Pulsuant to section 18 of the said Act, I hereby declare upon the said Petition the matters following, viz.:—

1. That the scheme or plan of the proposed works shall comprise an offtake from the main Sandhurst aqueduct of the Coliban system, a local storage reservoir, and channels for the conveyance and distribution of the water to the lands to be irrigated.

2. The works of the Coliban system are National works; the other works shall be Trust works.

3. That the amount of money it is proposed that the Board of Land and Works shall advance by way of loan, for Trust works, is Eight thousand five hundred and seventy-two pounds (£8,572) sterling.

4. That the rate of interest to be paid by the Trust upon such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.

5. That the rate at which the Trust shall pay for water from the National works shall be, during the first year, One halipenny (3d.) per thousand gallons, and during the fourth and subsequent years Three halipence (14d.) per thousand gallons.

6. That the quantity of water the Trust shall be entitled and required to take from the Coliban National works shall be seven hundred millions of gallons per annum; but this obligation shall not take effect until the lapse of seven years after the constitution of the Trust.

7. The Trust shall not be entitled to receive a supply of water from any other source than the Coliban National works.

8. The powers of rating to be given to the Trust shall not exceed the sum of (5s.) Five shillings in the pound upon the annual valuation of the property within the Trust district.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF BAIRNSDALE.

THE Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Racecourse and other purposes of Public Recreation in the town of Bairnsdale, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of The Land Act 1884:-

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as the reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.
- 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or damage in any way the fences, seats, or buildings, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
- 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, sheep, horses, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Com-mittee of Management.
- 7. No person shall erect any booth, tent, or other structure in the reserve without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- 8. No person, except laborers or workmen employed in the reserve by the Committee of Management, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of trees, shrubs, or for other purposes without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- 9. No person shall be allowed to conduct or carry on any business or game for profit in or upon the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1834*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).




