"THE DENTISTS ACT 1887."—REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of May 1889.

IN accordance with the provisions of, and in exercise of the powers conferred by *The Dentists' Act 1887*, the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the subjoined Regulations for the examination of persons desiring to obtain certificates of fitness to practice dental surgery or dentistry, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

No. 1.

Candidates for examination under the Dentists Act, Victoria, No. 960, shall (except in cases which are hereinafter provided for by Regulation No. V.) produce evidence that they have for the four years during which they have been "engaged continuously in the acquirement of professional knowledge" (sec. 18, clause D of the Act) completed the following educational course:—

- (a) Matriculation at the University of Melbourne or the passage of some examination recognised by the University as equivalent thereto, such matriculation or examination to include passing in Latin, English, arithmetic, algebra, and geometry, as compulsory subjects of the examination.
- (b) Attendance on the following courses of lectures and demonstrations at some period subsequent to such matriculation or examination.
 - (1) A course of lectures on materia medica at the University of Melbourne or at the Melbourne College of Pharmacy, or at any School of Pharmacy recognised by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, as equivalent thereto.
 - (2) Two courses of lectures on anatomy at the University of Melbourne or at any School of Anatomy recognised by the University of Melbourne as equivalent thereto.
 - (3) Two courses of lectures on Physiology at the University of Melbourne or at any School of Physiology recognised by the University of Melbourne as equivalent thereto.
 - (4) Two courses of lectures on Chemistry at the University of Melbourne or at the Melbourne College of Pharmacy or at any School of Pharmacy recognised by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria as equivalent thereto.
 - (5) A course of dissections at any Medical School recognised by the Dental Board of Victoria.
 - (6) A course of clinical lectures and hospital practice during a period of not less than two years at any hospital recognised for the purpose by the Dental Board of Victoria.
 - (7) A course of lectures on medicine and surgery by lecturers appointed for that purpose by the Dental Board of Victoria.
 - (8) Two courses of lectures on Dental Anatomy and Physiology by a lecturer appointed by the Dental Board of Victoria.
 - (9) Two courses of lectures on Dental Surgery and Pathology by a lecturer appointed by the Dental Board of Victoria.
 - (10) Two courses of lectures on Dental Mechanics and Metallurgy by a lecturer appointed by the Dental Board of Victoria.
 - (11) The practice during a period of not less than two years of a dental hospital recognised by the Dental Board of Victoria, and the practice, as an indentured pupil, with a registered dentist for a period of not less than three years.

No. 2.

Candidates for the certificate issued by the Dental Board of Victoria under *The Dentists Act* Victoria, No. 960, shall, subsequent to the completion of the foregoing educational course, present themselves for examination before the Dental Board of Victoria, and shall be examined in all the subjects of their professional studies.

No. 3.

The fee for the examination before the Dental Board shall be £10 10s.

No. 4.

Candidates who have completed the foregoing educational course and passed the foregoing examinations shall be entitled to the certificate of qualification issued by the Dental Board of Victoria.

No. 5.

In the case of all apprentices who have been indentured previous to the gazetting of these regulations, and such other persons as have applied for registration within 18 calendar months since the coming into force of the Act, the Board may at its discretion admit to a modified examination; such modified examination to consist of—

1. Mechanical dentistry—Theory, illustrated by models, &c.
2. General—
 - (a) Elementary Anatomy and Physiology.
 - (b) Elementary Surgery and Pathology.
3. Dental—
 - (a) Elementary Anatomy and Physiology.
 - (b) Elementary Surgery and Pathology.

No. 6.

The fee for such examination shall be £5 5s.

No. 7.

Candidates who have passed the foregoing modified examination shall be entitled to the certificate of registration issued by the Dental Board of Victoria under *The Dentists Act* No. 960.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RODNEY IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATIONS REPEALED AND AMENDED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of May 1889.

WHEREAS by section 63 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, No. 898, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any trust appointed under the said Act for the purposes, among others, following:—

For determining the manner in which the elections of commissioners of any such trust shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat.

Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order—

That clauses 20, 23, 25, 27, 28, 32, and 33 of certain regulations bearing date the 16th day of April 1889, providing for the election of commissioners of the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 18th day of April 1889, shall be and the same are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be and be deemed to be and may be cited as clauses 20, 23, 25, 27, 28, 32, and 33 respectively of the said regulations:—

20. Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.—Chairman of trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.—For the purposes of the first such election, the Minister may appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the chairman of the trust for the time being shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of chairman of the trust should be vacant, the commissioners of the trust may by resolution appoint one of their number to be returning officer until the office of chairman shall again be filled; and the returning officer, whether appointed by the Minister or otherwise, may appoint a deputy or deputies to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy or deputies may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

23. Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners to be elected.—Fifth Schedule.—Notice of poll.—Hours of polling.—If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates the number of candidates exceeds the number of commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full, in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto, and shall also forthwith give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the district stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such commissioners upon the day named in such notice, and at such place or places within or near to the said district as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint, and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Ten o'clock in the forenoon and close at Four o'clock in the afternoon.

25. Polling-booths may be hired.—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place or suitable places for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as polling-booths any rooms which he may deem to be suitable at any places appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such rooms into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.

27. Scrutineers to be appointed.—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in each polling-booth, and the said returning officer, or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters, not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in any polling-booth.

28. Pencils to be provided.—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall provide pencils in the polling-booth or polling-booths for the use of the voters, and also a locked box at each booth, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers, and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers in each booth before the polling begins, and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer, or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

32. What questions may be asked.—At any election of commissioners the returning officer may, if he think fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer shall, put to any person tendering his vote the question or any of the questions following:—

"1. Are you the person whose name appears as (A. B.) in the roll now in force for this trust, being enrolled therein in respect of land in the parish of being (here specify land as described in the roll)?"

"2. Have you already voted at the present election?"

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such questions, or who shall not answer the first of such questions absolutely in the affirmative, and the second of such questions absolutely in the negative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

33. *False answer, polling twice, and personation.*—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to either of the questions aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once, or offer to poll more than once, at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"THE IRRIGATION ACT 1886."

IN the matter of the petition of Albert Miller and others, being the owners of lands situate within the parishes of Korperrimul and Merrimu, in the county of Bourke, in the colony of Victoria, praying for the constitution of an Irrigation and Water Supply District in respect of such lands, within the meaning of the said Act, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust for such district:

Pursuant to Section 18 of the said Act, I hereby declare upon the said petition the matters following, viz.:—

1. That the scheme or plan of the proposed works shall comprise a weir across the Lerderderg River, with a head main channel therefrom for a length of about one mile four chains; portion of such head channel, for a length of about 342 feet, to be tunnelled through the high ground known as Anderson's Bluff. From the bifurcation of this main channel will proceed two distribution channels, one on either bank of the river, that to the right bank to cross the river in a timber flume. Each of these channels will also bifurcate, and from a total length of about fifteen miles of channelling the minor distribution channels to be constructed by the landowners will be supplied.
2. That no portion of the works shall be either National or joint works, but that all shall be Trust works.
3. That the amount of money which it is proposed that the Board of Land and Works shall advance for the purposes of such Trust, by way of loan, shall be Seven thousand five hundred pounds (£7,500) sterling.
4. That the rate of interest to be paid by the Trust upon such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.
5. That no portion of the proposed Trust's supply of water shall be derived from National works.
6. That the source, other than National or joint works, from which the Trust will obtain its supply of water shall be the Lerderderg River, the quantity to be taken therefrom to be at the rate of 250 cubic feet per minute throughout the year; provided that during the period in each year from May to September inclusive the Trust shall at all times permit a volume of not less than 210 cubic feet per minute to pass its intake, and during the period in each year from October to April inclusive the Trust shall at all times permit a volume of 260 cubic feet per minute to pass its intake.
7. The powers of rating to be given to the Trust shall not exceed the sum of Four shillings in the pound upon the annual value of the property rated.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* (48 Vict. No. 812, sec. 73) it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time, by a notice in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim as a street or road or as a township any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such township, or within any city, town, or borough proclaimed before the passing of the said Act should be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road have been proclaimed should be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the tenth day of April One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, the boundaries of the township of Kurraan, in the parish of Waggarandall, were, in pursuance of the said Act, defined and described: And whereas it is expedient to extend the boundaries of the said township: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this notice extend the boundaries of the said township of Kurraan, in the parish of Waggarandall, by the addition thereto of the land comprised within the boundaries as defined by description hereunder, that is to say:—

TOWNSHIP OF KURRAAN EXTENDED.—County of Moira, parish of Waggarandall: Commencing at a point on the north-east side of the road from Benalla to Katamatite where it is intersected by the north boundary of the existing township; bounded thence by the said road bearing N. 27° 34' W. thirty-nine chains thirteen links; thence by lines bearing respectively S. 82° 13' E. seventeen chains seventeen links, N. 62° 35' E. twenty-one chains sixty-eight links, and N. 74° 28' E. four chains seventy-one links; thence by a road bearing S. 19° 31' W. forty-six chains twenty-six links; and thence by the existing township bearing west to the point of commencement.—(K.139A(1) (89.F.17816).

THE Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the management of the Egerton Common.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE EGERTON COMMON.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council, on 1st May 1888, the Managers of the Egerton Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council:—

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.
2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.
3. No bull or entire horse shall be allowed on the common without the written permission of the managers.
4. Sheep shall be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.
5. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October in every year:—
For every horse of the age of 12 months or over, 10s. per annum.
For every head of other large cattle of 12 months or over, 6s. per annum.
For every sheep or goat, 3s. per annum.
For stock under the age of 12 months, half the fees specified.
6. Persons desiring to depasture stock on the common shall, on payment of the prescribed fees deliver them to the herdsman to whom the receipt for such fees shall be produced if required, and

the herdsman shall, with the assistance of the owners or persons in charge of such stock, brand them with the common brand in pitch.

7. In the event of any registered stock being missed from the common, the herdsman shall forthwith give notice thereof to the owners, and should such stock be impounded prior to the issue of such notice, the herdsman shall release such stock at his own expense.

8. The herdsman shall muster the stock at such times and places as the managers shall direct.

9. The managers shall not be responsible for loss of, or injury to, any stock depastured on the common.

10. No person shall remove stock from the common without first applying to the herdsman.

11. Any diseased stock found upon the common shall be removed therefrom by the owner or owners, and should such owner or owners neglect or refuse to remove such stock within 24 hours after receiving written notice from the managers or the herdsman so to do, such owner or owners shall be liable for all expenses incurred by the managers or the herdsman in removing such stock.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK AND GARDEN IN THE PARISH OF WANGOOM, TOWN OF WOODFORD.

WHEREAS James Craig, Job Wines, William Farrer, Alfred Francis Roper, and Walter Lemuel Cardinal, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Public Park and Garden in the parish of Wangoom, town of Woodford, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted thereon.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All rules and regulations heretofore made by the trustees are hereby repealed.
2. All charges must be paid when the orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened up.
3. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery must be made to the trustees, in writing, and, if approved, a certificate of permission will be granted to the applicant, on payment of the proper charges.
4. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the friends or relatives of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.
5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug; but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be dug or constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them.
6. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences must be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the owners.
7. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
8. A plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
9. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.
10. Orders for interment must be given to the secretary, or other person appointed by the trustees, between the hours of Ten a.m. and sunset on the day previous to the interment.
11. In case an interment is to be made in any private vault or grave, the consent (in writing) of the proprietor must be left with the order.
12. The name, age, late place of residence, rank or occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
13. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
14. The usual hours for interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. during the other months of the year.
15. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept by the trustees, and may be inspected at the office of the secretary or sexton.
16. The trustees reserve the right to add to and make any alterations from time to time in these regulations.
17. The fees mentioned and set out in the schedule hereto shall be paid when application is made or orders given.

RULES AND REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE PUBLIC CEMETERY ESTABLISHED AT TRAFALGAR, AND KNOWN AS THE TRAFALGAR GENERAL CEMETERY.

1. The Rules and Regulations numbered one to twenty-two shall be the Rules and Regulations of the Trafalgar General Cemetery, after the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.
2. The Secretary for the time being shall attend to any requests at all reasonable hours.
3. No burial shall under any circumstances be permitted in the cemetery until an application has been made, and name, age, late place of residence, occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased given to the Secretary, an order in the form Schedule A obtained, and the fees paid.
4. The fees mentioned in Schedule B shall be the fees payable under the Act, and shall be paid at the time of making application for any order.
5. A burial right, Schedule C, shall give the holder and his representatives for ever the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
6. A permit, Schedule D, will, on the application of the holder of a burial right, and deposit of a plan, design, or drawing of the proposed erection, or a copy of the proposed inscription or epitaph thereon, be granted to construct a vault or grave, and to erect a monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection thereon if approved by the trustees, and subject to such terms and conditions as they may see fit to impose.
7. Any application for ground exceeding twelve feet in width shall be reserved for the special decision of the trustees.
8. Applicants for graves may get the graves dug themselves subject to the approval of the trustees.
9. The trustees will, if requested, cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees. Every coffin placed therein shall be bricked and cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron securely cemented.
10. Any tomb, monument, or material requiring to be removed on re-opening a grave or vault must be removed and re-erected or replaced by the owner.
11. No person other than the owner or his agent, duly authorized in writing, shall be permitted to interfere in any way whatever with a grave or enclosure unless by special direction of the trustees.
12. Every grave, vault, tombstone, or other erection shall be maintained and kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.
13. Any grave may, on approval of the trustees, be converted into a private one on payment of the fees or balance of fees provided for herein.
14. Every grave shall be six feet deep for an adult's body, and not more than two adults, unless the grave be of greater depth or extra width, shall be interred in each, two infants being considered equal to an adult.
15. No order shall be issued until there has been deposited with the Secretary a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths; and in case of re-interment or removal from another cemetery, verified copies of such certificate, and of the license of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and on payment of the fees.
16. No horses other than those engaged in conveying the corpse and mourning carriages shall be allowed inside the cemetery grounds.
17. No tree or shrub shall be planted in any portion of the cemetery except as approved by the trustees.
18. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.
19. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from sunrise to sunset daily throughout the year.
20. Any workman employed in the cemetery, though not in the employment of the trustees, shall be required to comply with such general directions of the trustees or their Secretary as may be necessary for the control and good order of the cemetery.
21. Sculptors, stonemasons, and others desirous of erecting tombstones, monuments, tablets, or railings, or of constructing vaults, or of placing inscriptions and epitaphs, shall obtain licenses, in the form of Schedule E, from the trustees.
22. All material required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery. Stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the person employed in the work.

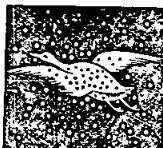
