ENGINEER STUDENTS IN HER MAJESTY'S NAVAL SERVICE.

THE following Extract from Regulations for the entry of Engineer Students in Her Majesty's Navy, and for the entry of Students in Naval Construction, to be trained in the Devonport Dockyard, is published for general information.

EXTRACT FROM REGULATIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF ENGINEER STUDENTS IN HER MAJESTY'S NAVY, AND FOR THE ENTRY OF STUDENTS IN NAVAL CONSTRUCTION, WITH A VIEW TO THEIR BEING TRAINED IN HER MAJESTY'S DOCKYARD AT DEVONPORT.

(The Engineer Students to be trained for service afloat as Engineer Officers.)

(The Students in Naval Construction to be trained with a view to their joining the Royal Corps of Naval Constructors.)

1. *Vacancies open to public competition principally; a few to be filled by nominated candidates.*—Vacancies for appointments as engineer students in Her Majesty's navy will be filled principally by means of competitive examinations open to all sons of British subjects, being of the prescribed age and of good moral character, but their Lordships will reserve to themselves the right to nominate a few candidates at each entry who will be appointed on passing the examination specified in paragraph 11.

The candidates to be nominated will be selected by the Board of Admiralty from sons of officers of the navy, army, or royal marines who have been killed in action or who have been lost at sea on active service, or killed on duty, or who have died of wounds received in action or injuries received on duty within six months from the date of such action or injury, or sons of officers of the navy or royal marines who have performed long and meritorious service. The number to be so nominated will not exceed one-fifth of the total number of engineer students to be entered. Except as regards exemption from competitive examination, these candidates will be subject in all respects to these regulations.*

Three engineer studentships will be given annually to sons of gentlemen in the Colonies on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, provided they pass the required examination. These candidates will be subject to precisely the same regulations as herein laid down for nominated service candidates.†

2. *Appointments.*—The number of appointments to be made in each year will be fixed by their Lordships.

3. *Time for sending in applications.*—The list of candidates for the appointments by open competition will be kept at the office of the Civil Service Commissioners. All applications for the forms to be filled up by persons who wish to compete must be sent to the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, London, S.W., on or after the first of January in each year, and care must be taken that the forms when filled up are returned so as to reach the Civil Service Commissioners on or before the 15th March following, as no notice will be taken of Forms received after that date. The list of nominated candidates will be kept at the Admiralty.

4. *Age.*—Candidates must not be less than fifteen nor more than sixteen years of age on the first day of May in the year in which they are examined.‡

5. *Age and character, evidence of.*—Evidence of age and character will not be required before the examination, but candidates successful in it will not be eligible for appointment unless they satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners on these points.

6. *Medical examination, time and place. Re-vaccination.*—The medical examination of the successful candidates will be held under the authority of their Lordships as soon as possible after the result of the educational examination is made known. No candidate will be entered as an engineer student unless he is pronounced to be physically fit. Candidates in or near London will be medically examined by the Medical Director-General of the Navy at the Admiralty. Those residing near one of Her Majesty's dockyards, or one of the first reserve ships or drill ships of the Royal Naval Reserve, or the flagship at Queenstown, will be examined by the medical officers attached thereto. The medical examinations will be conducted in all respects in strict accordance with the instructions for the examination of persons for admission into the naval service. All candidates at the time of their medical examination must produce certificates to the satisfaction of the examining officers that they have been re-vaccinated, or they must be re-vaccinated before they can be considered eligible for entry as engineer students in H.M. Navy.

7. *Educational examination, time and place.*—The educational examination will be held by the Civil Service Commissioners in London, Liverpool, Portsmouth, Devonport, Bristol, Leeds, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Edinburgh, Glasgow, and Dublin, and will

All candidates will be tested as to their ability to read aloud with clearness, distinctness, and accuracy, and without hesitation. Stammering, or any imperfection of utterance, will be regarded as a disqualification.

9. *Examination fee.*—A fee will be required from every candidate attending an examination. §

10. *Result of examination.*—Candidates in the competitive examination who may fail to pass in the first four subjects (those marked with an * asterisk), or in reading aloud, will be disqualified, and their other papers will not be examined. Successful candidates will be entered as engineer students in H.M. Navy according to the number of appointments which it may be decided to make that year; they will be taken according to their position on the examination list. Candidates who obtain less than 780 marks in the aggregate will not be placed upon the list.

11. *Examination for nominated candidates.*—The candidates who are nominated by their Lordships, and by the Secretary of State for the Colonies, will be required to pass the same test examination in the first four subjects and in reading aloud as the candidates who enter for the competitive examination. They will also be examined in the other subjects to ascertain the extent of their knowledge and to determine their order of merit, and no nominated candidate will be appointed as an engineer student who obtains less than 780 marks in the aggregate.

12. *Informing of result of examination.*—Candidates will be informed by letter from the Civil Service Commission of the result of their examination as soon as it has been ascertained.

13. *Entry as engineer students.*—The successful candidates will be entered as engineer students in H.M. Navy about the first of July in each year, and will be borne on the books of the guard ship of the reserve at Devonport for disciplinary purposes. The period of training at H.M. dockyard at Devonport will be for five years, but it will be reduced to four years in the case of engineer students of the latter service who pass the examination described in paragraph 23, clause 1, and also pass very creditably in practical workmanship and knowledge of engine room duties referred to in paragraph 32.

14. *Appointment as students in naval construction. Bonds.*—Students in naval construction not exceeding two in number annually will be appointed from among engineer students who have shown special ability at the end of their second year of service. The students in naval construction, on appointment, must join with their parents or guardians in a bond for £500 to enter, if required, into Her Majesty's service as assistant constructors, if at the expiration of their training they should obtain certificates of good conduct and efficiency for entry in that capacity. They will continue to be under naval discipline until their entry as probationary assistant constructors.

15. Students in naval construction will complete five years' service at Devonport in the training school for engineer students, and will be subject to the same conditions as to fees, pay, uniform, and other details as may be prescribed from time to time for engineer students. Their course of instruction will be laid down from time to time.

16. *Fees.*—The parent or guardian of each engineer student entered in future will be required to pay yearly in advance the sum of £40 per annum for each year the student may be under training—four or five years as the case may be. It will, however, be at the discretion of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to select from among the students entered at each yearly examination, a number not to exceed five, being sons of officers of the navy, army, or marines, or of civil officers under the Board of Admiralty, with respect to whom the annual payment will be £25 only. Their Lordships also reserve the power to further reduce this latter sum in the case of sons of officers killed or drowned, or who have otherwise lost their lives on service. In making their selection, my Lords will have regard solely to the pecuniary circumstances of the parents or guardians of the students.

§ At present this fee is One shilling, but it must be understood that the amount may be raised at any time by notice in the London Gazette.

17. *Payment of fees.*—The payments are to be made to the Cashier of H. M. Dockyard at Devonport; the first payment is to be made before the student is entered, and the subsequent payments on or before the 30th day of June in each of the four succeeding years. Should a student leave from any cause or be dismissed from the service, not any portion of the payments that have been made in his behalf will be refunded.

18. *Clothing, washing, necessaries, board, lodging, medical attendance.*—The parents or guardians of the students will also be required to provide the uniform (see par. 48) or other clothing, washing, and necessaries of each student. Board and lodging, and medical attendance, will be provided by the Admiralty. The students will be required to reside in the training school at Keyham.

19. *Pay.*—The weekly pay of students during their training will be as follows, provided they are well reported on by the officers:—

20. *Leave.*—Five weeks' leave (30 working days) on full pay will be granted each year to all students whose conduct and progress have been satisfactory. This leave is to be taken during the school vacations at Midsummer and Christmas.

Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Seven hundred and fifty pounds granted by Parliament to Horticultural Societies 1888-9.

1. That each society claiming to participate in the Grant shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February 1889, a statement in the Form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the Form marked E.

2. The distribution of the vote will be made one month after the above-mentioned date, when a sum equal to the amount of the prize-money awarded and paid away will be allotted to each society having a claim, and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, provided that the sums claimed do not exceed in the whole Seven hundred and fifty pounds, and if they do exceed this amount then they will be reduced *pro rata*, and the allotment made accordingly.

3. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st January 1888 and the 31st December 1888 amounts in the total to less than Fifty pounds shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

2. The account is then to be prepared by making the Government Dr. for the amount declared to have been awarded and paid away in prizes.

3. The account must be signed by the treasurer, and be countersigned by the president or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management; it should then be returned to the Department of Agriculture, with the declaration and statements appended.

It may expedite the payment of the money to fill in at the top of the account the name of the nearest pay office in the space left blank for the purpose. It is necessary to bear in mind that, if that space be not filled up, the account will be payable at Melbourne only.

4. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid, unless such cups have been finally awarded.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

GRANT FOR PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS, 1888-89.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations in connection with the above-named Grant, viz. :—

PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

Regulations in connection with the Vote of Nine thousand five hundred pounds (£9,500) for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

1. A sum not exceeding Ten shillings shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January 1888 and 31st December 1888, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 1st February 1889. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January 1888 and 31st December 1888; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January 1888.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1888 (*vide* form A), and a sum equal to one-half of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of Nine thousand three hundred and four pounds seventeen shillings and sixpence, they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. A sum of Ninety-five pounds two shillings and sixpence shall be paid to the Eaglehawk Borough Council in satisfaction of its claim against the vote for the year 1887-8; same not having been received in time to participate in distribution.

5. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

6. Moneys expended in street planting or in fencing, formation or maintenance of land for racing, cricket, football, croquet, tennis, bowling, quoits, or other sports, or in erection or repairs of stands or pavilions for the purpose of witnessing sports, must not be included in any claim upon the vote.

7. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, except the Royal Park, or to the Edinburgh Garden, Fitzroy, or the Botanical Garden, Geelong.

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

Regulations for the distribution of the sum of Twenty thousand pounds (£20,000) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1888-89.

1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February 1889, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to two-thirds of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding £25 each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum do not exceed

the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. Of the whole grant (£20,000), a sum not exceeding Nineteen thousand five hundred pounds shall be so divided; and if the sums claimable be in excess of this amount they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. A sum not to exceed Five hundred pounds shall be paid to the St. Arnaud Agricultural Society towards the expenses of its Spring show, held on the 26th and 27th September 1888, under the patronage of the Department of Agriculture.

5. No society located within twenty miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society, as hereinbefore specified, amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least.

Instructions.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration, form E, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, between the 1st January 1888 and the 31st December 1888, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account, when received, must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president, or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management. It should then be returned to the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne.

3. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid, unless such cups have been finally awarded.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

WHEREAS by section 18 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Waterworks Trust has been by Order in Council duly constituted, make additional Orders in Council, not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act, relating to such Waterworks Trust, and that the Governor in Council may in any such Order, among other things—

- (a) Increase or diminish the extent of the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust; and
- (b) Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Waterworks Trust.

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of October 1882 a Waterworks Trust, known and incorporated as the United Echuca and Waranga Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted; and the boundaries of the lands comprising the Waterworks District of the said Trust were, in and by clause 4 of the said Order in Council, described and limited.

That clause number 5 of Part I. of certain regulations made in accordance with the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, and dated the sixth day of June 1887, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be and may be cited as clause 5 of Part I. of the said regulations:—

5. Where application is for renewal of lease, Minister may waive the necessity for compliance with foregoing provisions.—Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the Minister may, as he shall see fit, waive the necessity for a compliance with any of the provisions of the foregoing clauses of this part of these regulations, in any case in which the applicant shall have previously obtained a pumping lease for any term not exceeding five years of the land in respect of which a further lease is applied for, if the source of supply in the further proposed lease be the same as in the original lease, and provided also that the application for such further lease shall be made within three calendar months from the date at which the term granted by the former lease shall have expired.

II. That clause number 7 of Part II. of certain regulations made in accordance with the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, and dated the sixth day of June 1887, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be and may be cited as clause 7 of Part II. of the said regulations:—

7. *Minister may waive necessity for compliance with foregoing provisions in certain cases.*—Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the Minister may, as he shall see fit, waive the necessity for a compliance with any of the provisions of the foregoing part of these regulations in any case in which the applicant shall apply for a renewal of a license previously obtained for the same race, drain, dam, or reservoir, and where the term of such former license shall not have exceeded five years, and provided that such renewed or further license shall be applied for within three calendar months from the date at which the term of the former license shall have expired.

III. That clause number 7 of Part III. of certain regulations made in accordance with the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, and dated the sixth day of June 1887, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be and may be cited as clause 7 of Part III. of the said regulations:—

7. *Minister in certain cases may waive the necessity for compliance with foregoing provisions.*—Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the Minister may, as he shall see fit, waive the necessity for a compliance with any of the provisions of the foregoing clauses of this part of these regulations in any case in which the applicant shall apply for a renewal only for a license previously obtained for the diversion of water in the same quantity and from the same source and offtake, and where the works are upon the same plan of construction, and where the term of such former license shall not have exceeded five years, and provided that such renewal or further license shall be applied for within three calendar months from the date at which the term of the former license shall have expired.

IV. That clause 13 of Part III. of the said Regulations shall be read and construed as if the words "in each case think necessary" were immediately followed by the words "for prescribing."

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by *The Mallee Amending Act 1885* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time, by Order in Council, proclaim any fence described in such Order to be a vermin-proof fence within the meaning of the said Act, and a sufficient fence within the meaning of *The Fences Statute 1874*, for the purposes of the now in part recited Act, and he might also by any such Order in Council proclaim any fence described in any such Order to be a sufficient fence within the meaning of the said Statute throughout Victoria, or within any portion thereof specified in such Order, and he might at any time revoke any such Order: Now therefore, I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Order proclaim the fences hereinafter described to be vermin-proof fences within the meaning of *The Mallee Amending Act 1885*, and sufficient fences within the meaning of *The Fences Statute 1874*, aforesaid, that is to say:—

1. A wire-netting, 36 x 1½, attached to posts or stakes 25 feet apart; the netting 4 inches in ground; 5 inches above netting a barbed wire to be stapled to posts; then, 9 inches above, a plain wire to be run through the posts, the netting and 2 wires being braced together every 4 feet 2 inches.

2. A wire-netting, 36 x 1½, attached to posts or stakes 25 feet apart; netting 4 inches in ground; 6 inches above netting, a plain wire to be bored through posts; wire and the netting to be braced together.

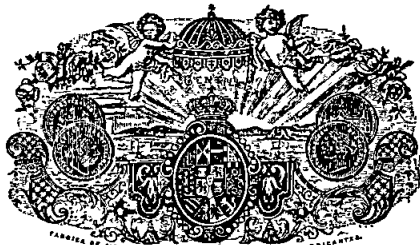
