TERMINATION OF TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP AND COMMERCE BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND SERBIA.

SIR,

With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 22nd of July 1880, I have the honor to acquaint you that I am informed by the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs that the Servian Minister for Foreign Affairs has addressed a note to Her Majesty's Minister at Belgrade announcing that the Servian Government give thereby the notification required by Article XIV. of the Treaty of Friendship and Commerce between Her Majesty and the Prince of Servia, signed at Nisch on the 7th of February 1880, to terminate the said Treaty, which will accordingly expire on the 18th of May 1889.

WHEREAS, by section 6 of *The Electoral (Amending) Act 1888*, it is provided that electoral registrars and deputy electoral registrars shall be respectively paid by salary only, and that such salary may be fixed by regulations from time to time made by the Governor in Council; and that, in fixing such salaries, regard shall be had to the population of the division for which any such registrar or deputy registrar may be acting, but that the amount of the salary of any registrar or deputy registrar shall not be in anywise affected by the number of persons whose names appear upon any list prepared by him: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations (that is to say):—

1. *Population*.—For the purposes of these regulations the population of any division of an electoral province, or of an electoral district, shall be taken to be that which at the time of any payment hereunder is set forth in the (for the time being) latest official return of the Government Statist as the ascertained or estimated population of such division.

2. *Electoral registrars' salaries*.—The annual salaries to be paid to electoral registrars in respect of the divisions (whether of an electoral province or of an electoral district) for which they respectively act shall be as follows:—

5. *Rate of payment where person acts both as registrar for one division and deputy for another*.—If any person hold office as electoral registrar for any division of an electoral province or of an electoral district and also as deputy electoral registrar of any other such division, he shall be paid the full salary attached to such office of electoral registrar and half the salary attached to such office of deputy electoral registrar under these regulations.

6. *Rate of payment where municipal clerk is registrar or deputy.*—If any person hold office as clerk of a municipal district within the meaning of "The Electoral (Amending) Act 1888," and also as electoral registrar or deputy electoral registrar, he shall, in addition to the salary to which he may be entitled under section forty-two of the said Act and the regulations made thereunder, be paid half the salary attached to such office of electoral registrar or deputy electoral registrar.

WHEREAS, by section forty-two of "The Electoral (Amending) Act 1888," it is provided that every clerk of a municipal district (including the city of Melbourne and town of Geelong) shall be entitled to be paid in each year for the performance by him of duties imposed upon him by the said Act and "The Electoral Act 1865" as amended by any other Act or Acts such salary as may be fixed by regulations from time to time made by the Governor in Council, and that in fixing such salary regard shall be had to the population of the municipal district of such clerk, but that such salary shall not be in anywise affected by the number of persons whose names appear upon any list prepared by him: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations (that is to say):—

1. *Meaning of terms municipal district and clerk.*—For the purposes of these regulations the term "municipal district" shall include the city of Melbourne and town of Geelong, and the term "clerk" shall include the town clerk of the city of Melbourne, of the town of Geelong, of every city, town, and borough, and the secretary of every shire.

2. *Population.*—For the purposes of these regulations, the population of any municipal district shall be taken to be that which at the time of any payment hereunder is set forth in the (for the time being) latest official return of the Government Statist as the ascertained or estimated population of such municipal district.

3. *Municipal clerks' salaries.*—The annual salaries to be paid to clerks of municipal districts for preparing, certifying, and transmitting to the registrars of divisions of electoral districts lists of male persons whose names appear upon any city roll, Burgess roll, or voters' roll of the respective municipal districts of such clerks in accordance with the provisions of "The Electoral (Amending) Act 1888" and "The Electoral Act 1865" as amended by any other Act or Acts or any of the same, shall be as follow:—

WHEREAS by section 18 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Waterworks Trust has been by Order in Council duly constituted, make additional Orders in Council not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act, relating to such Waterworks Trust, and that the Governor in Council may in any such Order (among other things)—

- (a) Increase or diminish the extent of the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust; and
- (b) Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Waterworks Trust.

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 17th December 1888, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 21st day of December 1888, page 4053, a Waterworks Trust, known and incorporated as "The Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust," was duly constituted; and the boundaries of the lands comprising the Trust District were in and by clause 4 of the said Order in Council described and limited.

And whereas it is deemed necessary to increase the extent of the district of the said Waterworks Trust as so described and limited.

Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth order—

That clause 4 of the said Order in Council shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be and be deemed to be the boundaries of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority:—

Portion I.—Supply District.—The Borough of Daylesford as defined in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th October 1859, page 2205.

Portion II.—Reservoir and Catchment Area.—Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment A8, parish of Bullarto, county of Talbot; thence in a general northerly direction by west boundary of road to a point in line with the north boundary of the permanent reserve for Water Supply purposes in the parish of Bullarto, as defined in the *Government Gazette* of the 2nd July 1882; thence by line bearing due west two thousand five hundred and eighty-four links; thence by line bearing 130° 34' three thousand nine hundred and eighty-five links; thence by line bearing 40° 34' two thousand two hundred links; thence by line bearing 12° 34' two thousand five hundred and twenty-five links; thence by line bearing 38° 4' four thousand and fifty links; thence by line bearing 4° 4' one thousand six hundred and sixty links; thence by line bearing 332° 4' two thousand eight hundred links; thence by line bearing 25° 0' two thousand seven hundred and sixty-one links; thence by line bearing 89° 9' to its intersection with east boundary of three-chain road from Bullarto Railway Station; thence south-easterly by east boundary of that road to its intersection with the north boundary of Railway reserve; thence easterly, north-easterly, and south-easterly by boundaries of Railway reserve to a point in line with the north boundary of allotment A7; thence by line bearing 268° 33' to the north-west boundary of allotment A7, the north boundary of allotment A7, and a line in continuation thereof to the west boundary of allotment A8; thence northerly and easterly by the west and north boundaries of allotment A8 to the commencing point.

Also those areas of land in the parish of Bullarto, temporarily reserved for Water Supply purposes, and defined in the *Government Gazette* of the 3rd May 1889.

Portion IV.—Race.—A strip of land one chain in width along existing race commencing at the storage reservoir on Kangaroo Creek, in the parish of Bullarto, and thence running in northerly, westerly, southerly, and westerly directions through the parishes of Bullarto, Glenlyon, and Wombat to the east boundary of the Borough of Daylesford.

No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Act, the sum of Five hundred pounds, a shire; and it was also enacted that the Governor in Council might make Orders altering, for the purpose of adjusting, the boundaries of contemporary municipal districts, being shires, without any notice; and it was further enacted that every Order under the provisions of

Part I. of the said Act should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Shire of Berwick, praying that a certain area described in such petition, and comprising the Scoresby riding and part of the Berwick riding of the said shire, be severed therefrom and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the Shire of Ferntree Gully: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make Orders constituting a shire to be named the Shire of Ferntree Gully, the proposed boundaries of which, as also those of the said Shire of Berwick as reduced, are hereunder set forth and described: It is also further ordered that the said new shire of Ferntree Gully be subdivided into three ridings, to be named the North Scoresby riding, the Central Scoresby riding, and the South Scoresby riding, the several boundaries of which are also set forth and described hereunder, that is to say:—

FERNTREE GULLY SHIRE CONSTITUTED AND DEFINED.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883* it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge) when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf upon the application of the council of the municipality in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and of the rules and regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council; And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Marong has made an application, under the Common Seal of the said municipality, in accordance with the said Act and with the rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder, for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal district of the Shire of Marong; And whereas the Administrator of the Government in Council, being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said council of the said municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said council to make the said application, in which notice the routes proposed to be followed were described, and persons objecting to same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the regulations, has been duly published as required by the rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and that no valid objections to the said application have been lodged within the time provided in the said rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, make the Order following, that is to say:—

That the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Marong, shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the municipal district of the Shire of Marong.

Route.—That the route of such tramway shall be as follows:—

Commencing at a point in the centre of High street, at the southern boundary of the city of Sandhurst; thence along said road, through Kangaroo Flat, to a point on same opposite a road leading to Crusee Gully.

Gauge.—That the gauge of such tramway shall be four feet eight and a half inches (4 feet 8½ inches), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications, numbered from one (1) to three (3) inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, Melbourne, and which plans and specifications are endorsed with a memorandum of the Honorable the Minister of Public Works, identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed to be as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

Motive power.—That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be electricity, applied to the propulsion of the cars by storage coils or accumulators and electro-motors.

Maximum speed.—That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be ten (10) miles in the hour.

Time of completion.—That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic throughout its entire length within the period of four (4) years from the date of this Order.

Passenger traffic only.—That such tramway shall be used for passenger traffic only.

Necessary precautions for safety of passengers and public.—That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets or roads upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said council of the said municipality.

Stoppages for taking up and setting down passengers.—That, for the convenience of the public, the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at such points upon the several routes as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic on the streets or roads, or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

Tolls and charges.—That the charges to be made for every passenger on the said tramway may be, but shall not exceed, the following, that is to say, for each passenger:—

From the commencing point, at the southern boundary of the city of Sandhurst, to the terminus, at Crusee road, or *vice versa*, or any lesser distance between, Threepence.

Governor in Council to be sole judge of breach of Order.—That the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order; and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 26 of the regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the said Act, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the regulations in the said schedule.

If upon the report to the Governor in Council by the referee, made under the said clause 26 of the regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred, by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited or shall cease and determine or shall be suspended, as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Council of the said Municipality of the Shire of Marong shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets or roads along which the said routes are laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramways, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

And the Honorable John Nimmo, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Order of the Council of the Shire of Lowan, made on the 1st day of February 1889.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 365 of the *Local Government Act 1874*, the Council of the Shire of Lowan do hereby order that the land hereunder described shall be a public highway from and after the date of publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*, namely:—All that piece of land in the parish of Winiam, county of Lowan, being part of Crown allotment fifty-five, said parish: Commencing at a point on the south-west angle of the said allotment; thence bearing east thirty-nine chains sixty-two links; thence north three chains; thence west thirty-nine chains sixty-two links; thence south three chains to the commencing point; containing about eleven acres three roods and twenty-one perches.

Such public highway is hereby declared to be in lieu of an existing road three chains wide: Commencing at a point ten chains seventy-three links north from the south-west angle of said Crown allotment fifty-five; thence bearing north fifty-eight degrees one minute east forty-six chains seventy links; thence north three chains fifty-four links; thence south fifty-eight degrees one minute west forty-six chains seventy links; thence south three chains fifty-four links to the commencing point; containing about fourteen acres and one perch.

BACCHUS MARSH IRRIGATION AND WATER
SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations, made by the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under the provisions of section 95 of *The Irrigation Act 1880*.

REGULATION No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 95 of *The Irrigation Act 1880*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 1.—REGULATIONS OF PROCEEDINGS AT MEETINGS OF THE BACCHUS MARSH IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST, ETC.

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed as far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. *Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall be signed by the chairman; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Trust at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting, if required.

3. *Order of business at meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Trust.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees, &c.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Opening and dealing with tenders.
- (vii.) Ordinary business.
- (viii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (ix.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (x.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (xi.) Notices of motion.
- (xii.) Reading rough minutes (if required).

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. *Addresses to Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and secretary to the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

5. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated, and given by the intending mover to the secretary before the close of the meeting of the Trust, or delivered to him at his office personally or by post, provided that he receive them at least four days before the meeting at which they are to be proposed; and such secretary

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shall number and enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received, and shall post a copy of the same to each commissioner two (2) clear days before the date of the meeting at which such notices shall be considered.

6. *Petitions.*—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

7. *Motions to be moved in order in motion book.*—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary in the notice of motion book, or they may be postponed by vote of the Trust, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

8. *Motion to be proceeded with by commissioner giving same, except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

9. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

10. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

11. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

12. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

13. *Mover of motion.*—A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

14. *Designation of commissioners.*—The commissioners in meeting of Trust shall designate each other by their official title, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.

15. *Priority of commissioners.*—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

16. *Chairman to rise when addressing Trust.*—The chairman shall rise in addressing the Trust to discuss any question.

17. *Commissioner not to speak a second time on same question.*—No commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

18. *Points of order.*—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final, except when an appeal is made to the Trust immediately upon the chairman giving his decision. On such an appeal no commissioner shall speak more than once, and the question shall be put thus—shall the decision of the chair be maintained.

19. *Commissioners not to digress.*—No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, and all imputations or improper motives and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

20. *Commissioners to apologize for disorderly expressions, &c.*—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

21. *Commissioner called to order to sit down.*—A commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

22. *Commissioner twice offending guilty of an offence.*—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation.

23. *Strangers.*—Any person, not being a commissioner, who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, shall be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation.

24. *Committee of the whole.*—Whenever a majority of the Trust determine, any matter before the Trust may be referred to a committee of the whole for consideration and report to the Trust, and such report may be received and adopted, or otherwise, as the Trust may think fit. When the Trust resolves itself a committee of the whole, the public shall be ordered to withdraw by the chairman, and the doors shall be closed, unless a majority of the committee determine otherwise.

25. *Commissioner not attending order for call.*—Any commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for call of the whole Trust, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation.

26. *Commissioner may demand documents.*—Any commissioner may of right demand the production of any documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion, and he may at any time, during business hours, require the officers of the Trust to produce for his inspection or examination any books or documents belonging to the Trust; but such books or documents shall not be removed from the offices without the permission of the chairman, and then only for short and limited periods.

27. *Voting.*—The Trust shall vote by show of hands; and any commissioner present and not voting, and not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation. Divisions shall be taken upon any question submitted to the vote of the Trust, provided any commissioner demand it before the next business has been proceeded with. When a division is taken, the secretary shall call the names of those commissioners who are present, and enter in his minute book how each vote, whether affirmatively or negatively, and the result shall be declared by the chairman.

28. *Question, how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

29. *Amendments.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

30. *Effect of rejection of original motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

31. *If amendment be negatived, a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second amendment may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved; but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Trust for discussion at a time.

32. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner, with the above exception, shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

33. *Adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

34. *Protests.*—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall, in every case, be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days, at least, before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such commissioner, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

35. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

36. *Explanations.*—While a member is speaking no one shall interrupt, except for the purpose of calling to order, or asking of the chairman leave to explain, or to call the previous question. A commissioner allowed to explain shall only have the right to explain an actual misunderstanding of language, and shall be strictly prohibited from going into debate on the merits of the case.

37. *Resolutions, how revoked or altered.*—No resolution at any meeting of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of the intention to propose such resolution or alteration be given to each of the commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the commissioners present at such subsequent meeting, if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority, if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

38. *Special meetings.*—The Trust may hold special meetings, and the chairman or any three or more of the commissioners may call a special meeting; but no such meeting shall be held unless two clear days' notice thereof at least be given, and every such notice shall specify the time of meeting and the object thereof; and no business shall be transacted at any special meeting except such as is stated in the notice thereof.

39. *Power to suspend officers.*—The Trust may, at any ordinary or special meeting, resolve that a special meeting be called to consider the removal from his office of any officer appointed by the Trust, and may direct that notice of such special meeting be given, and thereupon may suspend such officer from his office pending the holding of such meeting, and may appoint some other person to perform the duties of such office in the meanwhile.

40. *Committees of Trust, and quorum.*—The Trust may from time to time, as they may see fit, appoint occasional or standing committees, and may fix the quorum of every such committee; and every such committee shall appoint one of the commissioners thereof to be chairman of such committee; and the Trust may from time to time continue, alter, or discontinue such committee; and such committee may from time to time remove such chairman; and every such committee shall report to the Trust. The chairman of the Trust shall be *ex officio* member of all committees, and shall preside at all meetings at which he is present.

41. *Meetings, chairman, &c., of committee.*—Every committee so appointed may meet from time to time, and may adjourn from place to place as they may think proper, but no business shall be transacted at any meeting of the committee unless the quorum of members (if any) fixed by the Trust, and if no quorum be fixed, three members be present; and at all meetings of the committee, if the chairman be not present, one of the commissioners present shall be appointed chairman; and all questions shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the commissioners present; and in case of an equal division of votes, the chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a member of the committee.

42. *Seal.*—The seal of the Trust shall be in the custody of the secretary, and shall not be impressed except by direction of the Trust, and in the presence of at least two commissioners.

43. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust; and the secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of the committee.

44. *Meetings of committee.*—The secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any time thereafter by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

45. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

46. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that the contents do not violate any bye-law or any provision hereof.

47. *Commissioners to affix their names.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

48. *No letters, memorials, or accounts to be dealt with.*—No letters, memorials, or accounts shall be dealt with at any meeting of the commissioners unless received at the offices of the Trust, or the office of the chairman, two clear days preceding the day of meeting.

49. *Deputations to signify intention.*—Deputations can only be received by the Trust when they have signified their intention of waiting upon the Trust, and stated their object at least one day beforehand.

50. *Appointment, &c., of officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Trust, except those appointments made at the first meeting of the Trust and before the adoption hereof, shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given, by advertisement, in one or more newspapers circulating in the irrigation district, and such newspapers (if any) as the Trust may determine, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same, unless otherwise determined.

51. *No commissioner, &c., to be surety for officer.*—No commissioner or officer of the Trust, and no assessor or auditor of the Trust, shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Trust, or for any work to be done by the Trust.

52. *Expense of procuring security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, except otherwise determined by the Trust, the expense of procuring such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

53. *Suspension of rules.*—Any one or more of the rules and regulations contained herein may be suspended for a special purpose, on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended, except by a unanimous vote of the Trust.

54. *Penalty.*—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation, he or she shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not exceeding Five pounds.

The foregoing regulation, number 1, was made by the Commissioners of the "Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust," under and by virtue of section 95 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, this eleventh day of May 1889.

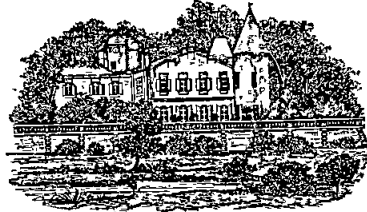

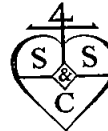

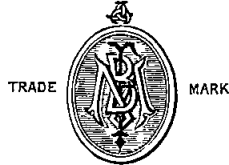
