# REGULÆ GENERALES.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Rules of Court dated the 15th day of October 1887, it is ordered as follows:—

Rules 24, 26, and 47 are hereby repealed, and the following Rules, numbered 24, 26, and 47, substituted instead thereof:—

# RULES FOR THE ADMISSION OF BARRISTERS AND ATTORNEYS.

- 24. Final Examination.—Every such person must, not earlier than six months before the expiration of his articles of clerkship or of his service as associate, and before he apply for admission to practise in the Court, also submit to be examined by the Board of Examiners of the Supreme Court for Attorneys, and must pass in six at least of the following branches of the law:—
  - (1.) Real Property and Conveyancing.
  - (2.) Common and Statute Law.
  - (3.) Equity, Divorce and Matrimonial, and Ecclesiastical Law.
  - (4.) Insolvency and Admiralty Law.
  - (5.) Criminal Law.
  - (6.) Practice of the Supreme Court in its various branches.
  - (7.) Practice of the Courts of inferior jurisdiction.
  - (8.) Constitutional Law and Constitutional History.

 ${\bf 26.}$  , Number of Final Examinations.—The Board shall hold four final examinations in each year.

In Rule 42 the words "for every sittings" are hereby repealed, and the words "for every final examination" shall be read instead thereof.

47. Interpretation.—The word "sittings" in these rules shall mean a sittings of the Full Court, and the word "Court" in Rules 9, 13, 17, 34, and 38 shall mean the Full Court.

The preceding Rules 24 and 26 shall apply to all articled clerks, and any articled clerk who has complied with Rule 23 of the Rules dated the 15th day of October A.D. 1887 shall be deemed to have complied with Rule 20 of the Rules dated the 3rd day of December A.D. 1872, or any rule to the like effect.

In case of non-compliance within the specified time with any rule now or hereafter to be in force for the admission of barristers and attorneys, the Full Court shall have power, upon application made to it for that purpose, to enlarge or abridge the time appointed by any such rule for doing any act or taking any proceeding, and may substitute for any time appointed for doing any act or taking any proceeding any other time, upon such terms as the Court may thing fit, and any such enlargement, abridgement, or substitution may be ordered although the application for the same is not made until after the expiration of the time appointed. time appointed.

Power of disposition.—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, exchange, or otherwise dispose of, subject to the written approval of the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Melbourne for the time being, or (in case of his death) of the person or persons administering the affairs of the diocese. The Archbishop, or such person as aforesaid, to have power to remove trustees and to appoint new trustees, and to fill up all vacancies occurring in trusteeship.

Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.—To such purposes of the Roman Catholic Church as may from time to time be agreed upon by the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Melbourne and a majority of the trustees.

## PUBLIC HEALTH-SHIRE OF TALBOT.

#### BY-LAW No. 2.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Talbot, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Amendment Statute 1858" and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board of Health, doth hereby make the following by-law, being by-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

All former by-laws on the matter and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.

3. This by law shall apply and have operation in the whole of the shire of Talbot.

#### Definitions.

Definitions.

4. In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law, the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground; and "earth-closet" shall include a pan closet of any description.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

"Slaughter-yard" or "slaughter-house" shall include an abattoir or any place whatever where slaughtering takes place.

Words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

#### Part I.-General Cleanliness.

15. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dust, fifth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be, once at least in every week, removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such fifth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of any premises used for the suppose of any

removed at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be effectually deodorized and to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupier.

7. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes.

7. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter in any street, road, lane, right-of-way, or place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health or in any way contrary to the directions of the Local Board or officer of health.

Board or officer of health.

8. The occupier of any land on which is erected any stable cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty, or on which land is any building wherein any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine are kept shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard, or once at least in every week, should the quantity not amount in that time to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said Local Board of Health at the expense of such occupier.

9. Nothing herein contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil (not being night-soil), or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any by-law of the Local Board of Health, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or contrary to any directions of the Local Board or officer of health.

10. Every person placing, depositing, or spreading, or causing

Every person placing, depositing, or spreading, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any liquid manure of which night-soil, urine, or any similar offensive matters form a part, night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth

not less than six inches in thickness, and shall keep and use the same in such a way only as not to be a nuisance or injurious to heath. And before doing so such person shall obtain the written permission of the Local Board or officer of heath, subject however to any general regulation or directions which the Central Board by publication in the Government Gazette may make or give. But such permission shall be no defence in any complaint or prosecution for having kept or used such liquid manure, night-soil, offal, blood, or other matter in such a way as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

# Part III .- As to Earth-closets, &c.

Part III.—As to Earth-closets, fc.

11. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground; and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the content whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

12. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing might-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

13. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and provided with a closely-fitted cover of pattern to be approved by the inspector of nuisancess.

16. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way into any such water.

of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.

18. Everyaccumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within twenty-four hours of notice given by the Local Board or by one of its officers:

#### Penalties.

Penalties.

19. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whother such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing by-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Talbot this fourth day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.



In pursuance of the powers vested in them, the trustees of the Footscray General Cemetery rescind the rules and regulations published in the Government Gazette of the 9th day of June 1871, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to

- 1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
- 2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tembstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery, under the above Act, shall apply to the trustees therefor. If approved, the trustees, on payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial.
- 3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, conotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply to the trustoes for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such, with full particulars, for approval.
- 4. That any order for interment shall be given at the cemetery six working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.
- 5. That the name, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in schedule C, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.

  6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the sexton, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, comented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or
- 7. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate, with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.

  8. That every grave shall be at least seven feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground, after such interment.
- 9. That no interment shall be permitted in any grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next
- therein is enterted to do an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in
- 11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cometery without a certificate from a deputy registrar of deaths or a coroner, such certificate shall be delivered to the sexton before the funeral enters the cemetery.
- 12. That the hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—On week-days, September to April inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.; on Sundays throughout the year, from 2 to 5 p.m. 13. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. except by special permission of the trustees.

  14. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

  15. That no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the cemetery. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.

  16. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

  17. That any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.

  18. That any person putting up any erection or placing any

No Bath-caen or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed, shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed work.

That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than three inches broad, shall be permitted to enter.

22. That no wooden erection shall be allowed.

23. That the Trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for reinterment either in said or any other cemetery.

24. That before any such exceptional case be dealt with by the
Trustees a written application, setting forth the reasons for the
proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall
be produced by the nearest available representative of the de-
ceased; and in the event of such application being granted, the
permission of the Minister administering the Coroners Statute 1865,
and the Act numbered CCCXXXVIII., in addition to that of the
Trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall
be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin, prior to removal.

28. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

29. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shruh, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or bye-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.


