#### INTERNATIONAL UNION FOR THE PROTECTION OF LITERARY AND ARTISTIC WORKS.

THE following Order in Council for bringing into effect from the 6th of December 1887 the Convention for the creation of an International Union for the protection to be given, by way of copyright, to the authors of literary and artistic works, which was signed at Berne on the 9th of September 1886, is published for general information.

At the Court at Windsor, the 23th day of November 1887.

Present :

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty.

Lord President,

Lord Stanley of Preston,

WHEREAS the Convention,\* of which an English translation is set out in the First Schedule to this Order, has been concluded between Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the foreign countries named in this Order, with respect to the protection to be given by way of copyright to the authors of literary and artistic works :

And whereas the ratifications of the said Convention were exchanged on the fifth day of September One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven between Her Majesty the Queen and the Governments of the foreign countries following, that is to say :—Belgium, France, Germany, Hayti, Italy, Spain, Switzerland, Tunis.

And whereas Her Majesty in Council is satisfied that the foreign countries named in this Order have made such provisions as it appears to Her Majesty expedient to require for the protection of authors of works first produced in Her Majesty's dominions :

Now therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority committed to Her by the International Copyright Acts 1844 to 1886 doth order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

1. The Convention, as set forth in the First Schedule to this Order, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, have full effect throughout Her Majesty's dominions, and all persons are enjoined to observe the same.

2. This Order shall extend to the foreign countries following, that is to say :—Belgium, France, Germany, Hayti, Italy, Spain, Switzerland, Tunis ; and the above countries are in this Order referred to as the foreign countries of the Copyright Union, and those foreign countries, together with Her Majesty's dominions, are in this Order referred to as the countries of the Copyright Union.

3. The author of a literary or artistic work which, on or after the commencement of this Order, is first produced in one of the foreign countries of the Copyright Union shall, subject as in this Order and in the International Copyright Acts 1844 to 1886 mentioned, have as respects that work throughout Her Majesty's dominions the same right of copyright, including any right capable of being conferred by an Order in Council under section two or section five of the *International Copyright Act 1844*, or under any other enactment, as if the work had been first produced in the United Kingdom, and shall have such right during the same period :

Provided that the author of a literary or artistic work shall not have any greater right or longer term of copyright therein than that which he enjoys in the country in which the work is first produced.

The author of any literary or artistic work first produced before the commencement of this Order shall have the rights and remedies to which he is entitled under section six of the *International Copyright Act 1886*.

4. The rights conferred by the International Copyright Acts 1844 to 1886 shall, in the case of a literary or artistic work first produced in one of the foreign countries of the Copyright Union by an author who is not a subject or citizen of any of the said foreign countries, be limited as follows, that is to say, the author shall not be entitled to take legal proceedings in Her Majesty's dominions for protecting any copyright in such work, but the publisher of such work shall, for the purpose of any legal proceedings in Her Majesty's dominions for protecting any copyright in such work, be deemed to be entitled to such copyright as if he were the author, but without prejudice to the rights of such author and publisher as between themselves.

5. A literary or artistic work first produced simultaneously in two or more countries of the Copyright Union shall be deemed for the purpose of copyright to have been first produced in that one of those countries in which the term of copyright in the work is shortest.

6. Section six of the *International Copyright Act 1886* shall not apply to any dramatic piece to which protection is extended by virtue of this Order.

7. The Orders mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked :

Provided that neither such revocation, nor anything else in this Order, shall prejudicially affect any right acquired or accrued before the commencement of this Order, by virtue of any Order hereby revoked, and any person entitled to such right shall continue entitled thereto, and to the remedies for the same, in like manner as if this Order had not been made.

8. This Order shall be construed as if it formed part of the *International Copyright Act 1886*.

9. This Order shall come into operation on the sixth day of December One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, which day is in this Order referred to as the commencement of this Order.

Made on the fifth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, between Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India; His Majesty the German Emperor, King of Prussia; His Majesty the King of the Belgians; Her Majesty the Queen Regent of Spain, in the name of His Catholic Majesty the King of Spain; the President of the French Republic; the President of the Republic of Haiti; His Majesty the King of Italy; the Federal Council of the Swiss Confederation; His Highness the Bey of Tunis.

**REGULATIONS OF THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.**

**I**N pursuance of the "Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1876," "The Melbourne Harbor Trust Act Amendment Act 1883," and "The Melbourne Harbor Trust Further Amendment Act 1883," the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulation, viz.:-

No person shall smoke in, under, or near to any shed, or loiter therein or upon any wharf, or lounge or sleep among the cargo placed in or upon any shed or wharf, or play at any game, or, without the written consent of the Commissioners, address any assemblage of persons in any shed or on any wharf or any approach thereto.

This Regulation shall be read and construed together with the Regulations of the Commissioners made on the 4th day of December 1884, the 31st day of July 1885, and the 22nd day of July 1886 respectively.

**RED SEA.**

**Position of Avocet Rock.**

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners No. 190 of 1887, on reported sunken rocks northward of Jebel Zukur Island:—

Telegraphic information has been received from Lieutenant and Commander T. F. Pullen, H.M. surveying vessel *Stork*, that he has found a small coral patch, with a least depth of 15 feet, situated in latitude 14° 22' 8" N., longitude 49° 41' 32" E.

This is undoubtedly the danger on which the steam vessels *Avocet* and *Teddington* struck during last year. It lies midway between the two best positions, which, from conflicting evidence, could be assigned to the respective vessels when they struck. The depths around the rock are 28 to 30 fathoms.

The *Stork's* search is the fourth that has been made by H.M. ships before this small danger has been re-discovered.

Vessels passing down the Red Sea should keep to the westward of this rock, and should remember that irregular lateral currents sometimes set across the sea; and if, when on the homeward voyage, they pass eastward of Abu Ail, care should be taken to steer to the westward after rounding that island, until Jebel Zukur summit bears about S.S.E. ½ E.

There is little doubt that the loss of the *Avocet* was due to one of the lateral currents above mentioned, as not only was the steam vessel *St. Oswald*, in company with the *Avocet*, also to the

eastward of the correct track, but other vessels passed on both sides of the two vessels while stopped to save the crew of the *Avocet*.

The bearing is magnetic. Variation 4° westerly in 1888.

**POSITION OF MINE-FIELD, WELLINGTON HARBOR.**

NOTICE is hereby given that all waters inside of a line drawn from the outer rock off Gordon Point, Wellington Harbor, in a S.S.E. direction, for a distance of 7 cables, and a line from thence to shore, in a W.S.W. direction, a distance of 3 cables, so marked by four black cask-buoys, are now used as a torpedo mine-field. All vessels are therefore cautioned against getting within the above-described limits.

## VICTORIAN MILITARY FORCES.—REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twelfth day of June 1888.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by the Discipline Act 1870 it was provided that the Governor in Council might make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order the following addition to and alteration in the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces made on the sixteenth day of June and twenty-third day of November 1885 respectively, that is to say:—

## REGULATIONS FOR THE 1ST CLASS MILITIA RESERVE.

1. The Reserve formed by Order in Council, dated 23rd November 1885, shall in future be designated the 2nd Class Militia Reserve.

2. The 1st Class Militia Reserve will consist (a) of all members of the Militia passed to the Reserve after completing three years' service in the ranks, and (b) of such men now serving in the Reserve, or who may now or hereafter be serving in the Militia, who have been effective in the Militia for a period of not less than one year, and elect to join it, provided that they are recommended by their Commanding Officer and approved by the Commandant. Every member of the 1st Class Militia Reserve shall receive a retaining fee of £3, due annually on the 1st July, provided that he has been classed as effective in the Reserve on the 30th June preceding.

3. A member of the 1st Class Militia Reserve, in order to be classed as effective, must attend four days at the annual training, or at nine half-day parades during the year, and must also undergo a special course of musketry or gunnery, to be prescribed by the Commandant, which shall not extend over a longer period than the duration of three half-day parades and three night drills.

4. Members of this Reserve who are classed as effective will receive from the fund provided by Parliament for the annual encampment an additional sum of £1 as bonus if they shall have attended the four days' annual (or Easter) training.

5. The special courses of musketry and gunnery may be dispensed with in the case of men joining the Reserve subsequent to 1st July, who have undergone the ordinary courses with their corps during the year.

6. No man transferred to the Reserve subsequently to the 30th April in any year shall be entitled to receive the retaining fee for such year.

7. A member of the 1st Class Reserve, who has been transferred to such Reserve between the 1st July and the 30th April, will be required to perform a proportionate number of the drills required for the whole year in order to be classed as effective; and shall receive a proportionate amount of the retaining fee, but he may, if he desires, perform the whole number of drills laid down, and receive the full amount.

8. The Commandant shall determine the requisite proportion of drills under this clause.

8. Any member of the Reserve failing to become effective shall be liable to be fined £1 and to be transferred to the 2nd Class Reserve, at the discretion of the Commandant.

9. Members of the 1st Class Militia Reserve shall be under the same obligation as members of Militia to notify change of address to their Commanding Officers.

10. Any member of the 1st Class Militia Reserve may, at his own request, and with the sanction of the Commandant, be replaced upon the active list of his corps to fill a vacancy on the establishment.

11. A member of the 1st Class Militia Reserve may obtain his discharge on the same conditions as members of the Militia.

12. Members who have served three years in the Militia may be permitted by the Commandant to serve the other two years in Militia instead of joining 1st Class Militia Reserve.

13. Members, on completion of five years in the Militia, or in the Militia and the 1st Class Militia Reserve, may be permitted by the Commandant (a) to re-engage for an equal period in the Militia and the 1st Class Militia Reserve, not exceeding in the aggregate five years nor less than two years; (b) or may re-engage for any period not less than two years in the 1st Class Militia Reserve, provided that their age at the termination of such period shall not exceed 45 years.

14. A member of the 1st Class Militia Reserve removing permanently from the district in which the head-quarters of his corps is situated may, if he desires it, and with the approval of the Commanding Officers concerned, be transferred by the Commandant to the 1st Class Militia Reserve of any corps in his new district, in order to enable him to attend drills and rifle shooting, provided there be vacancies in the 1st class Militia Reserve of such corps.

15. Members of the 1st Class Militia Reserve, while at rifle practice or on parade of any sort with their corps, shall be in every way subject to the provisions of the Discipline Act.

16. Members of the 1st Class Militia Reserve will be shown on a separate line on all returns of their corps, and a nominal roll, giving their addresses, shall be sent to Head Quarters on 1st July annually.

17. The number of men in the 1st Class Militia Reserve of any corps shall not exceed such a number as will raise it to its war establishment, without the special sanction of the Minister.

18. Every man joining the 1st Class Militia Reserve shall receive, or retain if already in possession of them, the arms, equipment, and clothing of his corps.

19. Free ammunition will be granted to the 1st Class Militia Reserve of each corps, provided it is fired with the corps.

20. Members of the 1st Class Militia Reserve will have the same facilities as members of rifle clubs for the purchase of rifles and ammunition.

21. Any member of the 1st Class Reserve who may be discharged, dismissed, or transferred to the 2nd Class Reserve, shall hand over to his Commanding Officer all Government and corps property in his possession.

22. At the commencement of each year, Commanding Officers will be credited for each effective member of the 1st Class Militia Reserve with the sum of 20s. per head as effective allowance.

23. The following paragraphs in the Regulations made by Order in Council, dated 23rd November 1885, are cancelled:—

3. All future recruits to be sworn in for five years, three of which to be in Militia and two in the Militia Reserve.

4. Members desirous of leaving the Militia may be permitted by the Commandant (in lieu of paying the fine) to serve the remainder of their time in the Militia Reserve, provided they have not less than six months' effective service, and are recommended by the Commanding Officer. Provided that no member shall have the right to claim transfer to the Reserve until he shall have completed three years' effective service.

5. Members who have left the Militia for a period not longer than one year may be permitted by the Commandant to re-enroll in the Militia Reserve for the balance of the five years, provided they had when they left the Militia not less than three months' effective service and are recommended by their Commanding Officer.

8. Any member of the Militia Reserve may, at his own request, and with the sanction of the Commandant, be replaced upon the active list of his corps to fill a vacancy on the establishment.

10. Members who have served three years in the Militia may be permitted by the Commandant to serve other two years in the Militia instead of joining the Militia Reserve.

The following addition is made in paragraph 2, Section 1, Part IV, of the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces:—

#### PART IV. (Victorian Militia.)

Paragraph 2.—After the first sentence—"Engagement shall be for a period not exceeding five years," add "of which the first three shall be in the Militia and the remaining two in the 1st Class Militia Reserve."

And the Honorable Sir James Lorimer, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by a Statute of the Parliament of Victoria No. 310, intitled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting the Public Health*, it was enacted that in case it should appear to the Governor in Council that burials in any cemetery, under any law relating to public cemeteries, or in any other burial-ground or place of burial whatsoever, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, the Governor in Council might, by an Order to be published in the *Government Gazette*, direct that after a time to be mentioned in such Order, not being less than three months from the date thereof, burials in such cemetery, or burial-ground, or place of burial should be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in the same, or in any subsequent Order, and might from time to time postpone the time mentioned in such Order for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise vary any such Order, whether the time appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived: And whereas it appears to the Governor in Council expedient that burials in the grounds in connection with the Lutheran Church at Doncaster should be discontinued: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that all burials in the grounds in connection with the Lutheran Church at Doncaster shall be wholly discontinued on and after the 1st day of October now next ensuing.

And the Honorable John Lamont Dow, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation, made by the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the provisions of *The Water Conservation Act 1837*.

#### REGULATION No. 7.

The Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1837*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1837*, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

#### General Conditions.

1. All service-pipes, with the necessary stop-cocks, shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

2. All delivery cocks to be of high pressure and of strong, hard brass, and in all exposed places to be open and shut by a movable key or handle.

3. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away from any drinking tap, trough, or public or private service pipe any water shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. The Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary; such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial on same is capable of registering One million gallons.

6. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for such breach.

7. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without at first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, under a penalty of Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, after notice, to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

8. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

9. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a license in that behalf to execute such works. And any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

10. Before any license shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such license at any time.

11. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust, in writing, being first obtained, or who

shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve-pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, unless the necessary repair shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier, if any, and if none, the owner, shall, in every instance in which damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence after notice, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

13. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps, to prevent overflow.

14. The water supplied in the urban district of the Trust shall be received and used under and in accordance with these regulations and *The Water Conservation Act 1887* and such parts of the *Public Works Statute 1865* as are incorporated herewith.

15. In the foregoing Regulations, wherever the words "officer" or "servant" appear, the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf.

16. In the construction of these Regulations the word "person" shall extend to and be deemed to include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean The Maryborough Waterworks Trust.

#### MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council, under the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, has approved of the subjoined Regulation made by the Maryborough Waterworks Trust.

#### REGULATION No. 6.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the following Regulation, viz.:

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, used either partly or wholly as a domicile, an amount of five per cent. per annum on the annual value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, not being a domicile, an amount of 3½ per cent. per annum on the annual value of such property. Provided that in any case the charge shall not be less than the sum of One pound.

4. For every water-trough One pound per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs shall be 8,000 gallons.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre.

For every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses.

In open sheds used for the above purposes each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.

6. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January 1888, and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1888, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first of January and on the first of July 1888. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Mary-

borough Waterworks Trust may from time to time approve of for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover the said rate.

NOTE.—During the first quarter of 1888 the excess of registered births over registered deaths was 3,635, viz., 1,470 males and 2,156 females; and the excess of recorded arrivals over recorded and unrecorded departures (the latter being estimated) was 7,554, viz., 5,467 males and 2,087 females. The total gain to the population was thus 11,189, viz., 6,946 males and 4,243 females, as shown in the table.

The total allowance for unrecorded departures since the census of 1881 was taken has been 37,545, viz., 29,967 males and 7,578 females. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of March would have been 1,084,853, viz., 586,957 males and 497,896 females.

An estimate based upon returns made annually by the municipal authorities of the populations of their respective districts, supplemented by an allowance for such portions of the colony as have not been brought under local self-government, gives the total population at the end of March as 1,043,769, or 3,539 less than the estimate given in the table.

The total excess of recorded arrivals over recorded departures during the quarter was 9,111, the greatest gain to the population being from New South Wales (4,335), the next from Tasmania (1,721), then from the United Kingdom (1,251), South Australia (1,070), and New Zealand (948). On the other hand, there was a loss of 214 by excess of departures for, over arrivals from, Foreign countries. All the arrivals and departures referred to are by sea.

## THE COUNTY COURT RULES, 1888.

## RULES RELATING TO ACTIONS BROUGHT UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF "THE EMPLOYERS' LIABILITY ACT 1886."

1. Save as herein is otherwise provided, the rules for the time being in force with respect to actions brought in the County Court shall, so far as applicable, apply to all actions brought under the provisions of this Act.

2. *Particulars of demand.*—In all actions brought under the provisions of this Act, the particulars of demand shall state in ordinary language the cause of the injury, and the date at which it was sustained, and the amount of compensation claimed, and where the action is brought by more than one plaintiff the amount of compensation claimed by each plaintiff, and where the injury of which the plaintiff complains shall have arisen by reason of the act or omission of any person in the service of the defendant the particulars shall give the name and description of such person.

3. *How assessors are to be applied for.*—A party who desires assessors to be appointed shall, seven clear days at least before the return day, file an application according to the form in the Schedule, stating the number of assessors he proposes to be appointed, and the names, addresses, and occupations of the persons who may have expressed their willingness in writing to act as assessors.

If the applicant has obtained the consent of the other party to the persons named being appointed, he shall file such consent with his application.

4. *Where application for assessors is made by one party only, it shall be forwarded to the other party.*—Where the application for the appointment of assessors has been made by only one party to an action, the Registrar shall forthwith forward a copy of the application so made to the other party, who may then within two days either file an application for assessors or file objections to one or more of the persons proposed.

5. *Where both parties propose assessors, no objection to be allowed to persons proposed.*—Where separate applications are filed by the parties no objection to the persons proposed shall be made by either party, but the Judge may appoint from the persons named in each application one or more assessors, provided that in such case the same number of assessors be appointed from the names given in each of such applications respectively.

6. *Application to be forwarded to the Judge.*—The application for the appointment of assessors, together with any objections made to the persons proposed, shall be forthwith forwarded by the Registrar to the Judge.

7. *If the Judge grant the application for assessors, he shall appoint such of the persons proposed as he shall think fit, or may substitute other persons.*—Where the Judge shall grant any application for the appointment of assessors, he shall appoint such of the persons proposed for assessors as he may think fit, subject to the provisions herein contained, or in his discretion may reject one or more of those named in any application, and may in lieu thereof select and appoint one or more persons to act as assessors.

8. *Where no application has been made, the Judge may appoint assessors.*—Where no application for assessors has been made, the Judge may, if he think fit, appoint any one or more persons to act as assessors in the action before or at the day of hearing.

9. *Where assessors shall fail to attend.*—If, at the time and place appointed for the trial, all or any of the assessors appointed shall not attend, the Judge may either proceed to try the action with the assistance of such of the assessors, if any, as shall attend, or he may adjourn the trial generally or upon any terms which he may think fit, or he may appoint any person who may be available, and who is willing to act, and who is not objected to, or, if objected to, is objected to on some insufficient ground; or the Judge may try the action without assessors if he shall think fit.

10. *Remuneration of assessors.*—Every person nominated as an assessor shall receive for each day's attendance in every action the sum of two pounds two shillings, together with such further sum, if any, for his expenses as the Judge may order.

11. *Deposit on application for assessors of amount of their remuneration.*—Every person requiring the Judge to be assisted by assessors shall, at the time of filing his application, deposit with the Registrar the sum of two pounds two shillings for each assessor proposed, and such payments shall be considered as costs in the action unless otherwise ordered by the Judge. Provided that where a person proposed as an assessor shall have in writing informed the Registrar that he does not require his remuneration, no deposit in respect of such person shall be required.

12. *Remuneration of assessors not proposed by the parties but by the Judge.*—Where an action shall be tried by the Judge with the assistance of any assessors in addition to or independently of any assessors proposed by the parties the remuneration of such assessors shall be borne by the parties, or such of them as the Judge shall direct.

13. *Where action not tried, an allowance to be made to assessors by order of the Judge.*—If, after assessors have been appointed, the action shall not be tried, the Judge shall have power to make an allowance to the assessors for any expense or trouble they may have incurred by reason of their appointment, and direct the payment to be made out of the sum deposited for their remuneration. This rule shall apply whether there be one or more assessors appointed.

14. *Duties of assessors.*—The assessors shall sit in Court with the Judge and assist him when required with their opinion and special knowledge, for the purpose of ascertaining the amount of compensation, if any, which the plaintiff is entitled to recover.

## CONSOLIDATION OF ACTIONS OR STAY OF PROCEEDINGS.

15. *Consolidation of actions.*—Where several actions shall be brought under this Act against a defendant in the same Court in respect of the same negligence, act, or omission, the defendant shall be at liberty to apply to the Judge that the said actions shall be consolidated.

16. Where several actions shall be brought by the same plaintiff against the same defendant in the same Court for or in respect of different causes of action under this Act, the defendant shall be at liberty to apply to the Judge that the said actions be consolidated.

17. *Stay of proceedings.*—In case several actions shall be brought under this Act against a defendant in the same Court in respect of the same negligence, act, or omission, the defendant may, on filing an undertaking to be bound so far as his liability for such negligence, act, or omission is concerned by the decision in such one of the said actions as may be selected by the Judge, apply to the Judge for an order to stay proceedings in the actions other than in the one so selected, until judgment is given in such selected action.

18. *Application for consolidation or for stay of proceedings.*—Applications for consolidation of actions or for stay of proceedings shall be made upon notice to the plaintiffs affected thereby.

19. *Judge may impose terms.*—Upon the hearing of any application for consolidation of actions or for stay of proceedings, the Judge shall have power to impose such terms and conditions and make such order in the matter as may be just.

20. *When judgment entered in selected action.*—In case a judgment in the selected action shall be entered against the defendant, the plaintiffs in the action stayed shall be at liberty to proceed for the purpose of ascertaining and recovering their damages and costs.

21. *Judgment where there are several plaintiffs.*—Where two or more persons are joined as plaintiffs at the commencement of an action, or by any order of consolidation, and the negligence, act, or omission which is the cause of action shall be proved, the judgment shall be for all the plaintiffs, but the amount of the sum so awarded for damages and the costs ordered to be paid to each such plaintiff shall be found and set forth in the judgment, and the amount of costs awarded in the action shall be ordered to be paid to such person and in such manner as the Court may think fit.

22. *If defendant fail to pay.*—Should the defendant fail to pay the several amounts of compensation and the costs awarded in the action, execution may issue as in an ordinary action, and should the proceeds of the execution be insufficient after deducting all costs to pay the whole of the amounts awarded, a dividend shall be paid to each plaintiff calculated upon the proportion of the amount which shall have been awarded to the respective plaintiffs to the total amount realized after the deduction of all costs of the action as aforesaid.

#### CUTTING, DIGGING, OR REMOVING TIMBER FROM CERTAIN CROWN LANDS PROHIBITED.

##### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything therein, before contained, the Governor might by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such Proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part VIII. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live timber which, at a height of two feet from the surface of the ground, is less than twelve inches in diameter, on or from the Crown lands in the parishes of Bagshot, Huntly, Lockwood, Marong, Nerring, and Shelbourne, county of Bendigo.

##### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* (No. 812, sec. 73) it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might from time to time, by a notice in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim as a street, or road, or as a township any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such township, or within any city, town, or borough proclaimed before the passing of the said Act should be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road should have been proclaimed should be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim as roads the portions of Crown lands hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

ROADS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF BAIRNSDALE AND PARISHES OF BAIRNSDALE, BROADLANDS, MOORMURNG, AND WY-YUNG.

No. 812, sec. 16) it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might subdivide any county into parishes and townships, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* might define the boundaries of such parishes or townships, and might distinguish each by a name; after such Proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions should thenceforward be recognised as a parish or township by the name so given as aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the boundaries of the township hereinafter described, and do distinguish the same by the name prefixed thereto, that is to say:—

TOWNSHIP OF GRIFFITH'S POINT.—County of Mornington, parish of Woolamai: Commencing at a point on the shore of Western Port Bay where the west boundary of allotment 1 abuts thereon; bounded thence by that allotment, a line, and allotment 9 bearing south to the shore of Bass' Strait; and thence by that shore and the shore of Western Port Bay aforesaid westerly, north-westerly, and easterly to the point of commencement.—(W.189p) (88.P.26389).

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE KANIVA COMMON.  
IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 1st May 1888, the Managers of the Kaniva Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year:—For every horse or mare, 12s. per annum; for every head of other large cattle, 8s. per annum; for every head of small cattle, 2s. 8d. per annum. Progeny under six months old, of stock legally depasturing on the common, free.

3. No bull or entire horse over the age of nine (9) months shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the permission in writing of the managers, who may refuse to allow thereon any beast or animal which, in their opinion, would be dangerous to stock on the common.

4. The herdsman shall, with the assistance of the owners, muster, during the last week of every quarter, all stock on the common; and shall, during the same week, take delivery of stock that may be placed on the common. And the managers shall, on payment of the prescribed fees on stock, of which the owners shall have furnished in writing the number and description, give a receipt for the same. And the herdsman shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owners or persons in charge, brand such stock in a conspicuous place with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar or a mixture of both.

5. All stock on which the prescribed fees shall not be paid within ten (10) days after the beginning of each quarter shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall be liable to be impounded.

6. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

7. No stock registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common, unless notice of intention so to do be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock removed.

8. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of, or injury to, stock depasturing on the common, save as provided in clause nine (9).

9. The herdsman shall, on any stock straying from the common, or on being removed therefrom without the consent of the owners, notify them within three (3) days thereof; and if the herdsman fail or neglect to give the owners notice in writing within the time specified, the former shall, should the stock be lost, be held responsible for the loss, which shall not exceed Five pounds (£5) for every horse, and Three pounds (£3) for every head of other large cattle.

10. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common; and as soon as the herdsman shall discover that any stock legally depasturing thereon is infected with any such disease, he shall forthwith give notice thereof in writing to the owner or owners of such stock and to the managers of the common, and shall at once take steps to remove such stock therefrom, and shall not be responsible for any loss the owner or owners thereof may suffer.

11. Sheep shall be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.

12. The herdsman shall assist the owners of stock legally depasturing on the common to separate any that they may require to remove.

13. All carcasses found on the common, which the owner or owners thereof may refuse or neglect to remove after receiving twenty-four (24) hours' notice in writing from the managers or the herdsman, may be removed or destroyed by burning or otherwise at the expense of such owner or owners.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty (20) pounds for each offence.

## LABOUR REPORTS.

SUPPLIED by the municipal authorities to the Government Statist in March, April, and May, 1888:—

TOWN DISTRICTS.<sup>1</sup>

Ballarat.—Steady work people generally well employed; prospective improved demand not immediately apparent.

Browns and Scarsdale.—There is no demand for labour of any kind within the borough.

Collingwood.—The demand for cooks, laundresses, housemaids, nursemaids, and general servants and girls is very great, and numbers could find employment.

Creswick.—Business continues very dull, and no demand for any kind of labour.

Geelong.—In my opinion the supply is quite equal to the demand for labour of every kind. There is no doubt there are periods of greater demand, but it is not continuous. The principal effect is to cause a temporary rise, which soon rights itself again.

Heathcote.—Railway works have given employment for some months, but are approaching completion, and supply likely to be greater than demand.

Horsham.—No demand in this borough.

Newtown and Chilwell Borough.—There is no special remark to make with regard to labour of any description, with the exception of domestic servants, for which there is always an unsupplied demand.

Port Melbourne.—There is always a demand for labour, both skilled and unskilled, but it is fluctuating and not easy to formulate.

Raywood (Borough of).—Great scarcity of labour at harvest time.

Rutherglen.—No demand for extra labour at present.

St. Kilda.—Domestic servants are difficult to obtain almost at any price. All persons in the building trade are fully employed at present, and are likely to be so for some time to come.

Smythesdale.—No demand for labour.

Talbot.—No demand for labour.

Warrnambool.—Good female servants much wanted.

COUNTRY DISTRICTS.<sup>2</sup>

Avoca.—Labour fully supplied.

Ballan.—Supply equal to demand.

Bannockburn.—There is no present demand for labour in the shire.

Barrabool.—No demand for any kind of labour at present.

Barwon (South).—No demand for any kind of labour at present.

Beechworth.—There is always a demand for general servants and girls; gardeners also generally obtain employment.

Boroondara.—Melbourne prices rule here.

Bright.—No demand for labour.

Bulla.—The shire of Bulla being one of the oldest settled districts, the demand for labour does not vary from year to year; the only demand is for a few farm labourers at harvest time.

Buln Buln.—There is a good demand for good workmen (labourers) all over the shire.

Buninyong.—Supply of male labour equal to demand; good general servants could readily obtain situations.

Bulleen.—This district is fully supplied with labour at present; there is likely to be more required next spring.

Bungaree.—Good general demand for farming men, if steady and competent; also domestic servants, general servants, and girls.

Corio.—There is no great demand for labourers generally; the pastoral holders employ but few hands; the properties being all fenced. At shearing time, a few shearers and washers are engaged for a short time. The agricultural farms are small, and the work is mostly carried on by the members of the family. A few extra labourers are employed in harvest season; no likelihood of increased demand—rather the contrary, from low prices of agricultural produce.

Cranbourne.—The demand for all kinds of labour is limited.

Dandenong.—The district is fairly supplied with all kinds, except farm labourers and general female servants.

Darebin.—There is no demand for labour in the district.

Euroa.—There is very little chance of employment for new arrivals, as the number of families growing fully supply the demand for labour of all kinds.

Flinders and Kangerong.—Labour hands are very scarce in this shire; the few that were in are drawn away to railway works. I am quite sure that from 30 to 40 would find constant and remunerative employment in the shire. This is the only class of workmen recommended to come.

Glenelg.—The land in this shire is almost wholly devoted to pastoral purposes, and is consequently very sparsely populated. The demand for labour, skilled or unskilled, is very limited. I am not aware of any demand for labour at this time in any part of the shire.

Glenlyon.—There is no demand within this shire except for farm labourers and miners, and very few extra hands are required; nearly all the work on the farms is carried out by the families occupying the land. The only period of the year when a few hands are required is at harvest time.

Gordon.—There is a limited demand for farm labourers, and the demand is likely to increase as the irrigation works now in progress are brought into operation.

Grenville.—There is no demand for extra labour in this district at present.

Hampden.—This is a slack season for work of all kinds, and cannot say there is any demand such as to induce people coming to the district for work.

Korong.—There is employment for good farm labourers and female servants; but the low price of produce prevents the farmer from increasing the area under cultivation, and the demand for labour is therefore limited.

Leigh.—General labour is fully supplied in the district; masons are few, one or two good men would probably find employment enough; good female servants of all kinds are almost impossible to get, as most girls are fully employed in their parents' home till they marry.

Loddon.—Probably during next season hand-shearing of sheep will, in a great measure, be superseded by the sheep-shearing machines, which are rapidly attaining to perfection.

Lowan.—Fair demand for farm labourers.

Malvern.—Supply of labour equal to demand.

Marong.—Probably during next season hand-shearing of sheep will, in a great measure, be superseded by the sheep-shearing machines, which are rapidly attaining to perfection.

Meredith.—The supply of labour is fully equal to demand.

Minhamite.—Fairly supplied with all kinds of labour and artisans at present.

Moorabbin.—Labour in plenty, but this place being so near Melbourne there is no difficulty in obtaining labourers at very short notice.

Mortlake.—The only demand is for servant girls from eighteen to twenty years of age.

Newham.—Good general servants (female) in demand; we have plenty of male labour.

Newstead.—General farm labourers required; good men could easily obtain constant work.

Numurkah.—There is a demand in this district for good farm labourers, which I believe will be continuous for some time. I could not estimate what number of workers would be required to satisfy this demand.

Oakleigh.—Cannot recommend anyone to come and seek employment, except three or four general servant girls, supply being equal to demand.

Oxley.—Labourers generally during the past year have been equal to the demand. There are but few skilled workmen employed throughout the shire; general female servants able and willing to milk are in demand. There are times when labourers are scarce, but, generally speaking, the district can supply what are required.

Phillip Island.—There is an unlimited demand for all classes of labour, and this demand is increasing daily, for the district is prosperous, and population rapidly increasing.

Preston.—Work of all kinds plentiful. You have to beg and pray, and pay too.

Pyslong.—Very little employment for farm labourers, the land being principally adapted to grazing only; the farmers who own rich patches do not cultivate, being far from market, having, as yet, no railway communication; they say it would not pay. Ring-barking, grubbing, and knocking-out scrub—a dozen men may find employment. A good man seeking work in this neighbourhood is rare to see.

Rodney.—There is no demand for labourers at present, as the busy grain season is partly over, and farmers are supplied with ploughmen and farm labourers.

Romsey.—Forty or fifty first English farm labourers could find constant employment at highest rates mentioned. Demand not likely to increase beyond this for a few years. Really good farm labourers are not procurable in the shire at the present time, nor have they been for a few years past.

Rosedale.—The ratepayers of the shire of Rosedale are chiefly graziers and small farmers, or selectors; the latter employing little outside labour. There are no large towns within the shire, and therefore little demand for mechanics, or, in fact, for any other kind of labour.

**Shepparton.**—All domestic labour greatly in demand; 15s. a week and no milking repeatedly offered to a good general servant. Superior farm labour wanted. Steady reliable men obtain constant work and well treated.

**St. Arnaud.**—There is always a demand for farm labourers during harvest time, but not during the whole year. The demand is increasing, although machinery is greatly employed to do away with the want.

**Strathfieldsaye.**—There is no outlet in this shire for skilled labour, the little that is required is procured from the adjoining town of Sandhurst, all kinds of farm labour are dear and hard to procure, particularly female servants, the whole supply drifting to the town, notably to Melbourne, where the hours of labour are shorter, and holidays more numerous and better observed. Rent is entirely unknown, firewood easily procured, and all industries well rewarded.

**Swan Hill.**—Labourers generally scarce.

**Tambo.**—An extensive field for agricultural and other labour would be opened up by railway extension to Omco, Snowy River, and Gelantipy.

**Towong.**—There is very little demand for skilled labour, the rates quoted are generally paid when required. No special demand exists for any particular class of labour, as the land is principally devoted to stock-raising. Very little agriculture is carried on, and the owners find their own labour when required. The mining industry does not employ many miners; the majority are working for themselves in co-operative parties.

**Walhalla.**—The rising generation of Walhalla promise fairly an increased demand for labour for some time to come; the occupation is principally mining.

**Wannon.**—The supply of labour is equal to the demand, excepting female domestic servants; there is a steady demand for them. This district is agricultural.

**Wimmera.**—Labour market fairly supplied.

**Whittlesea.**—There is no demand for any labour in the district.

**Winchelsea.**—Large demand for good domestic servants, general, and housemaids.

**Wodonga.**—There is no demand for labour of any description.

**Yea.**—Females of all kinds very scarce; also farm labourers.

Under 31 Victoria No. 310, section 9, cemetery fees are not payable in the cases of paupers buried upon an order signed by a Justice, and in such cases the contractor's account for the burial will be correspondingly reduced.

2. The funerals are to be of the most economical description consistent with propriety. A plain hearse for an adult, and a covered, plain, suitable four-wheeled vehicle for a child under seven years of age, to be provided. The body shall be taken direct to the cemetery, and no more than one body shall be carried in the hearse at a time.

3. Coffins to be sufficiently long, deep, and wide for the corpse to lie extended at full length, and to be fastened down with screws. The contractor shall provide two inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

4. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Cemetery Regulations.

The contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed, and that he received the fee for so doing; the receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

8. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

9. In the event of any charge of impropriety or neglect in conducting the funerals being established against the contractor, the Government may for the first offence deduct from the security money, by way of fine, £5; and for the second offence a similar amount, and, in addition thereto, may forthwith cancel the contract.

10. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited.

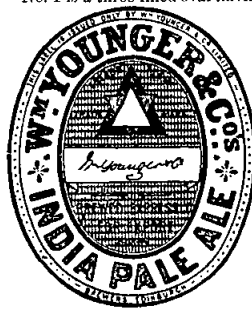

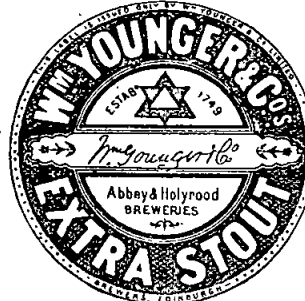
