REGULATIONS UNDER "THE EDUCATION (TEACHERS) ACT 1888" AMENDED.

THE Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Present Order direct that clause 6 of the Regulations under *The Education (Teachers) Act 1888*—Temporary Unclassified Schools—be rescinded, and that the following clause be substituted therefor:—

6. Persons who possess the following qualifications will be eligible for employment in temporary unclassified schools:—They must be not less than seventeen years of age if females, or eighteen years of age if males, of good character, sound health, and

(1.) Hold the licence to teach or any higher certificate under the Education Department; or

(2.) Satisfy an inspector of schools that they are able to impart elementary instruction, and

(a.) Hold an approved certificate of qualification from the Committee of Council on Education, or from any recognised board or department of education in any British possession; or

(b.) Have passed the Victorian Public Service Examination (clerical division); or

(c.) Have passed in the full course of free instruction in State schools; or

(d.) Have passed in four subjects of the matriculation or any higher examination of a recognised University, of which subjects two shall have been English and Arithmetic; or

(e.) Have passed a satisfactory examination held by the department for the purpose of reading, writing, arithmetic, grammar, and geography.

BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

BYE-LAWS.—MELBOURNE WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, make the Bye-laws following:—

1. All bye-laws heretofore made relating to the Melbourne Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board, that is to say:—

I. On every house or tenement of £20 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.

II. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, a rate of Sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive, and One pound ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300.

III. Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, a rate of Sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the valuation up to £300, and One pound per centum on the amount of such valuation in excess of £300.

IV. Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Forty shillings per annum each, except where in the opinion of the Board a meter shall be necessary.

V. Water for steam boilers will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler except where, in the opinion of the Board, a meter shall be necessary.

VI. For water supplied to shipping the charge will be—at the Melbourne Wharves, Three shillings per one thousand gallons; at other places, Four shillings per one thousand gallons.

VII. Water for horses, where the number kept on one tenement does not exceed two, will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse, and water for cows up to three in number, kept or partially kept on premises, at the rate of Five shillings for each cow, but it shall be optional for the owners of same to take the supply by measure.

In instances where the above numbers are exceeded, the supply of water must be by measure.

VIII. The Board may supply water for the making and mixing of concrete at the rate of Twopence per cubic yard, and for masonry and brickwork at the rate of Three half-pence per cubic yard as measured in the work.

IX. Water supplied by the Board by measurement will be charged at the rate of One shilling per one thousand gallons, and in cases where the supply is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge will be 25,000 gallons per quarter.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes, as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which at One shilling per thousand gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

4. The Board may grant permission to persons requiring water for "domestic" and for "other than domestic purposes" to affix two service-pipes, one for domestic supply without meter for which the ordinary assessed rate shall be paid, and one for other than domestic purposes with meter, the water used therefrom to be paid for at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, but subject to such regulations as may be approved by the Board against the use or re-use of water from the domestic service for irrigation or any other purpose not domestic.

5. Any person receiving water from the Board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Board, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Board, he shall obtain from the Board a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. Such licence shall be for such period and be from time to time renewable as the Board may see fit, and the Board may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employes, committing any breach of these bye-laws.

9. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Board the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Board that he is a competent plumber.

10. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Board, without giving two days' notice to the Board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Board, without the permission in writing of the Board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

11. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board. Lead piping of the following weights:—

and galvanized iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services.

Ordinary connexions with submains must be made with proper stop-cock ferrules, to which, for iron services, a length of not less than three feet of lead pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement will be permitted, and for houses rated at Twenty pounds per annum and under, the bore of such service-pipe must not exceed 1/2 inch.

12. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of licence. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line, and at a uniform distance of three (3) feet from the building line, to be properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap.

13. No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Board.

14. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Board may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which, after notice that service-pipe requires repairing, any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

15. Any person supplied with water by the Board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

16. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Board. Each meter must be capable of registering at least one million gallons.

17. If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Board may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe.

18. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to, and with the approval of the Board.

19. Baths to be fitted must not exceed six feet three inches in length along the centre line by a mean width of two feet and a depth of one foot nine inches; the section of bottom to be a segment of a circle, the ends to be circular in shape and sloping inwards. Overflow pipes will not be permitted.

20. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

21. No person shall, without the written permission of the Board, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrants and hose attached to fire plugs. Any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. The water supply to all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the Water Supply Branch of the Department of Public Works, and any person not duly authorized turning on the water or otherwise interfering with such water supply shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

23. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Board for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

24. No tap shall be placed in any garden or yard or to or outside of any dwelling or premises supplied with the water of the Board unless a water-meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

25. In the construction of these bye-laws, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole.

WHEREAS by Section 63 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, No. 898, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any Trust appointed under the said Act for the purposes, among others, following:—

For determining the period for which Commissioners of any Trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order—

That clauses 23 and 25 of certain regulations bearing date the 8th day of January 1889, providing for the election of Commissioners of the Yatchaw Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 11th day of January 1889, shall be and the same are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be and be deemed to be and may be cited as clauses 23 and 25 respectively of the said regulations:—

23. *Notice of election.—Nomination of candidates.—Fourth Schedule.*—Seven clear days before any election of Commissioners under these regulations the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the said district, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within or near to the said district (and named in such notice) in manner hereinafter mentioned, at a specified hour between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than ten days after the time of giving such notice and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, at such hour and place, cause to be delivered to the returning officer a nomination paper in the form of the fourth schedule hereto, or to the like effect, stating the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than four persons duly qualified to vote at such election, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate in token of his assent to being so named; and such candidate, or some person on his behalf, shall, at the time when such nomination paper is delivered to the returning officer, pay into the hands of such returning officer the sum of Ten pounds, to be dealt with as by law provided; and no person who shall not have been so nominated and by whom or on whose behalf such payment shall not have been so made shall, within the subsequent provisions of these regulations, be deemed to be a candidate at any election of commissioners.

25. *Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners to be elected.—Fifth Schedule.—Notice of poll.*—Should the number of candidates exceed the number of commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be prepared with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full, in the form of the fifth schedule hereto, and shall also forthwith give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the irrigation district, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place within or near to the said district as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint, and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence and close at such times as the returning officer in and by such notice may appoint.

PUBLIC HEALTH.—SHIRE OF BULN BULN.

BYE-LAW NO. 4.—FOR PROVIDING FOR THE INSPECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF DAIRIES WITHIN THE SHIRE OF BULN BULN.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Buln Buln, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Amendment Statute 1883*, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 4 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of March in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding by registered letter, or delivering to the secretary of the Local Board of Health, an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Five shillings in cash.

2. Upon the receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary of the Local Board of Health shall endorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

3. All cattle in dairies or places where any of the said trades shall be carried on, shall be inspected by an officer appointed by the Local Board of Health, and any cattle found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness, or any other cause, are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, or the milk thereof unwholesome or unhealthy, shall be forthwith removed from every such dairy or place if ordered by such inspector, and any such order as aforesaid may be revoked by the said Local Board of Health, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made by the said inspector.

4. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper, or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and proper and sufficient drainage shall be provided, and no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatsoever in or upon or about or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

5. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily, and at all times properly cleansed.

6. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report in writing to the said inspector the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or any contagious or infectious disease in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever, but shall immediately upon being obtained be destroyed or thrown away.

7. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

8. If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this bye-law, he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) nor less than Five shillings (5s.), or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) nor less than Five shillings (5s.) for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued: Provided that the justices, before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered, may order the whole, or part only, of such penalty to be paid, and every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy, condone, or waive such breach, and whether such Local Board of Health have, or have not, taken advantage of such powers.

9. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall have operation in the whole of the said shire.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Buln Buln this thirteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

THE LOWAN SHIRE COUNCIL, AND THE LOWAN SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—APPLICATION OF FUNDS.

WHEREAS by section 109 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946, it is enacted that any Municipal Council may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, from time to time apply any portion of the municipal fund towards the payment of interest on and the creation of a sinking fund for the liquidation of any moneys borrowed by any Waterworks Trust.

And whereas the Municipal Council of the Shire of Lowan is desirous of applying a portion of the municipal fund of the said shire—that is to say, a sum of Three hundred and ten pounds three shillings and eleven pence (£310 3s. 11d.) for the purpose of paying interest (from the 1st July 1888 to the 31st December 1888) on certain moneys borrowed by the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust.

I therefore recommend His Excellency the Governor in Council to consent to the said sum of Three hundred and ten pounds three shillings and eleven pence being applied by the said Municipal Council of the said Shire of Lowan from the municipal fund thereof for the purpose aforesaid.

SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations made by the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust under the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946.

REGULATIONS.

The Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, whose Waterworks District is contained and described in a proclamation dated the 29th day of December 1887, as the Town of Shepparton, has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the following regulations (that is to say):—

The rates hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay in respect of the term of one year, from the 1st day of January to the 31st day of December 1889, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rates to be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year.

On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during said year, the annual minimum sum of Twenty-five shillings.

On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during said year, the sum of One shilling and twopence in the pound of such valuation.

2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

- (a.) Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.
 - (b.) For water supplied for manufacturing purposes, unless otherwise specified, One shilling per one thousand gallons.
 - (c.) For stand-pipe or hydrant, water for each load of Two hundred and fifty gallons or under, sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.
 - (d.) Where water is supplied for domestic use, and is used to supply boilers for steam engines under ten horse-power, the charge shall be by special agreement, or at the rate of Twelve shillings and sixpence per horse-power per annum in addition to the charge for domestic use (except in cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power) in which case a charge by measurement shall be made.
 - (e.) For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, One shilling per thousand gallons.
 - (f.) For water supplied to gardens and nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per thousand gallons.
 - (g.) For water supplied to troughs in streets, Twenty shillings each per annum in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.
 - (h.) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering.
3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where it is supplied by measure for domestic use, the watering or irrigation of private gardens, or for any other purpose

whatsoever, shall be the quantity for which the return would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable upon the premises so supplied if supplied under the rating or otherwise than by measure.

4. All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be paid monthly or as may be agreed upon.

5. Where water is supplied for domestic use, except when paid for by meter or under special agreement, the supply shall be through separate service-pipes of the following diameter, according to the assessed value annually of the premises supplied, as follows:—

- (1.) For premises assessed at or under £20 (½in.) half-inch pipe.
- (2.) And more than £20 per annum to £100 (¾in.) three-quarters of an inch pipe.
- (3.) Over £100 per annum (1in.) one-inch pipe.

6. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stables, or for manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour) or for water power of fountains, fishponds, or for any ornamental or other purpose not provided in these regulations.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe, or alter, repair, or in any measure interfere with any pipe belonging to the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a license or authority in that behalf to execute such works.

8. No person shall be authorised or allowed to lay private service-pipes, and attach the same to any pipe of the Trust, or to any private service-pipe already connected with the pipes laid down by the Trust unless he can satisfy the Trust or their officer that he is competent to execute such work.

9. No private service whatsoever to be laid or extension made from one tenement to another by any authorised person unless he has ascertained at the office of the Trust that the person for whom such work is intended has duly signed the required form of application to the Trust, and has received the consent of the Trust to execute such work.

10. Before any private service is laid, extension made, or meter affixed and attached to the service-pipes laid by the Trust or otherwise to service-pipes already connected, each authorised person shall give twelve hours' notice of same, and shall, after each service or extension, &c., has been completed, report on the prescribed form the nature of the work done, and lodge the same at the office of the Trust within twenty-four hours of such service or extension, &c., being completed as aforesaid.

11. Each authorised person shall be held solely responsible to the Trust for each service-pipe being laid and completed by him in a sound, competent, workmanlike, and durable manner, and to remain in that condition (sound and watertight) for a period of three (3) months after each service has been completed.

12. Each authorised person shall be held solely responsible to the Trust for any injury occasioned by him from whatsoever cause to the service-pipes laid by the Trust, their street mains, or other property, or whilst attaching services to the pipes laid by the Trust, or to services already laid and connected with the Trust's water supply, and any loss of water sustained by the Trust through such injury, or its ascertained value, together with the cost of all and every repairs necessitated thereby, shall be refunded by such person to the Trust within twenty-four (24) hours after the time of such injury having occurred.

13. Every person, previous to being licensed or authorised to lay private services, shall read the specifications in the office of the Trust, and shall sign in witness thereof his name and address, and at the same time deposit the sum of Five pounds (£5) sterling as security for the strict observance and performance of the stipulations and conditions contained therein; and in case of the non-observance and non-performance of any of the stipulations and conditions aforesaid, the Trust may cancel such license or authority, and shall be entitled to declare such deposit to be absolutely forfeited as liquidated damages, and the name of such person may at once be struck off the roll of those authorised to lay private services, and the same may be published in any local paper.

14. Provided that the period of maintenance of private services laid has duly expired, deposits may be withdrawn at any time upon seven (7) days' notice in writing to that effect being previously given to the Secretary of the Trust, when the name or names of such parties withdrawing their deposits may be published as before described in a local paper; and the Trust reserves the right on their part to alter, cancel, and annul the term and nature of any license or authority to lay such services at any time.

15. The whole of the works herein referred to shall be carried out under the superintendence, and according to the direction, of the foreman of the works of the Trust; and any disputes between the various parties concerned as to the quality of work and labor done, or as to the exact meaning of the specification aforesaid, shall be referred to the Trust, whose decision in all cases shall be final and binding upon all parties.

16. *Quality of materials required in laying private services, viz.*—The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron, of British manufacture.

17. All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.

18. All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

19. The whole of the tubes, tees, bends, &c., &c., to be perfectly new, sound, and free from all defects, and capable of standing hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet.

20. All delivery-cocks to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows or bends, &c. All cocks to stand the same pressure as the tubes.

21. All meters required to be fixed on private ground to be of the best manufacture and pattern, and no meter to be provided and fixed by any person unless previously approved by foreman of works.

22. No service-pipes in private ground shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than ten (10) inches.

23. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust, in writing, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe-work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for such offence to the penalty hereinafter mentioned.

24. No person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust or service-pipes therefrom except according to the specification approved of by the Trust, and if necessary, subject to and under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Trust, nor shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust. Wrought-iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed to be fixed for internal services.

25. No service of a larger bore than one (1") inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the Trust.

26. Should any person allow any service-pipe or pipes conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person to remain defective or in want of repair after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe required repairing, the Trust may stop the water flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

27. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier or the owner shall in every instance in which damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in neglect to have such pipes repaired within twenty-four (24) hours after notice from the officers of the Trust, be liable to a penalty as hereinafter mentioned. The Trust shall have power, in default of such owner or occupier to have such repairs done, and to demand and recover by process of law from such owner and occupier all or any reasonable costs and charges the Trust may have incurred in laying all new service-pipes or in repairing or renewing any such service-pipes.

28. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty as hereinafter mentioned.

29. Any person who shall have agreed with the Trust for a supply of water by measure, or who shall be called upon by the Trust to affix a water-meter shall, at his own expense, provide such meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working order and condition, to the satisfaction of any officer or agent of the Trust; and in the event of any repairs being required, notice in writing shall be immediately given to the Trust, and the registration on the dial of the meter of the quantity of water supposed to have been used shall be taken before such meter is removed or such repairs are effected; and every person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give twelve (12) hours' notice to that effect to the Trust.

30. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the Trust may estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous month or quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

31. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter shall be liable to a penalty as hereinafter mentioned.

32. No meter shall be affixed unless it is first approved by an officer of the Trust, and the dial of the same is capable of registering One million gallons (1,000,000).

33. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises to any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, or who shall allow any person to take and carry away the same, or who shall sell the water supplied by the Trust to any other person, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty as hereinafter specified.

34. Any person not having agreed with the Trust for a supply taking or carrying water away from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty as hereinafter mentioned.

35. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all reasonable times to enter any house, building, or lands to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water consumed or supplied, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or lands for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus, the property of the Trust; and if any person hinders any such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall be liable to a penalty as hereinafter mentioned.

36. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or to do anything which under these regulations ought to be done for the prevention of

the waste, misuse, undue consumption or contamination of the water, or wilfully or negligently allows the water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust.

37. The water supplied in the above-named district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid and affixed, and being under and in accordance with the same regulations, and not otherwise.

38. In the construction of these regulations the word "Person" shall be deemed to, and extend to, and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; the word "Officer" shall be deemed and be taken to mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" be deemed to mean the "Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust."

39. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of any of these regulations above contained and numbered, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five (£5) pounds for such breach, and in the case of a continuing breach to a penalty not exceeding One (£1) pound for every day such breach continues after notice of the offence from the Trust.

The foregoing regulation was made by the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, on the twenty-eighth day of November One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and to take effect from the first day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Rating Regulation for 1889, made by the Maryborough Waterworks Trust under the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946.

REGULATION No. 8.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Water Works Trust, the Waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the following Regulation, viz. :—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district :—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.
2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, used either partly or wholly as a domicile, an amount of five per cent. per annum on the annual value of such property.
3. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, not being a domicile, an amount of Three and a half per cent. per annum on the annual value of such property. Provided that in any case the charge shall not be less than the sum of One pound.
4. For every water-trough One pound per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs shall be 8,000 gallons.
5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows :—
Exceeding one quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum 16,000 gallons.
Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum 24,000 gallons.
For every additional acre and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.
In livery, carters', and carrier's stables, supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses.
In open sheds used for the above purposes each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.
6. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
7. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 4,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January 1889, and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1889, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first of January and on the first of July 1889.

Such persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time approve of for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover the said rate.

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling (except as hereinafter mentioned) on the annual value of all rateable property in the Yarrawonga urban district, to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic purposes, according to the valuation for the time being of all the lands and tenements comprised within the said urban district for the municipal rates of the Shire of Yarrawonga in Yarrawonga, is hereby made for the year commencing on the first day of January 1889, and ending on the thirty-first day of December 1889.

APSLEY TOWN COMMON.—REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the management of the Apsley Town Common.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, by the Governor in Council, on first May 1888, the Managers of the Apsley Town Common, having drafted the following for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle.
2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follows, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October, in every year, and the owners of stock registered during the currency of any quarter shall pay the agistment for the whole of such quarter —

For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule	2s. 6d. per quarter.
For every head of other large cattle	2s. 0d. "
For every head of small cattle	1s. 0d. "
Filles, colts, and calves, under the age of six months, the progeny of dains on the common	Free.
3. No entire horse over the age of six months, shall be allowed on the common, nor any bull over the age of six months, unless approved by the managers.
4. All stock on which the fees shall remain unpaid, for a period of fourteen days after the commencement of any quarter, shall be treated as trespassers.
5. All horned cattle, after the fees in respect thereof are paid, shall be branded with the common brand by the owners, unless instructions have been given by the managers to the herdsman to brand such cattle before being placed on the common.
6. The herdsman shall, at his own expense, release from pound all cattle having the common brand, or entitled to depasture on the common.
7. No bullocks or horses belonging to carriers, unless entitled to commonage, shall remain more than twenty-four hours on the common, unless detained by accident or stress of weather.
8. No person shall remove registered stock from the common without the consent, in writing, of the herdsman, or one of the managers.
9. Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (20) for each offence.
10. All travelling stock must cross over the common within one hour and a-half.

2. On application being made to the trustees for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the fees set forth in the schedule.
3. Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in this cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that the relatives of the deceased are unable to pay the usual fees.
4. The sexton shall dig all ordinary graves, unless otherwise specially ordered, on payment of the fees mentioned in schedule A.
5. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones, must be kept in repair and in proper condition at the expense of the owners.
6. All persons destroying the fences or in any way injuring the cemetery will be prosecuted as the law directs.
7. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
8. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined on payment, as set forth in schedule A.
9. When a meeting of the trustees is required, the same to be convened by the secretary; four to form a quorum.
10. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alterations from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.
2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.
3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.
4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.
5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.
6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.
8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.
9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.
10. 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SHIRE OF HEALESVILLE.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Healesville, made under section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 1, for regulating the proceedings of Council, Officers, &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the president, councillors, and ratepayers, of the Shire of Healesville, order as follows:—

That the whole of Part XI. of the 13th schedule of the "Local Government Act 1874" be adopted, viz:—

PART XI.—REGULATION OF PROCEEDINGS OF COUNCIL, OFFICERS, &C.

1. In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. At every meeting of the council, the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the council at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.
- (2.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.

- (3.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (4.) Presentation of reports of committees and officers.
- (5.) Payments.
- (6.) Ordinary business.
- (7.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (8.) Extraordinary business, and new rules and regulations.
- (9.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (10.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

6. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. No motion, except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

9. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book; and if not so moved, or postponed, shall be struck out.

10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall, at some previous meeting, have submitted a draft of the same.

12. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order; when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

15. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded; but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the president's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon; but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. The councillors, in meeting of council, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

18. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

24. A councillor called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

25. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

28. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

29. The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. At every meeting of the council all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

35. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council by the protesting councillor, in a book to be kept for that purpose, in the office of the municipal clerk, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

38. If any debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

39. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. Minutes of proceedings of committees as well as their reports numbered in consecutive order shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee shall be presented to the council; and the municipal clerk when practicable shall attend all meetings of committees.

41. The municipal clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

42. No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

43. It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision thereof.

44. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

45. Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

46. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

48. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the shire, inviting application from qualified candidates for the same.

50. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. No councillor or officer of the council, and no assessor or auditor of the municipality, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council, or for any work to be done for the council.

52. In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

53. All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

54. It shall be lawful for the treasurer of the municipality from time to time, on the written order of the municipal clerk, to

disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the council for the purpose of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the council the sum of Five pounds sterling.

55. The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks each councillor shall have a key, and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the municipal clerk; and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the chairman of the municipality and one other member of the council, or, in the absence of such chairman, unless two councillors be present.

56. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this bye-law may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the council.

57. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this bye-law, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds sterling.

BYE-LAW No. 2.

A bye-law of the Shire of Healesville made under Section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 2, for the purpose of adopting and applying to the said Shire the provisions of clauses 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 19, 23, 25, 26, 27, 42, and 48 of Part 1. of the 15th Schedule of the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the "Local Government Act 1874," the president, councillors, and ratepayers of the Shire of Healesville order as follow:—That clauses 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 19, 23, 25, 26, 27, 42, and 48 of the said Schedule of the said Act be adopted viz.:—

PART I.—STREETS AND FOOTWAYS.

(3.) Spouts and drains from houses, &c.

12. The owner or occupier of every house or building in, adjoining, or near to any street, or road, within seven days next after service of a notice by the council for that purpose, shall put up a shoot, or trough, of the whole length of such house or building, and shall connect the same either with a similar shoot on the adjoining house or building, or with a pipe or trunk to be fixed to the front or side of such first-mentioned house or building from the roof to the ground to carry the water from the roof thereof in such manner that the water from such house or the shoot or trunk affixed thereto, or from any portico or projection therefrom, shall not fall upon the persons passing along the street or road, or flow over the footway, but so that no such pipe or trunk shall be an obstruction to the safe and convenient passage along the footway, and shall construct or lay from and in continuation of such pipe or trunk to the water channel a gutter, herein called channel, at the outer edge of the footway, and through, under, and transversely to the footway, such covered drain or trunk for carrying such water to such channel as shall be authorized or directed by some regulation in that behalf, and shall thereafter keep in good condition every such shoot, trough, pipe, drain, and trunk, and every such drain or trunk shall be constructed, laid and repaired subject to the inspection of such officer as the council shall have appointed in that behalf; and in default of compliance with any such notice within the period aforesaid or with the provisions of this section such owner or occupier shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day that he shall so make default.

13. Every owner or occupier of land in, adjoining to, or near any street or road, if such land shall be so situated that surface or storm water from, or upon the same, overflows or tends naturally, if not otherwise discharged, to overflow any footway of such street or road, shall within seven days next after the service of notice by the council for that purpose, construct and lay from such point upon such land being near to the footway as shall be specified in such notice by plan appended or otherwise, and higher in level than the bottom of the channel at the outer edge of the footway to the said channel, and through, under, and transversely to the footway, and keep in good condition such covered drain or trunk as and subject to the like inspection as in the last preceding section mentioned respectively; and in default of compliance with any such notice within the period aforesaid, or with the provisions of this section, such owner or occupier shall forfeit a sum not exceeding forty shillings for every day during which he shall make default.

14. It shall be lawful for the council to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—

For regulating the material and the size, the level, and the fall of any drain or trunk to be laid or constructed under any footway, either absolutely or with relation to the level or fall of the footway or channel, or otherwise, in like manner, and so if they please that such size be variable within limits prescribed in the regulation according to the discretion of such officer as the council shall thereby direct.

(4.) Crossings over footways and channels.

15. Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse rides or drives any horse or other animal, or drives or wheels any carriage, cart, or other vehicle upon, along, or across any footway, or any water channel, or gutter, herein called channel, by the side of any street or road, save in each such case upon and by or at some crossing to be made as hereinafter mentioned, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and shall also pay to the council such sum not exceeding Ten pounds by way of compensation for any damage done by him to the footway or channel, as the justice adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order.

16. If any land shall front to, adjoin, or abut upon the footway to any street or road, and if access with horses and vehicles from such street or road to such land or to some sufficient way appurtenant thereto, cannot be had without riding, driving, or wheeling the same respectively upon or across the said footway or the channel (if any) lying along the outer edge thereof, and if the owner of such land shall desire that a crossing for horses and other animals and for vehicles be made as herein provided over such footway and channel, and shall give notice in writing of such his desire to the council, and in such notice describe the land in question and the proposed work by reference to the specification deposited as hereinafter mentioned, such specification being in accordance with the provisions hereof, and with such regulation as may be in force in that behalf, it shall be lawful for such owner, after seven clear days from the giving such notice and not before (with no unnecessary delay or obstruction), at his own cost and under the inspection of such officer as the council shall have appointed for the purpose, to make such crossing according to the tenor of such notice and specification, and not otherwise, and the owner of such land shall afterwards in like manner maintain the same.

17. Every such owner who desires as aforesaid that any such crossing shall be made shall, before giving notice to the council as herein provided, deposit with the municipal clerk a specification describing the proposed work with respect to each of the several matters hereby or by any such regulation in force in that behalf required or provided.

19. In streets or roads in which, at the site of any proposed crossing, there is a kerb of stone, or wood, along the outer edge of the footway, the crossing so far as the footway extends shall have on both sides a kerb not higher in any part than the surface of the footway at any part, and similar in all respects to such first-mentioned kerb, and such kerb shall approach to and join the street-kerb in gentle curves outwards, and such crossing shall be of such width, and the surface thereof so far as the footway extends shall have such inclination outwards, and be depressed so far below the footway, as shall have been respectively appointed by some regulation in that behalf, and shall with respect to the channel be so laid or constructed as not to raise or obstruct the same, or any part thereof.

23. If any private street or road shall meet at an angle the footway of any public street or road, and there shall be no crossing upon and across such footway and the channel adjacent thereto from such private street or road to such public street or road, it shall be lawful for the council, if they shall see fit, to make in accordance with any regulation in force in that behalf a crossing upon and over such footway and channel of the description hereinbefore provided with respect to other crossings, and to recover from the owner of each of the tenements abutting on such private street or road such portion of the expenses of such making as shall bear to the whole of such expenses the same proportions as the rateable value of such tenement bears to the whole rateable value of all the tenements so abutting.

25. If any crossing shall be out of repair, and the person liable hereunder to maintain or repair the same shall, for seven days after notice from the council to that effect, neglect properly and completely to repair the same, he shall forfeit for every day that such crossing shall remain so unrepared a sum of Forty shillings, and the council may, if they shall see fit, effect such repair and recover the same from such person before any justice.

26. It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following, that is to say:—

For regulating the width, depression, and inclination of crossings across or over footways and channels, and the material for making and constructing the same, the mode of laying and bedding such materials, the length, width, size, strength, and fall of bridge crossings, and the said inclination and fall, either absolutely or with relation to the levels, inclination or fall of the footway or channel, or otherwise in like manner.

(5.) *Deposit or discharge of rubbish, liquid, &c., on streets, &c.*

27. Every person who causes to run from any manufactory or any establishment for the boiling or preparing of any animal matter, or any brewery, slaughter-house, butcher's shop, or any dunghill or other receptacle, or from any inn, into or upon any street or road, public or private, or any footway or channel; and every occupier of any land or premises who causes or permits to run from such land or premises into or upon any such street or road, footway, or channel any offensive liquid or matter, shall for every day during which any such liquid or matter shall so run forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

(9.) *Obstructions, &c., to streets, &c., by cattle, &c.*

42. If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and if such cattle shall by reason of having been so found at large have been impounded by the council, the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle shall not be sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs shall have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same, or so much thereof as remains unpaid, shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and, if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known, then the provisions of the preceding section as far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction shall apply.

(11.) *Miscellaneous.*

48. It shall be lawful for the council to make regulations for prohibiting or restraining the travelling with or driving of loaded

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drays or carts on Sundays; and if any person travel with or drive any such loaded dray or cart contrary to such regulations, he shall forfeit for every such breach of such regulations a sum not exceeding Forty shillings.

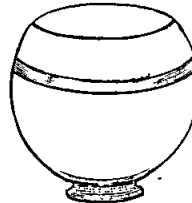

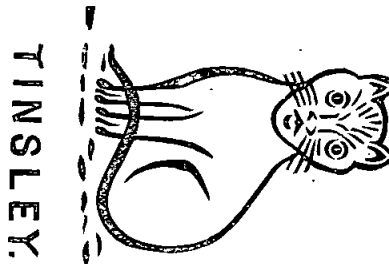

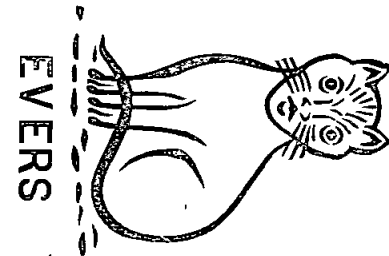
