PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the twelfth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine; and issued in pursuance of *The Public Health Statute 1865*, it was notified that the Island of Sumatra was infected with cholera, and that it was probable that such disease might be brought from such Island to Victoria: And whereas the circumstances which led to the issue of such Proclamation have ceased to exist: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and in the fifty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.

"The Marine Board Act 1887."

GENERAL RULES FOR FORMAL INVESTIGATIONS BY THE COURT OF MARINE INQUIRY.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of December, 1889.

WHEREAS by section 135 of *The Marine Board Act 1887*, it is provided that the Governor in Council, may, from time to time, make, and when made may revoke, alter, and add to general rules to carry into effect the provisions of the said Act with respect to the Court of Marine Inquiry, and in particular with respect to the summoning of and procedure before the court, the amount and application of fees, and the publication of such rules: And whereas the Governor in Council did, on the 28th day of December, 1888, make General Rules for Formal Investigations by the Court of Marine Inquiry, and whereas it is expedient to revoke the same to the extent hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth revoke the rules Nos. 26, 27, and 29, and in lieu thereof doth make and substitute the following amended rules, namely:—

26. *Constitution of court where master or mate of sailing ship charged.*—Where the investigation involves or appears likely to involve the cancelling or suspension of the certificate of a master or mate of a sailing ship, one at least of the members of the court shall be a master mariner, possessing a certificate of

competency as such, who has served five years as a master in the merchant service, two years of which service, at least, must have been in command of a sailing ship, or an officer who has served not less than five years in any rank not lower than that of lieutenant or navigating lieutenant in Her Majesty's naval forces or in the naval forces of the colony of Victoria.

27. *Constitution of court where master or mate of steam ship charged.*—Where the investigation involves or appears likely to involve the cancelling or suspension of the certificate of a master or mate of a steam ship, one at least of the members of the court shall be a master mariner, possessing a certificate of competency as such, who has served five years as master in the merchant service, two years of which must have been in command of a steam ship, or an officer who has served not less than five years in any rank not lower than that of lieutenant or navigating lieutenant in Her Majesty's naval forces or in the naval forces of the colony of Victoria.

29. *Constitution of court where pilot or exempt master charged.*—Where the investigation involves or appears likely to involve the cancelling or suspension of the licence of a Port Phillip pilot or of an exempt master, one at least of the members of the court shall be a Port Phillip pilot, or a master holding a licence as exempt master at the time of his selection by the Board as eligible for appointment as a skilled member of the court, or shall be a person who has held a licence as a Port Phillip pilot and has retired from active service.

And the Honorable James Brown Patterson, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Trade and Customs for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885."

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (49 Vict. No. 862), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of the said section 29 in

ALL THE WOOLLEN FACTORIES IN VICTORIA

for a further period of three months from the 1st January, 1890, upon these express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factories any female or any male under the age of sixteen for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, or more than ten hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That no female or male under the age of sixteen shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without her or his consent.
3. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in each such factory for the information of all concerned.

REGULATIONS FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE
BONUS OF £2,000 APPROPRIATED BY PARLIAMENT
TO ENCOURAGE THE INCREASE OF THE
SUPPLY OF FISH AND OYSTERS IN VICTORIA.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the distribution of the bonus of £2,000 appropriated by Parliament to encourage the increase of the supply of Fish and Oysters in Victoria:—

1. Any person or company intending to compete for the bonus voted by Parliament for the encouragement of the fishing industry shall notify their intention to the Honorable the Commissioner of Trade and Customs on or before the 31st March, 1890, and shall give in such notification full particulars of the vessel and appliances proposed to be used, and the names of all parties concerned in the venture.

FISH.

2. Out of the sum of £2,000 set apart for the development of the fishing industry, the sum of £600 shall be paid to the person or company who shall before the 1st of December, 1890, deliver in Melbourne 50 tons of fish, exclusive of salmon, taken by means of trawling or deep-sea fishing from any part of Bass' Straits, or off the coasts of Victoria. The vessel or vessels used for such purpose shall not be less than 25 tons gross registered measurement, and shall, with all fittings and appliances and equipment, be subject to the approval of the Inspector of Fisheries as to their adaptability to the work of trawling or deep-sea fishing. In the event of more than one person or company competing and delivering, as above mentioned, 50 tons of good marketable fish, exclusive of salmon, before the date specified, such person or company as shall be second in delivering the said quantity of

fish shall receive a bonus of £400. No credit will be given for any fish not approved or passed by the Inspector of Fisheries. All fish delivered under this regulation must have been taken by the vessel or vessels above mentioned.

OYSTERS.

3. Out of the said sum of £2,000 the sum of £300 shall be paid to the person or company who shall before the 1st December, 1890, deliver in Melbourne 600 sacks of oysters, each sack containing three bushels, taken without infringing proclamations, by means of dredging, from any part of Bass' Straits, or off the coasts of Victoria. The vessel or vessels used for the purpose shall not be less than 25 tons gross registered measurement, and shall, with all fittings and appliances and equipment, be subject to the approval of the Inspector of Fisheries as to their adaptability to the work of oyster dredging. In the event of more than one person or company competing and delivering, as above mentioned, 600 sacks, each containing three bushels, of oysters before the date specified, such person or company as shall be second in delivering the said quantity of oysters shall receive a bonus of £200.

4. The fish and oysters may be delivered in Melbourne in any quantities, and at such times as may be most convenient to the takers, provided that no credit will be given for any fish or oysters respecting which the Inspector of Fisheries is not satisfied that they have been caught or taken by the persons or company delivering them. The fish delivered may be either fresh or salted.

5. The persons or company who may compete for the bonuses above mentioned will be required to provide in each vessel employed in trawling or oyster catching suitable accommodation for an Assistant Inspector of Fisheries, and shall properly board the same for an amount not exceeding Four shillings per diem.

6. Any persons or company as aforesaid shall at all times when so required by the Inspector of Fisheries produce all books, vouchers, and evidence which such Inspector may deem necessary, in order to prove that the fish and oysters delivered are *bona fide* the property of the person or company delivering the same, and that such fish or oysters have been procured in the manner and by the means required under these regulations, and no bonus or any portion of the amount voted by Parliament shall be paid unless with the approval of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, and on the certificates of the Inspector of Fisheries that these regulations have been complied with.

BET BET SHIRE WATERWORKS DISTRICT.—DIVIDED.

REGULATION No. 5.

By virtue of Act No. 946.

Regulation for imposing, levying, and receiving water charges within the Borough Echuca Water Trust District for the year 1890.

1. The following charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Borough Echuca Water Trust District shall pay for the year 1890, namely:—

2. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Thirty pounds or less, the sum of Thirty shillings.

3. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Thirty pounds, in addition to the Thirty shillings named in the last clause, a sum of Four pounds per centum for every pound from £31 to £100 inclusive, and a sum of Three pounds per centum on every pound from £100 upwards.

4. On every cordial or aerated water factory, or other such like factories, a charge of Ten pounds per centum. On every flour mill a charge of Fifteen pounds.

-5. On every steam engine, exclusive of any factory or mill, &c., &c., a charge of Twenty shillings.

6. On every livery stable, a charge of Seven pounds ten shillings.

7. On every hotel, a charge of Five pounds per centum on the valuation up to £150; and for every pound from £150 upwards, a charge of Three pounds per centum, including eight stalls, every extra stall One shilling.

8. On every horse trough, a charge of Twenty shillings.

9. On houses, lands, hotels, tenements, &c., &c., using a hose, in addition to the foregoing charges named for each respectively a charge of Twenty shillings.

10. The charge for every private house shall include one quarter acre of land. Should any larger quantity of land be attached to a private house, and water laid thereon, an extra charge of Ten shillings for every quarter of an acre or part of a quarter of an acre shall be paid.

11. In cases where parties have gardens from any part of which produce is sold, in addition to the ordinary charge for domestic purposes, they shall pay an additional charge of Fifty shillings for every quarter of an acre or part of a quarter of an acre cultivated or watered.

Cases where Water is not used.

12. On every house, tenement, hotel, factory, &c., &c., not supplied with water, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the valuation of same.

13. On each allotment or piece of land rated separately from any tenement, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of same, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings and sixpence.

Meters.

14. The charge for water supplied by meter shall be Three shillings per thousand gallons (1,000), provided that the amount shall not in any case be less than the charges hereinbefore made.

15. The charge for water supplied from the Trust stand-pipes shall be Three shillings per thousand gallons (1,000). The foregoing regulations were duly made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust, at their office, Echuca, on the eleventh day of December. And the seal of the Trust was affixed hereto this eleventh day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

REGULATION.

The Commissioners of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, by virtue of clause 95 and in accordance with the provisions of clause 136 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 5.

1. That the year shall be divided into four irrigation periods as follows, viz.:

- (1) From the first day of December to the last day of February, both inclusive.
- (2) From the first day of March to the thirty-first day of May, both inclusive.
- (3) From the first day of June to the thirty-first day of August, both inclusive.
- (4) From the first day of September to the thirtieth day of November, both inclusive.

2. That application for water may be made at any time, to be supplied in any period named in the application.

3. That water supplied to a consumer in one period shall not prevent such consumer from applying for and being supplied with a fair share of the water available during any other period. Provided that in no period shall a consumer be entitled to more than a fair share of the water available.

4. That no application for water shall be recognised unless a deposit equal to twenty-five per cent. of the total price of the quantity of water applied for be paid when the application is made; and if any applicant shall refuse or neglect to take such water at the time named in his application, as that at which he desires the supply; or if the water be not then available at some subsequent period not later than fourteen days from such time, such deposit as aforesaid shall be forfeited. Provided that if no water be available for the supply of such applicant during the irrigation period for which such application was made, the applicant shall be entitled to a refund of the amount of the deposit paid on account of such application. Any dispute which may arise with a water bailiff shall be referred to the head water bailiff and finally to the Trust.

5. That previous to the water being supplied, the balance (seventy-five per cent.) of the total price of the quantity of water applied for shall be paid by the applicant. If such balance be not paid as aforesaid, no water shall be supplied, and the deposit may be forfeited by the Trust.

The foregoing regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust this fifth day of July, 1889.

A REGULATION of the Lancefield Waterworks Trust, made under *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving a Rate.

In pursuance of the powers granted and conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, the Commissioners of the Lancefield Waterworks Trust make the following Regulation:—

A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Lancefield Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Romsey, in which such lands and tenements are situated, for one year, commencing on the first day of January, 1890; and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1890.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments of One shilling each, and the first portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the second day of January, 1890, and the second portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the second day of July, 1890.

No. 26.

Regulation for the making of a rate for the year 1890 on all ratable property in that portion of the Wimmera United Waterworks district, of which notice has been given that the same has been supplied with water, under the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act*, and which notice was published in the *Government Gazette* of 12th March, 1886, wherein the portion of the district so described as supplied with water is as follows, that is to say—the whole of the area of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, except in the parishes of Hindmarsh, Joop, Jeparit, Batyick, Tarranyrick, Willenabrina, Yallangip, Katyil, and Dimboola.

Whereas the Governor in Council has, by an order made the second day of December, 1889, under the provisions of section 97 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, divided the Wimmera United Waterworks District into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of their waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connection therewith, shall be levied in such divisions, viz.:—The Shire of St. Arnaud division, the Shire of Kara Kara division, the Shire of Dunmunkle division, and the shire of Stawell division; and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such said several divisions, and that the proportion in which such several divisions shall be rated respectively one to another shall be as follows, that is to say, that the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of ratable property rated for municipal purposes in the said several divisions shall be—Shire of St. Arnaud division, fifteen pence; Shire of Kara Kara division, twelve pence; Shire of Dunmunkle division, sixteen pence halfpenny; Shire of Stawell division, ninepence.

And whereas the Governor of the colony of Victoria, by proclamation dated 28th June, 1886, proclaimed certain areas in and around the townships of Murttoa and Warracknabeal to be respectively Urban Districts under the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*, No. 778.

And whereas by further proclamation, dated the 29th December, 1887, the Governor of the colony of Victoria proclaimed certain areas in and around the townships of Donald and Dimboola to be respectively Urban Districts, under the provisions of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946.

And whereas the Governor in Council by an order dated the 13th day of December, 1886, diminished the extent of the said Wimmera United Waterworks District by excising therefrom the territory described above as the Shire of Wimmera division.

And whereas His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, by an Order dated the twenty-sixth day of August, 1889, further diminished the extent of the said Wimmera United Waterworks District by excising therefrom such portions of the said district as were within the Shire of Dimboola and to the westward of the Yarriambiack Creek, excepting the site of the Longerenong Weir and the portion of the reserve within two chains thereof:—

The following rate is made on the annual value of all the ratable property in the said several divisions of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, excepting in the said Urban districts of Murttoa, Warracknabeal, and Donald, according to the valuation for the time being on all such lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shires of St. Arnaud, Kara Kara, Dunmunkle, and Stawell respectively, that is to say, on ratable property within the Shire of St. Arnaud division, a rate of fifteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Kara Kara division, a rate of twelve pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Dunmunkle division, a rate of sixteen pence halfpenny in the pound sterling of such valuation; and in the Shire of Stawell division, a rate of ninepence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made for the year 1890, commencing on the 1st January, 1890, and terminating on the 31st of December, 1890, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1890.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

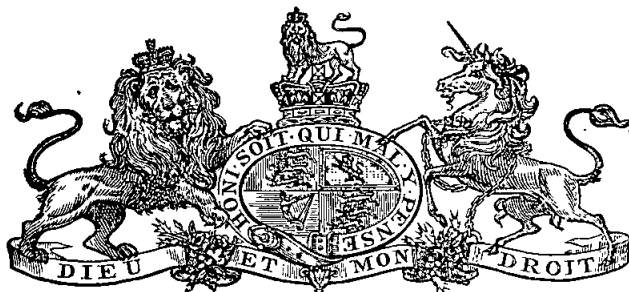

THE ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF CRESWICK BOUNDARIES OF BULLAROOK, CRESWICK, AND SMEATON DIVISIONS ALTERED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirtieth day of December, 1889.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act Amendment Act 1888*, it is amongst other things enacted that the boundaries and divisions and the names of the Electoral Districts created by the said Act shall be those set forth in the second schedule thereto, and shall be substituted in lieu of the boundaries and divisions repealed by the said Act, but the Governor in Council may, by an order to be published in the *Government Gazette* before the first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety, alter, vary, extend, subdivide, or abolish any of such divisions: And whereas it is expedient that the boundaries of the Bullarook, Creswick, and Smeaton Divisions of the Electoral District of Creswick should respectively be altered: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council, under and in pursuance of the provisions of *The Electoral Act Amendment Act 1888* aforesaid, doth hereby order that the boundaries of the Bullarook, Creswick, and Smeaton Divisions of the said Electoral District of Creswick be those set forth in the descriptions hereto subjoined, respectively marked "A," "B," and "C" in lieu of those set forth in the Second Schedule to the Act above mentioned:—

(A.)

20. CRESWICK.

1. *Bullarook Division*.—Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 68, being a point on the boundary of the district; thence east by the said allotment and allotment 65 to the township of Smeaton; thence east and north by the boundary of the said township to the Bullarook Creek; thence south-easterly by that creek to the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section 3, parish of Dean; thence west to a road on the west side of allotment A of section 3; thence south-westerly by that road to the west angle of allotment 3B of section 4, same parish; thence south-easterly by the said road to the south-west angle of allotment 3A, section 4; thence westerly to the north-east angle of allotment 4 of section 3, parish of Creswick; thence due south to the boundary of the district; thence easterly, northerly, and south-westerly by that boundary to the point of commencement.

(B.)

2. *Creswick Division*.—Commencing at the point on the boundary of the district where it is intersected by the Clunes and Creswick main road; thence by the said boundary southerly and easterly to the south-west angle of the Bullarook division; thence north by the boundary of that division and the south-western boundary of the Smeaton division, northerly and north-westerly to the point of commencement.

(C.)

3. *Smeaton Division*.—Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 107, parish of Spring Hill, being a point on the bound-

dary of the district; thence south by the said boundary of the district to the Clunes and Creswick main road; thence south-easterly by the said road to the south-west angle of allotment 16 of section H, parish of Creswick; thence by a road and a line easterly to the east boundary of the parish of Creswick; thence south by that boundary to the road forming the south boundary of the parish of Spring Hill; thence east by that road to the north-west angle of allotment 5 of section M, parish of Spring Hill; thence south and east by that allotment and allotment 4 and a line to the eastern side of the main road from Smeaton to Creswick; thence south-westerly by the said road to the north angle of allotment A¹, parish of Creswick; thence by a road bearing south-easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section A; thence south and south-easterly by the said allotment to the Back Creek; thence south-westerly by that creek to the Adekate Creek; thence south-easterly by that creek to the western boundary of the Bullarook Division; thence northerly and westerly by the said boundary to the boundary of the district; and thence by the said boundary bearing southerly and westerly to the point of commencement.

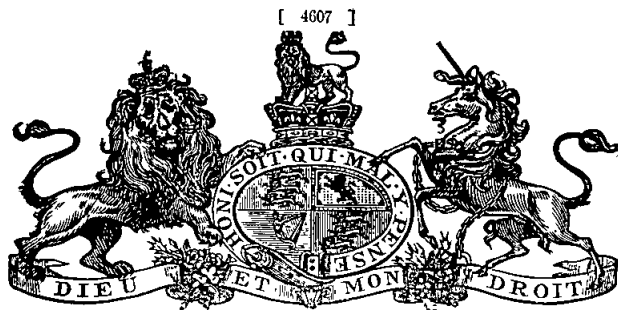
