By His Excellency Sir ROBERT GEORGE CROOKSHANK HAMILTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Imperial Parliament of the 48 and 49 Vict. Ch. 60, intitled "An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia," it is enacted that the Sessions of the Federal Council subsequent to the first Session thereof shall be held in such colony as the Council shall from time to time determine; and, further, that the Council shall be summoned and prorogued by the Governor of the colony in which the Session shall be held, and shall be so summoned and prorogued by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of each of the colonies in the said Act referred to in respect to which the said Act is in operation, and shall meet at such time and such place as shall be named in the Proclamation; and whereas in the Second Session of the Federal Council, held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania, during the months of January and February, in the fifty-first year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, it was, on the twentieth day of the said month of January, determined by the said Council that the next Session thereof should be held in Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania; Now therefore I, Sir Robert George Crookshank Hamilton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, in pursuance of the said Act, and by virtue of the power thereby conferred upon me, do by this my Proclamation summon the Federal Council of Australasia, as constituted by the said Act, to meet at the Parliament Buildings, in Hobart, in Tasmania aforesaid, on Tuesday the twenty-ninth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, at the hour of Eleven in the forenoon, for the dispatch of business.

**REGULATIONS UNDER "THE EDUCATION (TEACHERS) ACT 1888."**

**W**HEREAS by the 23rd section of *The Education (Teachers) Act 1888* it was enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time make regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and might at any time repeal, alter, and amend the same: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations, that is to say:—

**TEMPORARY UNCLASSIFIED SCHOOLS.**

1. In thinly peopled districts a temporary unclassified school may be established in any locality where it is probable that an average attendance of eight scholars will be maintained; provided that there is no existing State school at which such scholars could attend, and provided that suitable school premises can be obtained at a reasonable rental.

2. The buildings which may be used or erected for temporary unclassified schools shall be such as contain not less than eighty cubic feet of space for every child in average attendance, and have sufficient means of warming, light, and ventilation, and shall be approved by the Minister.

3. Any temporary unclassified school which has not for six consecutive months maintained an average attendance of eight children may be closed.

4. If the average attendance at any temporary unclassified school for six consecutive months has been twenty or more, the Minister will direct that it become a classified school, provided that it appears from the number of children attending that such average attendance is likely to be maintained, and that suitable school accommodation for the attendance is available.

5. When the average attendance at any classified State school for six consecutive months has been less than twenty, and is likely so to continue, and it is not desirable or practicable to make it a classified part-time school, the Minister will notify to the classifiers that it is his intention to make such school a temporary unclassified school, and such order will take effect forthwith if there be no teacher in charge of the school, and if there be a teacher, from the date of his transfer to a classified school or of his electing to remain in the school.

Persons who possess the following qualifications will be eligible for employment in temporary unclassified schools:—They must be not less than seventeen years of age if females, or eighteen years of age if males, of good character, sound health, and (a) hold the license to teach or any higher certificate under the Education Department, or satisfy an inspector of schools that they are able to impart elementary instruction; and (b) hold an approved certificate of qualification from the Committee of Council on Education, or from any recognised Board or Department of Education in any British Possession; or (c) have passed the Victorian Public Service Examination (Clerical Division); or (d) have passed in the full course of free instruction in State schools; or (e) have passed in four subjects of the matriculation or any higher examination of a recognised University, of which subjects two shall have been English and Arithmetic; or (f) have passed a satisfactory examination held by the department for the purpose in reading, writing, arithmetic, grammar, and geography.

7. A register of the names of persons who are applicants for such schools will be kept, in which the names will be entered in order of precedence, according to qualification and date of application.

8. As vacancies occur in temporary unclassified schools, the Minister will from time to time appoint persons whose names are entered in this register.

9. All such appointments will be temporary, and may be terminated by three months' notice on the part of either the Minister or the teacher, or by the Minister without notice in case of misconduct, inefficiency, or neglect of duty by the teacher.

10. The fixed salaries of teachers of temporary unclassified schools will be at the rate of £75 per annum for males, and £60 per annum for females, and, in addition, a sum equal to one-half the amount of the fixed salary will be obtainable by way of results, to be determined as in the case of classified schools.

11. Teachers of temporary unclassified schools will be paid maintenance allowance for performing the services in connection with the school buildings, etc., for which teachers of classified schools are paid a maintenance allowance.

## BYE-LAW No. 70.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law, and all previous Bye-laws conflicting therewith are hereby cancelled:—

## APPOINTMENT OF GATEKEEPERS.

1. Male Gatekeepers may be selected from employes who have been disabled by accident, advanced age, or loss of health while in the Victorian Railway Service.
2. Female Gatekeepers may be selected from the wives or unmarried daughters of Victorian Railway employes, or the widows (during widowhood) of former employes, or from deceased employes' female relatives who were solely dependent upon such deceased persons for maintenance.

REGULATIONS FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE GRANT "FOR THE PURPOSE OF  
AIDING THE FUNDS OF FREE LIBRARIES AND COUNTRY MUSEUMS."

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the subjoined Regulations for the Distribution of the Grant "For the purpose of aiding the Funds of Free Libraries and Country Museums."

REGULATIONS.

1. Any Institution claiming to participate in the Grant must be a Free Library solely, or a Mechanics' Institute, Athenæum, Country Museum, &c., as the case may be, and Free Library combined, or a Country Museum solely, but in any case Condition II. of the Grant must be strictly complied with.

2. The Grant will be allotted for three purposes, viz.:—(a), Building ; (b), Books ; and (c), Maintenance.

- (a) Building will comprise the erection of or repairs to and painting of buildings, fencing in of the land, and providing furniture.
- (b) Books will comprise the purchase of books, periodicals, and newspapers, and the binding of the same.
- (c) Maintenance will comprise fuel, light, water, cleaning, and incidental expenses ; but not more than ten per centum (10%) of the sum allotted to any Free Library or Country Museum shall be expended under this head without the special permission of the Chief Secretary, and in no case shall more than twenty per centum (20%) of the total revenue of any Institution be expended on maintenance and salaries.

3. All applications to participate in the Grant must be made on the forms provided for that purpose, and the correctness of the particulars furnished in support of any application must be verified by a Statutory Declaration, to be made by the President or the Secretary of the Institution on behalf of which the application is made.

4. The following shall be the form of application to participate in the Grant :—

5. The Grant shall, excepting as provided in Clause 6 hereof, be distributed amongst the Institutions entitled to participate therein, in proportion to the sums locally raised by them, from all sources, during the year immediately preceding its distribution; but the Chief Secretary shall prescribe in what manner the sum allotted to any Institution shall be expended, and no deviation from the mode of expenditure so prescribed shall be permitted without the sanction of the Chief Secretary being first obtained thereto.

6. In any case where, in previous years, a promise has been made, in writing, by or on the authority of the Chief Secretary for the time being that any Institution should receive a specific sum in aid of its building fund contingent upon the fulfilment of any condition specified in such promise, or should receive a specific sum in aid of its building fund for one or more years as set forth in such promise, such Institution shall, in lieu of receiving a sum in proportion to the amount locally raised, as provided in Clause 5 hereof, receive out of the Grant the amount promised as aforesaid; but if such amount shall be found to be less than the Institution would be entitled to receive under the provisions of Clause 5 hereof, then in such case its share of the Grant shall be computed under the provisions of Clause 5.

7. No Institution shall receive from the Grant more than the sum of three hundred pounds (£300), no matter what sum has been locally raised as provided in Clause 5 hereof; and the Chief Secretary may, if he think fit, debar any Institution from participating in the distribution of the Grant for any particular year.

8. Forms of application to share in the Grant shall, if possible, be issued in January in each year to Institutions which have previously received aid from the Government, and may, on application being made to the Under-Secretary, be supplied to any Institution which has not received aid from the Government, but desires to do so.

9. To be entitled to share in the Grant as a Country Museum solely, or as a Museum in connection with a Free Library, it must be shown that the Institution is a *bonâ fide* Museum, and in either case a catalogue of the articles contained in the Museum must accompany the application for a share of the Grant.

10. No Institution shall be entitled to participate in the distribution of the Grant whose building is erected on leasehold land—excepting in cases where there is an objection on the part of the Department of Mines or of Crown Lands and Survey to the alienation of the land for Free Library or Museum purposes—or which does not hold a good title to its land, *i.e.*, the land must have been permanently or temporarily reserved for the purposes of the Institution; or, if the land has been a gift to the Institution, it must have been duly conveyed to the Trustees of the Institution. If the land be permanently or temporarily reserved, steps should be taken, by an application to the Honorable the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey, to obtain the permanent reservation of, or a Crown Grant for, it as circumstances require.

11. In all cases where the Free Library forms a portion of the municipal buildings, or where the land on which the library building is erected is the property of or vested in the municipal council, an agreement must be executed by such council, covenanting to keep and maintain the Free Library portion of the building open to the public or to allow the use of the land for Free Library purposes (as the case may be) in perpetuity, before any sum can be allotted the Institution from the Grant. A Form for this purpose can be obtained on application to the Under-Secretary.

12. All applications for a share of the Grant made on behalf of Institutions which have previously received aid from the Government must be accompanied by a Balance-sheet showing the receipts under different items from all sources, and the expenditure, also under different items, for the year ended the 31st December previous, and by receipts for the different items of expenditure contained in the Balance-sheet; and the correctness of such Balance-sheet must be verified by a statutory declaration, to be made by the Treasurer of the Institution in the following form, *viz.* :—

## GRANT TO HORTICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grant 1888-9:—

*Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Seven hundred and fifty pounds granted by Parliament to Horticultural Societies 1888-9.*

1. That each society claiming to participate in the Grant shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February 1889, a statement in the Form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the Form marked E.

2. The distribution of the vote will be made one month after the above-mentioned date, when a sum equal to the amount of the prize-money awarded and paid away will be allotted to each society having a claim, and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, provided that the sums claimed do not exceed in the whole Seven hundred and fifty pounds, and if they do exceed this amount then they will be reduced *pro rata*, and the allotment made accordingly.

3. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st January 1888 and the 31st December 1888 amounts in the total to less than Fifty pounds shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

The blank spaces in the declaration form E for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations between the 1st January 188 and the 31st December 188 must be filled up in words as well as in figures; and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account is then to be prepared by making the Government Dr. for the amount declared to have been awarded and paid away in prizes.

3. The account must be signed by the treasurer, and be countersigned by the president or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management; it should then be returned to the Department of Agriculture, with the declaration and statements appended.

*It may expedite the payment of the money to fill in at the top of the account the name of the nearest pay office in the space left blank for the purpose. It is necessary to bear in mind that, if that space be not filled up, the account will be payable at Melbourne only.*

4. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid, unless such cups have been finally awarded.

**MARQUIS HILL IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS.**

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirty-first day of December 1888.*

**W**HEREAS by section 63 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, No. 898, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any Irrigation and Water Supply Trust appointed under the said Act for the purposes, among others, following:—

(a) For determining the period for which the commissioners of any trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office.

(b) For determining the manner in which elections of any such commissioners shall be held, and the manner of voting thereat.

(c) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners shall be filled up.

(d) For determining questions as to the due election of any such commissioner; and

(e) For prescribing, subject to the provisions of the said Act, any other matter necessary for giving effect to Part IV. of the said Act.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth, for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain irrigation and water supply trust duly appointed under the said Act, and known as the Marquis Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, make the regulations following, viz.:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In these regulations, “the Minister” shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; “the trust” or “the said trust” shall mean the Marquis Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust; and “the district,” “the said district,” “the irrigation district,” or “the irrigation and water supply district” shall mean the lands as defined by the Order in Council appointing the said trust wherein the trust shall have authority.

2. *Period for which commissioners shall hold office.*—Subject to the provisions in reference to the first election of commissioners hereinafter contained, for securing the annual retirement of two commissioners, the period during which the commissioners of the said trust shall hold office shall be three years.

3. *Annual retirement of commissioners.*—Two commissioners shall retire annually, but the retiring commissioners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be eligible for re-election.

4. *Term of office of persons elected commissioners at first election.*—At the first election of commissioners two of the persons elected commissioners shall hold office as such commissioners for the term of three years, two others of such persons shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two persons elected as such commissioners shall hold office for the term of one year, and the particular term for which each such person so elected a commissioner shall hold office shall be determined in manner following, (that is to say):—

(a) *How term of office is ascertained when no poll taken.*—If the first election is made without a poll, as in the case in these regulations provided, then the particular term for which each candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office shall immediately upon such election be publicly determined by lot by the returning officer in such manner as to him may seem fit, and the returning officer shall thereupon immediately and publicly announce the term for which each individual candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

(b) *How term of office ascertained when poll taken.*—If at the first election a poll shall be held as in these regulations provided, then of the six candidates elected as commissioners the two candidates who shall have received the highest number of votes shall hold office as commissioners for the term of three years, and the two candidates who shall have received the next highest number of votes shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two candidates who shall have been elected shall hold office for the term of one year; and if two or more than two candidates elected shall have obtained the same number of votes, then the returning officer shall determine by lot (as hereinbefore provided in the case of the first election if decided without ballot) the term or terms of three, two, or one year or years during which such candidates shall respectively hold office. But so that no candidate elected shall hold office for a shorter time than the term during which any other candidate who shall have obtained a less number of votes shall hold office. And the returning officer shall publicly declare the respective terms during which the several candidates shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

5. *Extraordinary vacancies, how filled, and term of office.*—Should any vacancy in the office of commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy, and the provisions contained in these regulations as to the nomination of candidates, the manner in which elections shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat, shall apply to any election in respect of such vacancy, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

6. *Date of first election of commissioners.*—Date of ordinary annual election.—The first election of commissioners of the said trust shall be held on the first day of February 1889, and the ordinary annual election shall be held on the first day of February in each succeeding year. Provided that whenever such date may fall upon a Sunday, or upon any day set apart as a public holiday, such election shall be held upon the day next following.

7. *Voters' list to be prepared.*—For the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the said trust, a voters' list shall be prepared by the persons upon whose petition the said trust has been constituted, and the said voters' list shall be forwarded to the Minister.

8. *Form of voters' list.*—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname the christian name or names, surname, and address, so far as these may be known, of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of *The Irrigation Act 1886* or under the provisions of any Act amending the said *Irrigation Act 1886*, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such person, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act or Acts, each such person is entitled.

9. *Voting in respect of lands jointly owned.*—In the case of joint owners of land, or in the case of joint lessees of land, the name of any one of such owners or lessees, as the case may be, shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act or Acts and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned or leased solely by such one owner or lessee, and the owner or lessee so placed upon the said list or lists shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners or lessees jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners or lessees is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners or lessees in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners or lessees, as the case may be, shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

10. *Copy of voters' list to be available for inspection.*—Second Schedule.—Objections to list to be in writing and forwarded to Minister.—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, in some convenient place within or near to the irrigation and water supply district of the trust for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Second Schedule hereto, setting forth the times and place at which such voters' list may be so inspected, shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the Minister within the time mentioned in the said notice.

11. *Grounds of objection to be stated.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the Minister within nine days after the first day of the publication of such notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

12. *Minister to revise and certify lists.*—The Minister shall revise the said list and consider all objections thereto, and make such alterations and amendments therein as to him may seem just, and shall certify the list under his hand as correct, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

13. *Certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the trust, but shall also be available for any election in respect of any extraordinary vacancy occurring within twelve months next after the date of the said first election.

14. *Voters' list to be prepared yearly.*—Before the 1st day of December in each year the officers of the trust shall prepare a voters' list in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and such list shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and in alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of *The Irrigation Act 1886* or under the provisions of any Act amending the said *Irrigation Act 1886*, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such person, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act or Acts, each such person is entitled.

15. *Voting in respect of lands jointly owned.*—In the case of joint owners of land, or in the case of joint lessees, the name of any one of such owners or lessees, as the case may be, shall, subject to the provisions of the said Acts and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned or leased solely by such one owner or lessee, and the owner or lessee so placed upon the said list shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners or lessees jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners or lessees, as the case may be, is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners or lessees in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list or lists shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners or lessees, as the case may be, shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

16. *Copy of list to be available for inspection.*—Third Schedule.—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, at some convenient place within or near to the irrigation and water supply district of the trust for a period of fourteen clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Third Schedule hereto shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and

such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the trust within the time mentioned in the said notice.

17. *Grounds of objections to list to be forwarded in writing to the chairman of trust.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the trust within the time mentioned in the said notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

18. *Special meeting of trust to be held to revise list.*—List to be certified.—In the month of December, in each year a special meeting of the trust shall be held for the purpose of revising the said list; and all objections which may have been forwarded to the chairman under the preceding clause shall be considered by the commissioners then present; and the chairman may make such alterations and amendments in the said list as the commissioners or a majority of the commissioners present may determine to be just and necessary, or such as by these regulations are required to be made; and the list, when so revised, altered, and amended, shall be certified as correct under the hand of the chairman, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

19. *Revised and certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) of trust commissioners to be held within one year from the second day of February then next, the said day inclusive.

20. *Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.*—Chairman of trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.—For the purposes of the first such election, the Minister may appoint some fit and proper person, not being an owner of land within the district, to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election, whether ordinary or extraordinary, the chairman of the trust for the time being shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of chairman of the trust should be vacant, the commissioners of the trust may by resolution appoint one of their number to be returning officer until the office of chairman shall again be filled; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

21. *Notice of election.*—Nomination of candidates.—Fourth Schedule.—Twenty-one clear days before any election of commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the said district, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said district to be named in such notice, in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than ten days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination paper in the form of the Fourth Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than three persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate in token of his assent to being so named; and such candidate or some person on his behalf shall, at the time when such nomination paper is delivered to the returning officer, pay into the hands of such returning officer the sum of Ten pounds to be dealt with as by law provided, and no person who shall not have been so nominated and by whom or on whose behalf such payment shall not have been so made shall, within the subsequent provisions of these regulations, be deemed to be a candidate at any election of commissioners.

22. *Where number of candidates does not exceed number of commissioners to be elected.*—If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nominations of candidates the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

23. *Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners to be elected.*—Fifth Schedule.—Notice of poll.—Hours of polling.—If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates the number of candidates exceeds the number of commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full, in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto, and shall also forthwith give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the irrigation district stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place within the said district as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint, and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Ten o'clock in the forenoon and close at Four o'clock in the afternoon.

24. *Retirement of candidates before polling-day.*—If at any election after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid any candidate for such election and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer not later than four clear days before the day of polling a notice in the form of the Sixth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires, and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the irrigation and water supply district a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election,

shall on the day appointed for the election declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and if such papers are already printed shall erase such name therefrom, and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

25. *Polling-booth may be hired.*—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling-booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.

26. *Returning officer to preside at polling-booth.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall preside at the polling-booth for taking the poll.

27. *Scrutineers may be appointed.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling-booth, and the said returning officer, or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters, not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling-booth.

28. *Pencils to be provided.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall provide pencils in the polling-booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers, and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins, and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer, or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

29. *Mode of voting—Where voter is illiterate.*—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being in the form of Schedule Five hereto, and initialed by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer, or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate, and after such name or names have been so struck out, the ballot paper or ballot-papers, as the case may be, shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling-booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time, and no person having once demanded and received any such ballot paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.

30. *Ballot-papers to be numbered.*—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

31. *Informal ballot-papers.*—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

32. *What question may be asked.*—At any election of commissioners the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer shall, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

"Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) in the roll now in force for this trust, being enrolled therein in respect of land in the parish of \_\_\_\_\_, being (here specify land as described in the roll)?"

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

33. *False answer, polling twice, and personation.*—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

34. *Result of polling, how ascertained; returning officer to have casting vote.*—Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll publicly declare the candidates not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected commissioners of the trust; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote.

35. *Ballot-papers, how disposed of.*—The returning officer shall, in the case of the said first election of commissioners, forthwith after the declaration of the poll endorse with a description of the contents thereof and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Minister, who shall, as soon as may be after the first meeting of trust commissioners shall have been held, forward such sealed packet

to the secretary of the trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him cause to be destroyed in the presence of three commissioners of the trust; but in all subsequent elections the parcel of ballot-papers so sealed, endorsed, and signed shall be delivered by the returning officer to the said secretary, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months after such delivery, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three of the commissioners of the trust.

36. *Minister to determine questions arising upon first election.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question in writing to the Minister, who shall decide the same, and such decision shall be final and binding.

37. *Questions arising upon subsequent elections to be determined by trust.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at any subsequent election, whether ordinary or extraordinary, such question shall be determined by the commissioners of the trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a commissioner until such question shall have been so determined, and the majority of the commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

38. *Appeal to Minister from determination of trust.*—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just, and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

39. *Failure to elect deemed to create extraordinary vacancies.*—If at any election of commissioners no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the commissioners eventually elected to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

40. *Expenses of election to be paid by trust.*—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connection with any election, shall be defrayed by the trust.

41. *Penalty for breach of regulations.*—These regulations shall also be deemed to be regulations under section 250 of *The Irrigation Act 1883*, and any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.

42. *Interpretation.*—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

### BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Rating Regulation for 1889, made by the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust under the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Water Conservation Act, make the Regulations following:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district, that is to say:—

(1.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

(2.) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to five per cent. on the amount of the municipal valuation.

(3.) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement: Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs shall be 16,000 gallons for any trough not exceeding twelve feet in length, and 8,000 gallons for every additional five feet or fractional part thereof.

(4.) Every trough situated in a paddock shall be supplied through a meter, affixed by the consumer according to the directions of the Trust, provided, nevertheless, that the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall not be less than that charged for troughs supplied under the preceding clause.

(5.) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the trust by measurement, the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 8,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder.

(6.) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon); and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and

lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purposes of irrigation or for ornamental purposes shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

# CUTTING, DIGGING, OR REMOVING REDGUM TIMBER FROM CROWN LANDS PROHIBITED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir HENRY BROUGHAM LOCH, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything therein before contained, the Governor might by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such Proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part VIII. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove redgum timber on or from any state forest, timber reserve, or other Crown lands whatsoever within the Colony of Victoria.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and in the fifty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF BYAWATHA.

WE, John McIntosh, James Allan, Isaac Young, Thomas Hutton, Charles Hutton, Robert Johnson, and William Dunston, junior, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order of 30th July 1888 as a site for Public Recreation in the parish of Byawatha, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding six in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for the holding of fêtes or sports.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in or around the reserve, or leave, throw, or roll stones therein, or pollute any water in the reserve, or remove therefrom any soil, sand, or manure.

4. No person shall depasture in the reserve any horses or cattle without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management, and then only in such portion thereof as may be specified in such permission: Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that accounts thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

5. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, or other property in the reserve, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter.

6. No person shall erect any booth or other structure in the reserve, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or articles of any description, without having first obtained the written permission of the committee of management, and no person shall light any fires in the reserve without the special permission, in writing, of the committee of management.

7. No person, except laborers or workmen employed by the committee of management, shall enter any plots in the reserve which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

8. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog for coursing or other purpose of sports, or for bathing; and all dogs so brought in, and all goats and poultry found in the reserve, shall be liable to be destroyed.

9. The following shall be the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve on such days as the same may be set apart for fêtes or sports:—

For the admission of every adult to the reserve, a sum not exceeding One shilling.

For the admission of every saddle horse to the reserve, exclusive of the rider, a sum not exceeding One shilling and sixpence.

For the admission to the reserve of every carriage, cart, or vehicle drawn by one horse, exclusive of passengers, a sum not exceeding Two shillings.

For the admission of every additional horse, One shilling.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE EDENHOPE TOWN COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council on the 1st May 1888, the Managers of the Edenhope Town Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October in every year, and the owners of stock registered during the currency of any quarter shall pay the agistment fees for the whole of such quarter:—

For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule ... 2s. 6d. per quarter.  
For every head of other large cattle ... 2s. 0d. per quarter.  
For every head of small cattle ... 1s. 0d. per quarter.  
Fillies, colts, and calves, under the age of six months, the progeny of dams on the common ... Free.

3. No entire horse over the age of six months shall be allowed on the common, nor any bull over the age of six months, unless approved by the managers.

4. All stock on which the fees shall remain unpaid for a period of fourteen days after the commencement of any quarter shall be treated as trespassers.

5. All horned cattle, after the fees in respect thereof are paid, shall be branded with the common brand by the owners, unless instructions have been given by the managers to the herdsman to brand such cattle, before being placed on the common.

6. The herdsman shall, at his own expense, release from pound all cattle having the common brand or entitled to depasture on the common.

7. No bullocks or horses belonging to carriers, unless entitled to commonage, shall remain more than twenty-four hours on the common, unless detained by accident or stress of weather.

8. No person shall remove registered stock from the common without the consent, in writing, of the herdsman or the managers.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10.
