"THE FEDERAL COUNCIL OF AUSTRALASIA ACT 1885."

By His Excellency Sir ROBERT GEORGE CROOKSHANK HAMILTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Imperial Parliament of the 48 and 49 Vict., Ch. 60, intitled "An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia," it is enacted that the Federal Council of Australasia shall be summoned and prorogued by the Governor of the Colony in which the Sessions shall be held, and shall be so summoned and prorogued by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of each of the colonies in the said Act referred to in respect to which the said Act is in operation: And whereas the present Session of the said Federal Council has been held at Hobart, in the colony of Tasmania: And whereas it is expedient that the said Federal Council shall be prorogued: Now therefore I, Sir ROBERT GEORGE CROOKSHANK HAMILTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, in pursuance of the said Act, and by virtue of the power thereby conferred upon me, do, by this my Proclamation, prorogue the said Federal Council.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by section 40 of *The Marine Board Act 1887* it is among other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make regulations for directing to what officer of the Board any fees, rates, dues, charges, and other moneys payable under the authority of the said Act, and not therein directed to be paid to any particular officer, shall be paid: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make the following regulations, that is to say:-

1. These regulations may be cited as "Regulations for payment of moneys due to the Board."
2. All fees, rates, dues, charges, and other moneys payable under the authority of *The Marine Board Act 1887*, and not otherwise in the said Act directed to be paid to any particular officer, shall be paid to and received by the Secretary to the said Board, or any person duly authorized to act in his behalf.
3. The Secretary shall find security in a guarantee society approved by the Minister for the amount of (£1,000) One thousand pounds, and any person acting for him for the sum of (£500) Five hundred pounds.

The foregoing regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board held this 8th day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might from time to time make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Winchelsea has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the forty-sixth section of the said Act, and no counter petition received: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order abolish all previous subdivisions of the Shire of Winchelsea, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned doth hereby re-subdivide the said Shire of Winchelsea into four separate ridings, the names and boundaries of which shall be as follow, that is to say:—

EAST RIDING.

Commencing at a point in the centre of the River Barwon—the shire boundary—at the north-east angle of the parish of Carrington-murrough; thence westerly and southerly by the said river to its junction with the Wornibete Creek; thence southerly by that creek and a line being the county boundary to the centre of the Salt Creek; thence easterly by that creek to the shire boundary, at the south-east angle of the parish of Wornibete; thence north-west and north again by the shire boundary to the commencing point.

WEST RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the shire boundary at the north-west angle of allotment 7, parish of Hesse; thence east, north, and easterly by the northern boundary of the shire to the River Barwon; thence southerly and westerly by that river to its junction with the Birregurra Creek; thence westerly by said creek to the western boundary of the shire; and thence north by said boundary to the commencing point.

MIDDLE RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the west boundary of the shire at the north-west angle of allotment 48, parish of Murron; thence by said boundary northerly to the Birregurra Creek; thence easterly by that creek to its junction with the Barwon River; thence north-easterly by that river to its junction with Wornibete Creek; thence by that creek, being the county boundary, to its intersection with the eastern boundary of the parish of Yan Yan Gurt; thence south by said boundary to the south-east angle thereof; thence west by the south boundary of said parish to the east boundary of the parish of Bamba; thence south by the east boundary and west by the south boundary of the said parish to the east boundary of the parish of Murron; thence by a direct line west to the commencing point.

COAST RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the shire boundary at the north-west angle of allotment 48, parish of Murron; thence due east to the south-west angle of the parish of Bamba; thence by the southern boundary of said parish to the south-east angle thereof; thence north by the eastern boundary of said parish to the south boundary of the parish of Yan Yan Gurt; thence east by part of the south boundary and north by the east boundary of said parish to the Wornibete Creek—the county boundary; thence south east by said county boundary to Salt Creek, easterly by that creek to the shire boundary; and thence following the shire boundary to and along the coast south-westerly to Skene's Creek; and thence northerly by said boundary to the commencing point.

The shire boundary above referred to is that described in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th November 1884.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

And the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby further Order, that a Council consisting of twelve members be elected accordingly.

And the Honorable John Nimmo, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PUBLIC HEALTH—BOROUGH OF HAMILTON.

BYE-LAW No. 14.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Borough of Hamilton, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, in pursuance of the powers contained in *The Public Health Acts 1865-1888*, and of every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being bye-law No. 14 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. *Repeal of sections 12 and 13, bye-law 13.*—Sections Nos. 12 and 13 of bye-law No. 13 of the said Local Board are hereby repealed.
2. *To come into force immediately after it is gazetted.*—This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. *To have force in the whole borough with certain exceptions.*—This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said borough, except as hereinafter more particularly specified.

No. 20.—MARCH 1, 1889.—2.

4. *Occupier to have night-soil removed.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall once at least in every week, or more often if required by the health officer or inspector, cause to be emptied and cleaned every earth-closet or privy on or belonging to such premises.

5. *Licensed nightman to be employed within certain areas.*—A nightman licensed by the municipal authorities shall alone be employed for the removal of night-soil from any premises situate within the following area, that is to say, the township area north of the Grange Burn Creek, and no other person shall remove the same.

6. *Carcasses &c., only to be buried at the manure depot.*—No person shall bury any carcass of any dead animal, or place or deposit dust, filth, rubbish, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter in or upon any land whether unenclosed or otherwise within the said borough, except only at the depot for the time being provided for the purpose by the said Local Board, or in or upon such other place as may be set apart by the said Board from time to time for such purpose.

7. *Carcasses, &c., to be buried 12 inches deep and disinfected.*—Every such carcass and all dust, filth, rubbish, offal or other refuse or offensive matter shall be buried, if animal refuse of any kind liable to decomposition, at least 12 inches below the natural surface of the ground, and in all cases to the satisfaction of the inspector of nuisances. A sufficient quantity of chloride of lime or other efficient disinfectant shall be spread over the whole surface of the deposit, which shall then be duly covered with earth as hereinbefore described, and in such a way that no nuisance by offensive smell or otherwise can arise therefrom.

8. *Penalties for breach of bye-law.*—Every person who shall, by any act or default, be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

PUBLIC HEALTH—SHIRE OF HEIDELBERG.

BYE-LAW No. 10.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Heidelberg, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Acts 1865-1888*, and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following bye-law, being Bye-law No. 10 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. All former bye-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

2. This bye-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This bye-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire excepting Part II., which shall apply to and have operation in the township of Heidelberg and in the district of Alphington and Fairfield Park, being that portion of the said shire which is bounded by the Merri Creek, the Borough of Northcote, the Dandenong Creek, the River Yarra, and the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum.

Definitions.

4. In the construction and for the purposes of this bye-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter, below or above the ground; and "earth-closet" shall include a pan-closet of any description.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

"Slaughter-yard" or "Slaughter-house" shall include an abattoir or any place whatever where slaughtering takes place.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

PART I.

General Cleanliness.

5. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto or occupied in connexion therewith to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dust, filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be, once at least in every week, removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Local Board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon, to be effectually deodorized and to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupier.

7. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter, in any street, road, lane, right-of-way or place so as to be a nuisance to any person, or injurious to health, or in any way contrary to the directions of the Local Board or Officer of Health.

8. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

PART II.

Disposal of House Refuse and Cleanliness in the township of Heidelberg, and in the district hereinbefore described and commonly known as Alphington and Fairfield Park.

9. The occupier of any land on which is erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty, or on which land is any building wherein any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine are kept, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to two cubic yards, or once at least in every week should the quantity not amount, in that time, to two cubic yards; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the said Local Board at the expense of such occupier.

10. Every occupier of a building or premises wherein or whereon any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle or swine may be kept shall provide, in connexion with such building or premises, whenever required by the Local Board or Officer of Health, a suitable receptacle for dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may from time to time be produced in the keeping of any such animal in such building or upon such premises, and cause such receptacle to be constructed so that the bottom or floor thereof shall not in any case be lower than the surface of the ground adjoining such receptacle, and in such a manner and of such materials and to be maintained at all times in such a condition as to prevent any effluvia therefrom or any escape of the contents thereof, or any soakage therefrom, into the ground or into the wall of any building, and to be furnished with a suitable cover and, when not required to be open, to be kept properly covered.

11. He shall likewise provide in connexion with such building or premises, if required by the Local Board or Officer of Health, a sufficient drain constructed in such a manner and of such materials and maintained at all times in such a condition as effectually to convey all urine or liquid filth or refuse therefrom into a proper receptacle.

PART III.

As to Manure.

12. Nothing herein contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil (not being night-soil), or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any bye-law of the Local Board of Health, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or contrary to any directions of the Local Board or Officer of Health.

13. Every person placing, depositing, or spreading, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any liquid manure of which night-soil, urine, or any similar offensive matters form a part, night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered, with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness, and shall keep and use the same in such a way only as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

PART IV.

As to Earth-closets, &c.

14. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground; and every such building shall be constructed

with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, workroom, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

15. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

16. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and provided with a closely-fitted cover of pattern to be approved by the inspector of nuisances.

17. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width.

18. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, chloride of lime, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

19. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

20. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

21. Where any nightman is licensed by the municipal authorities or the Local Board, such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same.

22. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter a thing shall be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the Local Board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

23. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m., unless otherwise permitted by the Local Board (of which the proof shall lie on such person), or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.

24. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

PART V.

Prevention of Pollution of Water.

25. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in, or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into, any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

26. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.

27. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way or be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within twenty-four hours of notice given by the Local Board or by one of its officers.

PART VI.

Drainage of Buildings.

28. Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed, to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

29. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease, of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired, shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

PART VII.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

30. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of April in every year, register himself with the Local Board of Health in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of Five shillings.

31. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Secretary of the Local Board of Health shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

32. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said Local Board, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said Local Board; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said Local Board may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said Local Board may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

33. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

34. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

35. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

36. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the Local Board or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the Local Board of Health; and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said Local Board or the officer

of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such Local Board or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until, in either case, all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

37. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the Local Board, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

38. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

PART VIII.

Penalties.

39. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this bye-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing bye-law was duly made, ordered and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council) in and for the shire this thirteenth day of February in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

SHIRE OF ARAPILES.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Arapiles, made under the 213th section of "The Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 3, for the purpose of regulating crossing over footways and channels.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Arapiles order as follows:—

Sections 15, 16, and 25, sub-division 4, of Part I., of the 13th Schedule of "The Local Government Act 1874" is hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Arapiles.

BYE-LAW No. 2.

PART I.—(4.) Crossing over Footways and Channels.

15. Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse rides or drives any horse or other animal, or drives or wheels any carriage, cart, or other vehicle, upon along or across any footway or any water-channel or gutter, herein called channel, by the side of any street or road, save in each such case upon and by at some crossing to be made as hereinafter mentioned, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and shall also pay to the council such sum, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of compensation for any damage done by him to the footway or channel, as the justice adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order.

16. If any land shall front to or adjoin or abut upon the footway of any street or road, and if access with horses and vehicles from such street or road to such land or to some sufficient way appurtenant thereto cannot be had without riding, driving, or wheeling the same respectively upon or across the said footway or the channel (if any) lying along the outer edge thereof, and if the owner of such land shall desire that a crossing for horses and other animals and for vehicles be made as herein provided over such footway and channel, and shall give a notice in writing of such his desire to the council, and in such notice describe the land in question and the proposed work by reference to the specification deposited as hereinafter mentioned, such specification being in accordance with the provisions hereof and with such regulation as may be in force in that behalf, it shall be lawful for such owner, after seven clear days from the giving of such notice and not before (with no unnecessary delay or obstruction), at his own cost and under the inspection of such officer as the council shall have appointed for the purpose, to make such crossing according to the tenor of such notice and specification, and not otherwise, and the owner of such land shall afterwards in like manner maintain the same.

25. If any crossing shall be out of repair, and the person liable hereunder to maintain or repair the same shall, for seven days after notice from the council to that effect, neglect properly and completely to repair the same, he shall forfeit for every day that such crossing shall remain so unrepaired, a sum of Forty shillings, and the council may, if they see fit, effect such repair and recover the same from such person before any justice.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Local Government Act 1874," the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Arapiles order as follows:—

Part 2 of the 13th Schedule of "The Local Government Act 1874" is hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Arapiles.

BYE-LAW No. 3.

PART II.—(1.) Waterworks, Drains, &c.

1. Whosoever shall bathe in any stream, reservoir, conduit, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the council, or shall wash, cleanse, throw, or cause to enter therein any animal, whether alive or dead, or any rubbish, filth, stuff, or thing of any kind whatsoever, or shall cause or permit or suffer to run or be brought therein the water of any sink, sewer, drain, engine, or boiler, or other filthy, unwholesome, or impure water, or shall do anything whatsoever whereby any water or waterworks belonging to the council, or under their management or control, shall be fouled or obstructed, shall for every such offence forfeit on conviction a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for each day while such offence is continued after written notice is that behalf.

2. Whosoever being supplied with water by the council from any waterworks of, or belonging to, or under the control or management of the council, or having access to any such waterworks for the taking of water therefrom shall wilfully or negligently suffer any water to run to waste from any pipe or conduit from or by which he shall be so supplied, or to which he shall have access, shall on conviction forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. Whosoever shall, without the consent in writing of the council, construct or place any dam or embankment in or across any river, creek, or natural watercourse, or permanently obstruct the same in any way, shall on conviction forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Five pounds for every day after such conviction during which such dam or embankment or any part thereof shall continue.

4. In any case in which the council has the exclusive right of collecting for the supply of any reservoir or waterworks belonging to the council or under their management or control the storm-water having fallen on any gathering ground, whosoever shall by any means whatsoever divert any such water from the course of its natural flow, so that the same shall tend to flow elsewhere than to such reservoirs or waterworks or some watercourse leading

thereto, or shall flow to the same respectively in a foul state, shall forfeit on conviction a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every day after such conviction during which water so tends to flow or flows as the case may be.

5. It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for prohibiting or regulating the shooting of water-fowl and the taking of fish upon or in or within one quarter of a mile of any stream, reservoir, or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the council; and every person who shall offend contrary to any such regulation shall on conviction forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Whosoever shall obstruct or damage any culvert, sewer, or drain belonging to or under the control of the council shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and shall pay to the council by way of compensation for any such damage such further sum not exceeding Ten pounds as the convicting justice shall order.

SHIRE OF ARAPILES.

A Bye-law of the Shire of Arapiles made under the 21st Schedule of the Local Government Act 1874, and numbered 4, for nuisances of various kinds.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Arapiles, order as follows:—

Sections 1 to 9 inclusive of Part 8 of the 13th Schedule of the Local Government Act 1874, is hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Arapiles.

BYE-LAW No. 4.

PART VIII.—Nuisances, &c.—(1) Nuisances of Various Kinds.

1. Every owner or keeper of any goat usually kept within the municipal district shall register with the municipal clerk his name and address as a keeper of goats, and shall at the time of such registration pay to such clerk the sum of Sixpence, and shall place and keep upon the neck of every goat so owned and kept a collar bearing the name and address so registered; and if any person shall without lawful excuse offend in any respect against this section he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

2. If a goat shall be found having on its neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person registered as aforesaid, such goat shall *prima facie* be presumed to be owned and kept by such person.

3. The council from time to time shall provide one secure enclosure for the keeping and custody of goats for the purpose of this subdivision, and forthwith when any such enclosure shall have been provided shall notify the same and the situation thereof in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourhood.

4. Every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place may by the proper officer of the council be forthwith seized and confined in such enclosure as aforesaid until dealt with as hereinafter provided.

5. Whenever a goat having on the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person resident within the municipal district registered as aforesaid shall be seized hereunder, the proper officer of the council shall forthwith cause notice of such seizure to be given to such person or left at the place of such address.

6. Subject to the provisions hereinafter in this bye-law contained, every goat so seized and confined as aforesaid which shall not have upon the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of some person registered as aforesaid may, by the proper officer of the council be destroyed at or after noon of the day following the day of such seizure, and every such goat which shall have on the neck such a collar as aforesaid may by the said officer be destroyed at or after noon of the day following next but one the day of such seizure.

7. The owner of any goat which shall have been seized as aforesaid may apply *ex parte* to any justice that such goat be restored to such owner, and such goat shall, if a justice shall so order, and not otherwise, be (unless the same has been destroyed) restored to such owner accordingly, and such order of a justice, or any minute thereof under the hand of such justice, shall for all purposes of this subdivision be conclusive evidence that the person so applying was the owner of such goat.

8. The owner, whether registered hereunder or not, of every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place, shall, whether such goat be destroyed or not, or be restored or not, forfeit and pay a penalty of Five shillings.

9. It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for appointing by limits to be set forth therein portions of the municipal districts in which it shall not be lawful to keep any swine, and if any person shall keep any swine within any such prescribed limits he shall forfeit for every day during which he shall so offend a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Arapiles order as follows:—

Sections 2, 3, and 4 of Part 9 of the 13 Schedule of The Local Government Act 1874, is hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Arapiles.

BYE-LAW No. 5.

PART IX.—Miscellaneous Matters.

2. If any person shall wilfully, and without the authority of the council, cut, break, bark, root up, or otherwise destroy or damage the whole or any part of any tree, sapling, shrub, or underwood growing in or upon any street, road, or place under the management of the council, although the injury done shall not be to the amount of One shilling, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. If any person shall, without the authority of the council, break, displace, or remove the surface or soil of any land belonging to or under the control or management of the council, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. For the purpose of those provisions of any statute now or hereafter to be in force whereby any person may be authorized to destroy goats, land shall be deemed to be securely enclosed, and fenced if the same be enclosed or fenced with a substantial three-railed fence of the usual height, and the openings in which (if any) shall at the time of trespass be secured or barred with gates or other fastenings of like closeness and strength with the fence, or if such land be enclosed or fenced with any fence and gates or fastenings of equivalent closeness and strength with such first-mentioned fence.

BYE-LAWS OF THE VICTORIAN EYE AND EAR HOSPITAL.

WHEREAS by an Order of His Excellency the Governor in Council, bearing date the 27th day of December 1876, and published in the *Government Gazette* 30th December 1876, the contributors for the time being to the Institution called and known as "The Victorian Eye and Ear Hospital," situate in the city of Melbourne, were, under an Act intitled "An Act for Hospitals and Charitable Institutions," and numbered 220, declared to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Victorian Eye and Ear Hospital."

And whereas, by the said recited Act, power is given to the corporation of any institution incorporated thereunder to make bye-laws for the regulation of its own proceedings, for fixing the number of votes of contributors in proportion to the amount of their contributions, for determining the validity of disputed elections, and for conducting such elections; and generally for all matters whatsoever affecting the management of the Institution not inconsistent with the laws of the colony.

Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Corporation of the Victorian Eye and Ear Hospital as follows:—

That the following bye-laws, made by the committee thereof, confirmed by a general meeting of contributors, specially convened for that purpose on the 27th day of February 1889, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 20 on Friday the 1st day of March 1889, shall be the bye-laws for the future government of the hospital, and the same shall take effect from and after the 1st day of April 1889.

INTRODUCTORY.

1. All bye-laws made prior to the date of the making of these bye-laws shall be and the same are hereby repealed, all existing rights being reserved.

2. In these bye-laws the word "governor" shall mean and be equivalent to the word "contributor" in the Act of the Parliament of Victoria No. 220, and the term "office-bearer" shall be understood as referring to the president, vice-presidents, and treasurer.

OBJECT OF HOSPITAL.

3. The object of the hospital shall be to place gratuitously within the reach of all destitute persons, without distinction of creed or country, every attainable means for the relief or cure of diseases of the eye and ear.

COMMON SEAL.

4. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept at the hospital, in the joint custody of the treasurer and secretary, and shall be affixed only under the order of the committee, by and in the presence of such treasurer or some one deputed in his place by the committee and one other member of the committee; and those two shall sign their names as witnesses.

GOVERNORS AND THEIR PRIVILEGES.

5. Every contributor of £1 and upwards per annum shall be solicitor, annual governor of the hospital; and every contributor of £1 and upwards shall be a life governor.

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6. Governors shall have the privilege of recommending patients to the hospital, according to the following scale, viz. :—

7. All life governors, whether individual contributors or not, and all persons who contribute £1 per annum, shall be entitled to recommend four out-patients in each year, and shall have one vote at all meetings of governors.

8. Those who contribute £30 in one sum, or £2 per annum, shall be entitled to recommend four out-patients and one in-patient each year, and shall be entitled to two votes.

9. Those who contribute £40 in one sum, or £5 per annum, shall be entitled to recommend ten out-patients and two in-patients each year, and shall have three votes.

10. Those who contribute £50 in one sum, or £10 per annum, shall be entitled to recommend twenty out-patients and four in-patients each year, and shall be entitled to three votes.

11. No governor of less than three months' standing as such shall be entitled to vote; and, in accordance with the Act, no governor shall have more than three votes.

12. Governors shall have the privilege of exchanging a single in-patient ticket for six out-patient tickets, or six out-patient tickets for one in-patient ticket on application to the secretary. Tickets shall continue in force for one month; and no person shall be admitted as a patient without a ticket, except in cases of accident or sudden emergency, or unless they can furnish satisfactory proof that they are suitable and worthy objects for admission.

13. Any person (not being a paid servant of the institution), who shall pay to the hospital in any one year, in one sum, collections to the amount of £30 or upwards—no portion of which shall be annual subscriptions—shall be enrolled a life governor.

14. Any public or corporate body which shall contribute £5 annually shall be entitled to nominate some one person to be appointed an annual governor; and if the contribution shall amount to £20 in one sum, then such nominee shall be appointed a life governor. The appointee in either case shall enjoy the same privileges as individual contributors of a like amount.

15. All yearly subscriptions shall be payable in advance, and the date of the first payment shall be the date of the commencement of each successive year for which the subscription shall become due and payable. And so long as any subscription remains due and unpaid after that date in each year, the party shall not be entitled to enjoy any of the privileges of a governor.

16. Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privileges through some one member of such firm only, whose name shall be duly notified by them to the committee. But the subscription of any firm or partnership shall not qualify an individual member thereof for election as a member of the committee unless the total amount subscribed shall average one pound for each member of such firm or partnership.

17. The first-named executor in any will under which a bequest of £50 or upwards shall have been paid to the hospital or his nominee may be appointed a life governor. And it shall be competent for the committee further to appoint as life governors from time to time such persons as in their judgment shall be considered deserving of that distinction on account of valuable services rendered by them to the hospital, whether they be contributors or not.

18. Any governor absent from the colony may, by proper power of attorney, exercise all the privileges to which he or she would be entitled if personally present; but such power of attorney shall be deposited with the secretary for record at least seven clear days before the same can be used in exercise of such privileges.

19. Every contributor to the hospital shall, for every £20 contained in any single amount contributed by them at one time, be entitled to nominate one life governor, and such nominee may be so appointed by the committee accordingly.

OFFICERS AND COMMITTEE.

20. The management shall be vested in a committee of thirteen gentlemen, consisting of the president, two vice-presidents, and a treasurer (as *ex officio* members), together with an honorary secretary and eight other elective members. And one-third part of the nine elective members of such committee shall, in accordance with the provisions of the Act, retire annually, but will be eligible for re-election.

21. The president, vice-presidents, and treasurer shall be elected annually at the general meeting, and shall hold office until the election of their successors, but shall be eligible for re-election. They shall be *ex officio* members of all sub-committees, but it shall not be necessary to send them notice of the meetings of such sub-committees.

22. The honorary secretary shall be elected at the annual meeting of governors—and at all times from amongst the elective members of committee—and shall hold office during the term of his committee membership. And in case of a vacancy at any time occurring, other than by effluxion of time, the committee shall fill the same, and the party elected shall hold office only until the next annual meeting, but will be eligible for re-election.

23. It shall be the duty of the honorary secretary to check all amounts received during the month on behalf of the hospital, and see that the same have been properly accounted for. Also to examine all accounts for disbursement, and certify as to their correctness preparatory to their being submitted to the committee for payment; and, in the event of his absence, he shall arrange with some other member of the committee to perform that duty on his behalf.

24. With the exception of life governors and the honorary surgeons, no gentleman shall be eligible for election as an office-bearer or as a member of committee who is not in his own person a contributor to the funds of the hospital to the extent of at least one pound per annum; and all such as are contributors of this amount shall be eligible for those positions. But such contribution—if the party be a new contributor—must have been paid fully three months prior to the date of his nomination for the position, otherwise he shall not be eligible. The honorary surgeons, in consideration of the valuable services they render gratuitously to the hospital, shall be eligible without being contributors, as shall

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men as are life governors.

25. No person being a paid servant in the employ of the hospital, and no person in any way interested in any contract therewith, shall be a member of the committee.

26. The committee shall direct all the business of the hospital, appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants, and may from time to time, as occasion requires, make rules, not inconsistent with these bye-laws, for the regulation of their own proceedings, for defining the duties of officers and servants, for maintaining order among the patients, and generally for all matters connected with the management as they may consider necessary.

27. There shall be a visiting committee, consisting of three members, who shall hold office for three months. The honorary secretary shall be *ex officio* one of these, and also chairman; and the other two shall be elected by and from the general committee. Two shall constitute a quorum.

28. It shall be the duty of the visiting committee to inspect the hospital from time to time as the chairman may appoint; and to offer to the general committee at the monthly meetings such suggestions with regard to the management, &c., as they may deem expedient.

MEETINGS IN GENERAL.

29. The president, and in his absence either of the vice-presidents or the treasurer, shall preside at all meetings both of governors and of the committee; and should none of these officers be present, then the meeting shall elect its own chairman.

30. The chairman at all meetings shall, in addition to his deliberative vote, have a casting vote in case of an equality of votes.

31. At all meetings all questions shall be determined by a majority of the votes of those present.

32. With the reservation hereinafter mentioned, all meetings in connection with the hospital shall be open to contributors and to representatives of the press; but no person who is not entitled to vote shall interfere or take any part in the proceedings. Governors or other contributors shall not, however, be present at committee meetings, unless by special permission of the committee.

33. No business shall be entered upon at any meeting until the minutes of the previous meeting shall have been confirmed or otherwise disposed of, and no discussion thereon shall be permitted except as to their accuracy.

MEETINGS OF GOVERNORS.

34. An annual meeting of governors shall be held in Melbourne on the last Thursday in July in each year, at which a report of the condition and progress of the hospital shall be presented by the committee, together with an audited account of receipts and disbursements for the year ending 30th June previously. And at such meeting all vacancies in the committee shall be filled up. The report to be so presented shall be submitted to a special meeting of the committee for revision and approval at least three days previously.

35. At all general meetings of governors ten shall constitute a quorum, and should a quorum not be present within a quarter of an hour after the time appointed for holding the meeting, the meeting shall be adjourned for one week, to be held on the same day and at the same hour, but at the hospital; and at the adjourned meeting five shall form a quorum, but should a quorum be present within fifteen minutes after the appointed hour then the meeting will be adjourned *sine die*. It shall not be necessary to give notice by advertisement of an adjourned meeting.

36. In the event of any member of committee being elected to the office of president, vice-president, or treasurer, the vacancy thus created shall be filled up at the meeting at which such officer was elected.

37. If it shall happen that any member or members of the committee, whose retirement may require to be determined by lot in accordance with the Act, shall be absent from the meeting at which such determination has to be made, then the chairman of the meeting, if need be, shall inscribe on the paper the name or names of those absent, and otherwise act on their behalf; and the issue of the lot shall have the same force and effect as if the said absentee or absentees were present.

38. Candidates for the offices of president, vice-president, or treasurer, or for the vacancies in committee, shall notify, or cause to be notified, to the secretary in writing their intended candidature not less than two weeks prior to the day of election, otherwise they shall not be eligible for election.

39. Should there be more candidates than there are vacancies, then the election shall take place either by ballot or show of hands as the meeting may determine. If there be only the same number, then those nominated shall be declared duly elected. But should there be fewer, then it shall be competent for the committee, should they think fit, to elect members at the next monthly meeting to fill such vacancies in the committee as may exist. The members so elected shall retire at the next annual meeting, but will be eligible for re-election.

40. No person shall be allowed to propose a candidate, if absent, as an office-bearer or as a member of the committee unless he shall have previously obtained his written consent to act in such capacity if elected.

41. Should there, from any cause, be a failure to elect at the annual or adjourned annual meeting of governors new members of committee instead of those retiring by rotation, or to elect new office-bearers, then the committee at its option, and at its next meeting, may fill all or any of the existing vacancies, and the parties so elected shall hold office only until the next annual meeting, but they will then be eligible for re-election.

42. Voting by proxy shall be permitted at all general meetings of governors, provided the appointee be a qualified voter, and that the appointed governor lives beyond a radius of ten miles from the General Post Office, Melbourne, and is duly qualified to vote, and that the proxy be in the subjoined form, and lodged with the secretary seven clear days previous to the meeting.

43. The committee may at any time call a special general meeting of governors on giving seven days' notice thereof in any two of the daily papers published in Melbourne, specifying the object for which it is called; and no other business but that shall be brought before the meeting.

MEETINGS OF COMMITTEE.

41. The committee shall meet at the hospital on the first Wednesday of every month, at half-past three o'clock p.m.; or on such other fixed monthly date and at any such other hour as they may at any time appoint. Three shall form a quorum. And in the absence of a quorum at the expiration of a quarter of an hour from the appointed time, it shall be competent for those present to pass the necessary audited accounts for payment; but no other business shall be transacted by them unless it be of an urgent nature. And all business transacted shall be submitted for approval at the next meeting at which a quorum shall be present.

45. It shall be competent nevertheless to hold special committee meetings on the written request—conveyed to the secretary—of any three members of the committee, for the transaction of such business as shall be indicated in the notice calling such meeting, but no other business shall be transacted thereat. Three shall constitute a quorum.

46. Any member of the committee, whether *ex officio* or elected, who shall be absent from four consecutive meetings without leave from the committee shall cease to be a member, and the vacancy thus created may be filled by the remaining members in accordance with the provisions of the Act No. 220. The non-attendance, however, of members of committee at special meetings shall not of itself, or in conjunction with any other, involve a vacancy of office under the Act, which shall be understood as referring only to the regular monthly meetings of the committee.

47. In the event of any member of committee—*ex officio* or elective—becoming disqualified, and his office becoming vacant, it shall be necessary, before the remaining members proceed to fill up the vacancy, that one month's notice of motion to that effect be given by some member of the committee.

48. No proposition to enact or amend a bye-law, or to frame or vary any rule, shall be entertained unless one month's previous notice shall have been given. And no motion to rescind a resolution of committee shall be submitted within three months after such resolution has been passed. And such rescission, to have force and effect, will require to be sanctioned by the vote of an absolute majority of the entire committee—*ex officio* and elective.

49. No motion, except on current business, shall be entertained unless three clear days' notice thereof shall have been given, and the same notified in the summons to each member of the committee.

SURGICAL STAFF.

50. The surgical staff shall consist of three honorary surgeons, one honorary assistant surgeon, and one resident surgeon. The duties of the honorary assistant surgeon shall be to assist in seeing out-patients, in administering chloroform, and otherwise assisting at operations; and in the absence of any of the honorary surgeons he shall take their place and perform their duties.

51. Mr. Andrew S. Gray shall be honorary surgeon for life, in recognition of his being the founder of the hospital. Mr. T. Aubrey Bowen shall be honorary surgeon for the term of ten years, dating from 1st January 1887. Mr. James P. Ryan shall be honorary surgeon, and Dr. James W. Barrett shall be honorary assistant surgeon, each for the term of three years from 1st September 1888.

52. It shall be competent for the committee, on the recommendation of the honorary surgeons, in the event of the absence of any of their number, to appoint a duly-qualified medical man to discharge, for the time being, the duties of the honorary assistant surgeon on that officer's undertaking the duties of the absent surgeon; but such temporary appointment shall be only honorary, and shall lapse on the resumption of duty by the surgeon who had been absent.

53. The resident surgeon shall be appointed for a term not exceeding six months, but at the expiration of that time he shall be eligible for re-appointment for a further term of six months, subject to the approval of the majority of the honorary surgeons. On the expiration of that period he shall not, however, be eligible for re-appointment for any further term.

54. All future appointments to the surgical staff shall be made by the committee, and the term of each and all of such future appointments shall not exceed a period of three years.

55. When any honorary surgeon shall have served as such for a period of twelve years, and has resigned his office, the committee may appoint him an honorary consulting surgeon. But in case of his subsequent re-election as honorary surgeon his office of honorary consulting surgeon shall be suspended during his continuance in the other.

56. Any honorary assistant surgeon who shall, as such, have served the hospital for five years, may, if the committee think fit, be appointed to the first vacancy that occurs in the office of honorary surgeon.

57. No person shall be eligible for appointment on the surgical staff unless he be registered by the Medical Board of Victoria.

58. When any vacancy occurs in the surgical staff, or is about to occur through effluxion of time, the committee shall give public notice of the same by advertisement in at least two daily newspapers published in Melbourne, and shall fix therein a time, not less than fourteen clear days from the date of insertion of such notice, within which candidates shall send in their applications, together with evidences of their qualifications.

59. Should there be only one duly-qualified candidate, the committee may declare him duly elected, or in their discretion may from time to time postpone the election, and advertise anew as hereinbefore directed. Provided always that no vacancy shall remain unfilled for a longer period than six weeks.

GENERAL.

60. Tenders for the supply of stores for the use of the hospital shall be called for by public advertisement, and for such periods as may be determined upon by the committee; and the particulars of all such tenders shall be recorded in the minute-book.

61. All requests made to the hospital—subject to the conditions thereto attached—shall be placed to the credit of the Endowment Fund; and all moneys belonging to such fund may from time to time be invested by the treasurer in such manner as the committee shall direct. And the income arising from such investments shall be applied to the maintenance of the institution.

62. Every person obtaining the benefits of the hospital under a plea of destitution—expressed or implied—who shall be subsequently found to have been at the time able to pay for the same, shall be required to do so at the rate of not less than twenty-five shillings per week. And every person admitted on the ground of emergency, and able to pay, shall also be required to do so at the same rate. The liability of the parties in such cases to be determined by the committee.

63. All property found in possession of patients who may die in the hospital shall be applied to defray the expenses of their maintenance, and also of their burial if buried by the institution; and the residue, if any, shall be handed over to their legal representatives.

64. Servants of the hospital shall not, without the consent of the committee, accept any fee, perquisite, or gratuity from patients or their friends under penalty of immediate dismissal.

65. The secretary shall superintend the general conduct of the hospital; and shall at once report to the committee any want of attention, or any neglect on the part of any or either of the servants, or any irregularity, or any other matter or thing that may occur relating to the affairs of the institution and out of the ordinary course of business.

66. No alteration of these bye-laws shall be made save at the annual meeting of governors, or at a special general meeting of same called by the committee, or at one called by direction of the president at the request of ten governors. And notice in writing shall be furnished through the secretary to the committee of any such intended alteration not less than fourteen days prior to such meeting. And no alteration and no new bye-law shall have any force or effect until the same shall have been confirmed by a general meeting of governors specially convened for that purpose, and until one month after the same shall have been subsequently published in the *Government Gazette*, as determined by the Hospitals Act No. 220.
