PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW SHIRE.

They therefore pray that Your Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the said area from the Shire of Swan Hill and constitute it a separate municipality under the name of the Shire of Mildura; that it be not subdivided; and that the council consist of (9) nine members.

TELEPHONIC COMMUNICATION BETWEEN MELBOURNE AND GEELONG.

"The Post Office Act 1883," Sec. 88.

THE Administrator of the Government in Council has been pleased to approve of the following rates for the use of the Telephone Line between Melbourne and Geelong, and of the undermentioned Regulations in connection with the said line; to take effect from the 1st October, 1889:-

1. For the use of the trunk line, £45 per annum, payable in advance; this sum to be charged in addition to the local Exchange rates.
2. Non-subscribers to the trunk line to be allowed to converse on the line upon payment of the sum of *One shilling and sixpence* (1s. 6d.) for any period not exceeding five minutes.
3. That a fee of 6d. be charged for messenger's services for calling any person required to converse with subscribers or others to the public office. That annual subscribers be allowed the use of the line at any time when the same is disengaged.
4. Subscribers to the Melbourne and Geelong local Exchanges may use the line when required by paying a toll fee of 1s. 6d. for each connection of five minutes duration or fraction thereof, provided a sum of money equal to their estimated requirements for, say one month, be paid in advance. All accounts to be rendered monthly, re-imbursements to be promptly made, and no connections to be made after notification that the advance has been exhausted.
5. Public offices will be established in Melbourne and Geelong, where persons not subscribers to either Exchange may, on application thereat, be allowed the use of the line and instruments, and be connected with any subscriber at the other end, or may converse with any other person at the other end, who may be in attendance by appointment, on paying the toll fee of 1s. 6d. for each connection of five minutes duration or fraction thereof.
6. Upon payment of the fee of 6d., in addition to the telephone toll fee, a messenger will be despatched to call any person the applicant may desire to converse with, provided the place of business or residence of such person be within a radius of 1½ miles from the office.
7. No person, whether an annual subscriber, toll subscriber, or otherwise, to be allowed the use of the line for more than five (5) minutes consecutively if other applicants are waiting to use it; but, if the line be disengaged, an extension of time may be granted to annual subscribers without further fee, and to others on paying an additional fee of 1s. 6d. for every five minutes or portion thereof.
8. In cases where the line may be engaged, applications will be registered, and connections will be made in the order of priority of application.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognized surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognized surveyor.

IV. Or he must have completed the full course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and have served one year in the field as above.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

WHEREAS by *The Water Conservation Act 1887* it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should—

(a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out such proposed waterworks, and of paying the cost and expenses of preparing the general plan and description of the same, and the costs of the application for the constituting of such Waterworks Trust; and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted;

(b) Specify the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Waterworks Trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District;

(c) State what are the principal works to be constructed;

(d) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and

(e) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with this Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council thinks fit.

And it was further enacted by section 23 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946, that whenever a Waterworks District was either wholly or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof within one municipal district, the Governor in Council might appoint the municipal council for the time being of such municipal district, together with one or more persons not being members of such municipal council to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District. Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the Council of the Shire of Rodney for a loan of Four hundred and twenty-five pounds sterling (£425) to carry out certain waterworks for the domestic supply of a Waterworks District under the said Act, embracing the township of Kyabram as shown on the general plan and description accompanying the said application, deposited in the Department of Water Supply, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1.) The construction of the said waterworks and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust.

(2.) The Municipal Council of the Shire of Rodney for the time being and one other Commissioner to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District.

(3.) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Four hundred and twenty-five pounds sterling (£425), for the purpose of constructing works for the supply of the township of Kyabram with water, and also for paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payment of which interest shall be made half-yearly.

(4.) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be that portion of the Shire of Rodney bounded by lines distant ten chains from and parallel to the north, south, east, and west boundaries of the township of Kyabram as gazetted the 18th February, 1876; all of which Trust boundaries are as shown on Order in Council plan deposited in the office of the Minister of Water Supply, Melbourne.

(5.) The principal works to be carried out shall consist of reticulating the township of Kyabram.

(6.) The name of the Trust shall be the Kyabram Waterworks Trust.

4. Any owner or agent subject to the foregoing conditions may use any pen not containing the required number of pigs as allowed by this regulation.

5. Should any dispute arise between any one or more persons concerning this regulation, it may be referred to the Market Inspector, and his decision thereon shall be final.

6. Any person who shall place in any pen more pigs than allowed by this regulation, or place any pig in any pen not set apart for its particular class, and shall fail to remove same forthwith when so required by the Market Inspector, or shall in any way fail to comply with this regulation, shall, on conviction before two or more justices, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

III. Rules for the better regulation and government of the Market—

That the Market shall be open for the reception and sale of stock and produce of every description on every Thursday in each week, from 10 o'clock in the forenoon to 7 o'clock p.m. of the same day. Should any of the days hereby fixed for the sale of stock or produce fall on Christmas Day or New Year's Day, the Market shall be open for the sale of stock and produce on the day preceding.

IV. There shall be appointed by the Council, if necessary, an Inspector for said Market, whose duty shall be as follows:—

- 1st. To see that the Market Regulations are duly observed.
- 2nd. To preserve order and regularity in the Market.
- 3rd. To inspect all articles intended for human food that may be brought to the Market, and such articles as are deemed unfit for use, to report the same to the proper authorities, or take such measures as may be desirable to prevent the sale thereof.

V. All Tolls and Dues chargeable under the said schedule, shall be payable and collected on the entrance of the articles into the Market, or prior to their being sold and leaving the Market, in the discretion of the Inspector.

VI. Any person who shall place any matter or thing so as to obstruct the thoroughfare in the said Market, and shall refuse or neglect to remove the same on being required by the Inspector to do so, or who shall place any cart, carriage, or wheelbarrow in any part of said Market, contrary to the direction of the Inspector thereof, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this by-law.

VII. No person shall place or drive any hook, nail, peg, or other instrument, into any part of the wood, stone, or brickwork of any shed or stall, or shall in any way fit up or enclose any stall without the consent of the Inspector in writing.

VIII. Any person resisting or obstructing or interfering with the Inspector in the discharge of his duty shall, independently of any penalty he or she may incur for assault or otherwise, be deemed to have committed a breach of this by-law.

IX. No person shall offer for private or public sale in any part of the said Market any produce, goods, horses, or cattle before the hour of opening or after the hour of closing said Market, nor upon any day not fixed by the Council as a day upon which the Market will be open, without the sanction of the Council in writing. All produce or implements of every description must be removed out of the Market yards before 12 o'clock noon on the day following that upon which they are sold or offered for sale, otherwise a charge of (5s.) Five shillings per week will be made for a space not exceeding 200 superficial feet. All horses or cattle must be removed out of the Market before 12 o'clock noon on the day following the day of sale.

X. Any person or persons guilty of any wilful act or breach of default of this by-law shall, on conviction before two or more justices, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

5. No person shall injure, cut down, destroy, damage, or otherwise interfere with the fences in and around the park, or in any manner disturb, damage, or destroy any property, chattels, effects or things in the park.

6. No person shall remove or carry away from the park, or any part thereof, any soil, gravel, earth, sand, mullock, or mining debris, without having first obtained the consent in writing of the council.

7. No cart or other vehicle used for carting or conveying soil, gravel, earth, sand, or mining debris shall, without the authority of the duly appointed officer of the council, be driven through the park.

8. In addition to the provisions herein contained, it shall be lawful for the council from time to time make such regulations for the proper maintenance and management of the park as shall seem to them fit.

9. Any person offending against this by-law or any such regulation shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

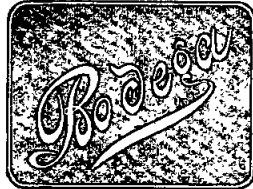
