"THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885."

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (49 Vict. 1. That no person or persons shall employ in the dress-making and carpet departments of the said factory more than fifty-six females for more than fifty-six hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That none of such females who are paid weekly wages shall be so employed without receiving overtime payment for the extra work they are called upon to perform.
3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

5. Galvanized Iron, in cases, and Fencing Wire to be charged and carried under Miscellaneous Class Rates and Conditions.
6. Chaff to be charged and carried under Agricultural Produce Rates and Conditions.
7. Straw, loose.—20 miles and under, 13s. 6d. per truck; over 20 and up to 50 miles, 5½d. per truck per mile additional; over 50 miles, 4½d., and over 75 miles, 3½d. per truck per mile additional.  
Hay.—20 miles and under, 15s. 9d. per truck; over 20 and up to 50 miles, 5½d. per truck per mile additional; over 50, 4½d., and over 75 miles, 3½d. per truck per mile additional. "The Irrigation Act 1886."

PROPOSED EMU VALLEY IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

IN the matter of the Petition of Carl Pohl and others, being the owners of lands situate within the parish of Strathfieldsaye, in the county of Bendigo, in the colony of Victoria, praying for the constitution of an Irrigation and Water Supply District in respect of such lands within the meaning of the said Act; and for the appointment and creation of a Trust for such district.

Pursuant to section 18 of the said Act, I hereby declare upon the said Petition the matters following, viz.:-

1. That the scheme or plan of the proposed works shall comprise an offtake from the main Sandhurst aqueduct of the Coliban system, a local storage reservoir, and channels for the conveyance and distribution of the water to the lands to be irrigated.

2. The works of the Coliban system are National works; the other works shall be Trust works.

3. That the amount of money it is proposed that the Board of Land and Works shall advance by way of loan, for Trust works, is Eight thousand five hundred and seventy-two pounds (£8,572) sterling.

4. That the rate of interest to be paid by the Trust upon such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.

5. That the rate at which the Trust shall pay for water from the National works shall be, during the first year, One halfpenny (½d.) per thousand gallons, during the second and third years One penny (1d.) per thousand gallons, and during the fourth and subsequent years Three halfpence (½d.) per thousand gallons.

6. That the quantity of water the Trust shall be entitled and required to take from the Coliban National works shall be seven hundred millions of gallons per annum; but this obligation shall not take effect until the lapse of seven years after the constitution of the Trust.

7. The Trust shall not be entitled to receive a supply of water from any other source than the Coliban National works.

8. The powers of rating to be given to the Trust shall not exceed the sum of (5s.) Five shillings in the pound upon the annual valuation of the property within the Trust district.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF BAIRNSDALE.

THE Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Race-course and other purposes of Public Recreation in the town of Bairnsdale, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as the reserve may be set apart for races, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or damage in any way the fences, seats, or buildings, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, sheep, horses, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any booth, tent, or other structure in the reserve without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
8. No person, except laborers or workmen employed in the reserve by the Committee of Management, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of trees, shrubs, or for other purposes without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
9. No person shall be allowed to conduct or carry on any business or game for profit in or upon the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

## BENDIGO BENEVOLENT ASYLUM AND LYING-IN-HOSPITAL (INCORPORATED).

ALTERATIONS to Bye-laws, confirmed at a meeting of governors convened for the purpose, held at the institution, on Friday, 3rd August 1888, at 4 p.m.

## Bye-law 5.

There shall be, on the last Thursday in the month of July in each year, a meeting of the governors of the institution, seven to form a quorum, to be held in the city of Sandhurst, at such place as the committee of management may appoint, and of which notice shall have been given in one or more of the Sandhurst newspapers, seven days previously, for the purpose of receiving the reports and accounts of the committee and officers, also to elect the committee of management and auditors for the ensuing year; but, should seven not be present within half-an-hour after the time appointed, the meeting shall stand adjourned for one week, to the same place and at the same hour, and at such adjourned meeting three shall form a quorum.

## Bye-law 6.

The committee of management shall consist of twelve governors, who shall, at the first meeting after the meeting of governors in July, elect from their own body their president, vice-president, treasurer, and secretary.

## Bye-law 7.

On the last Thursday in the month of July in every year, one third part of the elected members of the committee shall go out of office (but may, nevertheless, be re-elected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election; or, where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.

## Bye-law 9.

A general meeting of committee, of which four shall form a quorum, shall meet on the second Thursday in every month, at half-past seven o'clock p.m., to pass accounts, and to transact the general business of the institution, except applications for relief.

## Bye-law 11.

Should any member of committee be absent for three consecutive monthly meetings, without an apology, his office shall become vacant.

## Bye-law 12.

Should any vacancies occur in the committee of management or auditors or honorary medical officers, if any, the committee of management may, at the next monthly meeting, temporarily supply such vacancies until the next annual meeting, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of Act 220, are required to go out of office.

## Bye-law 15.

The treasurer shall receive all moneys on behalf of the institution, and deposit the same in such bank as the committee shall direct to the credit of the Bendigo Benevolent Asylum and Lying-in Hospital (Incorporated). He shall pay all accounts passed by the committee by drafts on the bank, which shall be countersigned, at a meeting, by the chairman and secretary. He shall keep an account of all money received and paid, and report the same to such monthly meeting of the committee; and shall present a financial report to the annual general meeting of governors, the same being previously examined and signed by the auditors.

## Bye-law 28.

Any inmate being guilty of improper or rude behaviour, or of using indecent or profane language, or defacing or injuring the property of the institution, or neglecting to obey the directions of the medical officer or officers, superintendent or matron, shall be forthwith reported to the committee, and be liable to dismissal.

## Bye-law 32.

He shall keep a register of the cases treated by the medical officer or officers, a periodical abstract of which he shall prepare, to be laid before the committee half-yearly, embracing the numbers, diseases, and results. On the admission of applicants into the asylum he shall write the name, age, and date of admission, &c., on a card to be kept suspended over the bed. He shall keep a book in which he shall insert the name of every inmate for whom the medical officer or officers shall have prescribed either wines, spirits, ales, or stout, the name of the medical officer who has ordered the same, and the precise quantity ordered each day, which book he shall lay before the committee at their usual

weekly meetings. He shall keep such medical books and papers as the medical officer or officers may require for the use of his or their department. He shall examine, both as to quantity and quality, all supplies, and enter an account thereof in the supply book, which shall be laid before the committee monthly. He shall keep an exact account of the admission and discharge of inmates, and also of all out-door alms people, the nature of the relief given, and period of its continuance, in the register book.

## Bye-law 33.

He shall keep a diet book, according to the dietary of the committee, and according to the orders of the medical officer or officers, as to the sick inmates, so as to exhibit the individual and aggregate consumption of provisions. He shall regularly visit every part of the institution connected with the men's department daily to enforce proper order and cleanliness.

## Bye-law 37.

The wardsmen and wardswomen shall carefully keep clean their respective wards, and attend to the inmates therein who may be sick, according to the directions of the medical officer or officers, superintendent, or matron.
