WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifty-first year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "*An Act to make Provision for the Indemnification by the Colony of Queensland of Her Majesty's Imperial Government against the Expenses of the Government of British New Guinea*," it is amongst other things provided that the said Act shall commence and take effect so soon as Her Majesty shall have assumed Sovereignty over the Territory aforesaid, and such assumption of Sovereignty shall have been proclaimed in the Colony of Queensland: Now, therefore, I, Sir ANTHONY MUSGRAVE, the Governor aforesaid, do hereby notify and proclaim that on Tuesday last, the fourth instant, the Officer appointed by Her Majesty to administer the Government of British New Guinea did, by Proclamation, a copy of which is hereto annexed, declare the Territory therein described to be part of the Queen's Dominions.

#### PROCLAMATION.

On behalf of Her Most Gracious Majesty Victoria, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, Empress of India, &c., &c.

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting.

In pursuance of instructions received by me from Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies, I, WILLIAM MACGREGOR, Doctor of Medicine, and Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, do hereby declare that the Territory and Islands hitherto known as the Protected Territory of New Guinea, that is to say, the southern and south-eastern shores of New Guinea from the 141st meridian of east longitude eastward as far as East Cape, and thence north-westward as far as the 8th parallel of south latitude in the neighbourhood of Mitre Rock together with the territory lying south of a line from Mitre Rock, proceeding along the said 8th parallel to the 147th degree of east longitude, then in a straight line in a north-westerly direction to the point of intersection of the 6th parallel of south latitude and of the 144th degree of east longitude, and continuing in a west-north-westerly direction to the point of intersection of the 5th parallel of south latitude and of the 141st degree of east longitude, together with the Trobriand, Woodlark, D'Entrecasteaux, and Louisiade Groups of Islands, and all other Islands lying between the 8th and 12th parallels of south latitude, and between the 141st and the 156th degrees of east longitude, and not forming part of the Colony of Queensland, and, furthermore, including all islands and Reefs lying in the Gulf of Papua to the northward of the 8th parallel of south latitude, and which are now under Her Majesty's protection, shall henceforth become and be and do hereby become and are part of the Queen's Dominions.

#### PROCLAMATION.

By WILLIAM MACGREGOR, Esquire, Doctor of Medicine, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, and Administrator of British New Guinea.

WHEREAS I have, by my Proclamation bearing even date herewith, declared that the Territory and Islands therein described shall thenceforth be and become part of the Queen's Dominions: And whereas, in Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom bearing date the eighth day of June 1888, it is provided that upon such Proclamation such Territory and Islands shall be erected into a separate Possession and Government under the name of British New Guinea: And whereas Her Majesty has by Commission issued under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet appointed me to be Administrator of British New Guinea: Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM MACGREGOR, the Administrator aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that I have this day taken the prescribed Oaths before Anthony Musgrave, Esquire, and that I have accordingly assumed the said office of Administrator of British New Guinea.

WHEREAS, by my Proclamation bearing even date herewith, I did, on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen, declare that the Territory and Islands therein described should thenceforth form and become part of Her Majesty's Dominions: And whereas Her Majesty has, by Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, bearing date the eighth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, provided for the Government of the said Territory and Islands, which by the said Proclamation and Letters Patent aforesaid are constituted and erected into a Separate Possession and Government by the name of British New Guinea: And whereas it is further provided that such Letters Patent shall be read and proclaimed at such place within the Possession as the Administrator of the Government thereof shall think fit, and that they shall thereafter be of full force and effect therein: And

whereas Her Majesty has been further pleased, by Commission passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, bearing date the ninth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, to appoint me to be Administrator of the said Possession of British New Guinea: Now, therefore, I, the said WILLIAM MACGREGOR, having this day publicly read the said Letters Patent and Commission, do hereby proclaim and publish the same in the words and figures following, respectively:—

BRITISH NEW GUINEA.

LETTERS PATENT PASSED UNDER THE GREAT SEAL OF THE UNITED KINGDOM FOR ERECTING CERTAIN BRITISH TERRITORY IN NEW GUINEA AND THE ADJACENT ISLANDS INTO A SEPARATE POSSESSION AND PROVIDING FOR THE GOVERNMENT THEREOF.

*Dated* Victoria, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith, 8th June, 1888. *Empress of India:* To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting.

*Preamble.*

Whereas divers of Our subjects have heretofore resorted to and settled in divers places within the Territory and Islands hereunder described, in which there is no civilised Government:

*Boundaries.*

And whereas the said Territory and Islands will shortly become Our Possessions, and part of Our Dominions: that is to say, the southern and south-eastern shores of New Guinea, from the 141st meridian of east longitude eastward as far as East Cape, and thence north-westward as far as the 8th parallel of south latitude in the neighbourhood of Mitre Rock, together with the territory lying south of a line from Mitre Rock, proceeding along the said 8th parallel to the 147 degree of east longitude, then in a straight line in a north-westerly direction to the point of intersection of the 6th parallel of south latitude and of the 144th degree of east longitude, and continuing in a west-north-westerly direction to the point of intersection of the 5th parallel of south latitude and of the 141st degree of east longitude, together with the Trobriand, Woodlark, D'Entrecasteaux, and Louisiade Groups of Islands, and all other Islands lying between the 8th and the 12th parallels of south latitude, and between the 141st and the 155th degrees of east longitude, and not forming part of Our Colony of Queensland; and furthermore including all Islands and Reefs lying in the Gulf of Papua to the northward of the 8th parallel of south latitude:

And whereas the said Territory and Islands will not have been acquired by cession or conquest, and will not be within the jurisdiction of the Legislature of any British Possession:

And whereas We are minded, as and when the said Territory and Islands shall become part of Our Dominions, to erect the same into a separate Possession, and to provide for the Government thereof:

*Possession constituted and erected.*

Now, therefore, We do, by these Our Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, as and when the same shall become part of Our Dominions, constitute and erect the said Territory and Islands as above described into a separate Possession and Government by the name of British New Guinea.

*Office of Administrator constituted.*

II. We do hereby order and declare that there shall be in and over British New Guinea aforesaid (which is hereinafter called the Possession) an Officer charged with the duty of administering the Government thereof in Our name and on Our behalf, and that such Officer shall in the first instance, be styled the Administrator, and that appointments to the said office shall be made by Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet.

*Provision for appointment of a Governor or Lieutenant-Governor.*

III. And We do further order and declare that if at any time we shall see fit to appoint a Governor or Lieutenant-Governor to administer the Government of the Possession, appointments to such offices shall be made by Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet, and that every Governor and Lieutenant-Governor so appointed shall have and may exercise all the powers and authorities hereby vested in the Administrator.

*Administrator's powers and authorities.*

IV. We do hereby authorise, empower, and command the Administrator to do and execute all things that belong to his said office, according to the tenor of these Our Letters Patent and of such Commission as may be issued to him under our Sign Manual and Signet, and according to such instructions as may from time to time be given to him under Our Sign Manual and Signet, or by Our Order in Our Privy Council, or by Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and to such Laws as are now or shall hereafter be in force in the Possession.

*Administrator's Commission to be published.—Oaths to be taken by Administrator.—Imperial Act, 31 and 32 Vict., c. 72.*

V. And We do by these Our Letters Patent declare Our will and pleasure as follows:—

VI. Every person appointed to fill the office of Administrator shall, with all due solemnity, before entering on any of the duties of his office, cause the Commission appointing him to be Administrator to be read and published within the Possession, and he shall then and there take the Oath of Allegiance, in the form provided by an Act passed in the Session holden in the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Our reign, intituled, "An Act to amend the Law relating to Promissory Oaths;" and likewise the usual Oath for the due execution of the office of Governor or Administrator of one of Our Colonies, and for the due and impartial administration of justice, which Oaths the Senior Officer in Our service then present is hereby required to administer.

*Public Seal.*

VII. The Administrator shall keep and use the Public Seal of the Possession, for sealing all things whatsoever that shall pass the said seal: and until a Public Seal shall be provided for the Possession the Seal of the Administrator shall be used as the Public Seal of the Possession.

*Executive Council.*

VIII. There shall be an Executive Council for the Possession to advise and assist the Administrator, and the said Council shall consist of such persons as We shall direct by any Instructions under Our Sign Manual and Signet, and all such persons shall hold their places in the said Council during Our pleasure.

*Legislative Council.*

IX. There shall be a Legislative Council of the Possession, and the said Council shall consist of the Administrator and such persons, not being less than two at any time, as We shall direct by any Instructions under Our Sign Manual and Signet, and all such persons shall hold their places in the said Council during Our pleasure.

*Recites "British Settlements Act, 1887" (50 and 51 Vict., cap. 54).—Powers of Legislative Council.*

X. In pursuance of and without prejudice to the powers vested in Us by "The British Settlements Act of 1887," We do hereby delegate to the persons who shall from time to time compose the said Legislative Council full power and authority to establish all such laws and institutions, and to constitute such Courts and Officers, and to make such provisions and regulations for the proceedings in such Courts, and for the administration of justice, as may be necessary for the peace, order, and good government of Our subjects within the Possession or within any territory which may, at any time, be part of or dependent upon the same. Subject nevertheless to all such conditions, provisions, and limitations as We shall see fit to prescribe from time to time by Our Order in Our Privy Council, or by this or any other Instrument under Our said great Seal, or by the Instructions under Our Sign Manual and Signet, bearing even date herewith, or by any other Instructions that We may hereafter make or issue under Our Sign Manual and Signet.

*Prohibiting the enactment of differential duties.*

XI. The said Legislative Council shall not have power to establish any Law whereby duties may be imposed upon the importation into the Possession of any article, the produce or manufacture of, or imported from, any particular country or place, which shall not be equally imposed on the importation of the like article, the produce or manufacture of, or imported from, all other countries and places whatsoever.

*Providing against the purchase of land except through the Government.*

XII. The said Legislative Council is hereby required to establish a Law providing that no purchase of land within the Possession be allowed to be made by private persons, except from the Administrator, or other authorized officer of the Government, or from purchasers from him.

*Restricting the deportation of natives, and trading with natives in arms, explosives, or intoxicants.*

XIII. The said Legislative Council is hereby further required to establish Laws providing—

- (1) That no deportation of natives be allowed either from one part of the Possession to another, or to any place beyond the Possession;
- (2) That no trading with natives be allowed in any firearm, ammunition, explosive, intoxicating liquors, or opium; except under such conditions as may be established by Order of Ourselves in Our Privy Council, or by some law of the Possession which has been reserved for the signification of Our pleasure, and assented to Ourselves in Our Privy Council.

*No law to take effect until assented to and published.*

XIV. No law established by the said Legislative Council shall take effect unless the Administrator shall have assented thereto on Our behalf, and shall have signed the same in token of such assent, nor until the same shall have been published in the Possession by his authority.

*Disallowance of laws.*

XV. We do hereby reserve to Ourselves, Our heirs and successors, full power and authority, and Our and their undoubted right to disallow any such Law, and to signify such disallowance through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State. Every such disallowance shall take effect from the time when the same shall be published by the Administrator in the Possession.

*Administrator and Legislative Council to observe Instructions.*

XVI. In the transaction of business and making of Laws the Administrator and Legislative Council shall conform to the Instructions from Us under Our Sign Manual and Signet bearing even date herewith, and to any other Instructions that We may hereafter make or issue under Our Sign Manual and Signet.

*Civil List.*

XVII. There shall be payable to Us, Our heirs and successors, every year, out of the Public Revenues of the Possession, the following sums for the salaries of the several officers hereunder mentioned, that is to say:—

Administrator	£1,500
Private Secretary	300
Judicial Officer	1,000
Secretary to Government	500

*Administrator empowered to make grants of Lands.*

XVIII. The Administrator, in Our name and on Our behalf, may make and execute under the Public Seal, grants and dispositions of any lands within the Possession which may be lawfully granted or disposed of by Us; provided that every such grant or disposition be made in conformity with some Law in force in the Possession.

*And to appoint Judges and other Officers.*

XIX. The administrator may, in Our name and on Our behalf, constitute and appoint all such judges, commissioners, justices of the Peace, and other necessary officers and Ministers, as may be lawfully constituted or appointed by Us, all of whom, unless otherwise provided by law, shall hold their offices during our pleasure.

*Suspension of Officers.*

XX. The Administrator may, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, suspend from the exercise of his office any person holding any office within the Possession, whether appointed by virtue of any Commission or Warrant from Us or in our name, or by any other mode of appointment. Every such suspension shall continue and have effect only until Our pleasure therein shall be signified to the Administrator. In proceeding to any such suspension, the Administrator is strictly to observe the directions in that behalf given to him by any Instructions as aforesaid.

*Grant of Pardons—Remission of Fines—Pardon—Banishment Prohibited—Exception—Political Offenders.*

XXI. When any crime has been committed within the Possession, or for which the offender may be tried therein, the Administrator may, as he shall see occasion, in Our name and on Our behalf, grant a pardon to any accomplice in such crime who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of the principal offender, or of any one of such offenders, if more than one; and further, may grant to any offender convicted in any Court, or before any Judge or other Magistrate, within the Possession, a pardon, either free or subject to lawful conditions, or any remission of the sentence passed on such offender, or any respite of the execution of such sentence, for such period as the Administrator thinks fit, and may remit any fines, penalties, or forfeitures due or accrued to Us. Provided always, that the Administrator shall in no case, except where the offence has been of a political nature unaccompanied by any other grave crime, make it a condition of any pardon or remission of sentence that the offender shall be banished from or shall absent himself or be removed from the Possession.

*Succession to Government—Senior Member of Executive Council—Proviso—Oaths of Office.*

XXII. Whenever the office of Administrator is vacant, or if the Administrator become incapable or be absent from the Possession, except as hereinafter provided, then such Person or Persons as We may appoint under Our Sign Manual and Signet, and in default of any such appointment the Senior Member of the Executive Council shall, during Our pleasure administer the Government of the Possession, first taking the Oaths hereinbefore directed to be taken by the Administrator and in the manner herein prescribed; which being done, We do hereby authorize, empower, and command every such person as aforesaid to do and execute, during Our pleasure, all things that belong to the office of Administrator, according to the tenor of these Our Letters Patent, and according to Our Instructions as aforesaid, and the Laws of the Possession.

*Appointment of Deputies to Administrator.*

XXIII. In the event of the Administrator having occasion, in the interest of Our Service, at any time to visit any place beyond the limits of the Possession, in pursuance of any Instructions from Us, or through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, or with the approval of the Governor of Our Colony of Queensland, and at any time when the Administrator is within the Possession, he may by an instrument under the Public Seal of the Possession appoint any person or persons to be his Deputy or Deputies within any part of the Possession, and in that capacity to exercise, during his pleasure, such of the powers hereby vested in the Administrator, except the powers of suspension and pardon, as the Administrator shall think fit to assign to him or them. The appointment of such Deputy or Deputies shall not affect the exercise by the Administrator himself of any of his powers or authorities. Every such Deputy shall, in the discharge of his office, conform to and observe all such Instructions as the Administrator shall address to him for his guidance.

*Officers and others to obey Administrator.*

XXIV. And We do hereby require and command all Our Officers and Ministers, Civil and Military, and all other the inhabitants of the Possession, to be obedient, aiding and assisting unto the Administrator and to any person for the time being administering the Government of the Possession.

*Term "Administrator" explained.*

XXV. In these Our Letters Patent, the term "Administrator" shall mean the person for the time being administering the Government of the Possession.

*Powers reserved to revoke, alter, or amend the present Letters Patent.*

XXVI. And We do hereby reserve to Ourselves, Our heirs and successors, full power and authority from time to time to revoke, alter, or amend these Our Letters Patent as to Us or them shall seem fit.

*Proclamation of Letters Patent.*

XXVII. And We do direct and enjoin that these Our Letters Patent shall be read and proclaimed at such place within the Possession as the Administrator shall think fit, and that they shall thenceforth have full force and effect therein.

And whereas by Our said Letters Patent we have made provision for the office of Administrator in and over Our said Possession of British New Guinea (therein and hereinafter called the Possession):

And whereas by Our said Letters Patent We have authorized and commanded the Administrator to do and execute all things that belong to his said office, according to the tenor of Our said Letters Patent, and of such Commission as may be issued to him under Our Sign Manual and Signet, and according to such Instructions as may from time to time be given to him under Our Sign Manual and Signet, or by Our Order in Our Privy Council, or by Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and to such laws as are now or shall hereafter be in force in the Possession:

*Appointment of William Macgregor, Esquire, M.D., C.M.G., to Administer the Government.*

*Officers, &c., to give obedience.*

Instructions to Our Administrator in and over Our Possession of British New Guinea, and to any other Officer for the time being administering the Government of Our said Possession.

Given at Our Court at Balmoral, this Eighth day of June 1888, in the Fifty-first year of Our Reign.

*Preamble—Recites Letters Patent of even date.*

Whereas by certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing even date herewith, We have provided, as and when the same shall become part of Our Dominions, for the erection into a separate Possession and Government by the name of British New Guinea of certain Territory and Islands in and adjacent to New Guinea and in Our said Letters Patent more particularly described.

And whereas by Our said Letters Patent We have made provision for the office of Administrator (therein and hereinafter called the Administrator) in and over Our said Possession of British New Guinea (therein and hereinafter called the Possession):

And whereas by Our said Letters Patent We have authorized and commanded the Administrator to do and execute all things that belong to his said office, according to the tenor of Our said Letters Patent and of such Commission as may be issued to him under Our Sign Manual and Signet, and according to such instructions as may from time to time be given to him under Our Sign Manual and Signet, or by Our Order in Our Privy Council, or by Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and to such Laws as are or shall hereafter be in force in the Possession.

And whereas We are minded to issue these Our Instructions under Our Sign Manual and Signet for the guidance and direction of the Administrator or other Officer for the time being administering the Government of the Possession:

Now, therefore, We do direct and enjoin, and declare Our will and pleasure as follows:—

*Terms "Administrator" and "Governor" explained.*

I. In these Our Instructions the term "the Administrator" shall, unless inconsistent with the context, include every person for the time being administering the Government of the Possession, and the term "the Governor" shall, unless inconsistent with the context, include every person for the time being administering the Government of Our Colony of Queensland.

*Administrator to correspond with and receive Instructions from the Governor.*

II. The Administrator shall correspond with the Governor on all subjects connected with his office, and shall transmit to him all official reports and information touching the same, and shall apply to the Governor for all such instructions as he may require for his guidance in the discharge of his office.

*Constitution of Executive Council.*

III. The Executive Council of the Possession shall consist of such persons as We may from time to time appoint by any Instructions or Warrant under Our Sign Manual and Signet, or as the Administrator, in pursuance of any Instructions from the Governor, may from time to time appoint by any Instrument under the Public Seal of the Possession.

*Extraordinary Members.*

Whenever upon any special occasion the Administrator desires to obtain the advice of any person within the Possession touching Our affairs, therein, he may, by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the Possession, summon for such special occasion any such person as an Extraordinary Member of the Executive Council.

*Precedence.*

IV. The Members of the Executive Council shall have seniority and precedence as We may specially assign, and, in default thereof, according to the priority of their respective appointments, or if appointed by the same Instrument, according to the order in which they are named therein.

*Provisional appointment of Members.—Revocation of provisional appointments.*

V. In the event of the absence from the Possession of any Member of the Executive Council, the Administrator may, by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the Possession, appoint any person to act provisionally as a Member of the Council, in the room of the Member so absent and during his absence. The Administrator shall forthwith report to the Governor every such provisional appointment, and every such appointment may be disallowed by the Governor, or may be revoked by the Administrator by any such Instrument as aforesaid.

*Administrator to communicate Instructions to Executive Council.*

VI. The Administrator shall communicate these Our Instructions to the Executive Council, and likewise all such others, from time to time, as We may direct, or as he shall find convenient for Our service to impart to them.

*Executive Council not to proceed to business unless summoned by the Administrator's authority.—Quorum.*

VII. The Executive Council shall not proceed to the despatch of business unless duly summoned by authority of the Administrator, nor unless two Members at least (exclusive of himself or of the Member presiding) be present and assisting throughout the whole of the meetings at which any such business shall be despatched.

*Proviso—Absence of Members.*

It shall not be necessary to summon any Member who is absent more than ten miles from the place of meeting.

*Administrator to preside.*

VIII. The Administrator shall attend and preside at all meetings of the Executive Council, unless prevented by illness or other grave cause, and in his absence such Member as the Administrator may appoint, or in the absence of such Member the senior Member of the Council actually present, shall preside.

*Minutes of Executive Council to be kept.—To be transmitted to Governor twice a year.*

IX. Minutes shall be regularly kept of all the proceedings of the Executive Council; and at each meeting of the Council the Minutes of the last preceding meeting shall be read over and confirmed or amended as the case may require, before proceeding to the despatch of any other business.

Twice in each year the Administrator shall forward to the Governor, for transmission to Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, a full and exact copy of the said Minutes for the preceding half-year.

*Administrator to consult Executive Council.—Proviso.—Urgent cases.*

X. In the execution of the powers and authorities granted to the Administrator by Our said Letters Patent, he shall in all cases consult with the Executive Council, excepting only in cases which may be of such a nature that, in his judgment, Our Service would sustain material prejudice by consulting the Council thereupon, or when the matters to be decided shall be too unimportant to require their advice, or too urgent to admit of their advice being given by the time within which it may be necessary for him to act in respect of any such matters. In all such urgent cases he shall, at the earliest practicable period, communicate to the Executive Council the measures which he may so have adopted, with the reasons thereof.

*Administrator to propose questions.—No Member to propose a question, but may record application for so doing.*

XI. The Administrator shall alone be entitled to submit questions to the Executive Council for their advice or decision; but if the Administrator decline to submit any question to the Council when requested in writing by any Member so to do, it shall be competent to such Member to require that there be recorded upon the Minutes his written application, together with the answer returned by the Administrator to the same.

*Administrator may act in opposition to Executive Council.—Reporting grounds for so doing.—Members may record on minutes their adverse opinions.*

XII. The Administrator may, in exercise of the powers and authorities granted to him by our said Letters Patent, act in opposition to the advice given to him by the Members of the Executive Council, if he shall in any case deem it right to do so; but in any such case he shall fully report the matter to the Governor by the first convenient opportunity, with the grounds and reasons of his action. In every such case it shall be competent to any Member of the said Council to require that there be recorded at length on the Minutes the grounds of advice or opinion he may give upon the question.

*Constitution of Legislative Council.—Vacation of seats.*

XIII. The Legislative Council of the Possession shall consist of the Administrator, and of such persons, not being less than two or more than five in number at any one time, as We may from time to time appoint by any Instruction or Warrant under Our Sign Manual and Signet, or as the Administrator, in pursuance of any Instructions from the Governor, may from time to time appoint by any Instrument under the Public Seal of the Possession.

Every Member shall vacate his seat at the end of six years from the date of the Instrument by which he is appointed, but may be re-appointed.

*Extraordinary Members.*

XIV. Whenever upon any special occasion the Administrator wishes to obtain the advice of any person within the Possession touching any matters about to be brought before the Legislative Council, he may, by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the Possession, appoint any such person to be for such occasion an Extraordinary Member of the Legislative Council.

*Provisional appointments.—Provisional appointments to be immediately reported to Governor.—Revocation of such appointments.*

XV. If any Member of the Legislative Council shall die, or become incapable, or be suspended or removed from his seat in the Council, or be absent from the Possession, or be unable through residence at a distance to attend the meeting of the Council, or if he resign by writing under his hand, or if his seat become vacant, the Administrator may, by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the Possession, appoint in his place a fit person, to be provisionally a Member of the said Council.

Such person shall forthwith cease to be a Member if his appointment is disallowed by Us, or by the Governor, or if the Member in whose place he was appointed shall return to the Possession, or shall be released from suspension, or shall be declared by the Administrator capable of again discharging his functions in the said Council.

The Administrator shall, without delay, report to the Governor, for confirmation or disallowance, every provisional appointment of any person as a Member of the Legislative Council. Every such person shall hold his place in the Council during Our pleasure, and the Administrator may by any Instrument under the Public Seal revoke any such appointment.

*Council may transact business notwithstanding vacancies.—Quorum.*

XVI. The Legislative Council shall not be disqualified from the transaction of business on account of any vacancies among the Members thereof; but the said Council shall not be competent to act in any case unless (including the Administrator or the Member presiding) there be present at and throughout the meeting of the Council three Members at the least.

It shall not be necessary to summon any Member who is absent more than ten miles from the place of meeting.

*Precedence of Members.*

XVII. The Members of the Legislative Council among themselves shall take precedence as We may specially assign, and, in default thereof, according to the priority of their respective appointments, or if appointed by the same Instrument according to the order in which they are named therein.

*Administrator to preside in Council, or in his absence the Senior Member.*

XVIII. The Administrator shall attend and preside in the Legislative Council unless prevented by illness or other grave cause; and in his absence that Member shall preside who is first in precedence of those present.

*Questions to be decided by majority.—Casting vote.*

XIX. All questions proposed for debate in the Legislative Council shall be decided by the majority of votes, and the Administrator or the Member presiding shall have an original vote in common with the other Members of the Council, as also a casting vote, if upon any question the vote shall be equal.

*Standing Rules and Orders to be made.*

XX. The Legislative Council may make Standing Rules and Orders for the regulation of their own proceedings; provided such rules and orders be not repugnant to Our said Letters Patent, or to these Our Instructions, or to any other Instructions from Us under Our Sign Manual and Signet.

*Questions, &c., for debate.*

XXI. It shall be competent for any Member of the Legislative Council to propose any question for debate therein; and such question, if seconded by any other Member, shall be debated and disposed of according to the Standing Rules and Orders. Provided always, that every ordinance, vote, resolution, or question, the object or effect of which may be to dispose of or charge any part of Our revenue arising within the Possession, shall be proposed by the Administrator, unless the proposal of the same shall have been expressly allowed or directed by him.

*RULES AND REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH ORDINANCES ARE TO BE ENACTED.*

XXII. In the making of Laws the Administrator and the Council shall observe as far as practicable the following Rules:—

*Form of enactment.*

1. All Laws shall be styled "Ordinances," and the enacting words shall be, "enacted by the Administrator of British New Guinea, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof."

*Ordinances to be numbered and methodically arranged.*

2. All Ordinances shall be distinguished by titles, and shall be divided into successive clauses or paragraphs, numbered consecutively, and to every such clause there shall be annexed in the margin a short summary of its contents. The Ordinances of each year shall be distinguished by consecutive numbers, commencing in each year with the number one.

*Different subjects not to be mixed in same Ordinance.—No clause to be introduced foreign to what title of Ordinance imports.—Temporary Ordinances.*

3. Each different matter shall be provided for by a different Ordinance, without intermixing into one and the same Ordinance such things as have no proper relation to each other; and no clause is to be inserted in or annexed to any Ordinance which shall be foreign to what the title of such Ordinance imports, and no perpetual clause shall be part of any temporary Ordinance.

*Description of Ordinances not to be assented to.*

XXIII. The Administrator shall not, except in the cases hereunder mentioned, assent in Our name to any Ordinance of any of the following classes:—

1. Any Ordinance for the divorce of persons joined together in holy matrimony.
2. Any Ordinance whereby any grant of land or money, or other donation or gratuity, may be made to himself.
3. Any Ordinance whereby any increase or diminution may be made in the number, salary, or allowances of the public officers.



4. Any Ordinance affecting the Currency of the Possession or relating to the issue of bank notes.
5. Any Ordinance establishing any Banking Association, or amending or altering the constitution, powers or privileges of any Banking Association.
6. Any Ordinance imposing differential duties.
7. Any Ordinance the provisions of which shall appear inconsistent with obligations imposed upon Us by treaty.
8. Any Ordinance interfering with the discipline or control of Our forces by land or sea.
9. Any Ordinance of an extraordinary nature and importance, whereby Our prerogative or the rights and property of Our subjects not residing in the Possession, or the trade and shipping of Our United Kingdom and its Dependencies may be prejudiced.
10. Any Ordinance whereby persons not of European birth or descent may be subjected or made liable to any disabilities or restrictions to which persons of European birth or descent are not also subjected or made liable.
11. Any Ordinance authorizing the purchase of land by private persons, except from the Administrator or purchasers from him.
12. Any Ordinance providing for the deportation of natives either from one part of the Possession to another, or to places beyond the Possession.
13. Any Ordinance providing for the supply of arms, ammunition, intoxicants, or opium to natives.
14. Any Ordinance containing provisions to which Our assent has been once refused, or which have been disallowed by Us.

*Proviso in cases of emergency for immediate operation of an Ordinance.*

Unless such Ordinance shall contain a clause suspending the operation of such Ordinance until the signification of Our pleasure thereupon, or unless when the Ordinance comes under one of the classes numbered one to ten inclusive or fourteen, the Administrator shall have satisfied himself that an urgent necessity exists requiring that such Ordinance be brought into immediate operation, in which case he is authorized to assent in Our name to such Ordinance, unless the same shall be repugnant to the law of England, or inconsistent with any obligations imposed on Us by treaty. But he is to transmit to Us, by the earliest opportunity, the Ordinance so assented to, together with his reasons for assenting thereto.

*Private Ordinances.*

XXIV. No private Ordinance shall be passed whereby the property of any private person may be affected in which there is not a saving of the rights of Us, Our heirs and successors, and of all bodies, politic or corporate, and of all other persons except such as are mentioned in the said Ordinance, and those claiming by, from, and under them. The Administrator shall not assent in Our name to any private Ordinance until proof be made before him in the Executive Council and recorded in the Minutes thereof, that adequate and timely notification, by public advertisement or otherwise, was made of the parties' intention to apply for such Ordinance before the same was brought into the Legislative Council; and a certificate under his hand shall be transmitted with and annexed to every such private Ordinance, signifying that such notification has been given, and declaring the manner of giving the same.

*Ordinances to be sent home duly authenticated.*

XXV. When any Ordinance shall have been passed in the Legislative Council, the Administrator shall transmit to Us, through the Governor, for Our final approval, disallowance, or other direction thereupon, a full and exact copy in duplicate of the same, and of the marginal summary thereof, duly authenticated under the Public Seal of the Possession, and by his own signature. Such copy shall be accompanied by such explanatory observations as may be required to exhibit the reasons and occasion for passing such Ordinance.

*Collection of Ordinances to be published every year.*

XXVI. At the earliest practical period at the commencement of each year, the Administrator shall cause a complete collection to be published, for general information, of all Ordinances enacted during the preceding year.

*Minutes of proceedings to be kept.—Minutes to be sent to Governor twice a year.*

XXVII. Minutes shall be regularly kept of all the proceedings of the Legislative Council; and at each meeting of the Council, the minutes of the last preceding meeting shall be read over, and confirmed or amended, as the case may require, before proceeding to the despatch of any other business.

Twice in each year, the Administrator shall forward to the Governor, for transmission to Us through one of our Principal Secretaries of State, a full and exact copy of the said Minutes for the preceding half year.

*Estimates of Receipts and Expenditure.*

XXVIII. The Administrator shall in each year transmit to the Governor, in sufficient time to be examined and returned before the end of the year, an estimate of the public Revenue and Expenditure of the Possession for the following year.

The expenditure of each year shall be legalized by an Appropriation Ordinance, and the Administrator shall not include in such Ordinance any item of proposed expenditure which shall have been disallowed by the Governor.

*Money grants.*

XXIX. The Administrator is to take care that no public money whatever, whether it be appropriated to any particular service or not by the Ordinance granting the same, be issued and disposed of otherwise than by Warrant under his hand.

*Accounts for Audit.*

XXX. The Administrator shall at convenient times transmit to the Governor, for audit by Officers of the Government of Our Colony of Queensland, all accounts of public Revenue and Expenditure of the Possession.

*Administrator to Promote Religion and Education.*

XXXI. The Administrator is to the utmost of his power to promote religion and education among the native inhabitants of the Possession; and he is especially to take care to protect them in their persons and in the free enjoyment of their land and other possessions, and by all lawful means to prevent and restrain all violence and injustice which may in any manner be practised or attempted against them; and he is to adopt and support such measures as may appear to him conducive to their civilization and as tend to the suppression of barbarous customs among such natives.

*Surveys and reservations to be made before waste lands are disposed of.—Administrator not to purchase lands.*

XXXII. Before disposing of any vacant or waste land to Us belonging, the Administrator shall, whenever practicable, cause the same to be surveyed, and such reservations to be made thereout as he may think necessary for roads or other public purposes. The Administrator shall not, directly or indirectly, purchase for himself any such lands without Our special permission given through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State.

*Appointments to be provisional and during pleasure.*

XXXIII. All commissions to be granted by the Administrator to any person or persons for exercising any office or employment shall, unless otherwise provided by law, be granted during pleasure only; and whenever the Administrator shall appoint to any vacant office or employment any person not by Us specially directed to be appointed thereto, he shall, at the same time, expressly apprise such person that such appointment is to be considered only as temporary and provisional until our allowance or disallowance thereof be signified through the Governor.

*Suspension of Officers.*

XXXIV. Before suspending from the exercise of his office any public officer who has been appointed by virtue of any Commission or Warrant from Us or in Our name, or whose emoluments exceed £100 a year, the Administrator shall signify to such Officer, by a statement in writing, the grounds of the proposed suspension, and shall call upon him to state in writing the grounds upon which he desires to exculpate himself. The Administrator shall lay both statements before the Executive Council, and, having consulted them thereon, shall cause to be recorded on the Minutes whether the Council or the majority thereof does or does not assent to the suspension; and if the Administrator thereupon proceed to such suspension, he shall transmit both the said statements, together with the Minutes of the Executive Council, to the Governor by the earliest opportunity. But if in any case the interests of Our service shall appear to the Administrator to demand that a person shall cease to exercise the powers and functions of his office instantly, or before there shall be time to take the proceedings hereinbefore directed, he shall then interdict such person from the exercise of the powers and functions of his office.

*Regulation of power of pardon in capital cases.—Judge's report to be laid before Executive Council.—Administrator to take advice of Executive Council in such cases.—May exercise his own judgment.—Entering his reasons on the Council Minutes.*

XXXV. Whenever any offender shall have been condemned to suffer death by the sentence of any Court in the Possession, the Administrator shall call upon the Judge who presided at the trial to make to him a written report of the case of such offender, and shall cause such report to be taken into consideration at the first meeting thereafter which may be conveniently held of the Executive Council, and he may cause the said Judge to be specially summoned to attend at such meeting and to produce his notes

hereat. The Administrator shall not pardon or reprove any such offender unless it shall appear to him expedient so to do, after receiving the advice of the Executive Council thereon; but in all such cases he is to decide either to extend or to withhold a pardon or reprove according to his own deliberate judgment, whether the Members of the Executive Council concur therein or otherwise, entering, nevertheless, on the Minutes of the Executive Council a Minute of his reasons at length, in case he should decide any such questions in opposition to the judgment of the majority of the Members thereof.

*Annual Report.*

XXXVI. The Administrator shall forward to the Governor, as soon as may be possible after the close of each year, a full Report of his proceedings in the Government of the Possession, in matters of legislation as well as in administration of public affairs

*Administrator's Absence.*

XXXVII. The Administrator shall not upon any pretence whatever quit the Possession except with the approval of the Governor, without having first obtained leave from Us for so doing under Our Sign Manual and Signet, or through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State.

QUEENSLAND (BRITISH NEW GUINEA).

ORDER of the QUEEN in Council, to confer upon the Supreme Court of the Colony of Queensland Appellate Jurisdiction in respect of certain matters arising or occurring in British New Guinea.

Dated 17th May, 1888.

*Preamble.—Colonial Conference, 1887.*

WHEREAS, at a Conference held in London in the months of April and May, 1887, Her Majesty was pleased to signify through The Right Honorable Sir Henry Thurstan Holland, Baronet (now Baron Knutsford), Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, one of Her Majesty's Secretaries of State having the Department of the Colonies, Her agreement with the Representatives of Her Majesty's Australasian Colonies, assembled at the said Conference, as to certain Proposals for the administration of British New Guinea, meaning certain Territory and Islands in and adjacent to New Guinea which were then under Her Majesty's protection:

*Recites British New Guinea (Queensland) Act, 1887.*

And whereas, in accordance with such agreement, the Parliament of the Colony of Queensland has passed a special Act for carrying out the said Proposals, which Proposals are set out in the Second Schedule to the said Act, of which a copy is hereto appended:

*Recites British Settlements Act, 1887 (50 and 51 Vict., cap. 54).*

And whereas Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in Her Majesty by the "British Settlements Act, 1887," has this day been pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct that Letters Patent be passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, to erect into a separate Possession and Government the said territory and Islands, which will in the said Letters Patent be more fully described, as and when they shall become part of Her Majesty's Dominions, and to give to such Possession the Name of British New Guinea, and to provide for the Government thereof:

*Power of the Queen in Council to confer jurisdiction on certain Courts.*

And whereas by the said "British Settlements Act, 1887," it is provided that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty the Queen in Council to confer on any Court in any British Possession any such jurisdiction, civil or criminal, original or appellate, in respect of matters occurring or arising in any British Settlement as might be conferred by virtue of the said Act upon a Court in the Settlement, and to make such provisions and regulations as Her Majesty in Council may think fit respecting the exercise of the jurisdiction so conferred on any Court, and respecting the enforcement and execution of the judgments, decrees, orders, and sentences of such Court, and respecting appeals therefrom; and that every such Order of Her Majesty in Council shall be effectual to vest in the Court the jurisdiction expressed to be thereby conferred, and that the Court shall exercise the same in accordance with and subject to the said provisions and regulations:

And, whereas, in pursuance of the fourteenth article of the Proposals aforesaid, it is expedient that Her Majesty, by Order in Her Privy Council, should confer upon the Supreme Court of the Colony of Queensland at Brisbane the appellate jurisdiction herein-after mentioned:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the said Act, or otherwise, in Her Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

*Short Title.*

I. This Order may be cited as the British New Guinea Order in Council of 1888.

*Operation of Order.*

II. This Order shall come into operation as soon as the above-mentioned Letters Patent take effect within the aforesaid Possession of British New Guinea (which is hereinafter called the Possession).

*Appeal in Civil Cases.*

III. In civil matters where the amount or value in dispute exceeds One hundred pounds an appeal shall lie from any Court of the Possession to the Supreme Court of Queensland at Brisbane.

Every appeal shall be brought within such time and in such manner as regards the form and transmission of the appeal as may be prescribed by any rules of procedure made by the said Supreme Court.

As regards matters not provided for by such rules, the procedure on appeal in the said Supreme Court may be the same as the ordinary procedure of that Court upon the hearing of any application for a new trial, or upon a case stated or reserved for the opinion of the Court, and the order of such Court on the appeal shall be certified under its seal to the Court below, which shall give effect thereto.

A Court of the Possession may, before deciding any civil matter, when the amount or value in dispute exceeds One hundred pounds, state a case in writing for the opinion of the said Supreme Court, and shall give effect to such opinion, and when a case has been so stated no appeal shall be brought against the decision of the Court of the Possession in conformity therewith, unless by leave of the said Supreme Court.

The decision of the said Supreme Court on an appeal under this section shall be subject to appeal to Her Majesty in Council in the same manner as any other decision of such Court.

*Appeal in Criminal Cases.*

IV. When any person has been sentenced by a Court in the Possession to a sentence which exceeds three months' imprisonment, with or without hard labour, such person may appeal to the Supreme Court of Queensland at Brisbane.

Every appeal shall be brought within such time and in such manner as regards the form and transmission of the appeal as may be prescribed by any rules of procedure made by the said Supreme Court.

The said Supreme Court may make such Order upon the appeal as it thinks fit, either as to matters of fact, or as to law, or as to mitigation of sentence, and the Court of the Possession shall give effect to such order.

Pending the appeal, the Court of the Possession may suspend the execution of the sentence, and may take such security by way of bail or otherwise, and if necessary by commitment to prison for safe custody, as the Court thinks necessary, for submission to the ultimate sentence.

*Interpretation.*

V. In this Order, unless the subject or context otherwise requires,—

"Person" includes an association of persons;  
"Month" means calendar month;  
The singular includes the plural, and the masculine the feminine;  
"Imprisonment" includes penal servitude.

## APPENDIX.

## QUEENSLAND ACT.

Anno Quinquagesimo Primo Victoriae Reginae.

No. 9.

AN ACT TO MAKE PROVISION FOR THE INDEMNIFICATION BY THE COLONY OF QUEENSLAND OF HER MAJESTY'S IMPERIAL GOVERNMENT AGAINST THE EXPENSES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF NEW GUINEA.

[Assented to 4th November, 1887.]

Most Gracious Sovereign—

*Preamble.*

WHEREAS the Governments of Your Majesty's Australasian Colonies some time since requested your Majesty to assume Sovereignty over the Territory comprising those portions of New Guinea and the adjacent islands which are now under your Majesty's Royal Protection, and to make provision for the administration of the government of that Territory: And whereas certain Proposals were lately made to your Majesty's Imperial Government by the Governments of the Colonies of New South Wales, Victoria, and Queensland, with respect to such administration, which proposals are set forth in the First Schedule to this Act: And whereas the said proposals were afterwards agreed to by your Majesty's Imperial Government with certain amendments and modifications thereof, and the said proposals, as so amended, are set forth in the Second Schedule to this Act: And whereas the said Amended Proposals were agreed to by the Representatives of the Governments of your Majesty's said Australasian Colonies assembled at a Conference held in London in the month of April, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven: And whereas your Majesty's Australasian Colonies cheerfully recognise and acknowledge the obligation to indemnify your Majesty's Imperial Government against the necessary cost of the administration of the government of the said Territory, in accordance with the conditions of the said Amended Proposals or such other conditions as may be mutually agreed to by your Majesty's Imperial Government and the Governments of the said Colonies, and it has been agreed that the Colony of Queensland on their behalf shall formally recognise and give effect to such obligation: And whereas your Majesty's Imperial Government have agreed with the Governments of the said Colonies of New South Wales, Victoria, and Queensland that, upon satisfactory provision being made to give effect to the aforesaid obligation, they will advise your Majesty to assume Sovereignty over the said Territory: And whereas, in order to give effect to the said Amended Proposals, and to make provisions for defraying the necessary cost of administration of the government of the said Territory upon such assumption of Sovereignty, We, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the members of the Legislative Assembly of Queensland, have resolved to grant to your Majesty the sums hereinafter stated and for the purposes hereinafter expressed: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Queensland, in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

*Commencement of Act.*

1. This Act shall commence and take effect so soon as Her Majesty shall have assumed Sovereignty over the Territory aforesaid, and such assumption of Sovereignty shall have been proclaimed in the Colony of Queensland.

*Appropriation of £15,000 annually for ten years.*

2. There shall be issued and paid to Her Majesty, out of the Consolidated Revenue of Queensland, in each of the ten years next succeeding the commencement of this Act, a sum not exceeding £15,000, for and in respect of the necessary expenses of the administration of the government of the said Territory in accordance with the conditions of the aforesaid Amended Proposals, or such other conditions as may be mutually agreed to by your Majesty's Imperial Government and the Government of the Colony of Queensland.

*Warrants for payments.*

3. The Colonial Treasurer shall issue and pay the amount of such contribution to such person and in such manner as the Governor by any warrant or order under his hand shall direct.

*Treasurer to receive credit for payments in pursuance of Warrants.*

4. The Colonial Treasurer shall, in his accounts, from time to time, be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any such warrant or order, and the receipt or receipts of the person to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to him in passing his accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

*Repeal of 43 Vic. No. 7.*

5. "The New Guinea and Pacific Jurisdiction Contribution Act of 1884" is hereby repealed, except as to any obligations already incurred under that Act.

*Short title.*

6. This Act may be cited as "The British New Guinea (Queensland) Act of 1887."

## THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

DRAFT PROPOSALS for the future Administration of British New Guinea agreed to by the Governments of the Colonies of New South Wales, Queensland, and Victoria, at Sydney, on the 28th of April 1886.

I. The Colony of Queensland to undertake by a permanent Appropriation Act to defray the cost of the Administration of the Government of British New Guinea to an extent not exceeding £15,000 per annum for the term of five years, subject to the following conditions:—

II. The Colonies of New South Wales and Victoria to undertake by similar permanent Appropriation Acts to bear equally with Queensland any amount which the latter Colony may be called upon to pay under Article I., so that each Colony shall be liable for one-third of the whole expenditure to an extent not exceeding £5,000.

III. Any contribution made by the Governments of any of the other Australasian Colonies to be applied in reduction of the amount which the Colonies may be called upon to pay under Articles I. and II.

IV. Any revenue raised by the Government of New Guinea to be similarly applied in reduction of the amount which the Colonies may be called upon to pay under Articles I. and II., unless in the event of a larger annual expenditure than £15,000 being agreed to, as provided in Article XVI., in which case the excess is to be provided from the revenue.

V. The Imperial Government to make a reasonable contribution (by way of loan or otherwise) towards the cost of efficiently starting the Government, and the necessary Government buildings, &c.

VI. Upon the proposed guarantee being given by Queensland, Her Majesty to assume Sovereignty over the Protectorate.

VII. An Administrator of the Government to be appointed with that title, to whom, with two or more other persons, legislative powers are to be delegated under the Imperial Acts 6 and 7 Victoriae, c. 13 and 23, and 24 Victoriae, c. 121.

VIII. The Colonies, recognising the necessity for a small Civil List, propose the following as probably sufficient for the first initiation of the Government:—

IX. No purchase of land to be allowed to be made by private persons, except from the Government or purchasers from it.

X. No deportation of natives to be allowed either from one part of the Colony to another, or to places beyond the Colony, except under Ordinances reserved for Her Majesty's assent, and assented to by Her Majesty.

XI. Trading with the natives in arms, ammunition, explosives, and intoxicants to be prohibited, except under Ordinances reserved and assented to in like manner.

XII. No differential duties to be imposed in favour of any of the guaranteeing Colonies, or any other Colony or country.

XIII. The foregoing four Articles to be made part of the Constitution of the Colony; preferably by Orders in Council made contemporaneously with the assumption of Sovereignty, or else by Ordinances to be passed immediately afterwards under instructions to the Administrator from Her Majesty's Imperial Government. Standing instructions to be given to the Governor of Queensland and to the Administrator of British New Guinea to observe the conditions of these Articles.

XIV. An appeal to lie to the Supreme Court of Queensland, at Brisbane, in all civil cases involving an amount of over £100, and in all criminal cases involving a punishment greater than three months' imprisonment.

XV. An estimate of revenue and expenditure to be submitted by the Administrator to the Governor of Queensland, and approved by him before the passing of any Appropriation Ordinance. The Governor of Queensland to have power to disallow any item of proposed expenditure.

XVI. Any appropriation beyond the amount of £15,000 for any one year to be agreed to by each of the three guaranteeing Colonies.

XVII. All accounts of receipts and expenditure to be audited by officers of the Queensland Government.

XVIII. The Administrator, in the exercise of his legislative and administrative functions, to be subject to the instructions of the Governor of Queensland (subject of course to Her Majesty's power of disallowance of proposed laws).

XIX. The Governor of Queensland to be directed to consult his Executive Council upon all matters relating to British New Guinea.

XX. The Government of Queensland to consult the Governments of the other contributing Colonies in all matters other than those of ordinary administration, and to report to them all action taken.

XXI. An annual report to be furnished by the Administrator to the Governor of Queensland of the proceedings of the Government (Legislative and Administrative), and copies of such report, together with any observations which the Governor of Queensland may think fit to make thereon, to be forwarded to the Secretary of State, and to each of the contributing Colonies.

#### THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

##### AMENDED PROPOSALS FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF BRITISH NEW GUINEA.

1. The Colony of Queensland to undertake by a special Act to defray the cost of the administration of the Government of British New Guinea to an extent not exceeding £15,000 per annum for the term of ten years, subject to the following conditions:—  
2. The Colonies of New South Wales and Victoria to undertake by similar Acts to bear equally with Queensland any amount which the latter Colony may be called upon to pay under Article 1, so that each Colony shall be liable for one-third of the whole expenditure to an extent not exceeding £5,000.

3. Any contribution made by the Governments of any of the other Australasian Colonies to be applied in reduction of the amount which the Colonies may be called upon to pay under Articles 1 and 2.

4. Any revenue raised by the Government of New Guinea to be similarly applied in reduction of the amount which the Colonies may be called upon to pay under Articles 1 and 2, unless in the event of a larger annual expenditure than £15,000 being agreed to, as provided in Article 16, in which case excess is to be provided from the revenue.

5. Her Majesty's Imperial Government to contribute a suitable steam-vessel for the service of the Territory, at a cost not exceeding £18,500, with the cost of its maintenance during the first three years estimated at about £3,500 a year.

6. Upon the passing of the above-named Special Act, Her Majesty to assume Sovereignty over the Protectorate.

7. An Administrator of the Government to be appointed, to whom, with two or more other persons, legislative powers are to be delegated by Letters Patent under the Imperial Acts 6 and 7 Vic. cap. 13, and 23 and 24 Vic. cap. 121.

8. The following sums to be reserved in the Letters Patent by way of Civil List:—

9. No purchase of land to be allowed to be made by private persons, except from the Government or purchasers from it.

10. No deportation of natives to be allowed either from one part of the Territory to another or to places beyond the Territory, except under Ordinances reserved for Her Majesty's assent, and assented to by Her Majesty.

11. Trading with the natives in arms, ammunition, explosives, and intoxicants to be prohibited, except under Ordinances reserved and assented to in like manner.

12. No differential duties to be imposed in favour of any of the Guaranteeing Colonies, or any other Colony or country.

13. The foregoing four Articles to be embodied in the Letters Patent as part of the constitution of the Territory.

14. An appeal to lie to the Supreme Court of Queensland, at Brisbane, in all civil cases involving an amount of over £100, and in all criminal cases involving a punishment greater than three months' imprisonment. The necessary legislation for this purpose to be proposed to the Imperial and Queensland Parliaments.

15. An estimate of revenue and expenditure to be submitted by the Administrator to the Governor of Queensland, and approved by him before the passing of any Appropriation Ordinance. The Governor of Queensland to have power to disallow any item of proposed expenditure.

16. Any appropriation beyond the amount of £15,000 for any one year to be agreed to by each of the three guaranteeing Colonies.

17. All accounts of receipts and expenditure to be audited by officers of the Queensland Government.

18. The Administrator, in the exercise of his legislative and administrative functions, to be guided by the instructions of the Governor of Queensland (subject to Her Majesty's power of disallowance of proposed laws).

19. The Governor of Queensland to be directed to consult his Executive Council upon all matters relating to British New Guinea.

20. The Government of Queensland to consult the Governments of the other contributing colonies in all matters other than those of ordinary administration, and to report to them all action taken.

21. The Administrator to be instructed to furnish to the Government of Queensland an annual report of the proceedings of the Government (Legislative and Administrative), and copies of such report, together with any observations which the Governor of Queensland may think fit to make thereon, to be forwarded to the Secretary of State, and to each of the contributing Colonies.

#### MEMORANDUM.

It is understood that Queensland is to have a first charge upon any surplus revenue of British New Guinea for any amount which the Colony may be called upon to pay under the Special Act beyond the agreed proportion of one-third.

Reefs reported off the islands Soemba and Flores.

THE commander of H.N.M.S. *Pontianak* reports the existence of reefs off the islands Soemba and Flores, as follows:—

a. Reef between Rendeh points, E. coast of Soemba.

Between the Rendeh points lies a reef, with discolored water extending far to seaward.

b. Reef off the south-west point of Toren Island, S. coast of Flores.

A reef extends from the south-west point of Toren Island to seaward.

c. Reef off the north-west point of the island Komodo, between Flores and Soembawa.

The reef surrounding the north-west point of the island Komodo extends about one mile further to the N.W. ward than is indicated on the charts.

d. Discolored water to the northward of the island Seraja Br., N.W. coast of Flores.

Discolored water extends from the south-east point of the island Seraja Br. to the northward, with the northern extremity bearing S. 83° W. from the north point of Longso Island.

NEW GUINEA, NORTH COAST.

I.—Shoal-ground reported off the islands Massi and Aroe, between Point d'Urville and the Humboldt Bay.

The commander of H.N.M.S. *Java* reports extensive and heavy breakers, probably an isolated reef, between the islands Massi and Jamna.

On the authority of the pilot, the passage between the island Aroe and the islet westward of it is unnavigable for vessels with large draught.

II.—Bank extending off shore to the southward of the island Massi and reef in the Geelvrink Bay.

The master of the Government steamer *Havik* reports the existence of the following shoals:—

a. A 3-fathoms' sandbank, extending about 1,100 yards off the low sandy point, situated S.S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. of the island Massi.

b. A reef, marked by discolored water, with 6 fathoms least water over it, and about 220 yards in extent, lying on the bearings:—

NEW PLYMOUTH HARBOR.

Marine Department,

THE following Notice to Mariners, received from the New Plymouth Harbor Board, is published for general information.

An extensive sandbank has formed across the entrance to the Port of New Plymouth, and directly across the approach to the end of the wharf.

This bank extends 750 feet in a south-easterly direction from the end of the breakwater, and 500 feet parallel with it, its southern end being nearly in line with the outer end of the wharf, which is 540 feet in from the end of the breakwater. From the end of the wharf to within 200 feet of the end of the breakwater, and 200 feet wide, there is 12 feet, 13 feet, and 14 feet of water at low-water springs, while on the bank there is only from 18 inches to 4 feet, the deepest being in line midway between the breakwater and wharf, and the shoalest at its southern end.

Vessels drawing 8 feet can cross the bank at half-tide, 10 feet at high-water neaps, and 12 feet at springs, in moderate weather (the sea breaks heavy on the bank in bad weather), by keeping the flagstaff just open to the westward of the end of the wharf. This is the deepest water over the shoal.

Masters of vessels bound for the wharf should keep the flagstaff and beacon in line bearing S.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. until the white bollard on the breakwater is in line with the summit of Moturoa Island, bearing N.W. by W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. This clears the outer edge of the bank, with 14 feet at low-water springs, with 12 feet at outer end of the wharf, and 8 feet at the inner end.

It is recommended for masters of vessels drawing over 12 feet to wait half-flood, unless the weather is very fine, or near high-water, if it be rough, and not to open the red beacon on Mikotahi, to the southward of the white beacon, on the approach to the wharf, bearing W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S. The wreck of the *Hanea* is inside this line. All bearings magnetic. Strangers should not attempt the port at night.

Strangers arriving off the port at night, and weather permits to anchor, should bring the centre of the outer Sugar Loaf Island in with the north end of Moturoa Island, bearing W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N.; depth of water 5 fathoms; sandy bottom; and the upper light S.S.W. The lower light, which is now exhibited, as well as the upper, from sunset to sunrise, and are both red, must not be taken as a signal to come inside. When it is prudent to come alongside the wharf at night two red lights will be shown from the wharf, one on the extreme end of the wharf, and the other about 300 feet in, to show the line of wharf. There is no danger of mistaking the wharf lights for the leading lights, as they are much lower.

White over red on lower beacon: "Wait for daylight." Two red lights on lower beacon: "Go on; do not wait."

## REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

Intending candidates must give notice of their intention in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognized surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognized surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognized surveyor.

IV. Or he must have completed the full course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and have served one year in the field as above.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with either of the above conditions will be eligible for examination.

The Board of Examiners shall affix a numerical value to each subject, and shall determine the numerical or other standard for Passes in the several subjects. In the event of a candidate failing to pass on first presenting himself for examination, the Board shall have the option of admitting him a second time without charge, or at a reduced fee, if he shall have obtained a certain standard in such examination.

#### CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

Certificates will be granted by the Board without examination to gentlemen who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the examiners that they have complied with the following conditions, and shall have paid the prescribed fee. But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination :—

I. Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience, and of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

Examinations shall be held from time to time, as the interests of the Public Service may require; and notice thereof shall be published in the *Government Gazette* of the intention to hold an examination at least one month before the date fixed upon.

THE subjoined Regulations respecting Naval Cadets, received by His Excellency the Governor from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, are published for general information.

#### REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS.

For the Information of Candidates.

1. Appointments to naval cadetships will be made by limited competition, with the undermentioned exceptions :—

Four cadetships given annually to sons of gentlemen in the Colonies, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

Service cadetships, the total number of which is not to exceed five in any one year. Service cadets will be selected by the Board of Admiralty from (a) sons of officers of the army, navy, or marines who have been killed in action, or who have been lost at sea on active service, or

killed on duty; or who have died of wounds received in action or injuries received on duty within six months from the date of such action or injury, (b) sons of officers of the navy who have performed long or distinguished service, and who hold or have held rank or relative rank on the active list not lower than that of commander. Not more than two such latter service cadets will be nominated annually.

Applications for service cadetships should be addressed to the Military Secretary, Horse Guards, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the army; to the secretary of the Admiralty, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the navy or marines; and to the Military Secretary, India Office, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Indian Army.

Colonial and service cadets will be entered on passing the test examination as specified in paragraphs 9 and 10, and will, in all other respects be subject to these regulations.

The educational examination of all candidates will be conducted by the Civil Service Commissioners (address Cannon Row, Westminster), who will deal with all questions connected with such examination and will announce the results. A fee of ten shillings will be required from each candidate.

2. Except in special circumstances, not more than one-third of the number of candidates actually presenting themselves before the Civil Service Commissioners will be entered.

3. The nomination of candidates for naval cadetships will be made by the First Lord, by individual members of the Board, and by the Secretaries to the Board of Admiralty.

A flag officer or a commodore 1st class appointed to the chief command of a station, or to a separate command, and a captain, on first appointment as such to the command of a ship, will be allowed to nominate one candidate, provided the privilege is exercised within six months of appointment.

No captain will be entitled to nominate more than one candidate during the time he holds the rank of captain, but a flag officer or a commodore 1st class may claim the privilege each time he is appointed to a command as above.

In the event of a candidate's nomination being cancelled before he has commenced the examination, the officer who nominated him will be allowed to select another candidate for the same or following examination.

4. The nominations will be made half-yearly, as soon as convenient after the report of the last examination has been received from the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. The examinations will be held in London and at Portsmouth, and will commence on the second Wednesday in June and the last Wednesday in November in each year, and the appointments will date from the 15th July and 15th January following respectively.

6. No candidate will be eligible for the June Examinations whose age will not be within the following limits on the 15th July following, viz. :—Not less than 13 nor more than 14½ years of age. Nor for the November Examinations, whose age will not be within these limits on the 15th January following.

7. Every candidate must be in good health, and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and in all respects well developed and active in proportion to his age. Before being examined by the Civil Service Commissioners he will be required to pass the medical examination according to the prescribed regulations, and must have been found physically fit for the navy; rejection at such examination will finally exclude him from the navy.

8. The candidate will be required to produce (1) a registrar's certificate of the date of his birth, or a declaration thereof made before a magistrate (*a certificate of baptism will not be accepted*); (2) a certificate of good conduct from the masters of the school or schools at which he may have been educated during the two previous years, or, if educated at home, from his tutor or the clergyman of the parish in which he resides; and (3) proofs of good health.

9. Candidates will be tested by examination in the following subjects :—

i. Arithmetic: including proportion, vulgar and decimal fractions	250
ii. Algebra: including fractions, simple equations and problems, and quadratic equations of one unknown quantity	200
iii. Geometry: Euclid, Book I., with exercises and questions	200
iv. English: Handwriting, dictation, reading with intelligence, and composition	150
v. French: Translating French into English, and English into French; grammatical questions, speaking, and dictation (No dictionary will be allowed, but the equivalents of the less usual words in either language will be given.)	250
vi. Scripture	100

Candidates will be required to obtain half marks in arithmetic, and 40 per cent. in each of the other subjects.

Candidates will be further examined in—

- vii. Mathematics: Harder questions in arithmetic, algebra, and geometry, as above defined
- viii. Latin: Translation, grammar, and prose composition  
(No dictionary will be allowed, but the equivalents for the less usual words will be given.)

ix. Geography: Including the subjects treated of in Grove's Primer, and an elementary knowledge of the principal places in the British Isles and dependencies	150
x. English history: A short selected period	150
xi. Drawing, freehand and simple rectangular model	100

The final order of merit will be determined by the sum of the marks obtained in the test and in the further examination.

10. Colonial and service cadets will be appointed on passing the test examination; they must, however, obtain 600 marks in the aggregate, as well as the proportion of marks in arithmetic and other subjects required from the candidates who compete.

11. A candidate who passes the test examination, but does not succeed in the competition, will be entitled to compete at the next examination, provided he is within the limits of age at that time. No candidate will be allowed to compete more than twice. A candidate who fails to pass the test will not be entitled to another trial, but he will be allowed to compete at the next examination if he receives a fresh nomination and is still within the limits of age.

12. A candidate who, owing to illness, fails to appear at the examination for which he has obtained his nomination may receive a second nomination, provided he is still within the limits of age.

13. For all cadets entered under these regulations the payment will be at the rate of £75 per annum for the period in the *Britannia*, to be paid half-yearly in advance to the accountant-general of the navy. But the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty reserve the power of selecting, from among the cadets entered at each half-yearly examination, a number, not to exceed eight, being sons of officers of the navy, army, or marines, or of civil officers under the Board of Admiralty, with respect to whom the annual payment will be £40 only. In this selection their lordships will have regard solely to the pecuniary circumstances of the cadet.

14. In addition to the annual payments mentioned in the foregoing paragraph, the parent or guardian will be charged with the personal expenses incurred by the cadet for washing, repairing boots and clothes, hair cutting, pocket-money, &c.

15. The period of training on board the *Britannia* will be four terms; there will be two terms in each year. The first term of each year will be from February to July, the second from September to December.

The vacations will be five weeks at Christmas, two weeks at Easter, and six weeks at Midsummer.

16. (a.) Examinations in seamanship and study will be held at the end of each term.

(b.) Cadets who fail at the end of their second term to obtain 40 per cent. of marks in mathematical subjects will be ordered to be withdrawn.

(c.) Cadets who fail at the final examination to obtain 40 per cent. in the mathematical subjects, including the theory of navigation and nautical astronomy, and 50 per cent. in the technical subjects, combined with physics and French, will be ordered to be withdrawn.

(d.) Cadets reported to the Admiralty for unsatisfactory conduct will be "warned;" and should they be again reported they will be discharged. Any cadet, however, who is reported for unsatisfactory conduct during his final term will be discharged without being allowed to present himself at the examination for passing out of the *Britannia*.

(e.) Any cadet who shall at any time appear to their lordships to be unfit for the naval service, for any reason whatever, will be removed from the *Britannia*, and it must be understood that this rule will apply to those who are considered unfit from insufficient physical development or weakness of constitution, although no actual organic disease may have been developed.

17. It is to be distinctly understood that the period of training on board the *Britannia* is a time of probation, and the parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to sign a declaration (on the admission of the cadet to the *Britannia*), to the effect that he shall be immediately withdrawn on the receipt of an official intimation of his being considered unfit for the navy.

18. Cadets will, on passing out of the *Britannia*, rank according to the amount of sea time they obtain at their final examination, and those who obtain equal amounts of sea time will rank in the order of merit in which they pass out of the *Britannia*.

19. The parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to provide outfit under the regulations in force.

20. No pay will be allowed by Government to cadets in the *Britannia*. The pocket money allowed to cadets will be charged to the parents.

21. As only cadets who are able to swim are permitted to use the boats belonging to H.M.S. *Britannia*, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty desire to impress upon parents and guardians the importance of cadets being taught to swim before they join the training ship, so as to enable them to obtain the full benefits of use of the boats.

#### QUARANTINE DISTRICT UNDER "THE DISEASES IN STOCK ACT 1872."

WHEREAS upon the statutory declaration of an Inspector of Stock, made pursuant to clause 59 of the Regulations of the 19th March 1880, under *The Diseases in Stock Act 1872*, the land hereinafter described has become a Quarantine District until the determination and declaration of the Governor in Council relative thereto: It is hereby notified that the Governor in Council has declared the said land to be a Quarantine District, in pursuance of clause 60 of the Regulations under the Act aforesaid, viz:—

All that piece of land situate in the county of Borung, parish of Corack, containing twenty-four acres three roods and twenty-four perches: Commencing at the north-east angle of the block, being a point bearing south eight chains from the south-west angle of allotment 26; bounded thence by allotment 25 bearing south fifteen chains and west sixteen chains sixty-six links; and thence by a line and allotment 27 bearing north fifteen chains, and by the last-mentioned allotment and a line bearing east sixteen chains sixty-six links to the point of commencement.

Also all that other piece of land situate in the county of Borung, parish of Corack, being allotment 26, containing one hundred and twenty acres, and leased under section 20, *Land Act 1869*, to John T. Glowry: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 25; bounded thence by that allotment bearing west thirty-one chains eleven links; and thence by lines bearing respectively north thirty-eight chains fifty-seven links, east thirty-one chains eleven links, and south thirty-eight chains fifty-seven links to the point of commencement.

#### SHIRE OF MOORABBIN.

##### BYE-LAW No. 9.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883* and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Moorabbin, being the Municipal Council thereof, for the purpose of carrying the said statute into execution within its jurisdiction, doth hereby make the following Bye-law, No. 9 (that is to say):—

Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing on any land within the Shire of Moorabbin, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, shall immediately on the deposit thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness, and shall so cover the same or cause the same to be covered with the said layer of earth before the hour of Half-past Eight o'clock ante meridian, from the twentieth day of March to the twenty-third day of September, both inclusive, and Half-past Seven o'clock ante meridian from the twenty-fourth day of September to the nineteenth day of March, both inclusive.

This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the place or places within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health for the Shire of Moorabbin.

If any person commit a breach of this bye-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such breach, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall have been committed or continued. Provided the justices before whom any penalty hereby imposed is sought to be recovered may order the whole, part, or part only, not being less than Five shillings (5s.) of such penalty to be paid, and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may have powers to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board of Health have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

FARES FOR CONVEYANCE BY PASSENGER TRAINS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. Melbourne to Ballarat, thence to Sandhurst *via* Maryborough and Castlemaine, thence to Melbourne, or the reverse route.—Ordinary Fare—First Class, 37s. 3d.; Second Class, 24s. 9d. Holiday Excursion Fare—First Class, 30s. 9d.; Second Class, 18s. 6d.

2. Representatives of Religious Bodies attending Annual Intercolonial Conferences to be granted return tickets, between Melbourne and Adelaide, at half ordinary First Class Return Fares.

CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

3. Iron Weights, 56 lbs., and others, to be charged First Class Rates.

4. The minimum on Leather for Export, Special B Class, is reduced from 5 tons to 1 ton.

5. Smoked or Dried Fish, Colonial, also Shell Fish, to be charged Fresh Fish Rates by Passenger or Goods Trains.

6. Machinery for Irrigation Works to be charged and carried under Miscellaneous Class Rates and Conditions.

7. Rails for Tramways being constructed under *The Tramways Construction Act* to be charged and carried under Special B Class Rates and Conditions.

8. Gas Retorts and Gas Pipes to be charged and carried under Special Class B Rates and Conditions as Gas Manufacturing Plant from Melbourne, Williamstown, Port Melbourne, or Geelong to Country Stations.

9. Eucalyptus Oil, in bulk, in Drums, Casks, or Jars covered with Wicker work, to be charged Third Class Rates.

10. Merry-go-rounds to be charged 1s. per truck per mile for one truck, and 9d. per truck per mile for every additional truck, if more than one is required.

11. Slates, roofing, to be charged and carried under Agricultural Produce Rates from Avoca to Melbourne.

12. Coring to be charged 1d. per ton per mile from Avoca to Melbourne in full truck loads.

13. Lime, from Bairnsdale to Melbourne, to be charged 15s. per ton.

14. Salt, in bags, from Melbourne to Albany, to be allowed the same Rebate as Rock Salt.

18. Ponies used in Polo Matches, when sent in full Horse-box or Truck loads, to be charged single rate for the return journey.

### TRAMWAYS IN THE SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the first day of October 1888.

#### PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

Mr. Deakin	Mr. Cuthbert

**WHEREAS** by The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883 it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge) when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf upon the application of the council of the municipality in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and of the Rules and Regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Yarrowonga has made an application, under the Common Seal of the said municipality, in accordance with the said Act, and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder, for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the Municipal District of the Municipality of the said Shire of Yarrowonga: And whereas the Governor in Council, being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said council of the said municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said council to make the said application, in which notice the route proposed to be followed was described, and persons objecting to the same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the regulations, has been duly published as required by the Rules and Regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and that no valid objections to the said application have been lodged within the time provided in the said rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, make the Order following, that is to say:—

That the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Yarrowonga shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the Municipal District of the Shire of Yarrowonga.

**Routes.**—That the route of the said tramway shall be as follows:—

Commencing at a point on the road north of allotment 237, parish of Dookie, near the terminus of the Shepparton to Dookie Railway: thence running in a northerly direction through allotments A1, 204, 205, 208, 211, 212A, same parish; thence northerly through allotments 6, 20, 54, 52, C, B, 30, 12, 35, 34, 33, 32, 31, 30, 11, 10, 1, 21, and 24, parish of Yabba Yabba; thence northerly through allotments 1A, 2, 2A, 12, 14, 15, 15A, 25, 26, 27, 3A, 3, 10, 13, 17, and 20, parish of Yotammitte; thence continuing in a northerly direction through the township reserve of Katamatite, terminating at Boosey Creek, parish of Katamatite, 17 miles 9 chains from the starting point.

**Gauge.**—That the gauge of such tramway shall be five feet and three inches (5 feet 3 inches), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications numbered from one (1) to sixteen (16) inclusive, now deposited in the Office of the Engineer-in-Chief of Victorian Railways, and which plans and specifications are endorsed with a memorandum of the Honorable the Minister of Public Works, identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

**Motive power.**—That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be steam.

**Maximum speed.**—That the maximum speed of the progression of the rolling stock upon the said tramway shall be twelve (12) miles in the hour.

**Time of completion.**—That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic throughout its entire length within the period of (9) nine months from the date of this Order.

**Nature of traffic.**—That such tramway shall be used for the purpose of carrying passengers, goods, live stock, and timber.

**Necessary precautions for safety of passengers and public to be observed.**—That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of the passengers passing along the streets or roads upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said council of the said municipality.

**Stoppages.**—That for the convenience of the public stoppages shall be made for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers, goods, timber, or live stock at such points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or roads or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

**Tolls and charges.**—That the charges to be made on the said tramway may be but shall not exceed the following, that is to say:—

From the commencing point near the terminus of the Shepparton to Dookie Railway to the terminus of the tramway at Boosey Creek, parish of Katamatite, for each passenger—First class, Four shillings and threepence; Second class, Two shillings and tenpence, and *vice versa*, over such route. That the charges for carrying goods, live stock, and parcels shall be the same as those adopted by the Victorian Railway Commissioners for distances under (18) eighteen miles, and in force on 1st October 1885.

**Intermediate distances.**—That the council shall have power to reduce the fares and rates for lesser or intermediate distances to such amounts as it may deem expedient.

That the land to be acquired for the purpose of constructing the said tramway shall not exceed one hundred and fifty acres.

**Governor in Council sole judge of breach of Order.**—That the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order; and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided by clause 26 of the regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the said Act before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the regulations in the said schedule.

If upon the report to the Governor in Council by the referee made under the said clause 26 of the regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited or shall cease and determine or shall be suspended or shall be otherwise dealt with as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Council of the said Municipality of the Shire of Yarrowonga shall forthwith (unless otherwise directed) proceed to restore the streets or roads along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway.

And the Honorable John Nimmo, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Land Act 1884* (No. 812, sec. 73) it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor might from time to time, by a notice in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim as a street or road or as a township any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such township, or within any city, town, or borough proclaimed before the passing of the said Act should be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road should have been proclaimed should be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim as a road the portion of Crown lands hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

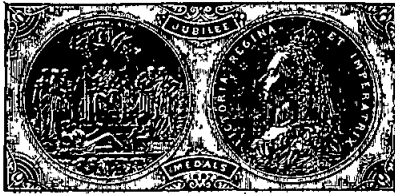

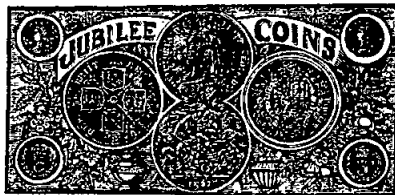
