or reserved by the Crown.

*Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.*—To be paid to the Bishop or administrator aforesaid, to be applied to such purposes of the Church of England in the Diocese of Melbourne as may by such Bishop or administrator, acting under the advice of the Council of the Diocese, be from time to time deemed desirable.
