REGULATIONS FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE VOTE TO AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES, 1889-90.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the Distribution of the sum of Twenty-four thousand pounds sterling (£24,000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1889-90.

Regulations.

1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February, 1890, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding Twenty-five pounds each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum do not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. Of the whole grant (£24,000), a sum not exceeding Twenty-three thousand five hundred pounds shall be so divided; and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. A sum not to exceed Five hundred pounds shall be paid to the Taralgon Agricultural Society towards the expenses of its Spring Show, to be held on the 5th and 6th December, 1889, under the patronage of the Department of Agriculture.

5. No society located within twenty miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society, as hereinbefore specified, amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

Instructions.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration, form E, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, between the 1st January, 1889, and the 31st December, 1889, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account, when received, must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president, or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management. It should then be returned to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne.

3. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid, unless such cups have been finally awarded.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

1. All exhibits to be the *bona fide* property of exhibitors, and the produce to be made or grown by the exhibitor.
2. The prizes to be awarded by judges appointed by the Society.
3. In any case where, in the opinion of the Secretary for Agriculture, any misstatement has been made regarding any exhibit, the prize shall not be paid.
4. Entrance fees for exhibits to be regulated by the Society's usual charges.

5. The amounts to be awarded as prizes shall be in accordance with the schedule herewith:—

PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS, 1889-90.

REGULATIONS FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE VOTE TO PUBLIC
PARKS AND GARDENS, 1889-90.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined
Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Nine thousand five hundred pounds sterling (£9,500) for fencing and improving Public Parks and Gardens, 1889-90.

Regulations.

1. A sum not exceeding Ten shillings shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January, 1889, and 31st December, 1889, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 1st February, 1890. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January, 1889, and 31st December, 1889; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1889.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1889 (*vide* form A), and a sum equal to one-half of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of Nine thousand four hundred pounds they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. Moneys expended in street planting or in fencing, formation or maintenance of land for racing, cricket, football, croquet, tennis, bowling, quoits, or other sports, or in erection or repairs of stands or pavilions for the purpose of witnessing sports, must not be included in any claim upon the vote.

6. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, except the Royal Park, or to the Edinburgh Garden, Fitzroy, or the Botanical Garden, Geelong.

1. That each society claiming to participate in the Grant shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February, 1890, a statement in the Form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the Form marked E.

2. The distribution will be made one month after the above-mentioned date, when a sum equal to the amount of the prize-money awarded and paid away will be allotted to each society having a claim, and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, provided that the sums claimed do not exceed in the whole Six hundred and ninety-five pounds three shillings and sevenpence, and if they do exceed this amount then they will be reduced *pro rata*, and the allotment made accordingly.

3. A sum of Fifty-four pounds sixteen shillings and fivepence shall be paid to the Port Fairy Horticultural Society for expenditure in prizes during the year 1888.

4. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st January, 1889, and the 31st December, 1889, amounts in the total to less than Fifty pounds shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

Instructions.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration form E for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations between the 1st January, 1889, and the 31st December, 1889, must be filled up in words as well as in figures; and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account is then to be prepared by making the Government *Dr.* for the amount declared to have been awarded and paid away in prizes.

3. The account must be signed by the treasurer, and be countersigned by the president or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management; it should then be returned to the Department of Agriculture, with the declaration and statements appended.

It may expedite the payment of the money to fill in at the top of the account the name of the nearest pay office in the space left blank for the purpose. It is necessary to bear in mind that, if that space be not filled up, the account will be payable at Melbourne only.

4. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid, unless such cups have been finally awarded.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW SHIRE.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, sec. 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, are published, viz:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Buln Buln which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Buln Buln and constituted a new shire, under the name or title of "The Shire of Powong and Jeetho."

Area described in the petition:—

Commencing at a point at the south-west corner of parish of Jumbunna East; thence in a line due north to the north-west corner of Horner's selection, No. 35, parish of Jeetho; thence along the Jeetho West-road to the south-west corner of No. 31, said parish; thence in a line due west to Westernport Bay; thence along the shore of said bay to the north-west corner of allotment 34, parish of Laing Laing; thence easterly to the north-east corner of selection No. 29 said parish; thence about fifty chains in a due northerly direction; thence about fifty-five chains in an easterly direction; thence about one hundred and thirty chains due north; thence about fifty chains in an easterly direction; thence about one hundred and ninety chains in a due northerly direction; thence in a north-east direction about one hundred and fifty-five chains to a point in selection 147, Lang Lang; thence in a north-westerly direction along the boundary of the parish of Yallock to a point in E. J. Cameron's selection, south of No. 24A parish of Yallock; thence along the course of the Lang Lang through the parish of Poowong to a point near the south-west corner of selection No. 26 Poowong East; thence in a southerly direction along the boundary of the parish of Poowong East to the south-west corner of selection No. 29; thence along the southern boundary of the said allotment; thence south to the south-west corner of selection No. 39; thence along the southern boundary of the said allotment; thence to the south-west corner of allotment No. 12; thence along the northern boundary of allotment No. 43; thence in a northerly direction to the north-west corner of allotment 45; thence east to McDonald's Track; thence in a south-westerly direction along the said track to Whitelaw's Track; thence southerly along the said track to a point due east of the south-east corner of the parish of Jumbunna East; thence along the boundary of the said parish to the starting point.

Petitioners state that the Great Southern Railway will intersect the proposed shire about midway, and will centralize their interests; that the new railway will necessitate the making of new roads, &c., and to construct them satisfactorily it is necessary that they should be under the management of a thoroughly representative body; that owing to the distance from the present Shire Hall such representation is practically impossible, and from the same cause it is impossible for the officers of the shire to properly supervise works so far distant from head quarters. That the new shire will comprise an area of not less than 133,552 acres, yielding an estimated revenue of not less than £1,024 19s. annually, on a 1s. rate.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that Your Excellency will be pleased to exercise the powers conferred by the 19th section of the *Local Government Act 1874*, and cause that portion of the Shire of Buln Buln above described to be severed from the Shire of Buln Buln and constituted a new shire, to be called the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho; that it be not subdivided, and that the number of councillors be nine (9).

SHIRE OF MALVERN.

BY-LAW No. 25.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Malvern, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Acts 1865-1888," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following By-law No. 25 of the said Local Board, that is to say:—

1. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the following boundaries of the Shire, viz.:—Commencing at the junction of Kooyong-road with Gardiner's Creek; thence by the said creek eastward to Tooronga-road; thence by that road southward to Wattle Tree-road; thence southward by Wattle Tree-road to Darling-road; thence southward by Darling-road to Dandenong-road; thence westward by Dandenong-road to Kooyong-road; thence northward by Kooyong-road to the commencing point.

3. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall once at least in every week, or more often if required by the health officer or inspector, cause to be emptied and cleansed every earth-closet or privy on or belonging to such premises.

4. Nightmen licensed by the Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Malvern shall alone be employed for the removal of night-soil from any premises situate within the above-described boundaries.

5. No person shall deposit night-soil, bury any carcass or any dead animal, or place or deposit dust, filth, rubbish, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter in or upon any land, whether enclosed or otherwise, within the said shire, except only at the depot for the time being provided by the said Local Board, or in or upon such other place as may be set apart from time to time for such purpose. And every carcass and all offensive matter liable to decomposition shall be buried at least two feet below the natural surface of the ground, and in all cases to the satisfaction of the Inspector of Nuisances.

6. Any person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds or less than Five shillings, and a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds or less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such power.

RÉGULATIONS UNDER "THE EDUCATION ACT 1872" AMENDED.

WHEREAS by The Education Act 1872 it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind Regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that Regulation XV. of the Regulations under The Education Act 1872 be cancelled, and that the subjoined Regulation be substituted therefor, and be read as and taken to be Regulation No. XV. of the aforesaid Regulations, that is to say:—

XV.—HOLIDAYS.

1. The holidays observed in State schools, exclusive of Saturdays, shall be as follows, except in cases in which a different arrangement may be specially sanctioned by the Minister:—

(a) Four weeks at midsummer, commencing on the Monday preceding Christmas Day, unless Christmas Day fall on Monday, in which case the holidays shall commence on that day.

(b) Good Friday and Easter week:

(c) The public holidays not included in the above, viz.:—May 24th; November 9th; and such other days as may be gazetted as public holidays, except those proclaimed in connection with races.

(d) Such other holidays, not exceeding four in each financial year, as may be approved by the Board of Advice.

2. No other holidays than those specified above shall be given without the express sanction of the Minister, except days on which the school building may be required for election purposes.

3. Whenever a school is closed on days other than those specified in clause 1, the head teacher shall notify the same, with full particulars, to the Board of Advice and to the District Inspector.

4. When a holiday is granted by the Board of Advice out of the four days placed at its disposal, the head teacher shall previously send notice to the District Inspector, and shall make a special report thereof to the Department in his monthly return.

5. In the absence of such special report, or in the event of any other days than those specified in clause 1 being observed as holidays and no explanation thereof being furnished in the monthly return, pay will be deducted; and no appeal against such deduction will be entertained.

(a) Make any order which might have been made in the Order in Council appointing or authorizing such Trust, body, or persons; and

Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to each Trust, body, or persons.

And whereas the said Trust has applied for a loan of certain moneys from the Board of Land and Works to carry out its duly authorized scheme of works: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order that clauses numbered 6, 8, and 9 of the said Order bearing date as aforesaid shall be and the same are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be and be deemed to be,

and may be cited as, clauses 6, 8, and 9 of the said Order respectively:—

6. That the total amount of money proposed to be expended by the said Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply Trust upon Trust works is Thirty thousand four hundred and fifty-five pounds (£30,455) sterling.

8. That the amount of money proposed to be advanced by the Board of Land and Works to the said Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply Trust by way of loan is Seven thousand pounds (£7,000) sterling; that the rate of interest to be paid upon such loan is Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, being one-half per cent. higher than the rate paid by the Government upon the public loan out of which such moneys are to be advanced, the rate of such interest to be subject to reduction in accordance with section one hundred and forty-six of the said Act in event of the interest paid by the Government upon such public loan being reduced.

9. That the amount of moneys which may be borrowed by the said Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall not, at any time, together with any balance due from the Trust to the Board of Land and Works or upon any Trust loan, exceed the sum of Thirty thousand four hundred and fifty-five pounds (£30,455) sterling; and no rate shall be made by the Trust which shall exceed the sum of Five shillings in the £ upon the annual value of the property rated within the Trust district.

THE Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied (otherwise than by measure) by the said Trust within the Trust District, that is to say:—

(1) For all lands and tenements within the Trust area (liable to be rated) of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

(2) For all lands and tenements within the Trust area (liable to be rated) of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, an amount equal to One shilling in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation for the shire of Seymour.

That the above-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January, 1890, and ending on thirty-first day of December, 1890, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and on the first day of July, 1890.

Such persons as the Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

RATING REGULATION.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Water Conservation Act, make the Regulations following:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to five per cent. on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons; and the minimum

quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs shall be 16,000 gallons for any trough not exceeding 12 feet in length, and 8,000 gallons for every additional 5 feet or fractional part thereof.

4. Every trough situated in a paddock shall be supplied through a meter, affixed by the consumer according to the directions of the Trust, provided nevertheless that the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall not be less than that charged for troughs supplied under the preceding clause.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 8,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder.

6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon); and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purposes of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre; for every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery and carriers' stables and all other stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds, used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

That each syphon-pump must have a meter affixed, and that Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons be charged for all water registered at such meter.

That the occupiers of all tenements not already rated, situated within a distance of a quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe, shall pay a rate equal to one-half; and where such tenements are situated at a distance of more than a quarter of a mile therefrom, such occupiers shall pay a rate equal to one-quarter of the amount which would be payable if such tenements were supplied with water from service-pipes.

The before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in such year. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

THE Commissioners of the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhill Urban District, that is to say:—

(1) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds sterling annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

(2) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to One shilling in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

(3) For all tenements in the said urban district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

(4) For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, £1 per annum on each inch diameter of the cylinder.

(5) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Three shillings per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon); and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 20,000 gallons.

Exceeding half an acre but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre; and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety; and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and on the first day.

of July, One thousand eight hundred and ninety. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust, may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the following Regulations, viz.:—

Regulation No. 1, as to Ordinary and Special and Committee Meetings.

1. The ordinary meetings of the commissioners shall be held at the Town Hall, Daylesford, once in every four weeks, on Friday, at Four o'clock in the afternoon, and any such meeting may be adjourned should the commissioners see fit.

2. Where any business other than ordinary business is required or intended to be transacted, done, or adopted at any ordinary meeting of the Trust notice thereof shall be given to each of the commissioners, and no such extraordinary business, nor any new rules or regulations, shall be transacted or adopted at the ordinary meetings of the Trust unless due notice thereof have been given at a prior meeting of the Trust, and sent to each commissioner in the manner provided for special meetings.

3. No resolution at any meeting of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of the intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given to each of the commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the commissioners present at such subsequent meeting, if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

4. A special meeting of the Trust may be called at any time by the chairman, or by the chairman at the request in writing of any two commissioners; but no such meeting shall be held unless three clear days' notice thereof is sent to each commissioner. Such notice shall state the business to be transacted at such special meeting, and no other business shall be transacted at such special meeting than that stated upon the notice convening the same.

5. The Trust may from time to time appoint occasional or standing committees, and may fix the quorum of every such committee; and every such committee shall report to the Trust; and the Trust may at any time alter or discontinue any such committee.

6. Every such committee shall appoint one of the members thereof to be chairman of such committee, and such committee may from time to time remove such chairman.

7. Every committee so appointed may meet from time to time, and adjourn from place to place, as they may think proper; but no business shall be transacted at any meeting of the committee unless the quorum of members (if any) fixed by the Trust, and if no quorum be fixed three members be present; and at all meetings of the committee, if the chairman be not present, one of the members present shall be appointed chairman; and all questions shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the members present, and in case of an equal division of votes, the chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a member of the committee.

Regulation No. 2, for the regulation of the Proceedings of the Meetings of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust, and its Officers, &c.

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. *Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the chairman; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Trust at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting.

3. *Order of business at meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Trust.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any commissioner, the commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. *Addresses to Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

6. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of the meeting of Trust, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of the Trust; and the secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. *Notice of motion to be given.*—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject apart from the ordinary business of the Trust for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. *Petitions.*—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

9. *Motions to be moved in order in motion book.*—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. *Motion to be proceeded with by commissioner giving same, except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. *Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.*—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall submit a draft of the same.

12. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

14. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

15. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. *Mover of motion.*—A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. *Designation of commissioners.*—The commissioners in meetings of the Trust shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.

18. *Priority of commissioners.*—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. *Chairman to rise in addressing Trust.*—The chairman shall rise in addressing the Trust to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. *Commissioner not to speak a second time on same question.*—No commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. *Points of order.*—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. *Commissioners not to digress, &c.*—No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any commissioner in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. *Commissioners to apologize for disorderly, &c., expression.*—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

24. *Commissioner called to order to sit down.*—A commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

25. *Commissioner twice offending guilty of an offence.*—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. *Strangers.*—Any person, not being a commissioner, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, or by his directions, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. *Commissioner not attending order for call.*—Any commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Trust, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

28. *Commissioner may demand documents.*—Any commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

29. *Voting.*—The Trust shall vote by show of hands; and any commissioner present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. *Question, how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. *Motions, &c., to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the Trust all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. *No second amendment until previous one disposed of.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. *Effect of rejection of words in original motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. *If amendment be negatived, a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved; but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Trust for discussion at a time.

35. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. *Motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. *Protests.*—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall, in every case, be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such commissioner, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

38. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted at the next meeting, unless otherwise decided by a majority of the Trust.

39. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust; and the secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

40. *Meetings of the committee.*—The secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

41. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

42. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and of any documents appended thereto, and to ascertain that they do not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision thereof.

43. *Commissioners to affix their names.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

44. *Petitions to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

45. *To be signed by petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

46. *Commissioners confined to statement of certain facts.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

47. *Appointments, &c., of officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given, by advertisement, in one or more newspapers circulating in the waterworks district, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

48. *Salaries of officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall, in all cases, be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

49. *No commissioner, &c., to be surety for officer.*—No commissioner or officer of the Trust, and no assessor or auditor of the Trust, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the Trust, or for any work to be done for the Trust.

50. *Expense of preparing security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

51. *Suspension of rules.*—Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose, on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended, except by a unanimous vote of the Trust.

52. *Penalty.*—If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission, contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds.

53. *Bank accounts and signing cheques.*—Every officer of the Trust having the control of moneys shall, within seventy-two hours, or such other period as the Trust may from time to time direct, pay all such moneys of the Trust as may from time to time come into his possession, amounting to twenty pounds or upwards, into such bank as the Trust may from time to time direct.

54. *Mode of drawing out money.*—No such moneys shall be drawn out of any such bank, except by cheque signed by any three commissioners duly authorized by the Trust and countersigned by the secretary, and having the seal of the Trust affixed thereon.

55. All letters and accounts must be lodged with the secretary to the Trust, not later than four o'clock p.m. on the day preceding the Trust meetings, otherwise they will not be considered until the next following meeting.

Regulation No. 3, regulating the Supply of Water, Fixing Meters, &c.

1. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stable or a supply for any manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour), or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants, or washing the house walls or a carriage, or for any similar purpose, unless where the water is charged for by meter, except by the written authority of the Trust; and no cock or tap with any connexion for attaching hose shall be affixed to any service-pipe, connexion, or fitting without the written authority of the Trust.

2. Any person receiving water from the Council who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

3. Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

4. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

5. Before any such licence shall be granted the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent person. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

6. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without

the permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve-pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

7. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipe of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust. Wrought galvanized-iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services. No service of a larger bore than half-inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the Trust.

8. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The occupier (if any), and if none, the owner, shall, in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipes being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

9. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

10. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe of the Trust with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing such approved self-acting valves as may be directed by the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust. All water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

11. All boilers or hot-water apparatus must be supplied from cisterns, as in no case will they be permitted to be fed directly from the pipes of the Trust.

12. In every bath the inlets must be distinct from and unconnected with the outlet, and the inlet-pipes must be visible and accessible, and be attached to the bath above the bottom thereof; and such bath shall be provided with a proper, well-fitted, and perfectly watertight ground outlet plug or cock. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

13. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except by permission of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

14. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all such times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

15. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied; but no such cutting off of the water supply shall exempt the offender from payment of the water rate during such suspension of the supply, nor from any fine or penalty provided for such offence by The Water Conservation Act or these regulations.

16. The Trust may order meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such meter to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supply to be charged for at the rates provided for in the regulations. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

17. If any meter should cease registering, or register incorrectly, during the time it is undergoing repairs, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

18. A meter shall not be used unless the same is of a kind and is placed in a situation approved in each instance by a memorandum in writing made by the duly authorized officer of the Trust.

19. Every meter shall be so placed as to be open to inspection, and as far as practicable in a situation where it cannot be affected by frost or injured by any other means, and shall be provided with means of access thereto.

20. A meter shall not be used, or be continued to be used, if it is found, on being tested by the officers of the Trust, to be inaccurate.

21. A meter shall not be connected to more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe leading from the service-pipe or other pipe of the Trust, unless permitted by a memorandum in writing under the hand of the duly authorized officer of the Trust.

22. Every person who has been ordered by the Trust to affix a meter shall keep and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of such officer as may be appointed by the Trust; and in the event of any repairs being required, notice in writing shall be immediately given by such person to the Trust; and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such repairs are effected.

23. Every person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give three days' notice in writing to that effect to the Trust; and a registration of the quantity of water used shall be taken before such removal or alteration is made.

24. If any person who under the provisions hereinbefore contained has been ordered to provide a meter, neglect or refuse, after having been required by the Trust so to do, to provide such meter, he shall for every day during which such neglect or refusal continues forfeit the sum of One pound.

25. If any person, who has provided any meter as aforesaid, fail to give the notice hereinbefore required of any repairs required for such meter, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

26. If any person refuse or delay to have such meter properly repaired and put in correct working order, after having been required by the officer of the Trust so to do, the Trust may shut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the service pipe or otherwise, until such meter shall have been properly repaired and certified by some officer of the Trust as being in proper working order.

27. If any plumber or other person fix or re-fix any meter upon any premises supplied with water by the Trust without having first obtained a certificate from the Trust that the said meter has been examined and found in correct working condition he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

28. If any person remove or alter the position of or in any way interfere with any meter without giving such notice as aforesaid, he shall for each such offence forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds over and above the damage which he may be found liable to pay in any action at law at the suit of the Trust.

29. The officers of the Trust may enter any house, building, or lands, to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or whether there be any waste or misuse of such water; and may from time to time enter any house, building, or lands for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust; and if any person hinders any such officer from entering or making such inspection or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; but except with the consent of a Justice this power of entry shall be exercised only between the hours of ten in the forenoon and four in the afternoon.

30. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wilfully or negligently causes or suffers any pipe, valve, cock, cistern, bath, soil-pipe, water-closet, or other apparatus or receptacle to be out of repair, or to be so used or contrived as that the water supplied to him by the Trust is or is likely to be wasted, misused, unduly consumed for irrigation or otherwise howsoever, or contaminated, or so as to occasion or allow the return of foul air or other noxious or impure matter into any pipe belonging to or connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

31. Any person guilty of any offence against these regulations not otherwise specifically provided for shall be liable on conviction thereof to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, in addition to being liable to make good any damage or loss sustained by the Trust.

Regulation No. 4, for regulating plumbers' work in connection with the laying of services, conditions respecting same, &c.

1. Pipes, &c.—The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reduced couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.

(a) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.

(b) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

(c) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of standing a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water of 500 feet.

(d) Delivery-cocks.—All delivery-cocks to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows, bends, &c. All cocks to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

(f) Depth of service-pipes.—No service-pipes shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 12 inches.

(g) Jointing.—All jointing between pipes, thimbles, bends, couplings, elbows, meters, and cocks to be made with red lead and flax only.

(h) Trenches to be properly filled in.—After service-pipes have been laid, the trench is to be properly filled in and thoroughly rammed, and any subsidence which may appear within three (3) months is to be immediately made good by the person laying such service.

2. No person shall be authorized to lay service-pipes, or make any fittings or connections, and attach the same to any service-pipes of the Trust, or to any private service-pipe already laid and connected with the pipes of the Trust, unless he can be proved to be a competent person.

3. No person shall lay private services, or make any fittings or connections, and attach the same to the pipes of the Trust, or to any private service already connected with the pipes of the Trust, without being duly approved, licensed, and authorized by the Trust to do such work.

4. The names of all plumbers authorized to lay private service-pipes shall be published in a local paper (after authorities have been granted) for three consecutive issues.

5. Every competent person, previous to being authorized to lay private services, shall read these stipulations and conditions, and sign in witness thereof his name and address, and at the same time pay the sum of One pound sterling as a fee for a license, and deposit the sum of Five pounds (£5) sterling as security for the strict observance and performance of the stipulations and conditions contained in these regulations and conditions; and in case of the non-observance or non-performance of any of these stipulations and conditions at any time, the Trust shall be entitled to declare such deposit to be absolutely forfeited, and the same shall thereupon become and be absolutely forfeited as liquidated damages, and the name of such person shall at once be struck off the roll of those authorized to lay private services, and be published in a local paper during three consecutive issues.

6. No private services whatsoever to be laid or extensions to be made by any authorized person unless he has ascertained at the Trust's office that the person for whom such work is intended has received the consent of the proper officers of the Trust to execute such work.

7. After private services are laid and attached to the pipes of the Trust or otherwise, or to private service-pipes already connected, each authorized person shall within twenty-four hours after each service has been completed, report all work done by him at the Trust office, and sign in the "day journal," his name and the date when each service was completed.

8. If at any time afterwards any such person wilfully infringes these regulations, either by himself or his workmen, or refuses to communicate any needful and proper information required of him in regard to any work connected with the works of the Trust done by him or his workmen; or under his superintendence, or upon his responsibility, his name shall be erased by the Trust from the list of "authorized persons," and shall be forthwith advertised as so erased in a local newspaper.

9. Each authorized person shall be held solely responsible to the Trust for such service-pipes being laid and completed by him in a sound, workmanlike, and durable manner, and to remain in that condition (sound and watertight) for a period of three (3) months after each service-pipe has been completed.

10. Provided always that after the period of maintenance of private services laid has duly expired, deposits may be withdrawn at any time upon twenty-eight (28) days' notice in writing to that effect having been given previously to the secretary to the Trust, when the name or names of such parties withdrawing their deposits shall be published in a local paper, the Trust reserving the right on their part to cancel and annul the licences of any or of all persons concerned at any time.

11. Each authorized person shall be held solely responsible to the Trust for any injury occasioned by him from whatsoever causes to the street mains or other property, whilst attaching private services, or to private services already laid and connected with the Trust's water supply; and any water lost by the Trust through such injury, or its ascertained value, together with the cost of all repairs necessitated thereby, shall be paid by such person to the Trust within twenty-four (24) hours after the time of such injuries having occurred.

12. The whole of the works herein referred to shall be carried out under the superintendence, and according to the directions, of the Trust's officer; and any disputes between the various parties concerned as to the quality of work and labour done, or to the exact meaning of this specification and the general conditions, shall be referred to the Trust, whose decision in all cases shall be final and binding on all parties.

In this and the foregoing regulations numbered one, two, and three, the word "Trust" shall mean the "Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust"; "secretary" shall mean the secretary of the Trust or the person for the time being discharging the duty of that office; "officer of the Trust" shall mean any officer of the Trust or other person appointed for the time being to carry out or supervise any work in connection with the Trust; and the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole.

The foregoing regulations, numbered one to four, were made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust this fifth day of April, 1889.

BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Rating Regulation for 1889, made by the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust under the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the following:—

REGULATION NUMBERED 5.

Fixing the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the Trust District, such rate being made for the year commencing on the first day of January, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1889.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust District, who are supplied with water by the Trust, shall be as follows, viz. :—

1. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, of the annual value of £20 and under, the sum of £1 1s. per annum.

2. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, above the annual value of £20, and not exceeding the annual value of £200, the sum of £5 per cent. per annum on the valuation.

3. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, above the annual value of £200, the sum of £4 10s. per cent. on the valuation.

4. On every hotel of the annual value of £30 and under, a minimum rate of £2 per annum.

5. On every hotel above the annual value of £30, the sum of £3 per cent. per annum on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than £2.

6. On unoccupied lands, and lands on which no tenements are erected, the sum of £5 per cent. on the annual valuation.

7. On livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of 10s. per annum for the first stall, and 7s. 6d. per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each six feet to be considered as one stall. For horses kept on private premises, 10s. per annum for the first horse kept, and 7s. 6d. per annum for each additional horse.

Cows to be paid for at the rate of 1s. each per annum.

Water-troughs, 10s. each per annum.

8. Water supplied by meter to be at the rate of 2s. per 1,000 gallons, except to manufactories, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, provided that not less than 50,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be 2s. per 1,000.

9. Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of 1s. 6d. for 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.

10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be 30s. per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering; or should the Trust require a meter to be affixed, the rate shall be 1s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to steam-boilers, the charge shall be at the rate of 10s. per horse-power per annum.

12. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.

13. These rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1889, except in cases where the Trust may have made a special agreement regarding the times of payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.

14. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.

The foregoing regulation, numbered 5, was made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust this fifth day of April, 1889.

KOROIT WATERWORKS TRUST.—LOAN.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR EXCURSIONS.

Holiday Excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (suburban excepted) from the 18th December, 1889, till the 4th January, 1890, both dates inclusive (Sundays excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example.—An Excursion ticket issued on the 18th December will be available till the 18th January. When the last day falls on a Sunday the ticket will be available till the next day. The journey must be commenced on the date the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger. During the same period tickets will also be issued at Messrs. T. Cook and Sons, 281 Collins-street; Federal Coffee Palace, 539-553 Collins-street; and Palace Hotel, 217 Bourke-street, city, from Melbourne to all stations; and at Yarra-street, Geelong (C. H. Swift); Lydiard-street, Ballarat (F. W. Niven and Co.); High-street, Sandhurst (J. Hemming), to Melbourne only.

Sydney Excursion Tickets.—From the 17th December, 1889, till the 4th January, 1890 (both dates inclusive), excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne for Sydney at the following return fares, viz.:—First class, £5 6s. 6d.; second class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for return for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line. (Passengers can, however, travel by the express train on the New South Wales line on payment of 15s. first class and 10s. second class.) The journey cannot be broken on the New South Wales line.

Adelaide Excursion Tickets.—From the 18th December, 1889, till the 2nd January, 1890 (both dates inclusive), excursion tickets, available by the express and ordinary trains, will be issued at Melbourne for Adelaide at the following return fares, viz.:—First class, £4 2s. 6d.; second class, £2 12s. 6d. These tickets will be available for return for two calendar months from date of issue, and the journey may be broken.

Brisbane Excursion Tickets.—From the 18th December, 1889, till the 4th January, 1890 (both dates inclusive), excursion tickets, available by the express and ordinary trains on all lines, will be issued at Melbourne for Brisbane at the following return fares, viz.:—First class, £10; second class, £6 17s. 6d. These tickets will be available for return for three calendar months from date of issue, and the journey may be broken.

Luggage.—Excursion passengers to or from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the starting time of train. Stamped parcels rates will be charged for it. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for.

Horses and Vehicles.—From the 20th December, 1889, till the 4th January, 1890 (both dates inclusive), the Department cannot engage to forward horses and vehicles by passenger trains unless accommodation can be provided by special arrangement.

Commercial Travellers' Samples.—From the 20th December, 1889, till the 4th January, 1890 (both dates inclusive), commercial travellers' samples will only be taken to or from roadside stations by mixed or goods trains.

Parcels.—On the 24th December, 1889, parcels must be at the parcels offices at Spencer-street and Prince's Bridge stations half-an-hour before the starting times of ordinary trains.

Goods Sheds Holidays.—The 25th and 26th December, 1889, and the 1st January, 1890, will be observed as holidays in the goods branch, and goods trains will not run. Perishable goods will, however, be delivered at all stations on application. Consignees of powder can ascertain from the stationmaster at Footscray West when explosives will be received in lieu of those dates. On the 23rd, 24th, 25th, and 26th December, 1889, and the 1st January, 1890, fruit and dairy produce will not be carried by purely passenger trains between Melbourne, Sandhurst, and Ballarat, nor on the North-Eastern line, unless parcels rates are paid. Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, clean white (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from beaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1890, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

9. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

10. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette* purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

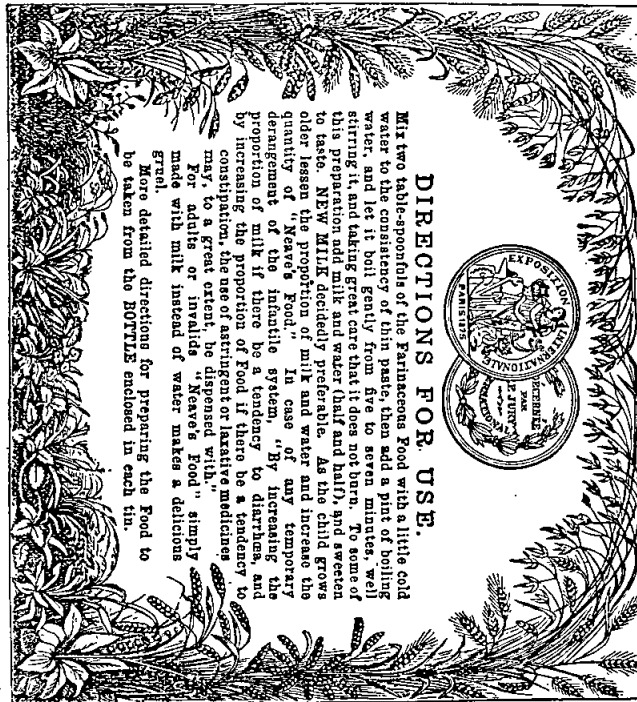

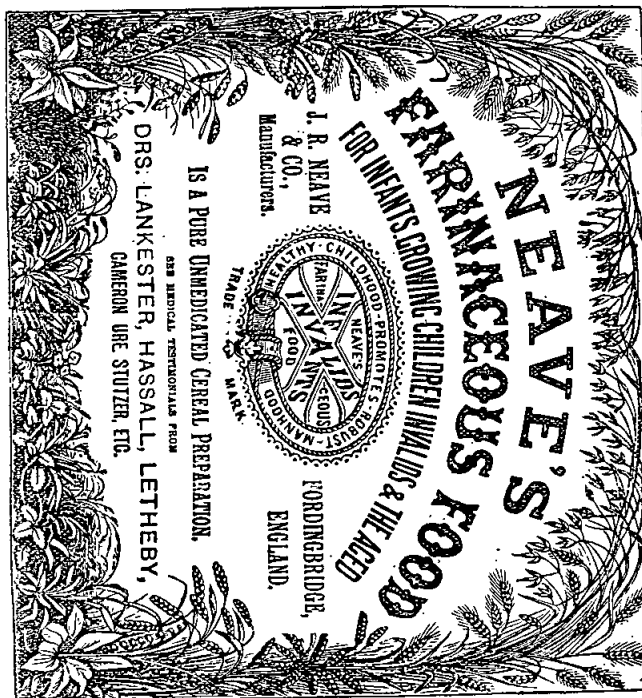
