"THE DENTISTS ACT 1887."-REGULATIONS

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventh day of May 1889.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Administrator of the Government.

Mr. Gillies Mr. Wrixon Mr. Pearson Sir James Lorimer-Mr. Nimmo Mr. Patterson.

IN accordance with the provisions of, and in exercise of the powers conferred by The Dentists' Act 1887, the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the subjoined Regulations for the examination of persons desiring to obtain certificates of fitness to practice dental surgery or dentistry, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

Candidates for examination under the Dentists Act, Victoria, No. 960, shall (except in cases which are hereinafter provided for by Regulation No. V.) produce evidence that they have for the four years during which they have been "engaged continuously in the acquirement of professional knowledge" (sec. 18, clause D of the Act) completed the following educational course:—

in the acquirement of professional knowledge "(sec. 18, clause D) of the Act) completed the following educational course:—

(a) Matriculation at the University of Melbourne or the passage of some examination recognised by the University as equivalent thereto, such matriculation or examination to include passing in Latin, English, arithmetic, algebra, and geometry, as compulsory subjects of the examination.

(b) Attendance on the following courses of lectures and demonstrations at some period subsequent to such matriculation or examination.

(c) Attendance on the following courses of lectures and demonstrations at some period subsequent to such matriculation or examination.

(d) A course of lectures on materia medica at the University of Melbourne or at the Melbourne College of Pharmacy, or at any School of Pharmacy recognised by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, as equivalent thereto.

(e) Two courses of lectures on anatomy at the University of Melbourne or at any School of Physiology recognised by the University of Melbourne as equivalent thereto.

(f) Two courses of lectures on Chemistry at the University of Melbourne or at any School of Physiology recognised by the University of Melbourne or on Chemistry at the University of Melbourne or at the Molbourne College of Pharmacy or at any School of Pharmacy recognised by the Pharmacy Board of Victoria as equivalent thereto.

(g) A course of dissections at any Medical School recognised by the Dental Board of Victoria.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1884 (48 Vict. THE Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the management of the Egerton Common.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE EGERTON COMMON. In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons, made by the Governor in Council, on 1st May 1888, the Managers of the Egerton Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council:—

Regulations.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole, or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the bond fide owner.

3. No bull or entire horse shall be allowed on the common without the written permission of the managers.

4. Sheep shall be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.

5. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the lst day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October in every year:

For every horse of the age of 12 months or over, 10s. per annum.

For every head of other large cattle of 12 months or over, 6s. per annum.

per annum.

For every sheep or goat, 3s. per annum.

For stock under the age of 12 months, half the fees specified.

6. Persons desiring to depasture stock on the common shall, on payment of the prescribed fees deliver them to the herdsman to whom the receipt for such fees shall be produced if required, and

the herdsman shall, with the assistance of the owners or persons in charge of such stock, brand them with the common brand in

7. In the event of any registered stock being missed from the common, the herdsman shall forthwith give notice thereof to the owners, and should such stock be impounded prior to the issue of such notice, the herdsman shall release such stock at his own

such notice, the herdsman shall release such stock at such times and expense.

8. The herdsman shall muster the stock at such times and places as the managers shall direct.

9. The managers shall not be responsible for loss of, or injury to, any stock depastured on the common.

10. No person shall remove stock from the common without first applying to the herdsman.

11. Any diseased stock found upon the common shall be removed therefrom by the owner or owners, and should such owner or owners neglect or refuse to remove such stock within 24 hours after receiving written notice from the managers or the herdsman so to do, such owner or owners shall be liable for all expenses incurred by the managers or the herdsman in removing such stock.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A PUBLIC PARK AND GARDEN IN THE PARISH OF WANGOOM, TOWN OF WOODFORD.

We James Craig, Job Wines, William Farrer, Alfred Francis Roper, and Walter Lemuel Cardinal, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Public Park and Garden in the parish of Wangoom, town of Woodford, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of The Land Act 1884:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to

sunset.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, goats, or nics.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any noises, carrie, por pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except laborers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in

plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of The Land Act 1884, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

- 8. A plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.

- 10. Orders for interment must be given to the secretary, or other person appointed by the trustees, between the hours of Ten s.m. and sunset on the day previous to the interment.
- 11. In case an interment is to be made in any private vault or grave, the consent (in writing) of the proprietor must be left with the order.
- 12. The name, age, late place of residence, rank or occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
- 13. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
- 14. The usual hours for interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. during the other months of the year.
- 15. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept by the trustees, and may be inspected at the office of the secretary or

Rules and Regulations made by the Trusters of the Pub-lic Cemetery established at Trafalgar, and known as the Trafalgar General Cemetery.

1. The Rules and Regulations numbered one to twenty-two shall be the Rules and Regulations of the Trafalgar General Cemetery, after the publication thereof in the Government

2. The Secretary for the time being shall attend to any requests at all reasonable hours.

3. No burial shall under any circumstances be permitted in the cemetery until an application has been made, and name, age, late place of residence, occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased given to the Secretary, an order in the form Schedule A obtained, and the fees paid.

4. The fees mentioned in Schedule B shall be the fees payable under the Act, and shall be paid at the time of making application for any order.

5. A burial right, Schedule C, shall give the holder and his representatives for ever the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monuments cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

6. A permit, Schedule D, will, on the application of the holder of a burial right, and deposit of a plan, design, or drawing of the proposed erection, or a copy of the proposed inscription or epitaph thereon, be granted to construct a vault or grave, and to erect a monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection thereon if approved by the trustees, and subject to such terms and conditions as they may see fit to impose.

7. Any application for ground exceeding twelve feet in width shall be reserved for the special decision of the trustees.

8. Applicants for graves may get the graves dug themselves subject to the approval of the trustees.

a. The trustees will, if requested, cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees. Every coffin placed therein shall be bricked and cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron securely cemented.

10. Any tomb, monument, or material requiring to be removed on re-opening a grave or vault must be removed and re-erected or replaced by the owner.

11. No person other than the owner or his agent, duly authorized in writing, shall be permitted to interfere in any way whatever with a grave or enclosure unless by special direction of the

12. Every grave, vault, tombstone, or other erection shall be maintained and kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

13. Any grave may, on approval of the trustees, be converted to a private one on payment of the fees or balance of fees into a private one provided for herein.

14. Every grave shall be six feet deep for an adult's body, and not more than two adults, unless the grave be of greater depth or extra width, shall be interred in each, two infants being considered equal to an adult.

15. No order shall be issued until there has been deposited with the Secretary a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths; and in case of re-interment or removal from another cemetery, verified copies of such certificate, and of the license of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and on payment of the fees.

16. No horses other than those engaged in conveying the corpse and mourning carriages shall be allowed inside the cemetery grounds.

17. No tree or shrub shall be planted in any portion of the cemetery except as approved by the trustees.

18. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.
19. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from sunrise to sunset daily throughout the year.

20. Any workman employed in the cemetery, though not in the employment of the trustees, shall be required to comply with such general directions of the trustees or their Secretary as may be necessary for the control and good order of the cemetery.

21. Soulptors, stonemasons, and others desirous of erecting tombstones, monuments, tablets, or railings, or of constructing vaults, or of placing inscriptions and epitaphs, shall obtain licenses, in the form of Schedule E, from the trustees.

22. All material required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery. Stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the person employed in the work.
