NOTICE TO WATERMEN, BOATMEN, AND OTHERS.—REGULATIONS FOR THE PREVENTION OF COLLISIONS AT SEA.—NON-EXHIBITION OF LIGHTS.—CAUTION.

COMPLAINTS having been made that watermen, boatmen, and others do not comply with the Regulations requiring the exhibition of a light when under way between sunset and sunrise, the Marine Board of Victoria directs attention to Article 10 of the "Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea," which is as follows:—

"Open fishing-boats and other open boats, when under way, shall not be obliged to carry the side-lights required for other vessels; but every such boat shall, in lieu thereof, have ready at hand a lantern with a green glass on the one side and a red glass on the other side; and on the approach of or to other vessels such lantern shall be exhibited in sufficient time to prevent Collision, so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side nor the red light on the starboard side."

The non-observance of the foregoing Regulation is deemed a misdemeanour, and boatmen and others are cautioned accordingly, and notified that in the event of any case being reported to the Board a prosecution will ensue.

KOROIT WATERWORKS TRUST CONSTITUTED.

WHEREAS by *The Water Conservation Act 1887* it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should state—

(a) The amount of money which the Governor in Council would grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same and paying the cost and expenses of the plans and application for the same; and also the rate of interest which would be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted;

(b) Should proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District;

(c) Should state what are the principal works to be constructed; and

(d) Should contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the now in part recited Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council should think fit.

And it was further enacted by section 23 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 943, that whenever a Waterworks District was either wholly or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof within one municipal district, the Governor in Council might appoint the municipal council for the time being of such municipal district, together with one or more persons not being members of such municipal council, to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District. Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the mayor, councillors, and burgesses of the Borough of Koroit for a loan of Five thousand pounds sterling to carry out certain waterworks for the supply of a waterworks district under the said Act, embracing such portions of the Borough of Koroit and Shire of Belfast as are shown on the plan accompanying the said application, together with the general plan and description therein referred to, deposited in the Department of Victorian Water Supply, Melbourne, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1) The construction of the said waterworks.

(2) The municipal council of the Borough of Koroit for the time being and one other Commissioner to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District.

(3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Five thousand pounds sterling, for the purpose of carrying out approved works and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.

(4) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—Commencing at the north-east angle of original Crown allotment 31, parish of Yarpurk, county of Villiers; thence westerly by the north boundaries of Crown allotment 31, parish of Yangery, and allotment 13, parish of Warrong, to the road forming west boundary of allotment 13, parish of Warrong; thence south-easterly, southerly, and south-easterly by that road to its intersection with the road forming the north-west boundary of the permanent reserve for public purposes round Tower Hill Lake; thence south-westerly by the road forming north-west boundary of permanent reserve round Tower Hill Lake to its intersection with the road forming west boundary of original Crown allotment 21, parish of Koroit; thence by a line in a south-east direction to the Tower Hill Lake; thence northerly, easterly, and southerly by the north and portion of the west boundaries of Tower Hill Lake to the road forming the north boundary of Crown allotment 43, parish of Yangery; thence easterly by that road to its intersection with the road forming west

boundary of the permanent reserve round Tower Hill Lake thence northerly and north-easterly by that last-named road to its intersection with Lake street, in the township of Koroit; thence northerly by Lake street and a line in continuation thereof to the north-east angle of Crown allotment 31, parish of Yarpurk, the commencing point; all of which boundaries are as shown on Order in Council plan, deposited in the office of the Minister of Water Supply, Melbourne.

(5) That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Trust shall consist of gathering wells to collect water from certain springs situate near the edge of Tower Hill Lake; channels of conveyance thence to a receiving cistern of iron or masonry; a service tank on the elevated ridge above the lake; a steam pumping plant to raise water from the cistern to the service basin, and a main pipe and sub-mains for the supply of the town.

(6) That the name of the Trust shall be the Koroit Waterworks Trust.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1874* (38 Vict. No. 506) it was amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council might, from time to time, make Orders, amongst other things, to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; and every such Order should be published in the *Government Gazette*, and should take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition purporting to be signed by more than one-fourth of the ratepayers whose names are for the time being inscribed on the municipal roll of the Shire of Yarrawonga has been presented to the Governor in Council, the substance and prayer of which petition were published in the *Government Gazette* of the eighteenth day of April 1889, and no counter petition received: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order abolish all previous subdivisions of the Shire of Yarrawonga; and, in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth hereby re-subdivide the said Shire of Yarrawonga into five separate ridings, the names and boundaries of which shall be as follow, that is to say:—

EASTERN RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of the shire at the north-west angle of the parish of Yarrawonga; thence south by the west boundaries of the parishes of Yarrawonga and Pelluebla to the south-west angle of the parish last named; thence east by the south boundaries of the parishes of Pelluebla, Boombahoomoonah, and Teecheiba to the eastern boundaries of the shire; and thence following the shire boundary northerly and westerly to the commencing point.

CENTRAL RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of the shire at the north-west angle of the parish of Boosey; thence south by the west boundaries of the parishes of Boosey and Youarang to

the south-west angle of the parish last named; thence east by the south boundaries of the parishes of Youarag and Tharanbega to the south-east angle of the last-named parish; thence north by the east boundaries of the parishes of Tharanbega and Burramine to the shire boundary; and thence westerly by that boundary to the commencing point.

NORTH-WEST RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of the shire at the north-east angle of the parish of Cobram; thence following the shire boundary north-westerly and south to the south-west angle of the parish of Naringaningalook; thence east by the south boundary of that parish and the parish of Katamatite to the south-east angle of the parish last named; and thence north by the east boundaries of the parishes of Katamatite and Cobram to the commencing point.

SOUTH-WEST RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the west boundary of the shire at the north-west angle of the parish of Dunbulbalane; thence following the shire boundary south and east to the south-east angle of the parish of Yabba Yabba; thence north by the east boundaries of Yabba Yabba and Youanmite to the north-east angle of the parish last named; and thence west by the north boundary of that parish and the parish of Dunbulbalane to the commencing point.

SOUTHERN RIDING.

Commencing at a point on the south boundary of the shire at the south-west angle of the parish of Waggarandall; thence following the shire boundary east and north to the north-east angle of the parish of Boweya; thence west by the north boundaries of the parishes of Boweya, Karrabumek, St. James, and Waggarandall to the north-west angle of the parish last named; and thence south by the west boundary of said parish to the commencing point.

Wherever the line described as aforesaid runs beside or along a river, creek, or road, whether specifically described or not, the centre of such river, creek, or road shall be taken to be the boundary line.

The shire boundary above referred to is that described in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th of January 1879, page 170.

PUPIL SURVEYORS.

APPLICATIONS will be received, addressed to the Secretary to the Board of Examiners, up to Monday the 10th June next, from Candidates desirous of being appointed as Pupil Surveyors and Draughtsmen in connection with this department. Two vacancies.

Conditions.

An applicant for appointment must be not more than twenty years or less than sixteen years of age. He will be required to produce a medical certificate to the effect that he is of sound constitution, and not affected with any physical infirmity which would interfere with the proper exercise of his profession. He will also be required to produce satisfactory evidence of having received a good general education, including a competent knowledge of euclid, algebra, and arithmetic, also a specimen of his plan drawing.

Competitive Examination.

Having duly complied with the foregoing requirements, he will undergo a competitive examination on a date of which he will be duly notified—subjects, plane trigonometrical computation, plotting, and plan drawing—when the competitors to whom shall be awarded a sufficient number of points by the Board of Examiners will be recommended for appointment in the order of merit, subject to the regulations of the department as to probation.

Term of Service.

The pupil's service in the department shall be for a term of four years, the first two of which will be served in the office, where he will be engaged in drawing and computing. He will then (if thought necessary) be examined in trigonometry, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, also plotting from field-book and plan drawing. If his progress up to this time is not deemed satisfactory he will be liable to be dispensed with, but, if satisfactory, he will be placed under a departmental surveyor for two years for field practice.

Afterwards he will have the privilege of attending for two months at the Melbourne Observatory, where he will be instructed in such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary for the duties he may be called on to perform as a qualified surveyor.

He will be allowed to present himself at the next ensuing examination for land surveyors (without payment of fees), for the purpose of obtaining the formal certificate of the Board of Examiners as to his qualifications.

Remuneration.

He will receive the following remuneration during the term of his pupilage:—1st year, £52; 2nd year, £58; 3rd year, £66; 4th year, £72.

Subject to Regulations.

During the whole term of his pupilage and service in the department he shall be subject to the Regulations for the Public Service of Victoria dated 31st December 1884, or any subsequent substituted or additional regulations.

Bonds required.

Each successful candidate for appointment as pupil surveyor and draughtsman will be required to find two approved sureties, who shall enter into bonds for £150 each for the faithful performance of his duties.

2. The purchases will be made in Madras, Calcutta, and Bombay, and at the various horse fairs and horse shows in India, by Remount Agents under the orders of the Director, Army Remount Department.

3. The Calcutta Landing and Remount Depot will be open for the reception of horses from the 1st October to the end of the purchasing season, and not from the 15th September. Purchasing to commence as soon after arrival of the shipment as the Remount Agent may direct.

4. Horses and mares of all breeds will be received, but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 6 years, except as regards country-breds, and in the case of Australian horses, 14 hands 3 inches to 16 hands high. It is to be distinctly understood that in regard to Class I. and III. remounts three years old and mares in foal will not be purchased.

5. Greys will not be purchased for horse or field artillery.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Avoca Water Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which was proclaimed an urban district on the 10th of March 1885 for the purpose of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1837*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the power and authorities conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1837*, make the Regulation following:—

1st. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling is hereby made for the year 1889 on the annual shire valuation of the urban districts of East and West Charlton; commencing on the 1st day of January and ending on the 31st day of December 1889.

Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.—To pay the money coming to their hands by virtue of any such power of disposition to the treasurer for the time being of the Presbyterian Church of Victoria, to be by him applied, first in payment of all incidental costs, next in payment to the said Presbyterian Church of Victoria of all deductions heretofore authorized or hereafter to be authorized by the General Assembly of the said Church to be made from such money, and lastly as to the residue for such purposes as the said Assembly has heretofore authorized or may hereafter authorize.

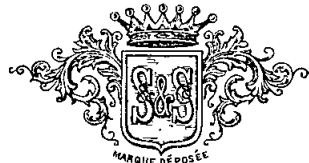
