PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

IT is hereby notified for general information that, at the request of the Associated Banks, it has been arranged that, from and after the 14th September proximo, applications for local Bank Holidays will not be submitted to the Governor in Council unless the Associated Banks shall have first signified their concurrence. "THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885."

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (49 Vict. No. 862), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of the said section 29 in the

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than seven boys for more than fifty-six hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That none of such boys who are paid weekly wages shall be so employed without receiving overtime payment for the extra work they are called upon to perform.
3. That none of such boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE EDUCATION ACT
1872" AMENDED.

WHEREAS by the 18th section of *The Education Act 1872* it was enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that clause 19 of section 18 of the Regulations under *The Education Act 1872* be rescinded, and that the following clauses be added thereto, that is to say:—

REGULATION XVIII.—TRAINING.

19. Persons other than students may on payment of a fee of £12 12s. be admitted to the second year's course of instruction, or on payment of a fee of £3 3s. to the course of instruction at the Training College in theory and practice of teaching.

20. Such persons must be at least eighteen years of age, of good character, must satisfy the principal of the college that they are qualified to profit by the lectures, and must undertake to comply while in attendance with the rules of the college.

21. Such persons may be suspended from attendance at the lectures or may be required to discontinue the course for repeated unpunctuality, absence from lectures, or breach of the rules of the college.

22. Persons who have paid the fee of £12 12s., and complied during two consecutive terms with the conditions prescribed by clause 13 for students, will be admitted to the final examination for the trained teacher's certificate without further payment.

23. Persons who have paid the fee of £3 3s. will, on production of a certificate signed by the principal stating that they have complied during two consecutive terms with the rules of the college as to attendance at the lectures in theory and practice of teaching and at the practising schools, be admitted without further payment to the final examination in theory and practice of teaching.

24. Persons other than students who either pass the final examination for the trained teacher's certificate or that in theory and practice of teaching will be awarded special certificates

stating what subjects they have passed in and to what extent they have been trained, but such special certificates will not render the holders eligible for employment in State schools.

25. Persons who have obtained such special certificates may be awarded the Department's trained teacher's certificate on producing satisfactory evidence that they have passed at some examination or examinations of the Department or of the Melbourne University in all the subjects in which students in training are required to pass during the whole of their course in order to obtain the same certificate, and that such examinations were of at least equal difficulty with those passed by students.

PUPIL SURVEYORS.

Conditions.

An applicant for appointment must be not more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession. He will also be required to produce satisfactory evidence of having received a good general education, including a competent knowledge of euclid, algebra, and arithmetic, also a specimen of his plan drawing.

Competitive Examination.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination on a date of which he will be duly notified—subjects, plane trigonometrical computation, plotting, and plan drawing—when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Board of Examiners will be recommended for appointment in the order of merit, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

Term of Service.

The pupil's service in the department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting from field-book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time is not deemed satisfactory he will be liable to be dispensed with, but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing examination for land surveyors (without payment of fees), for the purpose of obtaining the formal certificate of the Board of Examiners as to his qualifications.

Remuneration.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £52; 2nd year, £58; 3rd year, £66; 4th year, £72.

Subject to Regulations.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Public Service of Victoria dated 31st December 1884, or any subsequent substituted or additional regulations.

Bonds required.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds for £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties.

There is some trade in schooners from San Francisco with these islands, but the vessels are under the American flag. Upon making inquiries here, I find that the vessels under the British flag trading there usually hail from the Australian Colonies.

Sir, The Imperial German Government has declared the port of Yalint to be the only port of entry of the Marshall Islands. The masters of those ships which come from any port outside the said islands have to enter the port of Yalint, and to report to the Imperial Commissioner at said last-mentioned port before touching any other one of the said islands.

Any violation of any of the foregoing provisions shall be punishable by fine not exceeding 6,000 marks. This fine may be enforced against the ship and cargo without regard to the owner of the same, and the forfeiture of the ship may be adjudged.

It being desirable that all parties concerned receive timely notice of the foregoing, I would most respectfully request you to have the masters of such ships as are under your official control and may go to the Marshall Islands informed of the above requirements.

CHIEF SECRETARY'S DEPARTMENT.—REGULATIONS FOR PUPIL-COMPUTERS AND OBSERVERS AT THE MELBOURNE OBSERVATORY.

Conditions.

AN applicant for appointment must not be more than twenty years nor less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper discharge of his duty. He will also be required to produce satisfactory evidence of having received a fair general education, including a good knowledge of euclid, algebra, and arithmetic, and to furnish a specimen of his drawing, either plain or freehand.

Competitive Examination.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, the applicant will be required to undergo a competitive examination, on a date of which he will be duly notified. The subjects of such examination will be arithmetical and plane trigonometrical computation, and the use of logarithms. The competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Board of Examiners will be recommended for appointment in the order of merit. If any candidate shall have already passed as a pupil-surveyor he will be eligible, without further examination, for appointment, according to the position he may have attained at such examination.

Term of Service.

The pupil's service in the Observatory shall be for a term of four years, during which time he will be trained in computing, observing, astronomical surveying, and Observatory work generally. Should the pupil, however, be found unfit for such work, or his progress in the same be unsatisfactory, his services may be dispensed with at a month's notice. Pupils continuing the full four years, if their service shall have been satisfactory, and if they pass the examination under the regulations of the Public Service Board for appointment to the Clerical Division, will be eligible for appointment as Junior Computers and Observers of the 5th Class of the Chief Secretary's Department, in the order of their merit, and in accordance with the provisions of the regulations aforesaid.

Remuneration.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £52; 2nd year, £58; 3rd year, £66; 4th year, £72.

Subject to Regulations.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the Observatory, he shall be subject to the regulations for the Public Service of Victoria, dated 31st December 1884, or any subsequent substituted or additional regulations made under *The Public Service Act 1883*.

WATER SUPPLY TO SHIPPING.

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling (except as hereinafter mentioned) on the annual value of all the rateable property in the Yarrowonga Urban District to be supplied, otherwise than by measure, with water for domestic purposes, according to the valuation for the time being of all the lands and tenements comprised within the said urban district for the municipal rates of the Shire of Yarrowonga, in Yarrowonga, is hereby made for the year commencing on the first day of January 1888, and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1888. Provided that the sum of One pound shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated by the Trust within the Urban District of Yarrowonga, when the valuation of such house or tenement shall be under the sum of Twenty pounds per annum.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND
MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR PUBLIC
RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF YARRAWONGA.

WE, James Everist, William Cole Green, William Morriss, Thomas Elvin Bradstreet, Edward Joseph Provot, Maiben Cunningham, Motherwell Crockett, and William Frederick Hemming, the duly appointed committee of management of the land temporarily reserved, by Order of 23rd January 1888, as a site for public recreation in the town of Yarrowonga, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*.—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve, which is divided into the following divisions:—1st. Grand stand; 2nd. Grand stand reserve; 3rd. Residue of the reserve, shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as the reserve may be set apart for public sports, cricket matches, football matches, cycling, bowls, &c.

2. All persons paying for admission to any of the divisions of the reserve shall be supplied with a ticket of admission which shall on demand be produced, and (if required) be surrendered to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand the production or surrender of same.

3. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, fences, gates, or buildings, or put offensive matter in water fountains, or any vessels, in the reserve.

5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or damage in any way the same, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

6. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, pigs, or any other animal whatsoever.

7. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.

8. No person shall engage in any game or sport in the reserve on a Sunday.

9. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management.

10. Any person who may have obtained the consent, in writing, of the committee of management to the erection within the reserve of any building for special purposes shall be bound by any order made by the committee of management in regard thereto, and shall remove the same and all debris, as directed by the committee of management before the surrender of his deposit.

11. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees or shrubs.

12. Any person committing in the reserve or in any of the buildings any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding that such person may have purchased a ticket for admission thereto or to any part thereof:—1st. Assaulting any person; 2nd. Being drunk; 3rd. Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match; sports, &c., or trespassing upon the running ground when any race is being run; 4th. Using profane or abusive language, or behaving improperly or riotously; 5th. Not surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other authorized person any ticket duly authorizing admission to that part where such person shall be found.

13. The following fees may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the committee of management shall appoint:—For the admission of every person to the 1st division of the reserve, a sum not exceeding Ten shillings; for the admission of every person to the 2nd division of the reserve, a sum not exceeding Five shillings; for the admission of every person to the third division of the reserve, a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

14. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, or enclosure in the reserve on the occasion of any public sports, cricket, or football matches, may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding Ten pounds sterling, which the committee of management may determine, in the way of a guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, or enclosure; and the committee of management may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by any such stand, building, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money so deposited by such person as for liquidated damages.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON.
BYE-LAW No. 5.
A Bye-law of the Shire of Shepparton, made under section 479 of "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 5, for regulating the Shepparton Shire Municipal Cattle Market, and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, or in the immediate approaches thereto, and for fixing the days and hours during each day on which the market shall be held, for licensing yards and premises within the shire for the sale of cattle, and for fixing the dues to be paid for such licenses.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Shepparton order as follows:—
 1. That the Municipal Cattle Market shall be open daily for the reception, delivery, and sale of cattle and other live stock on every lawful day until 7 p.m.
 2. That on application the Council may license any yards or premises situated outside a radius of seven miles from Shepparton.

That the sum of One pound sterling per annum shall be the amount to be paid for each yard or premises so licensed.

That the word "Inspector" shall mean the collector or person appointed to collect the stallages, rents, or tolls authorized by the "Local Government Act 1874," and shall include the assistants of the inspector.

That there shall be appointed for such Cattle Market an Inspector thereof, whose duties shall be as follows:—

- i. To see that this bye-law and the provisions of the "Local Government Act 1874," relating to markets, are duly observed.
- ii. To demand and receive all market tolls and dues.
- iii. To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of parties bringing stock to the market for sale in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such inspector to be most convenient, and to prevent any unbroken horses or cattle from being roped within the market yards before five o'clock p.m. on the days of sale.
- iv. To preserve order and cleanliness within such market, and to remove or cause to be removed therefrom any person creating a riot or disturbance, or cursing or swearing, or using any gross or indecent language, or being guilty of gross or indecent conduct therein, and, if directed, to take legal proceedings against such person.
- v. Notwithstanding anything herein contained as to hours during which the market shall be open, the market inspector shall at all times give such facilities for the reception and delivery of stock as may in any case be actually necessary.

That no person shall release any stock from the market, or shall remove the same from one part of the market to another, without the authority of the inspector.

That every person placing stock in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls, dues, and charges accruing thereon, and in no case shall any stock be taken out of the market until all tolls, dues, and charges payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied.

That if any stock brought to the market for sale are not removed within twenty-four hours after the close of the market, such stock shall be provided with sufficient food by the person placing or entering them in the market for sale, or by the inspector at the expense of the person placing or entering them in the said market for sale (in case the name and address of the purchaser of such stock, if sold, cannot be ascertained).

That certain pens in the market shall be set apart for the reception of cattle for sale otherwise than by auction. Such pens shall be known as the private pens, and no cattle placed in the private pens shall be offered by auction until after the conclusion of the sales by auction of all similar stock on the day in which such cattle are entered for sale.

That certain lines of pens beginning at B, C, D, E, F, and numbered from 1 to 19, shall be for the reception of fat cattle only, and the whole of the balance of the cattle pens shall be set apart for the reception of horned cattle of all denominations for sale by auction.

That the inspector or his assistants shall inquire of every person in charge of cattle brought to the market for sale whether such cattle are for sale by auction or not, and in case of a negative answer, shall place such cattle in the private pens.

That all cattle brought to the market for sale shall be placed in pens, and that no person shall be permitted to remove cattle from one pen to another except with the consent of the inspector that in case of any dispute arising as to overcrowding of pens, or as to priority of occupancy, the inspector shall alone be competent to decide, and the disputants shall be bound by his decision.

That the inspector shall have power to remove, or order to be removed, cattle from one pen to another, and that any orders he gives in that respect shall be promptly carried out, on pain of removal of the owner and cattle from the market.

That the whole of cattle other than the fat cattle pens and the pens of cattle for private sale shall be offered by auctioneers in numerical order, beginning at the lowest number, and that no auctioneer shall be allowed to occupy more than six minutes in offering any one pen of cattle for sale. In case any auctioneer has not disposed of the whole of the cattle in his hands in the pen at the expiration of such six minutes, the cattle in his hands not disposed of shall not again be offered by auction until all other similar stock that day in the market for disposal by auction have been offered for sale.

That all auctioneers who have horses to dispose of by auction shall offer the stock placed in their hands in turn, and no auctioneer shall be permitted to occupy more than ten minutes in offering any horse or horses by auction while any other auctioneers who have horses to dispose of by auction are present, except with the consent of the whole of such other auctioneers, and in no case shall more than one auctioneer be permitted to offer horses for sale by auction at the same time. In case of any dispute arising as to priority of right to offer by auction the inspector's decision shall be final. In case of any auctioneer wilfully infringing or attempting to infringe this rule, he shall be debarred from offering any other horses by auction until after all the other auctioneers have finished offering the horse stock in their hands for sale by auction.

That all horses for sale by auction shall be paraded in a shed or ring in front of a rostrum to be erected.

That no cattle, sheep, or horses which have been placed in any auctioneer's hands for sale shall be permitted to leave the market without the production of a pass from the auctioneer in whose hands they were placed for sale.

That the sales by auction on sale days in the said market shall commence not later than the hours hereinafter mentioned:—Of sheep and lambs, 11 a.m.; of fat cattle, 12 noon; of other horned cattle, 12.30 p.m.; of horses, 3 p.m.

That any person or persons who may obstruct the inspector or his assistants in the performance of his or their duty, or shall release any stock from the market, or shall remove the same from one part of the market to another without the authority of the inspector, or shall wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, or premises of the market, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Five pounds, and in addition thereto be required to make good any such damage at his or their private expense.

That the amounts set out in the schedule hereunder written shall be the fees or dues payable by every person exposing or offering for sale or selling any cattle of the descriptions therein mentioned in such market or the immediate approaches thereto, or who shall use for the sale of any such cattle any yards or premises within the municipal district of the said shire and outside such market.

BYE-LAW No. 6.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Shepparton, made under sub-section 7 of section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," for authorizing the issue of licenses to auctioneers, empowering them to sell in the Shepparton Shire Municipal Cattle Market and immediate approaches thereto, and for fixing the amount of annual license to be paid for such license.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Shepparton order as follows:—

1. Every auctioneer desirous of exercising his vocation within the Shepparton Shire Municipal Cattle Market and its immediate approaches shall, on obtaining the consent in writing of the Council of the Shire of Shepparton, be authorized to sell in the

said market and approaches thereto, subject to the provisions of any bye-law now or hereafter to be in force in the said shire for the regulation and government of the said market.

2. That the sum of Two pounds sterling shall be the amount of the annual license-fee chargeable for the issue of a license authorizing an auctioneer to sell in the said market and its approaches, provided that the fee for such license shall only be in proportion to the period from which such license shall be issued to the period at which it shall expire, every such license expiring on the thirty-first of December in each year.

3. No auctioneer shall exercise his vocation within the said market or its immediate approaches without such consent, nor otherwise than in accordance with the terms thereof.

BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD.

BYE-LAW No. 35.

A BYE-LAW of the Borough of Daylesford made under the provisions of section 45 of the Factories and Shops Act 1885, No. 862, and numbered 35 for providing for the closing of all shops within the borough, other than those mentioned in the 3rd Schedule to the said Factories and Shops Act, for one afternoon in each week, and for imposing penalties on any shopkeeper failing or neglecting to close his shop in accordance with the provisions contained therein, or in accordance with the provisions of the said Factories and Shops Act 1885.

Whereas by the 45th section of the Factories and Shops Act 1885 it is enacted that any municipal council may from time to time if it think fit, make, alter, and repeal bye-laws in and for the municipality, for *inter alia* closing all shops within its municipality, other than those mentioned in the 3rd Schedule to the said Act for one afternoon in each week, and imposing penalties not exceeding Ten pounds on any shopkeeper failing to close his shop in accordance with the provisions of the said Factories and Shops Act or of any bye-law made in pursuance thereof, provided always that before any such bye-law be made a petition certified to by the municipal clerk as being signed by a majority of the shopkeepers substantially interested and affected thereby shall be presented to the said municipal council; and

Whereas a petition certified to by Donald McLeod, town clerk to the Borough of Daylesford, as being signed by a majority of the shopkeepers substantially interested and affected thereby has been presented to the municipal council of the said Borough of Daylesford, praying that a bye-law may be made for the closing of all shops within the said municipality (other than those mentioned in the 3rd Schedule to the said Act) for one afternoon in each week.

Now therefore the Council of the Borough of Daylesford, in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in it by the 45th section of the Factories and Shops Act 1885, doth order as follows:—

That all shops within the municipality of the Borough of Daylesford (other than those mentioned in the 3rd Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1885) shall close on each and every Wednesday afternoon at the hour of One o'clock.

Provided nevertheless that such shops may be kept open on the Wednesday afternoon of any week in which there occurs any of the following public holidays, namely, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, the Queen's Birthday, and the Prince of Wales Birthday.

Any shopkeeper failing or neglecting to close his shop in accordance with the provisions of this bye-law of the Borough of Daylesford numbered 35, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and for every second or subsequent offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Any shopkeeper, unless duly licensed pursuant to a bye-law made under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Act 1885, who fails or neglects to close his shop in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, shall be liable for a first offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty shillings, and for any second or subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
