THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1883-4, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by The Victorian Water Conservation Acts 1883-4, repeal the Regulations numbered 1 and 2 of the Regulations made by the said Waterworks Trust dated the twentieth day of January 1887, and approved by the (fovernor in Council on the eighth day of March 1887, and do hereby make the Regulations following in lien thereof:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district (that is to say):—

1. (1.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or

1. (1.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

- (2.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to five per cent. on the amount of the municipal valuation.
- (3.) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs shall be 16,000 gallons for any trough not exceeding twelve feet in length, and 8,000 gallons for every additional five feet or fractional part thereof.
- (4.) Every trough situated in a paddock shall be supplied (1.) Buy young student in a pandock shall be supprise through a meter affixed by the consumer according to the directions of the Trust, provided nevertheless that the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall not be less than that charged for troughs supplied under the preceding
- (5.) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 8,000 gallons for every inch of the diameter of the cylinder.
- for every hich of the diameter of the cylinder.

  (6.) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons; exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons; exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons; exceeding one-quarter of an acre but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre but not exceeding one-to-gallons; exceeding half-an-acre but not exceeding one-guarter of an acre but not exceeding one function of the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.





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
