The births of 1,386 children, viz., 711 boys and 675 girls, were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of January. In the month of December 1,265 births were registered, or 121 less than in the month under review. The births were 492 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 239 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in January numbered 1,211, viz., 655 of males and 556 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 175, or 14 per cent. The deaths were more numerous than those in December by 99, and than the average of January during the previous ten years by 582. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, the excess over that average will be reduced to 404.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.30, and of deaths registered 2.88.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 99.2° on the 23rd, and the lowest was 49.7° on the 5th. The mean temperature of the month (67.7°) was nearly two degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (38.1°) took place on the 9th, viz., from a maximum of 92.0° to a minimum of 53.9°. The least range (6.9°) was on the 2nd, viz., from a maximum of 77.4° to a minimum of 70.5°. The mean daily range was 18.7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.191 inches on the 8th, and the lowest was 29.413 inches on the 23rd. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.862 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on 11 days, the amount of rainfall being 4.22 inches. The average rainfall in January during the previous ten years was 1.72 inches, or 2.50 inches less than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 57 per cent. to that mortality, as against 53 per cent. in 1888, 53 per cent. in 1887, 54 per cent. in 1886, 48 per cent. in 1885, 44 per cent. in 1884, 48 per cent. in 1883, 49 per cent. in 1882, 46 per cent. in 1881, 43 per cent. in 1880, and 44 per cent. in 1879.

Forty deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a laborer, aged 75, died of simple cholera; two females, aged 80 and 83 respectively, a carter, aged 84, and a gentleman, aged 93, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 78, of dysentery; a laborer and a female, each aged 76, of cancer; a shipwright, aged 75, of inflammation of the brain; an agriculturist, aged 77, of apoplexy; a photographer and a whitesmith, aged 75 and 84 respectively, of cerebral hemorrhage; three females, aged 76, 77, and 91 respectively, and a laborer, aged 88, of heart disease; a laborer, aged 76, and a miner, aged 87, of bronchitis; a widow, aged 78, of uræmia; a gentleman, aged 75, of stone in the bladder; a laborer, aged 78, of peritonitis; a female, aged 75, of sunstroke; a gentleman, aged 80, of fracture of the thigh; two females, each aged 75, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 76, a tinsmith, aged 77, a butcher and a female, each aged 78, a female, aged 79, a bootmaker, a male of occupation unknown, and two females, each aged 81, a gentleman and a female, each aged 82, a female, aged 83, a female, aged 84, and a gardener and a widow, each aged 85, of old age.

Forty-six deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which thirty-seven were set down to accident, three to homicide, and six to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—Two boys, aged 8 and 15 respectively, died of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall from a tree; a boy, aged 9, of internal injuries, consequent on a fall; a laborer, aged 25, of fracture of the spine, caused by falling off a railway trolley; a laborer, aged 38, of injuries received by falling into a clay-hole; a laborer, aged 42, of fracture of the skull, occasioned by falling out of a window; a hawk, aged 44, of injuries sustained by a fall whilst intoxicated; a female, aged 45, of fracture of the skull and drowning, caused through a fall from an embankment into the River Yarra; a carpenter, aged 67, of dislocation of the neck, received through a fall. A lift-boy, aged 15, was crushed to death by a lift; a drayman, a nightman, and a gentleman, aged 39, 44, and 61 respectively, died of injuries occasioned by being thrown from vehicles; a female child, aged 2, and a laborer, aged 27, were passed over by trains; a stonemason, aged 66, was passed over by a tramcar; a seaman, aged 54, died of injuries consequent on coming in contact with a steam-crane; a gentleman, aged 80, of fracture of the thigh bone, how caused not stated; two females, aged 4 and 55 respectively, were burnt to death; a laborer and a lady, aged 40 and 75 respectively, died of sunstroke; a female, aged 50, accidentally poisoned herself; a boy, aged 14, a carpenter, aged 16, three laborers, aged 22, 22, and 23 respectively, a seaman, aged 26, a farmer, aged 29, a seaman, aged 32, and two males, of occupations unknown, aged 56 and 69 respectively, were found drowned; a female infant was smothered at birth through difficulty at delivery; three male infants, aged 1, 2, and 3 months respectively, were overlain. The homicidal deaths were those of two males, who were smothered at birth; and of a warder at the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, who died of wounds inflicted on him by a patient, a verdict of wilful murder being returned. The suicides were those of a bricklayer, aged 51, who shot himself; a contractor, aged 41, who cut his throat, a lodging-house keeper, aged 33, and a land owner, aged 63, who poisoned themselves, the former with chloroform and the latter with strychnine; a clerk, aged 50, who drowned himself in the River Yarra; and a printer, aged 39, who threw himself in front of a train whilst of unsound mind.

One hundred and sixty deaths, or 13 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—75 in the Melbourne Hospital, 23 in the Alfred Hospital, 8 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 8 in the Children's Hospital, 2 in the Women's Hospital, 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 10 in the Benevolent Asylum, 11 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, 6 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 694, of which 346, or 49 per cent., were of males, and 348, or 51 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 532 were under one year of age, 122 were between one and two, 24 were between two and three, 11 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 517. Of these, 309, or 60 per cent., were males, and 208, or 40 per cent., were females; 21 were between five and ten, 13 were between ten and fifteen, 19 were between fifteen and twenty, 46 were between twenty and twenty-five, 60 were between twenty-five and thirty, 38 were between thirty and thirty-five, 33 were between thirty-five and forty, 37 were between forty and forty-five, 32 were between forty-five and fifty, 43 were between fifty and fifty-five, 42 were between fifty-five and sixty, 37 were between sixty and sixty-five, 36 were between sixty-five and seventy, 20 were between seventy and seventy-five, 21 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 19 were upwards of eighty.

The total amount of tender must be stated in words as well as in figures.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit as shown above in bank notes, or a bank draft in favor of the Secretary of the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt in favor of the Secretary of the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security is calculated at Ten per cent. upon contracts not exceeding £1,000, and at Five per cent. over that sum; but no deviation will be allowed from the amounts above stated.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Persons failing to take up their contracts will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for —" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labor may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods, and be transmitted through the Stores and Transport Department, except in the case of supplies for the Local Military Department, the Naval Forces, the Harbor Department, and for Works and Buildings. From these departments the order will be sent direct to the contractor. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with the order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officers issuing the orders. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

10. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 13 of these conditions.

11. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 7.

12. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 7.

13. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 7, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

14. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.
