REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE DISCIPLINE AND CONDUCT TO BE OBSERVED BY PATIENTS IN ASYLUMS FOR INEBRIATES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventeenth day of December, 1889.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in accordance with the provisions of, and in exercise of the powers conferred by *The Inebriate Asylums Act 1888*, doth hereby make the following Regulations relating to the Discipline and Conduct to be observed by Patients in Asylums for Inebriates, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The hours of meals will be as follow:—Breakfast, at 8 a.m.; dinner, at 1 p.m.; tea, at 6 p.m.

2. Patients will retire to bed at 10 p.m., and will rise at 6 a.m. in summer, and at 7 a.m. in winter; unless otherwise directed by the superintendent.

3. Patients must not frequent those portions of the asylum set apart for culinary or other domestic purposes.

4. No patient is allowed to enter the bedroom of another patient unattended.

5. Patients are not permitted to assemble in any attendant's room.

6. The patients shall not be allowed to gamble.

7. No patient shall be allowed to walk beyond the garden and the home paddock, unless in company with an attendant, or by special permission of the superintendent.

8. Patients shall not receive any articles from visitors without the permission of the superintendent. All parcels intended for the patients shall be submitted to the superintendent for examination.

9. The outer doors of the asylum will be locked at 10 p.m., and opened at 6 a.m. in summer, and at 7 a.m. in winter; and no patient shall be allowed out of the asylum between these hours without a special order from the superintendent.

10. All lights in patients rooms must be extinguished at 10.30 p.m.

11. The superintendent, the secretary, and the attendant in charge on the female side shall respectively have authority to enter the bedrooms of the patients under their care at any time.

And the Honorable Charles Henry Pearson, for Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT, SUPERVISION, INSPECTION, AND REGULATION OF ASYLUMS FOR INEBRIATES.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventeenth day of December, 1889.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in accordance with the provisions of, and in exercise of the powers conferred by *The Inebriate Asylums Act 1888*, doth hereby make the following regulations for the management, supervision, inspection, and regulation of asylums for inebriates, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the subject or context, the words and expressions following shall have the meaning hereinafter respectively assigned to them (that is to say):—

"Inspector" shall mean the person for the time being holding the office of inspector or deputy-inspector of lunatic asylums under any Act for the time being in force relating to lunatic asylums.

"Secretary" shall mean the lay officer for the time being in charge under the superintendent of any asylum for inebriates.

"Superintendent" shall mean the medical practitioner appointed by the Governor in Council to superintend, for the time being, any asylum for inebriates.

2. All patients, officials, and attendants shall strictly conform to the regulations and obey the superintendent's directions.

3. No patient shall go outside the boundary of the grounds of the asylum without the permission of the superintendent.

4. *Admission*.—The secretary shall, immediately on the admission of any person as a patient into the asylum, make and sign an entry with respect to such patient in a book to be kept for that purpose, to be called the "Register of Admissions," and within 24 hours after such admission shall transmit to the inspector a notice of such admission, with a copy of the order and certificate on which the patient was received.

5. *Diet*.—The following diet shall be allowed daily to each patient and attendant:—Sixteen ounces of bread, two ounces of butter, half-an-ounce of tea, four ounces of sugar, two gills of milk, sixteen ounces of meat, sixteen ounces of vegetables, one ounce of cheese, one ounce of rice, one ounce of coffee, two ounces of flour, also pepper, salt, mustard, and vinegar as required, together with any extras which the superintendent may consider necessary and think fit to order in any particular case, and an entry of such extras shall be made in the "Case Book."

6. *Fees*.—The fees to be paid by patients for maintenance and treatment within the asylum shall be £2 per week for each patient admitted on the "lower scale," and £5 per week for each patient admitted on the "higher scale." The current market price shall be charged for any extras the superintendent may think fit to order in any particular case.

7. *Intoxicating liquors*.—Without special written authority from the superintendent of the asylum, no person shall take any intoxicating liquor or sedative narcotic stimulant, drug, or preparation, or enter any public-house, or other house where intoxicating liquors are sold.

8. Any employé of the asylum permitting alcoholic liquors to be placed within reach of the inmates under any pretext whatever, except when ordered by the superintendent, shall be immediately suspended by the superintendent, and, on conviction, dismissed.

9. *Letters, stamps, and money*.—No patient shall be allowed to have possession of money or stamps.

10. All letters addressed to the patients shall be opened in the presence of the superintendent or his deputy in such a manner as to show their contents.

11. Money or stamps coming in letters, or parcels addressed to patients, or found upon their person or in their apartments, shall be taken charge of by the superintendent, and a receipt given for the same, and all moneys or stamps so taken charge of shall be returned on discharge, or in the case of death or insanity, shall be given to the legal representative of such patient.

12. Letters.—The superintendent shall post or forward all letters written by patients according to the intention of the writers, unless he shall have good reason to suspect that they are written for the purpose of obtaining intoxicating liquor or other prohibited articles, and all letters about which he has such suspicion shall be forwarded within two days to the Inspector of Asylums, who shall give such directions concerning them as he may think fit. Provided always that all letters written by a patient and addressed to any responsible Minister of the Crown, Judge of the Supreme Court, Inspector of Asylums, or official visitor shall be forwarded unopened and without delay.

13. Parcels.—All parcels intended for the patients shall first be submitted to the superintendent for his examination.

14. Visits of friends.—Patients may be visited by their relatives and friends on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays, provided always that if in any case the superintendent shall think that the visit of any particular person or persons would at any particular time or generally be prejudicial to the patient proposed to be visited, or would be likely to hinder the cure of such patient, he may prohibit such visit.

15. In the case of a prohibited visit, the superintendent shall give his reasons for refusal to the visitor, and an entry of such reasons shall be made in the "Case Book," and a copy thereof sent to the Inspector of Asylums within 24 hours.

16. The Inspector of Asylums may at any time give an order in writing for the admission to any patient of any relative or friend of such patient of either sex, or of any medical practitioner whom any such relative or friend of such patient shall desire to be admitted to the patient, and such order of admission may be for a single admission or for an admission for a limited number of times, or for admission generally at all reasonable times.

17. The superintendent may at any time order that no interview shall take place between particular patients and visitors of the opposite sex, except in the presence of an official or attendant of the asylum, in any case in which the superintendent shall be of opinion that any such interview would be prejudicial to or likely to hinder the cure of such patients. In the case of any such order, the superintendent shall give to such visitors his reasons for such order, and an entry of such reasons shall be made in the "Case Book," and a copy thereof shall be sent to the Inspector of Asylums within 24 hours.

18. Separation of sexes.—The superintendent shall, in cases where both sexes are received into an asylum, make due provision for the separation of the sexes at all but defined hours.

19. Insanity.—If any patient admitted into or detained in the asylum shall be found to be or shall while there become insane, the superintendent shall immediately give notice thereof to the inspector, and to the person by whom the last payment for such patient was made, to the intent that that patient so being or becoming insane may forthwith be placed under proper care and control as a lunatic; and in the event of the person by whom such last payment was made not taking steps for the removal of such patient within a reasonable time after the receipt of such notice, then the superintendent, with the approval in writing of the inspector, shall have such patient removed to a lunatic asylum, according to the law now or hereafter to be in force relating to lunatics.

20. Death.—In the case of the death of any patient in the asylum, a notice and statement of the death and apparent cause of death of such patient, and the name or names of any person or persons who was or were present at the death, shall (in addition to any notice respecting such death required by any law now or hereafter in force relating to the registration of deaths) within 24 hours after such death be drawn up and signed by the superintendent of such asylum, and transmitted to the coroner of the district in which the patient shall have died, and to the inspector, and a copy thereof, signed as aforesaid, shall also within the same 24 hours be enclosed in a pre-paid envelope to the person who shall have made the last payment on account of such patient.

21. Discharge.—The secretary shall, within 24 hours after the discharge, removal, escape, or re-capture of any patient, transmit a written notice of such discharge, removal, escape, or re-capture, to the inspector; and the secretary shall, within 24 hours after the death, discharge, escape, or removal of any patient, make and sign an entry thereof in the said "Register of Admissions," and also in a book to be kept for that purpose to be called the "Register of Discharges."

22. Medical Journal.—In every asylum the superintendent shall at least once in every week enter or cause to be entered in a book to be kept for that purpose, to be called the "Medical Journal," a statement showing the date of such statement, the number of patients of each sex then in the asylum, the christian and surname of every patient who shall then be or shall have been since the last entry under restraint or in seclusion therein, and when and for what period and reasons, and in cases of restraint by what means, and the christian name and the surname of every patient under medical treatment therein, and for what (if any) bodily disorder, the condition of the asylum, and every death, injury, and violence which shall have happened to or affected any patient since the then last preceding entry.

23. Case Book.—There shall also be kept at each asylum a book, to be called the "Case Book," in which the superintendent shall enter the name, sex, and previous occupation of every patient admitted into the asylum, and also the history from time to time of his case whilst he shall continue in such asylum, together with a correct description of the medicines and other remedies adopted for the cure of the patient.

24. Visitation.—Every asylum shall, without any previous notice, as often as the inspector thinks fit, and at least once in every three months, be visited by the inspector, and every such

visit shall be made on such day or days and at such hours of the day or night and for such length of time as the inspector shall think fit, and such inspector when inspecting such asylum may and shall inspect every part of the same, and see every patient then confined therein, and inquire whether any patient is under restraint, and why; and inspect the order and certificate for the reception of every patient who shall have been received into such asylum since the last visit of the inspector thereto, and enter in a book kept for that purpose, called the "Inspector's Book," the result of the inspection and inquiries with such observations as he shall think proper.

25. Superintendent may make regulations as to minor matters.—Rules for minor matters of domestic arrangement and for giving better effect to these regulations may be drawn up by the superintendent, and when approved by the inspector shall have full force and effect.

26. Directions of superintendent.—The superintendent may from time to time direct that a patient shall receive such treatment as the superintendent may think necessary for the cure of such patient and for the carrying out of these regulations, provided that such directions shall not be inconsistent with these regulations, and such directions shall be strictly carried out by the official or officials to whom they may be given.

27. Deputy.—If the superintendent should be absent from the asylum or incapable of acting from illness, some other person may be appointed to be his substitute during such temporary absence or incapacity, and this substitute shall have all the powers and perform all the duties of the superintendent, and the secretary shall send at once to the Inspector of Asylums a notice of such temporary absence or illness for communication to the Governor in Council.

And the Honorable Charles Henry Pearson, for Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE Commissioners of the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhill Urban District, that is to say:—

(1) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds sterling annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

(2) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to One shilling in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

(3) For all tenements in the said urban district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

(4) For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, £1 per annum on each inch diameter of the cylinder.

(5) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Three shillings per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon); and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Water Conservation Act, make the Regulations following:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to five per cent. on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs shall be 16,000 gallons for any trough not exceeding 12 feet in length, and 8,000 gallons for every additional 5 feet or fractional part thereof.

4. Every trough situated in a paddock shall be supplied through a meter, affixed by the consumer according to the directions of the Trust, provided nevertheless that the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall not be less than that charged for troughs supplied under the preceding clause.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 8,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder.

6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon); and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purposes of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.
Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.
 Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.
 Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre; for every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery and carriers' stables and all other stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds, used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

That each syphon-pump must have a meter affixed, and that Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons be charged for all water registered at such meter.

That the occupiers of all tenements not already rated, situated within a distance of a quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe, shall pay a rate equal to one-half; and where such tenements are situated at a distance of more than a quarter of a mile therefrom, such occupiers shall pay a rate equal to one-quarter of the amount which would be payable if such tenements were supplied with water from service-pipes.

The before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January. One thousand eight hundred and ninety, and ending on the thirty-first day of December. One thousand eight hundred and ninety, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in each year. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946, do hereby make the following regulations:—

I. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, Three shillings for every one thousand gallons shall be charged.

II. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when the water is supplied by measure shall be—

(1.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at Three shillings per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2.) If for other than domestic purposes only thirty thousand gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{4}$ acre and less,	8,000	galls.	per annum.

Stand-pipe or hydrant, water for each load of 100 gallons or under ... Sixpence.

(3.) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid monthly.

III. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, chargeable with half-rate.

IV. Tenements exceeding one quarter, but not exceeding one half a mile distant from a stand-pipe, chargeable with one-fourth rate.

V. Every person who is supplied by the Trust with water by measure shall, at his or her own expense, provide a meter (which meter shall be submitted to and examined by the proper officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in a proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect), which, when fixed, shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

VI. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

VII. All delivery cocks to be strong hard brass, and in all exposed places to be open and shut by a moveable key or handle.

VIII. Plumbers or other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to refix or relay the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.

IX. No meter shall be fixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

X. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

XI. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

XII. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

XIII. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

XIV. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet-pipes to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and the bath provided with a proper well-fitted and watertight ground outlet plug or cock.

XV. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

XVI. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

XVII. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or washing houses and walls, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by measure.

XVIII. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his or her premises, or shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

XIX. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

XX. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without first receiving permission and giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each breach.

XXI. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall each have a stop-cock at the main, and shall in no case exceed one half-inch diameter for the supply of premises except where supplied by measure, and then not to exceed three-quarters of an inch.

XXII. The water supplied in the urban district of the Trust shall be received and used under and in accordance with these regulations and *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, and such parts of *The Public Works Statute 1865* as are incorporated herewith.

XXIII. If any person, whether supplied with water by the Trust or otherwise, shall commit a breach of these regulations, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and such person, if supplied with water by the Trust, shall be liable to have the supply of water cut off from his premises, either by cutting the pipes by or through which such water is supplied, or otherwise as the Trust may think fit, and such supply shall cease so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

XXIV. In the foregoing regulations, wherever the words "officer" or "servant" appears, the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf.

"THE IRRIGATION ACT 1886."

IN the matter of the Petition of John Doodie and others, being the owners of land situate within the parishes of Wharparilla, Millewa, Bamawn, and Ballendella, in the counties of Gunbower and Bendigo, in the colony of Victoria, praying for the constitution of a certain district comprising the said lands as an Irrigation and Water Supply District within the meaning of the said Act, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust for such district.

Pursuant to section 18 of the said Act, I hereby declare upon the said petition the matters following:—

1. That the scheme or plan of the proposed works shall be—
(a) A weir on the river Goulburn, between Murchison and Nangambie; a main channel thence to the Waranga, or Gunn's Swamp, a storage reservoir with regulating works at the swamp; thence a main supply channel westward to the right bank of the Campaspe River, a syphon to convey water across the Campaspe, a supply channel from the left bank of the Campaspe westward for a distance of about ten miles, and a system of distributary channels, with all necessary secondary and subsidiary works, including works for drainage. (b) A steam pumping plant on the south bank of the river Murray, in the Wharparilla pre-emptive right, parish of Wharparilla, county of Gunbower; thence an open or closed aqueduct, about four miles in length, to convey the water to or near the south boundary of allotment 52, parish of Millewa, county of Gunbower, and a system of distributary channels, with all necessary secondary and subsidiary works.

2. That the Goulburn weir, main channel to the Waranga Swamp, the Waranga reservoir, and the main channel from the Waranga reservoir to the Campaspe River shall be National works, all the other works shall be Trust works.

3. That the amount which it is proposed that the Board of Land and Works shall advance, by way of loan, for Trust works, is Twelve thousand pounds (£12,000) sterling.

4. That the rate of interest to be paid by the Trust upon such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.

5. That the rate at which the Trust shall pay for water supplied from National works shall be Six shillings for every cubic foot of water per minute delivered throughout the winter season as hereinafter defined, and Eight shillings for every cubic foot of water delivered throughout the summer season as hereinafter defined.

6. That the quantity of water which the Trust shall be entitled and required to take from National works shall be two thousand and sixty-seven cubic feet per minute throughout the winter season, that is to say, from 11th June to 15th November, both days inclusive, in each year; and one thousand one hundred and sixty-five cubic feet per minute throughout the summer season, from the 16th November to the 15th April, both days inclusive, in each year.

7. That the source, other than National works, from which the Trust is to obtain a supply of water shall be the Murray River, and the maximum quantity it shall be entitled to take from such source shall be six hundred and twenty-five cubic feet per minute throughout the year, subject to the condition that the whole of it shall be *bona fide* used for domestic and stock supply, and for the irrigation of the lands within the Trust district.

This right to be for three years only, and to be subject to review at the end of that period, and to be then modified, amended, or reduced in such manner and to such extent as the facts of the case and the public interests may then seem to require.

8. The powers of rating to be given to the Trust shall not exceed the sum of Five shillings in the £ of the annual valuation of the rateable property within the Trust district.

Holiday Excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (suburban excepted) from the 18th December, 1889, till the 4th January, 1890, both dates inclusive (Sundays excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue.

Example:—An Excursion ticket issued on the 18th December will be available till the 18th January. When the last day falls on a Sunday the ticket will be available till the next day. The journey must be commenced on the date the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger. These tickets will be available for return for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line. (Passengers can, however, travel by the express train on the New South Wales line on payment of 15s. first class and 10s. second class.) The journey cannot be broken on the New South Wales line.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, marked cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenders will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, clean white (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1890, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

TENDERS FOR GRAZING LANDS.

Tenders must be sent in on proper form, which can be obtained on application to the Lands Department, Melbourne, or any of the Survey Offices in the country.

Tenders must be placed in the Crown Lands Office Tender-box not later than Twelve noon on Tuesday, 31st December, 1889.

NOTE.—The fee for the period from 1st January, 1890, to 31st December, 1890, and fee of Five shillings for licence, must accompany each tender.

TENDERS will be received by the Board of Land and Works, up to Noon of Tuesday, 31st December, 1889, for the occupation for Grazing purposes only of the following unappropriated portions of land, subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council and also the subjoined special conditions.

Every licence granted under section 119 of *The Land Act 1884* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the schedule hereto, and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine; and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

2A. 7. No claim whatever shall be made or entertained by reason of the licence not being renewed or transferred.

8. This licence is to be used under and in accordance with the regulations made or to be made under the provisions of the said Act and for the time being in force.

9. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

10. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette* purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

1. The period of occupation will be from 1st January, 1890, to 31st December, 1890.

2. The licence fee must be paid in advance. No person shall deposit or cause or suffer to be deposited on any land within the City of South Melbourne for the purpose of raising the level of the said land any manure or other offensive matter or thing without the written consent of the Local Board of Health for the City of South Melbourne. And any such manure or other offensive matter as aforesaid which shall with such consent of the said Local Board of Health be so deposited shall be immediately on the deposit thereof covered over by the person depositing the same with such a quantity of earth as will at once prevent the escape of any noxious or offensive effluvia from any such soil, manure, or offensive matter before mentioned.

Every person guilty of any breach of the provisions of the foregoing by-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings.

7. That no person shall deface, by writing or otherwise, the walls or any portion of the bath premises.

8. That no person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall be permitted to enter or remain on the bath premises.

9. That no person shall smoke in any part of the bath premises.

10. That no person shall spit in the swimming baths, or on the floor or walls of any portion of the bath premises.

11. That no dogs shall be permitted on the bath premises.

12. That no person shall remain in the water for a longer period than half-an-hour.

13. That no person shall be guilty of any indecent or insulting behaviour in the bath premises.

14. That no male person shall enter or attempt to enter, or look into or attempt to look into, the bath premises during the hours the baths are open for the use of females.

15. That it shall be lawful for the person for the time being in charge of the baths to expel any person or persons from the bath premises who in any way commit any breach of this by-law.

16. That the Council of the Borough of Sale may at any time, and from time to time, close the baths to bathers.

17. That the said Council shall have power from time to time, by resolution, to fix and regulate the fees to be paid by the public for the use of the baths.

18. That the said Council shall have power from time to time, by resolution, to fix the hours during which the baths shall be open for the use of females only.

19. That the said Council shall have power from time to time, by resolution, to give such directions as it may consider necessary for the proper management of the baths.

20. That any person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £10.
