LACEPEDE BAY.

(1) *Sunken Rocks reported South-westward of Nation Rock and North-westward of Cape Jaffa.*

Information has been received from the Marine Board of South Australia, dated 9th January 1888, of the existence of the following sunken rocks, lying respectively south-westward of Nation rock, and north-westward of Cape Jaffa, Lacepede Bay, South Australia:—

1. A rock of small extent, having a least depth of 7 feet at low water, and with 5½ fathoms a quarter of a cable off all round, is situated about one mile south-westward of Nation rock.

Position, lat. 36° 41' 45" S., long. 139° 49' 30" E.

2. Two rocky heads, lying about 6 yards apart, and having a depth of 12 feet over them, are reported to be situated about three-quarters of a mile eastward of No. 1 rock.

Position, lat. 36° 41' 45" S., long. 139° 50' 30" E.

3. A rock is reported to be situated with Cape Jaffa Light-house bearing about S. by W. ¼ W., distant 2½ miles, and Cape Jaffa S. E. ¼ E. Although this rock is stated by the Harbour-master at Port Caroline to be well known to the lighthouse-keepers, it was not found in a search made by the commander of the colonial steam-vessel *Governor Macgregor*, and its existence is considered doubtful.

AUSTRALIA.—EAST COAST.

(2) *Shoal Ground North-eastward of Cartwright Point.*

The Government of Queensland has given notice, dated 20th March 1888, of the existence of shoal ground, north-eastward of Cartwright Point, northward of Moreton Bay, East Coast of Australia.

A rocky patch, about 2 cables in extent, the depth on which does not exceed 5½ fathoms, lies midway between Gneering

Shoal, and the 8 fathoms patch 2 miles to the eastward; this 5½ fathoms patch is situated with Cartwright Point bearing S.W., distant 3 miles. In bad weather the sea breaks heavily on the above patch, and also on Gneering Shoal.

At a distance of half a mile eastward of the above 8 fathoms patch, the depth does not exceed 7½ fathoms, and broken water is said to have been seen still further to the south-eastward. Vessels are therefore cautioned not to approach this part of the coast in bad weather.

WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it was provided that the Governor in Council might make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order the following alteration in and addition to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces made on the sixteenth day of June 1885, that is to say:—

PART III.—REGULATIONS FOR PERMANENT FORCES.

SECTION I.—CONSTITUTION AND ESTABLISHMENT.

Victorian Artillery.

Paragraph 2 is cancelled, and the following is inserted in lieu thereof:—

Warrant officers, non-commissioned officers, trumpeters, and gunners on joining will receive a free kit and a supply of clothing on the following scale:—

Free Kit (Necessaries).

2 flannel vests	1 brush, cloth
3 white shirts	1 " hair
3 pairs of socks	3 brushes, boot
1 pair of braces	1 brush, shaving
1 hold-all	1 razor and case
1 knife	1 blacking tin
1 fork	1 comb
1 spoon	1 pair of gloves
1 button-brush	3 towels
1 " stick	1 sponge.

Free Kit (Clothing).

*1 tunic	2 pairs of trousers
*1 jumper	1 helmet, blue
2 helmet covers, white	1 cap, forage
2 " " khaki	2 pairs of boots.
2 suits of khaki cotton drill	

The following will be the annual allowance of clothing:—

1 jumper
1 helmet cover, white
1 " " khaki
1 cap, forage
1 suit of khaki cotton drill.

The half-yearly issue will consist of 1 pair of trousers and 1 pair of boots.

One tunic will be issued every two years.

One helmet, blue, will be issued after two and a half years' service.

The annual issues of clothing will be made on the 1st of October, and the half-yearly issues on 1st of April and 1st of October.

Recruits will be supplied with new articles of clothing if enlisted more than six months prior to the next annual issue; and, if available, with part-worn articles if enlisted less than six months prior to the next annual issue.

Compensation, at contract rates, will be allowed in lieu of clothing, on the recommendation of the officer commanding the Victorian Artillery, to such warrant officers, non-commissioned officers, and men whose clothing is fit for wear for another period, such compensation not being paid until the end of the period of the issue of clothing.

* *Vide Instructions as to new or part-worn clothing.*

New or part-worn clothing does not become the property of the soldier after the next periodical issue, but must be kept for fatigue or barrack work, and cannot be made away with at discretion.

The officer commanding the Victorian Artillery can, however, sanction the disposal of clothing when there is too large an accumulation in the soldier's possession; buttons, chevrons, and badges being invariably removed before sale.

TEMPORARY REGULATION.

Men at present serving will be considered as recruits for the purpose of receiving part-worn clothing, or compensation in lieu thereof, for the broken periods between the dates on which they now become entitled to clothing and the date of the next annual issue.

The following new paragraph is inserted:—

Para. 3.

PERMANENT SECTION, SUBMARINE MINING COMPANY, CORPS OF ENGINEERS.

(a) Warrant officers from Imperial Service will draw clothing as laid down in Defence Circular No. 13, dated 1st April 1885.

SHIRE OF BAIRNSDALE.

A By-law of the Shire of Bairnsdale, made under Sections 213 and 447 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered Seven, for regulating the Supply and Distribution of Water and making a Rate for Water Supply purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bairnsdale order as follows:—

1. *Rates and charges for water supplied.*—The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements in the Centre Riding of the Shire of Bairnsdale shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale, that is to say:—

(a.) On every house or tenement of Forty pounds rateable annual value or under, Twenty shillings per annum.

(b.) On every house or tenement above the annual rateable value of Forty pounds, a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per cent. per annum on the amount of the municipal valuation.

(c.) On each allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate separately from any building, the annual rate of Two pounds ten shillings per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same; provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings per annum.

(d.) For every water-trough supplied with water by the council, the sum of Twenty shillings per annum, unless such water be supplied by measurement.

(e.) For every steam boiler supplied with water by the council, the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler.

(f.) For water supplied by the said council by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the council), One shilling per one thousand gallons.

(g.) Water supplied to Government departments, hospitals, cricket clubs, bowling greens, and for ornamental purposes, and water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, and to manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, breweries, livery and coach-horse stables, and to hotel premises, shall be charged for by measurement.

(h.) For water supplied from stand-pipes, One shilling per load of one hundred and fifty gallons or less.

(i.) For water supplied temporarily to buildings in the course of progress, Twenty shillings per centum on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or the said council may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

2. *Minimum quantity to be charged for.*—The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, excepting in the case of Government departments, hospitals, cricket clubs, and bowling greens, and for ornamental purposes, shall be—

(a.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b.) If for other than domestic purposes, only thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

3. *Rates recoverable from owner or occupier.*—The rates and charges for water and all sums due to the council under this bye-law shall be paid by and be recoverable from the owner of the premises or the occupier or person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

4. *Liability of occupiers having joint supply.*—Where several houses or parts of houses in the separate occupation of several persons are supplied by one common pipe, or where water is supplied to courts, alleys, and rights-of-way by stand-pipes, the several owners or occupiers of such houses or parts of houses or of the several houses or parts of houses in every such court, alley, or right-of-way, shall be liable to the payment of the same rates for the supply of water as they would have been liable to if each of such several houses or parts of houses had been supplied with water from the works of the council by a separate pipe.

5. *Rates how payable.*—The said rates and charges shall be payable in advance by equal instalments on the first day of July and the first day of January in each year (except in the case of water supplied by meter or by agreement, which shall be payable at such time or times as may be determined by the council from time to time), and the first payment shall be made at the time when the owner or occupier shall become liable to pay the rates and charges for the supply of water as hereinbefore mentioned.

6. *Supply not compulsory.*—It shall not be compulsory on the council to supply or to continue to supply any water to any person whomsoever.

7. *Council not liable.*—The council shall not be liable to any penalty or damages for not supplying water if the want of such supply arises from unavoidable cause or accident.

8. *Meter to be provided by consumer.*—Every person who shall have agreed with the council for a supply of water by measure shall at his own expense provide a meter and keep and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the council, and in the event of any repairs thereto being required, notice in writing shall be immediately given by such person to the council. If any person who has provided any meter as aforesaid shall fail to give the notice hereinbefore mentioned of any repairs required for such meter, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds. All meters must pass the Melbourne Water Supply test.

9. *Penalty for not providing meter.*—If any person who, under the provisions herein contained, ought to provide any meter neglect or refuse, after having been required by the council so to do, to provide such meter, he shall for every day during which such neglect or refusal continues forfeit a sum not exceeding One pound.

10. *Council may provide meter.*—The council may cause meters to be provided and fixed in any case where they may consider it necessary at the expense of the consumer, who shall keep and maintain the same in good working order, and the water supplied shall be charged for at the rates and charges heretofore mentioned or by special arrangement as the council shall determine.

11. *Meters to be approved by Inspector.*—Consumption how estimated if meter defective.—No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same shall be capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons, and unless the same is approved in writing by the duly authorized officer of the council. If any meter should cease registering or be reported by the Waterworks Inspector as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the council shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it shall have been repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous half-year or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the council may insert a check meter on the service pipe.

12. *Removal of meter forbidden.*—No person shall remove or alter the position of any meter when fixed without the written consent of the duly authorized officer of the council.

13. *Meters how placed.*—*Defective meters.*—Every meter shall be placed according to the direction of the duly authorized officer of the council, and so as to be open to inspection at all times, and as far as practicable in a situation where it cannot be affected by frost or injured by any other means, and shall be provided with means of access thereto. A meter shall not be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet pipe leading from the service pipe or other pipe of the council unless permitted by a memo. in writing under the hand of the duly authorized officer of the council. A meter shall not be continued to be used if it is found on being tested by the council's officer to be inaccurate.

14. *Council may cut off supply from defective meter.*—If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order after having been required by any officer of the council so to do, the council may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the service pipe or otherwise until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the council as being in proper working order.

15. *Penalty for fixing uncertificated meter.*—If any plumber or other person fix or refix any meter upon any premises supplied with water by the council without having first obtained a certificate from the council that the said meter has been examined and found in correct working condition, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

16. *Penalty for unauthorized interference with meter.*—If any person remove or alter the position of, or in any way interfere with, any meter without giving such notice as aforesaid, he shall for each such offence forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds over and above the damage which he may be found liable to pay in any action at law at the suit of the council.

17. *Fireplugs how used.*—Fireplugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them be allowed in writing by the council, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the council.

18. *Use of hose prohibited.*—No cock or tap with any connection for attaching hose shall be affixed to any service pipe, connection, or fitting; and no hose or pipe shall be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants, or washing house walls or vehicles or animals, or for any similar purpose, unless where the water is charged for by meter, without the written authority of the council.

19. *Limit of domestic supply.*—A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for livery or carriers' stables, or a supply for any manufacturing purpose, or for irrigation, or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose, and the supply of water for other than domestic purposes solely shall in all cases be by measure. The council may supply any person with water for domestic, or for domestic and for other than domestic purposes, by measure, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the council and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

20. *Penalty for illegal use of water.*—Any person receiving water from the council who shall take or carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or who shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

21. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the council who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, water trough, or private or public service pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. *License to lay service pipes.*—Before any person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the council, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the council, or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the council, he shall obtain from the council a license in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

23. *License fee.*—Licenses to affix and lay on, alter, or repair service pipes to tap mains and sub-mains, and to do and execute generally the plumbing and other work necessary for laying on and maintaining water services, may be granted to persons who shall satisfy the council of their competency to perform such plumbing and other work upon payment of an annual fee of One pound.

24. It shall not be compulsory on the council to grant a license every or any applicant who shall prove his competency.

25. *Responsibility of licensee.*—In all and every case a licensee shall be responsible for the acts, errors, and omissions of his employes; and the council shall have the power to cancel the license of any person at any time.

26. *Council may lay service pipes.*—The council may contract with any owner or occupier of any house, tenement, or land who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works for the provision and laying of a service pipe from the pipes of the council to the boundary or to any other part of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are laid the pipes of the council.

27. *Penalty for uncovering pipes without permission.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the council, without giving two days' notice to the council of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the council without the permission in writing of the council being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

28. *Penalty for laying pipes without giving notice beforehand.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the council without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the council, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the council, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipe of the council of a strength and material not sanctioned by the council, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day the offence is continued after notice of the offence from the council.

29. *Quality of service pipes.*—Wrought galvanized iron or lead piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services, ordinary connections with mains and sub-mains must be made with approved brass stop-cock ferrules, all connections with lead and iron pipes must be made with approved brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be wiped joints, and in no case will bolt or copper bit joints be allowed either in the interior or exterior of any building. One service pipe only to each house, tenement, or land will be permitted.

30. *Capacity of service pipes.*—No service pipe of a larger bore than $\frac{3}{4}$ inch will be permitted, unless by the special consent of the council.

31. *Defective service pipes.*—If any person shall neglect to repair any service pipe conveying water from the pipes of the council into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the council that such service pipe requires repairing, the council may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise as to the said council may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The occupier (if any) and if none the owner shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service pipes being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each day such offence is continued after notice thereof from the council.

32. *Penalty for wasting water.*—Any person supplied with water by the council who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing such offence to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each day the offence is continued after notice thereof from the council.

33. *Steam boilers.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service pipe or branch service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the action of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each day the offence is continued after notice thereof from the council.

34. *Water troughs and cisterns.*—To prevent overflow all water troughs and cisterns must be fitted with approved self-acting taps, which shall be at all times maintained in good working order.

35. *Hot water apparatus.*—All boilers or hot water apparatus must be supplied from cisterns, as in no case will they be permitted to be fed directly from the pipes of the council.

36. *Baths.*—In every bath the inlets must be distinct from and unconnected with the outlet, and the inlet pipes must be visible and accessible and be attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and such bath shall be provided with a proper, well-fitted, and perfectly water-tight ground outlet plug or cock. Overflow pipes to private baths or other vessels will not be permitted except where the supply is taken by measure.

37. *Water-closets.*—Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

38. *Entry of council's officers for purpose of inspection.*—The officers of the council may at all reasonable hours enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the council, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if any person hinders any such officer from entering or making such inspection or examination, the council may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

39. *Council may cut off supply for breach of regulations.*—If any persons supplied with water by the council does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the council may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

40. *Use of hose on footpaths forbidden.*—Any person (excepting where water is supplied by measure) watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the council, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for each such offence.

41. *Regulations for laying of service.*—The following regulations shall be observed by all persons in connection with the laying of services, &c. :—

1. The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., shall be sound and free from all defects, and all ends of pipes, bends, &c., shall be properly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c. All delivery cocks shall be high pressure and of the best quality in workmanship, all jointing between pipes, thimbles, bends, couplings, elbows, meters, and cocks shall be made with red lead and flax.

2. No service pipe shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground of less than ten inches. After service pipes have been laid, the trench or trenches shall be properly filled in and thoroughly rammed, and any subsidence therein which may appear within three months shall be immediately made good by the owner or occupier of the premises supplied by such service pipe. No trench made for the purpose of receiving, altering, repairing, or extending a service pipe shall be left open after sunset.

3. Every person previous to being licensed to lay services shall deposit with the shire secretary the sum of Ten pounds sterling as security for the strict observance and performance of the regulations and conditions contained in this bye-law, and in case of the non-observance or non-performance of any of such stipulations and conditions at any time by such licensed person, the council shall be entitled to declare his deposit absolutely forfeited, and the same shall thereupon become and be absolutely forfeited as liquidated damages, and the name of such person shall at once be struck off the roll of licensed plumbers. On surrender of license to the council, the Ten pounds deposit (if not forfeited) shall be refunded.

4. No private services whatsoever shall be laid or extensions made by any licensed person, unless he has ascertained at the council's office that the person for whom such work is intended has received the consent of the proper officers of the council to have such work executed.

5. Within twenty-four hours after the completion of each service the licensed person by whom such service shall have been laid shall report at the office of the council the completion of such service.

6. If at any time any such licensed person wilfully acts contrary to any of the provisions of this bye-law, either by himself or his workmen, or refuses to communicate any needful and proper information required of him in regard to any work connected with the works of the council done by him or his workmen, or under his superintendence or upon his responsibility, his name may be erased by the council from their list of licensed plumbers.

7. Each licensed person shall be held solely responsible to the council for such service pipes being laid and completed by him or his workmen in a sound, workmanlike, and durable manner, and maintained in that condition (sound and watertight) for a period of three months after such service pipe has been completed.

8. Each licensed person shall be held responsible to the council for any injury occasioned by him or his workmen to the streets, mains, or other property of the shire, or to private services already laid and connected with the council's water supply, and full compensation for such injury, including cost of all repairs necessitated thereby, shall be paid by such licensed person to the council within twenty-four hours of the time such injury was occasioned.

In the construction of this bye-law the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "council" shall mean the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale.

The above bye-law was passed by the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale on the 3rd day of May 1888, and confirmed on the 7th day of June 1888.

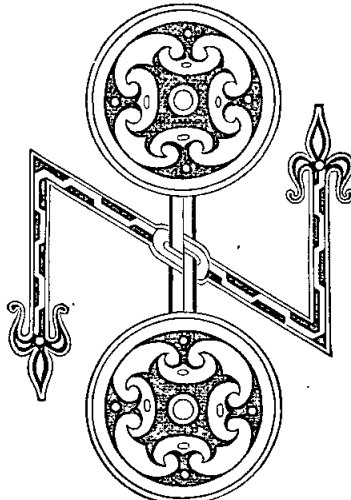
