**APPROPRIATION ACT 1888-89.—DIVISION NO. 52, SUBDIVISION NO. 1.—GRANTS.**

ITEM: "FOR THE PURPOSE OF AIDING THE FUNDS OF FREE LIBRARIES AND COUNTRY MUSEUMS."

IT is recommended for the approval of His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council that sub-paragraph C of paragraph 2, and paragraph 6 of the Regulations made under the provisions of Condition III. of Division No. 25, Subdivision No. 1—Grants—of the Appropriation Act of the financial year 1888-89, for the distribution of the Grant, "For the purpose of aiding the funds of Free Libraries and Country Museums," be cancelled, and that the following be substituted in lieu of such sub-paragraph C and paragraph 6 respectively, viz.:

C. Maintenance shall comprise fuel, light, water, cleaning, and incidental expenses; but not more than ten per centum, (10%) of the sum allotted from the Grant to any Free Library or Country Museum, and not more than twenty per centum (20%) of the total revenue of any such institution, shall be expended on maintenance and salaries without the special permission of the Chief Secretary.

6. In any case where, in previous years, a promise has been made, in writing, by or on the authority of the Chief Secretary, for the time being, that any institution should receive a specific sum in aid of its building fund contingent upon the fulfilment of any condition specified in such promise, or should receive a specific sum in aid of its building fund for one or more years as set forth in such promise, such institution shall, in lieu of receiving a sum in proportion to the amount locally raised, as provided in clause 5 hereof, receive out of the Grant the amount promised as aforesaid; but if such amount shall be found to be less than the institution would be entitled to receive under the provisions of clause 5 hereof, then in such case its share of the Grant shall be computed under the provisions of clause 5; and, in any case where the building belonging to any Free Library or Country Museum, or the furniture and fittings of any such institution, or the books of any Free Library, or the objects contained in any such Museum, shall have been wholly or partially destroyed by fire, then in such case the Chief Secretary may allot to such Free Library or Country Museum, out of the Grant, any sum, not exceeding the amount specified in paragraph 7 hereof, as he may think fit; but in case of any such allotment being made, the Free Library or Country Museum receiving the same shall not be entitled to participate in the Grant under the provisions of paragraph 5 hereof.

(a.) The rank to be regimental rank only, and not any higher rank which an officer may hold in the Victorian Military Forces.

(b.) In any case where an officer is promoted after he has attained the maximum of the lower rank, one year's increment will be granted to him on promotion.

(c.) No increment will be paid to officers appointed or promoted prior to the 1st of July, 1889, until such time as they shall have completed two years' service in their respective ranks.

(d.) Nothing in the foregoing scale shall deprive Lieutenants appointed prior to the 1st of July, 1889, of the right of receiving the pay of £300 per annum as Senior Lieutenant and £275 as Second Lieutenant, should they not have attained these rates of pay under the increments of Table A when the vacancies occur.

Any recruit who fails to pass into the ranks within nine months of the date of his enrolment shall be recommended for discharge, unless in the opinion of his Commanding Officer there are extenuating circumstances.

PART VII.—RESERVES.—SECTION II.—FIRST CLASS MILITIA RESERVE.

Add at the end of the section the following new paragraph—

22. Warrant and non-commissioned officers who join the 1st Class Reserve will do so as gunners, sappers, or privates, but in special cases the Commandant can authorize their retaining their rank. No extra pay will, however, be granted to them.

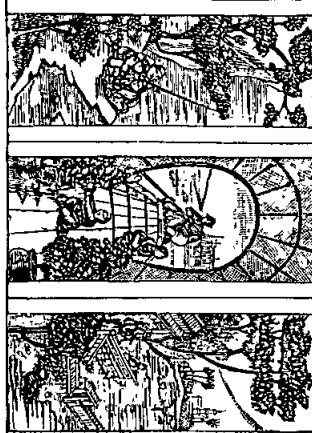
