## REGULÆ GENERALES.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Rules of Court dated the 15th day of October 1887, it is ordered as follows:—

Rules 24, 26, and 47 are hereby repealed, and the following Rules, numbered 24, 26, and 47, substituted instead thereof:—

## RULES FOR THE ADMISSION OF BARRISTERS AND ATTORNEYS.

24. *Final Examination.*—Every such person must, not earlier than six months before the expiration of his articles of clerkship or of his service as associate, and before he apply for admission to practise in the Court, also submit to be examined by the Board of Examiners of the Supreme Court for Attorneys, and must pass in six at least of the following branches of the law:—

- (1.) Real Property and Conveyancing.
- (2.) Common and Statute Law.
- (3.) Equity, Divorce and Matrimonial, and Ecclesiastical Law.
- (4.) Insolvency and Admiralty Law.
- (5.) Criminal Law.
- (6.) Practice of the Supreme Court in its various branches.
- (7.) Practice of the Courts of inferior jurisdiction.
- (8.) Constitutional Law and Constitutional History.

26. *Number of Final Examinations.*—The Board shall hold four final examinations in each year.

In Rule 42 the words "for every sittings" are hereby repealed, and the words "for every final examination" shall be read instead thereof.

47. *Interpretation.*—The word "sittings" in these rules shall mean a sittings of the Full Court, and the word "Court" in Rules 9, 13, 17, 34, and 38 shall mean the Full Court.

The preceding Rules 24 and 26 shall apply to all articulated clerks, and any articulated clerk who has complied with Rule 23 of the Rules dated the 15th day of October A.D. 1887 shall be deemed to have complied with Rule 20 of the Rules dated the 3rd day of December A.D. 1872, or any rule to the like effect.

In case of non-compliance within the specified time with any rule now or hereafter to be in force for the admission of barristers and attorneys, the Full Court shall have power, upon application made to it for that purpose, to enlarge or abridge the time appointed by any such rule for doing any act or taking any proceeding, and may substitute for any time appointed for doing any act or taking any proceeding any other time, upon such terms as the Court may think fit, and any such enlargement, abridgement, or substitution may be ordered although the application for the same is not made until after the expiration of the time appointed.

They must be able to read and write well, and must, indisputably, produce satisfactory testimonials of character. Those candidates who have served in any other force or Government department must also produce their discharge therefrom.

IN accordance with the provisions of, and in exercise of the powers conferred by, the *Mining Statute 1865*, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter the Regulations relating to Gold Mining Leases in so far only as they relate to the form of lease to be issued under such Regulations as set out in Schedule F thereto, and doth revoke the existing form of lease, and doth order that the form hereto subjoined be substituted therefor, that is to say:—

THIS INDENTURE made the day of in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and between Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria of the one part and

(hereinafter called the lessee) of the other part witnesseth that in consideration of the rents hereinafter reserved and of the covenants and provisos hereinafter contained Her Majesty doth by these presents demise and grant unto the lessee his executors administrators and transferees all that piece of land particularly described in the first schedule hereto and delineated and colored yellow on the map hereon endorsed or hereunto annexed together with the rights liberties easements advantages and appurtenances thereto belonging or appertaining And also together with liberty for the said lessee his executors administrators and transferees and their miners agents and workmen to search for dig open work and win the gold on and in and under the said land And also to sink drive and make and use all pits shafts levels drives adits watercourses races drains dams reservoirs roads and tramways and to erect all such buildings engines furnaces pumps machinery and works on and in or under the said land as shall be necessary or convenient for working the mine and winning the said gold And also to erect on the said land such offices cottages and dwelling-houses for the use of the persons and workmen employed in the said mine and works as the said lessee his executors administrators or transferees shall think proper But nevertheless excepting and reserving unto Her Majesty Her heirs and successors such part and parts of the said land (if any) to a depth of feet used as a street road track or creek shown on the plan hereon endorsed and therein colored blue with full and free liberty for Her Majesty Her heirs and successors and Her and their subjects and people to use the same streets roads creeks and tracks at all times And also excepting and reserving to Her Majesty Her heirs and successors and Her and their subjects and people at all times the full free right of ingress egress and regress with or without horses carts and carriages over and along the surface of the land hereby demised not being actually worked for the purposes of gold mining And also reserving and excepting unto Her Majesty Her heirs and successors Her and their servants agents subjects and people full and free right and liberty to go pass and re-pass at all times hereafter during the continuance of this lease and for all purposes and either with or without horses or other animals carts or other carriages through over and along such road or way or such several roads or ways in on or over the said land to be hereafter from time to time set out by the Minister of Mines for the time being And also excepting unto Her Majesty Her heirs and successors and to Her and all persons duly licensed in that behalf by or on behalf of the Governor or Officer administering the Government of Victoria for the time being in Council (hereinafter called the Governor in Council) the right at all times to take carry away and use any sand stone gravel clay or earth and timber live or dead now on in under or upon the said land And also excepting and reserving unto Her Majesty Her heirs and successors to a depth of one hundred feet such part and parts (if any) of the surface of the said land as are now occupied under a miner's right for residence or under a business license And also such part and parts of the underlying soil and earth or subjacent strata as shall be sufficient to give the necessary and proper support to such parts of the said land as are now occupied under a miner's right for residence or under a business license

to hold the said land and premises with the appurtenances (subject nevertheless to such rights interests and authorities as may be lawfully subsisting therein at the date of these presents) unto the said lessee his executors administrators and transferees from the date hereof for the term of years next ensuing for the purpose of mining thereon and therein for gold and for no other purpose yielding and paying therefor yearly and every year unto Her Majesty Her heirs and successors during the said term the yearly rent of by equal half-yearly payments of each to be made in advance the first payment to be made on the day of the date hereof and the next payment on the day of next and the succeeding payments respectively to be made on the same days in each succeeding year clear of all rates taxes and assessments to which the said land and premises are now or at any time during the said term may be subject or liable Provided always and it is hereby agreed that if and whenever any part of the said rent shall be in arrear for twenty-one days after the same shall have become payable or if any other sum of money hereby covenanted to be paid shall be in arrear twenty-one days after the time appointed for payment thereof whether such rent or

sum of money shall have been legally demanded or not Her Majesty Her heirs or successors and Her or their agents and officers and any person appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council and any bailiff of Crown lands may enter upon the said land premises and mine and seize and distrain all gold and auriferous stone and earth and auriferous minerals and all machinery apparatus tools waggons carts carriages engines plant live and dead stock and all other goods chattels and effects whatsoever which shall then be on in or under the said land premises and mine and every distress then made may take away sell and dispose of as in cases of distress for rent reserved in common leases and out of the moneys arising thereby retain so much as shall be sufficient to satisfy the said arrears and other payments and which shall at the time of such sale be unpaid and all expenses incurred by the non-payment thereof and by distraining and if any surplus the same to be paid to the said lessee h executors administrators or transferees Provided always that the power of distress hereinbefore expressly given shall not impair or prejudice but shall be cumulative or in addition to the power of distress to which lessors or reversioners are by law entitled for the recovery of their rents.

And the said lessee do hereby for himself his heirs executors administrators and transferees covenant with Her Majesty Her heirs and successors in manner following that is to say—

1. That the said lessee h executors administrators and transferees shall and will during the said term pay unto Her Majesty Her heirs and successors the rent hereby reserved at the times and in manner hereinbefore appointed for payment thereof clear of all deductions.

2. And shall and will except when prevented by inevitable accident or during the execution of repairs make construct and work the said land premises and mine in the best and most effectual manner and without interruption. And shall and will diligently explore and search for gold and work the said land premises and mine to the best advantage.

3. And shall and will employ in the construction of the works or in mining operations on or under the said land during the first month of the said term and during the usual hours of labor able and competent workmen and miners at the least not being Chinese and during the remainder of the said term not less than such miners and workmen not being Chinese unless prevented by inevitable accident or during the execution of repairs.

4. And shall and will during the said term effectually drain the said mine and pump out all water likely to cause injury thereto or which would prevent or interfere with the working thereof and if the said mine shall be affected or liable to be affected by the same flow or body of water as any other mine or mines contiguous thereto shall and will contribute with the lessee or lessees or owner or owners of such other mine or mines a reasonable proportion of the machinery and labor necessary to free and keep free such mine or mines from water to a workable extent or if the said mine shall be kept free from water to a workable extent whether wholly or partially by means of the machinery and labor of a contiguous mine or mines then shall and will pay to the lessee or lessees owner or owners of such contiguous mine or mines a reasonable proportion of the expenses of such machinery and labor.

5. And shall and will make such provision for the disposal of the detritus dirt waste workings or refuse of the said mine so that the same shall not be an inconvenience nuisance or obstruction to any roads ways rivers creeks or private or Crown lands or in any manner occasion any public or private damage or inconvenience.

6. And shall and will make such provisions for decency and the observance of sanitary regulations as the Minister of Mines for the time being shall approve of or direct.

7. And shall and will erect and keep erected during the said term posts not less than two feet six inches high above the ground and painted white so as accurately to define the boundary-line and angles of the said land and so that each post shall be visible from those nearest to it on each side.

8. And shall and will if required by the Minister of Mines erect and keep in repair a substantial wall or fence round each of the shafts at any time during the said term open on any part of the said land or used for the purpose of the said mine so as effectually to prevent all accidental access thereto and when the Minister of Mines for the time being or other person authorized in that behalf shall consider any such shaft unnecessary and shall by certificate under his hand notify the same then shall and will effectually fill up and substantially enclose the same.

9. And shall and will as often as required so to do during the said term make and deliver to the Secretary for Mines for the time being or other officer appointed for that purpose all such true and proper plans and sections returns statistics and particulars made up to the last day of the preceding month of the workings and operations of the said mine as shall be in accordance with the rules and directions from time to time issued by the Minister of Mines or other officer authorized so to do the same to be accompanied with a statutory declaration of the truth and correctness thereof by the lessee of the said mine h executors administrators or transferees or such other person as the said Minister shall direct.

10. And shall and will during the said term make proper and reasonable compensation to the occupier or occupiers or lessee or lessees from the Crown of any adjoining land in respect of any damage which may be sustained by him or them by the working of the said mine or the carrying on the works thereof or by any other works connected therewith such compensation to be determined by the Minister of Mines or other person authorized by him so to do.

11. And further shall and will at all times during the said term keep and preserve the said mine and premises from all unnecessary injury or damage and also the levels drifts shafts

watercourses roads ways works buildings erections and fixtures therein and thereon in good repair and condition except such of them as shall from time to time be considered by a mining surveyor or other proper officer to be unnecessary for the working of the said mine or any contiguous mine and in such state and condition shall and will at the end or other sooner determination of the said term deliver peaceable possession thereof and of all and singular the premises hereby demised to Her Majesty Her heirs and successors or to the warden or other officer authorized to receive possession thereof.

12. And shall and will permit the surveyor of or the chief mining surveyor or his deputy or other duly authorized person with all proper assistants at all reasonable times during the said term quietly to enter into and upon the said land premises and mine and every part thereof to survey and examine the state and condition thereof and for the purposes aforesaid to descend all pits and shafts and to use all roads ways engines ropes machinery gear labor and other things in or on the said land and mine or in or on any adjacent land held in connection therewith which shall be deemed necessary by him without making any compensation for the same so nevertheless that in so doing no unnecessary interference is caused with the carrying on of the said mining works.

13. And shall and will observe perform and fulfil the stipulations covenants and provisos which may be contained in the second schedule hereto.

14. And shall not nor will use or occupy or permit to be used or occupied the said land for other than mining purposes.

15. And shall not nor will cut any timber on the said land except for the mining operations hereby authorized and for the domestic purposes of those residing on the said land.

16. And shall not nor will cut down ring bark or burn any of the trees growing within the boundaries of any State forest any portion of which is within the boundaries of the land hereby demised nor in any way injure the same nor the soil in which they are growing except in so far as may be absolutely necessary to remove any impediment to the proper exploration and mining of the ground hereby demised.

17. And shall not nor will cut or remove or permit to be cut or removed from the said land any live trees which at the height of three feet from the surface of the ground are of less diameter than twelve inches and shall not nor will remove or permit to be removed bark from such trees.

18. And shall not nor will deposit any silt or detritus or allow any sludge or refuse of any kind to flow into the water-channels leading into any reservoir belonging to the Board of Land and Works or to any local governing body or water commission nor carry on mining operations so as in any way to injure or interfere with any land set apart for water supply purposes.

19. And shall not nor will close up or obstruct any adit or adits to or from any contiguous mine or mines whereby fresh air is admitted or ventilation promoted.

20. And shall not nor will transfer underlet or part with the possession of the said land mine and premises or any part thereof or mortgage charge or encumber the same without the license of the person for the time being authorized to grant leases of Crown lands for mining purposes.

Provided always and it is hereby agreed and declared in manner following—

21. That if the land and premises hereby demised or any part thereof shall before the date of these presents have been alienated by Her Majesty either in fee simple or for any less estate or licensed under any Act of the Parliament of Victoria the lessee h executors administrators or transferees shall not be entitled to any compensation on that account And that no implied covenant for title or for quiet enjoyment shall be implied herein.

22. That it shall be lawful for the chief mining surveyor or any other officer authorized by the Minister of Mines if he shall think fit so to do to order that any of the galleries drives airways passages waterways or adits belonging to or used in connection with the said mine whether the same be within the said land or not shall be stowed and he may from time to time by order in writing direct that such engineering or other works whether of masonry or otherwise be constructed and erected as in his opinion may be required for the support of the surface of the said land or any land adjoining thereto or as a precaution against any contingent damage to any road or street (if any) included in or hereafter to be formed on the land hereby demised or immediately adjacent thereto and as shall be specified in such order and the lessee h executors administrators or transferees shall upon receipt of such order forthwith proceed and with all convenient speed continue until the same shall be completed to execute at his or their own costs and charges to the satisfaction of the said chief mining surveyor or such officer to be testified by him in writing all such works as shall be so specified.

23. That it shall be lawful for Her Majesty Her heirs successors and assigns to make and use in on or under the said land any levels drifts leads shafts watercourses adits roads ways and passages for freeing and keeping free any other lands or mines from water or for conveying water to any other lands or mines for mining purposes or for supplying any other mines with fresh air or for effectually working any other mines or for any public purpose whatsoever causing as little damage obstruction or interference as possible to or with the said mine and the works thereof.

24. And it shall be lawful for Her Majesty Her heirs successors and assigns and all persons licensed as aforesaid to take carry away and use any sand stone gravel clay or live or dead timber on in upon or under the said land for any public purpose whatsoever and all proper facilities for the purposes aforesaid shall be given by the lessee h executors administrators or transferees.

25. And that if at any time during the said term any part or parts of the said land shall be required for sale or any railway road canal aqueduct watercourse reservoir or any public purpose it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to cause to be set

out the part or parts of the said land which shall be so required and so soon as the same shall be so set out such part or parts of the said land shall cease to be included in the lands hereby granted and the lessee h executors administrators or transferees shall not be entitled to any abatement of rent or any compensation whatever in respect thereof.

26. And if the lessee h executors administrators or transferees shall prove to the satisfaction of the Governor in Council that on account of unexpected or unforeseen difficulties in exploring or working the said land premises or mine or by reason of the want of water or on account of having too much water upon or in the said land premises or mine or for want of machinery or (when a company are the beneficial owners of the said land premises or mine) from exhaustion of capital of the company or the necessity for the reconstruction of such company or for from or on account of any other cause whatever which the Governor in Council shall deem sufficient the lessee h executors administrators or transferees shall be unable to employ the number of men hereby covenanted to be employed the Governor in Council may by order in writing if he shall think fit but not otherwise from time to time waive and dispense with the compliance of the covenants for the employment of workmen and miners and respecting the working of the mine for any period not exceeding six calendar months.

DISPOSITION OF CHURCH LAND ALLOWED.

A STATEMENT of Trusts having been submitted by the head or authorized representative of the denomination of the Roman Catholic Church, under the provisions of the Act to provide for the Abolition of State Aid to Religion, for allowance by the Governor, the same was allowed by him on the twenty-third day of July 1888, and the following is the form in which such statement of trusts has been allowed:—

*Description of land.*—One acre one rood, being allotments 11, 12, 13, 14, and 15, of section 4, town of Mornington, county of Mornington; bounded on the east by Cook street bearing S. 26° 7' E. five chains, on the south by the Presbyterian School reserve bearing S. 63° 53' W. two chains fifty links; on the west by allotments 2, 3, 4, 4A, and 5 bearing N. 26° 7' W. five chains; and on the north by part of allotment 8 and allotments 9 and 10 bearing N. 63° 53' E. two chains fifty links.

*Names of trustees.*—The Most Reverend Thomas Joseph Carr, D.D., Archbishop of Melbourne; Reverend William Quilter, of Dandenong; William Stanley and Laurence Murphy, of Mornington.

*Power of disposition.*—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, exchange, or otherwise dispose of, subject to the written approval of the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Melbourne for the time being, or (in case of his death) of the person or persons administering the affairs of the diocese. The Archbishop, or such person as aforesaid, to have power to remove trustees and to appoint new trustees, and to fill up all vacancies occurring in trusteeship.

*Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.*—To such purposes of the Roman Catholic Church as may from time to time be agreed upon by the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Melbourne and a majority of the trustees.

## PUBLIC HEALTH—SHIRE OF TALBOT.

## BY-LAW No. 2.

**T**HE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Talbot, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883," and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board of Health, doth hereby make the following by-law, being by-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply and have operation in the whole of the shire of Talbot.

*Definitions.*

4. In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law, the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground; and "earth-closet" shall include a pan closet of any description.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

"Slaughter-yard" or "slaughter-house" shall include an abattoir or any place whatever where slaughtering takes place.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

*Part I.—General Cleanliness.*

5. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dust, filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be, once at least in every week, removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Local Board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be effectually deodorized and to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupier.

7. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter in any street, road, lane, right-of-way, or place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health or in any way contrary to the directions of the Local Board or officer of health.

8. The occupier of any land on which is erected any stable cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty, or on which land is any building wherein any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine are kept shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard, or once at least in every week, should the quantity not amount in that time to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said Local Board of Health at the expense of such occupier.

*Part II.—As to Manure.*

9. Nothing herein contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil (not being night-soil), or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any by-law of the Local Board of Health, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or contrary to any directions of the Local Board or officer of health.

10. Every person placing, depositing, or spreading, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any liquid manure of which night-soil, urine, or any similar offensive matters form a part, night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth

not less than six inches in thickness, and shall keep and use the same in such a way only as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health. And before doing so such person shall obtain the written permission of the Local Board or officer of health, subject however to any general regulation or directions which the Central Board by publication in the *Government Gazette* may make or give. But such permission shall be no defence in any complaint or prosecution for having kept or used such liquid manure, night-soil, offal, blood, or other matter in such a way as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

*Part III.—As to Earth-closets, &c.*

11. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground; and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the content whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

12. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

13. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and provided with a closely-fitted cover of pattern to be approved by the inspector of nuisances.

14. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

15. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

*Part IV.—Prevention of Pollution of Water.*

16. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

17. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.

18. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within twenty-four hours of notice given by the Local Board or by one of its officers.

*Penalties.*

19. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing by-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Talbot this fourth day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the trustees of the Footscray General Cemetery rescind the rules and regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th day of June 1871, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery, under the above Act, shall apply to the trustees thereof. If approved, the trustees, on payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial.
3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such, with full particulars, for approval.
4. That any order for interment shall be given at the cemetery six working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.
5. That the name, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in schedule C, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the sexton, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
7. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate, with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.
8. That every grave shall be at least seven feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground, after such interment.
9. That no interment shall be permitted in any grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.
10. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.
11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a deputy registrar of deaths or a coroner, such certificate shall be delivered to the sexton before the funeral enters the cemetery.
12. That the hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—On week-days, September to April inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.; on Sundays throughout the year, from 2 to 5 p.m.
13. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m., except by special permission of the trustees.
14. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.
15. That no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the cemetery. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.
16. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.
17. That any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.
18. That any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the above Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.
19. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No Bath-stone or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed, shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed work.
20. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than three inches broad, shall be permitted to enter.
21. That no catacomb shall be allowed.
22. That no wooden erection shall be allowed.
23. That the Trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment either in said or any other cemetery.

24. That before any such exceptional case be dealt with by the Trustees, a written application, setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased; and in the event of such application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering the *Coroners Statute 1865*, and the Act numbered CCCXXXVIII., in addition to that of the Trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin, prior to removal.

25. That any workman not employed by the Trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the sexton, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labor, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

26. That, unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. during the other months of the year.

27. That no child under 10 years shall be admitted into the cemetery, except in charge of a responsible person.

28. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

29. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

30. That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or bye-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

31. That no person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.

32. That the sexton shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the Trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

33. That no person employed under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the Trustees.

34. That any person so employed accepting any such gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.

35. That the charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in this cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the said Trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

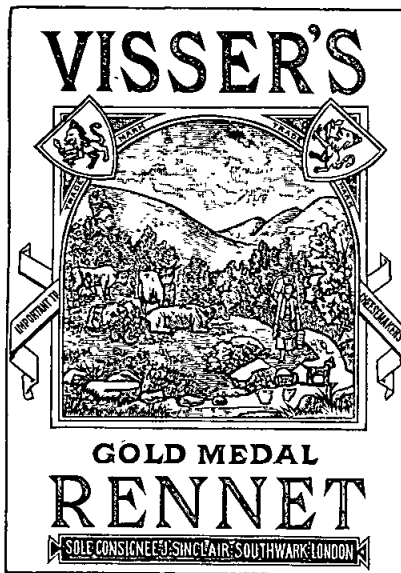
