GRANT FOR PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS, 1888-89. THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grant,

PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

Regulations in connection with the Vote of Nine thousand five hundred pounds (£9,500) for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

1. A sum not exceeding Ten shillings shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January 1888 and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January 1888 and 31st December 1888, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 1st February 1889. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January 1888 and 31st December 1888; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the abovementioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January 1888.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof hat paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the roturn of expenditure for the year 1888 (ride form A), and a sum equal to one-half of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy, provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of Nine thousand three hundred and four pounds soventeen shillings and six-pence, they shall be reduced pro rath.

7. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, except the Royal Park, or to the Edinburgh Garden, Fitzroy, or the Botanical Garden, Geelong.

HE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grant,

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Twenty thousand pounds (£20,000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1888-89.

1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February 1889, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding £25 each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum do not exceed

the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. Of the whole grant (£20,000), a sum not exceeding Nincteen thousand five hundred pounds shall be so divided; and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount they shall be reduced

sums claimate be in excess of this amount they shall be paid to the St. Arnaud Agricultural Society towards the expenses of its Spring show, held on the 26th and 27th September 1888, under the patronage of the Department of Agriculture.

5. No society located within twenty miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society, as hereinbefore specified, amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration, form E, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, between the 1st January 1888 and the 31st December 1888, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account, when received, must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president, or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management. It should then be returned to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne.

3. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid, unless such cups have been finally awarded.

Nore.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

YATCHAW IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY THE TRUST.—ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS.

WHEREAS by section 63 of The Irrigation Act 1886, No. 898, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any irrigation and water supply trust appointed and created under the said Act, for the purposes, among others, following:—

(a) For determining the period for which the commissioners of any trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office;

(b) For determining the manner in which elections of any such commissioners shall be held, and the manner of voting thereat;

- (c) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners shall be filled up; and (d) For determining questions as to the due election of any
- such commissioner.

such commissioner.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain irrigation and water supply trust duly appointed and created under the said Act, and known as the Yatchaw Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, make the regulations following, viz.:—

Interpretation of the part of the properties of the Act, and the properties of the part o

- 1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the trust" or "the said trust" shall mean the Yatchaw Irrigation and Water Supply Trust; and "the district," "the said district," or "the irrigation district" shall mean the lands, as defined by the Order in Council appointing and creating the said trust, wherein the trust shall have authority.
- 2. Period for which commissioners shall hold office.—Subject to the provisions in reference to the first election of commissioners hereinafter contained, for securing the annual retirement of two commissioners, the period during which the commissioners of the said trust shall hold office shall be three years.
- 3. Annual retirement of commissioners.—Two commissioners shall retire annually, but the retiring commissioners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be eligible for re-election.
- ect to the provisions of the said Act, be eligible for re-election.

 4. Term of office of persons elected commissioners at first election.—At the first election of commissioners two of the persons elected commissioners shall hold office as such commissioners for the term of three years, two others of such persons shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two persons elected as such commissioners shall hold office for the term of one year; and the particular term for which each such person so elected a commissioner shall hold office shall be determined in manner following (that is to say):—

 the first election is made without a poll, as in the case in
 these regulations provided, then the particular term for
 which each candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold

 as to him may seem fit, and the returning officer shall thereupon immediately, and publicly, announce the term for
 which each individual candidate elected as a commissioner

How term of office ascertained when poll taken.—If at the first election a poll shall be hold as in these regulations provided, then of the six candidates elected as commissioners the two candidates who shall have received the highest number of votes shall hold office for the term of three years, and the two candidates who shall have received the next highest number of votes shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two candidates who shall have been elected shall hold office for the term of one year; and if two or more than two candidates elected shall have obtained the same number of votes then the returning officer shall determine by lot (as hereinhefore provided in the case of the first election if decided without bullot) the term or terms three, two, or one year or years during which such candidates shall respectively hold office. But so that no candidate elected shall hold office for a shorter time than the term during which any other candidate who shall have obtained a less number of votes shall hold office. And the returning officer shall publicly declare the respective terms during which the several candidates shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

 5. Extraordinary acancies, hospilled, and term of office.—Should

Extraordinary vacancies, how filled, and term of office.—Should any vacancy in the office of commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy, and the provisions contained in these regulations, as to the nomination of candidates, the manner in which elections shall be held, and the node of voting thereat, shall apply to any election in respect of such vacancy, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.
- 6. Date of first election of commissioners.—Date of ordinary annual election.—The first election of commissioners of the said trust shall be held on the 4th day of February 1889, and the ordinary annual election shall be held on the 4th day of February

in each succeeding year. Provided that whenever such date may fall upon a Sunday, or upon any day set apart as a public holiday, such election shall be held upon the day next following.

- 7. Voters' lists to be prepared.—For the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the said trust, a voters' list shall be prepared by the persons upon whose petition the said trust has been appointed and created, and the said voters' list shall be forwarded to the Minister.
- 8. Form of voters' list.—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule herete, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence, and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address, so far as these may be known, of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of The Irripation Act 1886, or under the provisions of any Act amending the said Irripation Act 1886, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such person, or the land in respect of which each such person shall be entitled to vote, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such person is entitled.

 9. Voting in respect of lands jointly owned or jointly leased.—In the case of joint owners of land, or in the case of joint lessees of land, the name of any one of such owners or lessees (as the case may be) shall, subject to the provisions of the said Acts and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned or leased solely by such one owner or lessee, and the owner or lessees so placed upon the said list or lists shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners or lessees jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners or lessees is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners or lessees in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners or lessees (as the case may be) shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

Copy of voters' list to be available for inspection.—Second Schedule.—Objections to list to be in writing, and forwarded to Minister.—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, in some convenient place within or near to the irrigation and water supply district of the trust for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Second Schedule hereto, setting forth the times and places at which such voters' list may be so inspected, shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the Minister within the time mentioned in the said notice.

Evidence of voters' qualification to be furnished.—For the purpose of revising such list, and in order to clearly ascertain the voting powers and qualifications, under the said Acts, of persons entitled, or claiming to be entitled, to have their names inserted in such list, the commissioners of the trust, or the majority of them, may require such persons to furnish them with such evidence of qualification (whether by the production of documents of title or otherwise) as the said commissioners, or a majority of them, may deem necessary.

 21. Revised and certified list to be voters' roll.—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) of trust commissioners to be held within one year from the fourth day of February then next the said day inclusive.

 For the purposes of the first such election, the Minister may appoint some fit and proper person, not being an owner of land within the district, to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the chairman of the trust for the time being shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of chairman of the trust should be vacant, the commissioners of the trust may, by resolution, appoint one of their number to be returning officer until the office of chairman shall again be filled; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

Notice of election.—Nomination of candidates.—Fourth Schedule.—Seven clear days before the election of commissioners under these regulations the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the said district, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated atsome place within or near to the said district (and named in such notice) in manner hereinafter mentioned, at a specified hour between ten o'clock in the forenoon and four o'clock in the afternoon; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, at such hour and place, deliver or cause to be delivered to the returning officer a nomination paper in form of Fourth Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said Schedule; and such nomination-paper shall be signed by not less than four persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate, in token of his assent to being so named, and such candidate or some person on his behalf shall, at the time when such nomination-paper is delivered to the returning officer, pay into the hands of such returning officer the sum of Ten pounds, to be dealt with as by law provided. And no person who shall not have been so made, shall within the subsequent provisions of these regulations be deemed to be a candidate at any election of commissioners.

Council of the Shire of Avoca, as Managers of the above-named
Commons, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land
and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of
the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of all or any of
such Commons:—

- REGULATIONS.

 1. In the construction and for the purposes of these regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifors, over, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, assea, and mules; the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats; and the word "stock" shall mean and include "large cattle" and "small cattle."
- 2. Ratepayers, holders of miners rights, business licenses, carriers' licenses, and farmers may respectively depasture on the common within five (5) miles of their places aforesaid four (4)

head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such Common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the Commons shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of April and the first day of October in every year:—

Gay of April and the first day of October in every year:—

For every head of other large cattle 4s. 0d. "

Frogeny, under six (6) months old, of stock legally depasturing on the Common Free.

All stock registered during the currency of a half-year shall be charged the fees for the whole of such half-year.

A. No person shall depasture on any of the Commons stock of which he is not the bond fide owner.

5. Sheep shall he depastured on such portions only of the Commons as the managers may set apart for the purpose, and sheep found upon any other portion thereof shall be liable to be impounded. The expense and responsibily of herding sheep legally depasturing on the Commons shall be borne by the owners of such sheep.

6. No entire horse above the age of twelve (12) months shall be allowed to depasture on the Commons.

7. No bull above the age of six (6) months shall be allowed to depasture on the Commons.

8. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on any of the Commons; and should any registered stock thereon become so diseased the owner shall remove the same therefrom within twenty-four hours after receiving notice, in writing, from the herdsman so to do.

9. The owners of large catile (except horses) depasturing upon

receiving notice, in writing, from the herdsman so to do.

9. The owners of large cattle (except horses) depasturing upon any of the Commons shall, if required by the herdsman, muster such large cattle in their own yards, or some other place, as often as may be found necessary to be branded with the Common brand in pitch or tar upon notice, in writing, being given to such owners by the herdsman; and all unbranded large cattle or unmarked small cattle shall be liable to be impounded forthwith. All registered large cattle (except horses) shall be branded by or under the supervision of the herdsman with the Common tar brand, and shall have in addition the owner's brand. All registered goats wear a triangular yoke around the neck, with the owner's aname painted or carved thereon. All registered sheep shall be branded with the owner's fire brand, and the owners of registered sheep or goats shall, if required by the herdsman, yard them at any time for any necessary purpose.

required by the herdsman, yard them at any time for any necessary purpose.

10. All stock illegally depasturing on any of the Commons shall be liable to be impounded.

11. The managers shall not be responsible for the loss of, or injury to, any registered stock.

12. The herdsman shall keep an office in a convenient place, to be approved by the managers, and shall attend at such office between the hours of Twelve o'clock noon and Four o'clock in the afternoon on Tuesdays and Saturdays in every week to register stock entitled to depasture, and to receive the fees payable in respect thereof, and the managers shall give printed receipts for such fees in the prescribed form; and the herdsman shall see that all registered stock are branded with the Common brand, in pitch or such other distinguishing mark or brand as these regulations require, and shall without delay inform the owners of registered stock if any, to his knowledge, are missing from the Commons.

Every nerson offending against any of the foregoing Regulations

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

Section 415.—If any private street or road, or if any part of such street, has not been drained, paved, flagged, macadamized, and otherwise made good to the satisfaction of the Council, they may, by notice in writing, require the owners of the buildings or lands abutting on such street or road, or such part thereof (as the case may be), to drain, pave, flag, macadamize, or otherwise make good to the satisfaction of the Council, so much of the same to the centre thereof as fronts such last-mentioned buildings and lands, within a reasonable time to be fixed by the Council, and the said owners shall within such time as aforesaid, at their own costs, obey such requirement; and if such street, or such part thereof, as aforesaid be not so made good within the time fixed, the Council may cause so much as shall not be so made good to be made good, and the expenses which may be incurred by the Council shall be repaid to them by the owners, by whom such work ought to have been done respectively.

Section 416.—The Council of the municipal district to be flagged, kerbed, and paved, or asphalted, in such manner as the Council think fit; and half the amount of the expense thereof shall be borne and paid by the owner of such house or land, and may be recovered from such owner or from the occupier of such house or land in a summary way before two justices; provided that no proceeding for the recovery of such amount shall be taken until at least one month after a requisition for payment of the amount hereinbefore mentioned, together with an account of the total expenditure, signed by the municipal clerk, has been sent or deli

flagging, kerbing, paving, or asphalting, such occupier may either deduct the amount so paid from any rent then due or thereafter to become due to the owner, and the production of the receipt for the amount so paid by or recovered from such occupier shall be a good and sufficient discharge for the amount so paid or recovered on payment of rent to the owner; or such occupier may recover from the owner the amount so paid or recovered or any balance thereof, after deducting the rent, in a summary way before two justices.

Section 417.—The Council of the municipality may, by notice signed by the nunicipal clerk, and delivered to the owner or left at his last known place of abode, or at the residence of any agent or person receiving such owner's rents or transacting other business within the municipal district for such owner, of any ground lying alongside of any street, private street, road, or pathway, and being of a lower level than such street or private street, road or pathway, forthwith to have such low ground filled up to such level; and in case such owner shall refuse or neglect to fill up such ground for the space of one month after the delivery of such notice, the Council may proceed to fill up such ground at the expense of such owner, and the amount of such sexpense, not exceeding one-fourth of the then value of such ground, may be recovered from the owner in a summary way before two justices.

Section 418.—If any hole or place near any road or street, whether public or private, be, for want of sufficient protection or enclosure, dangerous to the passengers along such street or road, the Council shall, after due notice shall have been given, cause the same to be protected or enclosed, so as to prevent danger therefrom, and the expenses of such protection or enclosure, shall be repaid to the Council by the owner of the premises so protected or enclosed.
