AUSTRALIA—NORTH-WEST COAST.
Reef reported Westward of Cartier Islet.

Information has been received through the Board of Trade that the master of the barque *Millicent* reports the existence of a reef, which dries at low water, and on which that vessel was

wrecked on 5th January 1888, situated in lat. 12° 35' S., long. 123° 16' E.

Note.—The above position is extremely doubtful, but as the whole of the vicinity is very imperfectly surveyed, and it is possible that many more reefs may exist than those laid down, mariners are warned accordingly.

ACCORDING to Notice to Mariners No. 24, H. O. Adm., London, 1888, and with reference to notice No. 273 of the year 1887, on the exhibition of a flashing light from Horsburgh Lighthouse, Pedra Branca, the following additional information relative to the light has been received:—

The light is a flashing white light, showing one flash every ten seconds; it is elevated 101 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 16 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric and of the first order. The lighthouse, painted black and white in equal alternate bands, is 112 feet high.

PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

Regulations in connection with the Grant of Nine thousand five hundred pounds (£9,500) for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

1. That a sum of Nine pounds sixteen shillings and eight pence (£9 16s. 8d.) be paid to the Committee of Management of Riddell's Creek Public Gardens, for expenditure prior to the year 1887.
2. That a sum of Fifty pounds (£50) be paid to the Committee of Management of the Ocean Park, Sorrento, to be expended in improvements.
3. That a sum of Sixty-two pounds ten shillings and nine pence (£62 10s. 9d.) be paid to the Committee of Management of St. Arnaud Public Park (Friendly Societies), for expenditure prior to the year 1887.
4. That a sum of Seventy-five pounds (£75) be paid to the Committee of Management of the Elnore Public Park, for expenditure prior to the year 1887.

5. That a sum of Twenty pounds (£20) be paid to the Committee of Management of the Buninyong Public Gardens, for formation and maintenance of a lawn.

6. That a sum of Five shillings (5s.) be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote under Clause 1 of Regulations of 20th December 1887, gazetted 23rd December 1887, for every One pound expended from local contributions on works specified in the said Regulations.

IN accordance with the provisions of and in exercise of the powers conferred by *The Irrigation Act 1886* and *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order as follows, that is to say:—

1. That of the total sum of Forty-three thousand and thirty-nine pounds six shillings and twopence (£43,039 16s. 2d.) advanced to date, by way of loan, to the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be liable for the sum of Seven hundred and thirty-three pounds seventeen shillings and sixpence (£733 17s. 6d.), and that such last-mentioned sum shall be transferred from the liabilities of the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust and be added to and form a part of the liabilities of the said Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.

2. That the said Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be liable for and shall pay a sum of Fifty pounds nine shillings and seven pence (£50 9s. 7d.), as and for interest (at the rate of four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum) due and owing on the first day of January 1888 by the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust upon the said sum of Seven hundred and thirty-three pounds seventeen shillings and sixpence (£733 17s. 6d.).

3. That the said Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be liable for and shall pay such interest (at the rate aforesaid) as may have accrued since the said first day of January 1888 on the said sum of Seven hundred and thirty-three pounds seventeen shillings and sixpence (£733 17s. 6d.), or may hereafter accrue thereon; and further—

4. That the said Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall make due provision, as required by *The Irrigation Act 1886*, for a sinking fund for and in respect of the said sum of Seven hundred and thirty-three pounds seventeen shillings and sixpence (£733 17s. 6d.), and shall also, whenever required by the Board of Land and Works so to do, execute and give to the said Board of Land and Works such mortgage or deed of charge as will secure the payment of interest as hereinbefore provided for the repayment of the said principal sum of Seven hundred and thirty-three pounds seventeen shillings and sixpence (£733 17s. 6d.).

And the Honorable John Lamont Dow, for Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation, made by the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the provisions of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*.

REGULATION No. 7.

The Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the following Regulation, viz. :—

General Conditions.

1. All service-pipes, with the necessary stop-cocks, shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

2. All delivery cocks to be of high pressure and of strong, hard brass, and in all exposed places to be open and shut by a movable key or handle.

3. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away from any drinking tap, trough, or public or private service pipe any water shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. The Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary; such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial on same is capable of registering One million gallons.

6. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for such breach.

7. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without at first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, under a penalty of Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, after notice, to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

8. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

9. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a license in that behalf to execute such works. And any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

10. Before any license shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such license at any time.

11. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust, in writing, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve-pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, unless the necessary repair shall have been effected. The service pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier, if any, and if none, the owner, shall, in every instance in which damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence after notice, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

13. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps, to prevent overflow.

14. The water supplied in the urban district of the Trust shall be received and used under and in accordance with these regulations and *The Water Conservation Act 1887* and such parts of the *Public Works Statute 1865* as are incorporated herewith.

15. In the foregoing Regulations, wherever the words "officer" or "servant" appear, the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf.

16. In the construction of these Regulations the word "person" shall extend to and be deemed to include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean The Maryborough Waterworks Trust.

REGULATION No. 21.

A REGULATION of the City of Prahran for regulating and prescribing the route to be observed by carriages, carts, and vehicles, and by persons, for keeping order in the carriage and foot ways of the said city, and for preventing any obstruction thereof, made under and by virtue of the provisions of section 2 of the "Act to Amend the Police Offences Statute 1865," numbered 630.

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities to them given by the second section of Act numbered 630, being "An Act to Amend the Police Offences Statute 1865." The council of the city of Prahran, being the local authority in the said Act mentioned, do hereby order and direct as follows:—

That is to say:—

1. No person shall carry or convey any timber, metal, or building material, or any article or thing of any kind soever exceeding 25 feet in length, at any time upon, along, or across any carriage-way or footpath within the said city of Prahran upon any vehicle having less than 4 wheels.

2. No person shall carry or convey any building material or any article or thing of any kind whatsoever of a greater length than 14 feet on two wheels or than 25 feet on four wheels in, through, or along Chapel street or Toorak road (within the said city) at any time between the hours of nine o'clock in the morning and five o'clock in the evening of any day except by license of the said council under the hand of the Town Clerk or of the City Surveyor.

3. No person shall convey along or upon any street in the said city any article or thing of any kind soever which shall project outside the line of the wheels or of the sides of the vehicle carrying the same more than two feet.

4. No person shall carry along any footway in the said city any implement or any article of timber or metal in passing by or in front of any other person in such a manner or degree, or so in anywise, as to cause any obstruction of or any disorder in such footway.

5. The driver of every cart, waggon, or other vehicle apparently used for the carriage or conveyance of heavy burdens or of merchandise shall keep the same upon the left-hand side of the carriage-way of any street, and so as that in driving along such street, the tramway, if any, in such street shall be upon his right-hand side, save only (insofar as shall be necessary to depart therefrom) for the purpose of passing or of avoiding collision with any other vehicle or for necessary stoppage at any house or place.

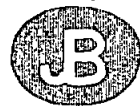

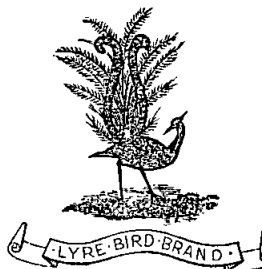

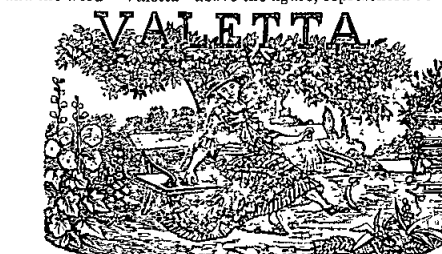
