PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

IT is hereby notified for general information that, at the request of the Associated Banks, it has been arranged that, from and after the 14th September proximo, applications for local Bank Holidays will not be submitted to the Governor in Council unless the Associated Banks shall have first signified their concurrence. Such applications should, therefore, after that date be made to the managers of the local banks, who will communicate with the Associated Banks in Melbourne.

With regard to local "Public" Holidays, it is pointed out that the proclamation of a Public Holiday gives no legal sanction for the closing of municipal offices, warehouses, shops or other places of private business, but affects "Government" offices only; and accordingly local public holidays will not, as a rule, be appointed unless the occasion be of sufficient importance to warrant the closing of the banks in the town or place concerned.

Applications for Public Holidays should be forwarded to this office through the local Municipal Councils, at least ten days before the date of the desired holiday.

WHEREAS by a Statute of the Parliament of Victoria No. 310, intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting the Public Health*, it was enacted that in case it should appear to the Governor in Council that burials in any cemetery, under any law relating to public cemeteries, or in any other burial-ground or place of burial whatsoever, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, the Governor in Council might, by an Order to be published in the *Government Gazette*, direct that after a time to be mentioned in such Order, not being less than three months from the date thereof, burials in such cemetery, or burial-ground, or place of burial should be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in the same, or in any subsequent Order, and might from time to time postpone the time mentioned in such Order for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise vary any such Order, whether the time appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived: And whereas it appears to the Governor in Council expedient that burials in the grounds of the Roman Catholic Convent at Warrnambool shall be discontinued: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that all burials in the grounds of the Roman Catholic Convent at Warrnambool shall be wholly discontinued on and after the expiration of three months from the date of this Order.

And the Honorable John Lamont Dow, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"The Irrigation Act 1886."

**PROPOSED SHIRE OF BACCHUS MARSH IRRIGA-  
TION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.**

IN the matter of the Petition of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh Waterworks Trust, praying for the constitution of certain lands situate in the parishes of Korkuperrimul and Merrimu, in the county of Bourke, and the parishes of Parwan and Corrocburghap, in the county of Grant, in the Colony of Victoria, as an Irrigation and Water Supply District within the meaning of the said Act, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust for such district.

Pursuant to section 18 of the said Act, I hereby declare upon the said Petition the matters following, viz:—

1. That the proposed scheme or plan of works shall comprise:—
  - (a) A channel, with head sluice from the Werribee River, about three miles above Bacchus Marsh, for irrigating about 700 acres of land, and a service reservoir at Maddingley, supplied from the channel, for the domestic supply of the township of Bacchus Marsh, the town reticulation being connected with the reservoir.
  - (b) A weir across the Parwan Creek in the parish of Parwan, from whence will be cut a head channel, to maintain a supply in two distribution channels, which will irrigate about two hundred and fifty acres of land in the flats on both banks of the creek.
  - (c) A weir across the Lerderderg River, about three and a half miles north from Bacchus Marsh, and a head channel, therefrom, which will supply two distribution channels, one on either bank of the river, from which about twelve hundred acres of land can be irrigated.
2. That no portion of the works shall be either National or joint works; all the works shall be Trust works.
3. That the amount which it is proposed that the Board of Land and Works shall advance for the purposes of such Trust works, by way of loan, shall be Fourteen thousand nine hundred pounds (£14,900).
4. The rate of interest to be paid by the Trust upon such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.
5. That no portion of the proposed Trust's supply shall be derived from National works.
6. That the sources other than National or joint works from which the Trust will obtain its supply shall be—1st. The Werribee River, the quantity taken therefrom to be at the rate of 130 cubic feet per minute throughout the year, provided that the Trust shall at all times permit a volume of, at least, 65 cubic feet per minute to flow down the river past their offtake. 2nd. The Parwan Creek, two-thirds of the volume of which may at any season be diverted, but not in excess of 45 cubic feet per minute; and 3rd. The Lerderderg River, two-thirds of the volume of which may at any time be taken, but not in excess of 260 cubic feet per minute.
7. The powers of rating to be given to the Trust shall not exceed the sum of Two shillings in the £ upon the annual value of the property within the reticulation area of the township of Bacchus Marsh, and Four shillings in the £ upon the annual value of the remaining portions of the Irrigation and Water Supply District.

The births of 1,232 children, viz., 630 boys and 602 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of July. In the month of June 1,377 births were registered, or 145 more than in the month under review. The births were 349 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 120 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in July numbered 594, viz., 340 of males and 254 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 638, or 107 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in June by 36, but exceeded the average of July during the previous ten years by 108. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than that average by 18.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.15, and of deaths registered 1.52.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 64.2° on the 1st, and the lowest was 28.3° on the 27th. The lowest shade temperatures ever recorded in Melbourne since 1869 were 28.2° on the 7th and 28.1° on the 8th July 1886. The mean shade temperature of the month (48.4°) was eight-tenths of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (25.5°) took place on the 28th, viz., from a maximum of 56.5° to a minimum of 31.0°. The least range (6.0°) was on the 13th, viz., from a maximum of 48.4° to a minimum of 42.4°. The mean daily range was 13.6°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.378 inches on the 17th, and the lowest was 29.297 inches on the 13th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.942 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on 15 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.51 inches. The average rainfall in July during the previous ten years was 1.39 inches, or slightly lower than that in the month under notice. Fog occurred on 3 days during the month.

Males contributed 87 per cent., and females 43 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 32 per cent. to that mortality, as against 30 per cent. in July 1887, 30 per cent. in July 1886, 26 per cent. in July 1885, 39 per cent. in July 1884, 32 per cent. in July 1883, 34 per cent. in July 1882, 33 per cent. in July 1881, 36 per cent. in July 1880, and 29 per cent. in July 1879 and July 1878.

Twenty-nine deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a slater (an inmate of the Alfred Hospital), aged 75, a produce merchant, aged 77, and a female, aged 82, died of cancer; a brick-maker and a female, each aged 75, a female, aged 78, and a farmer, aged 84, of disease of heart; a gentleman, aged 76, a surgeon, aged 77, a laborer (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), aged 85, and a female, aged 88, of bronchitis; a female, aged 78, and a female, aged 87, of pneumonia; a half-pay officer, aged 79, of hæmaturia; a seaman (an inmate of the Immigrants' Home), aged 80, of diarrhoea; a gardener, aged 82, of rheumatism; a builder, aged 82, and a gardener (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), aged 83, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 82, of cystitis; a female, aged 88, of constipation; a female, aged 90, and a male, of no occupation, aged 97 (both inmates of the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor), of asthma; a farmer, aged 78, a bootmaker, aged 81, a stonebreaker (an inmate of the Benevolent Asylum), aged 83, a male, of no occupation, aged 85, a female, aged 86, a gentleman, aged 87, and a shepherd, aged 97, of old age.

Thirty-four deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which twenty-seven were set down to accident, two to homicide, and five to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 3 years, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a gate falling on him; a boy, aged 7, of rupture of the liver, occasioned by being knocked down by



a horse; a female, aged 50, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall; a carter, aged 55, of fracture of the skull, how caused not stated; a carter, aged 18, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 26, and a cordial manufacturer, aged 63, were killed by being thrown from vehicles; a boy, aged 15, was killed by a fall from a building; a seaman, aged 21, by falling on the deck of the barque *Inglicwood*; a female, aged 63, died of fracture of the arm, how caused not stated; a laborer, aged 43, was killed, a brick wall falling on him; a railway porter, aged 28, a laborer, aged 47, and a carriage-cleaner, aged 56, were passed over by railway trains; and a laborer, aged 24, succumbed to injuries consequent on being caught in machinery. A female, aged 60, died of injury to the mouth, a portion of a gate penetrating it; a male child, aged 2 years, of oedema of glottis, caused by drinking hot tea; a female child, aged 3 years, and a female, aged 30, died of burns, the latter through her clothes catching fire; a female child, aged 4, of scalds, a female child, aged 2 years, from the poisonous effects of eating phosphorus matches; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 35, was drowned in the River Yarra; a sailmaker, aged 27, was found drowned in Hobson's Bay; a male infant, aged 3 months, was overlain; a boy, aged 9, and a girl, aged 15, were suffocated by the inhalation of coal-gas whilst sleeping; and a male infant died of umbilical hemorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of a female infant, who died of fracture of the skull and suffocation, and of a female, aged 22, from criminal abortion, a verdict of wilful murder being brought in each case. Of the suicidal deaths, a restaurant-keeper, aged 45, shot himself in the head; a woman, aged 22, placed herself on the railway line; an accountant, aged 34, cut his throat; and two chemists, aged 29 and 38 respectively, poisoned themselves, the former with prussic acid, and the latter with chlorodyne.

One hundred and thirty-nine deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—69 in the Melbourne Hospital, 19 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 4 in the Children's Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 14 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital, 2 in the Protestant Refuge, and 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 190, of which 113, or 59 per cent., were of males, and 77, or 41 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 134 were under one year of age, 24 were between one and two, 15 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 404. Of these, 227, or 56 per cent., were males, and 177, or 44 per cent., were females; 17 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 23 were between fifteen and twenty, 35 were between twenty and twenty-five, 45 were between twenty-five and thirty, 26 were between thirty and thirty-five, 21 were between thirty-five and forty, 19 were between forty and forty-five, 29 were between forty-five and fifty, 34 were between fifty and fifty-five, 32 were between fifty-five and sixty, 39 were between sixty and sixty-five, 27 were between sixty-five and seventy, 22 were between seventy and seventy-five, 10 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 19 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the experience of the previous month, under the head of specific febrile or zymotic diseases, deaths from diphtheria fell from 16 to 14, and those from typhoid fever from 20 to 12. Under the head of local diseases, deaths from heart affections fell from 38 to 46, and those from bowel and stomach complaints from 59 to 43. On the other hand, deaths from kidney disorders rose from 15 to 20. Ten deaths of child-bearing women occurred during the month, or 6 less than in June. If these numbers be compared with the births registered during the same period, it will be found that 1 death of a mother took place in every 123 children born alive in the month under notice, as against 1 such death to every 86 children born alive in the previous month.

AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS.

MEMORANDUM.—At the early date at which the Agricultural Statistics are collected, it is impossible to obtain a reliable estimate of the produce of Hops, Tobacco, or Vines. The following information has been collected by circulars addressed to the growers by the Government Statist. In most cases these circulars have been responded to, but where no replies have been received, the produce has been estimated according to the average yield of the same crops prevailing in the district.

*A Regulation of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust, made under the 73rd section of "The Water Conservation Act 1887," for the imposing, levying, and receiving of rates.*

In pursuance of the powers granted or conferred by section 73 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust make the following Regulation:—

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such lands and tenements are situate.

2. All water supplied by the said Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for One thousand gallons or at such price as shall be specially agreed upon.

3. The abovementioned rate is for one year, commencing on the 1st January 1888 and ending on the 31st December 1888, and shall be payable by one instalment on the 1st of September.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect and recover the said rates.

**REGULATION No. 5.**

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling (except as hereinafter mentioned) on the annual value of all the rateable property in the Yarrowonga Urban District to be supplied, otherwise than by measure, with water for domestic purposes, according to the valuation for the time being of all the lands and tenements comprised within the said urban district for the municipal rates of the Shire of Yarrowonga, in Yarrowonga, is hereby made for the year commencing on the first day of January 1888, and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1888. Provided that the sum of One pound shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated by the Trust within the Urban District of Yarrowonga, when the valuation of such house or tenement shall be under the sum of Twenty pounds per annum.

2. Such rate shall be due and payable on the first day of January and the first day of July 1888.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and collect the said rate.

A By-law of the Borough of Sale, made under section 479 of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered eight, for establishing, controlling, and managing the Borough Market, and carrying out the purposes provided in Part XXI. of said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Sale order as follows:—

That the yards and buildings erected on the site reserved out of the Police Paddock at Sale, described in *Government Gazette* of 21st September 1883, page 2227, shall be the Borough Market place, and shall be open every day (Sundays and public holidays excepted) from nine a.m. to six p.m. during the months of April, May, June, July, August, and September, and to seven p.m. during the rest of the year, for the sale of cattle, subject to the payment of such tolls and dues as the Council of the Borough of Sale may from time to time by special order appoint.

That the said Council may, if it shall think fit, upon application, license yards and premises within the said borough for the sale of horses and pigs, and may at any time revoke and cancel any such licence.

That the sum of One pound (£1) per annum shall be paid for each such licence.

That the Council may appoint a market inspector and collector, whose duties shall be, *inter alia*, as follows:—

1. To see that the market regulations be observed.
2. To demand and receive all market tolls and dues, unless the same have been demised or let to farm to any person or persons, and pay same to the Town Clerk within forty-eight hours after receiving same.
3. To allot the principal and drafting yards, pens, &c., to the use of the parties bringing stock to the market for sale in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such inspector to be most convenient.
4. To preserve order, cleanliness, and regularity in the market, and to take proceedings against all persons causing a riot or disturbance, offending against decency, or in any manner or way provoking a breach of the peace within the precincts of the market.
5. To inspect all scales, weights, and measures used in the market, and to seize such as are found defective or fraudulent.

That every person who shall obstruct the inspector or his assistants in the performance of his or their duties, or shall release any stock from the market, or shall remove the same from one part of the market to another without the authority of the inspector, or shall wilfully damage any of the gates, fences, or premises of the market, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), and in addition thereto shall pay the cost of repairing or making good any such damage.

That any person who shall be found drunk or disorderly within the market, or cursing or swearing, or using profane, insulting, obscene, or abusive language therein, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence any sum not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

That the person or persons placing stock in the market for sale shall be responsible for all market dues and tolls accruing thereon, and in no case shall any cattle be taken out of the market until all dues, tolls, and charges payable thereon under this Bye-law shall have been first fully paid and satisfied.

That all cattle brought to the market for sale shall be yarded and removed by the times before specified respectively for the yarding and removing of cattle.

That sales of cattle by auction in the market shall take place in order of priority, to be determined in such manner as the said Council shall from time to time direct, and no auctioneer shall be entitled, without the consent of the other auctioneers present, to occupy the rostrum for a longer period than one hour at a time, but shall then, if required, give place to the next entitled to procedure, and any auctioneer failing to comply with this provision shall be deemed guilty of obstructing the inspector in the performance of his duties.

That the following tolls and dues shall be payable by every person exposing or offering for sale, or selling any cattle, in the said market, viz. :-
