Any recruit who fails to pass into the ranks within nine months of the date of his enrolment shall be recommended for discharge, unless in the opinion of his Commanding Officer there are extenuating circumstances.

PART VII.—RESERVES.—SECTION II.—FIRST CLASS MILITIA RESERVE.

Add at the end of the section the following new paragraph—

22. Warrant and non-commissioned officers who join the 1st Class Reserve will do so as gunners, sappers, or privates, but in special cases the Commandant can authorize their retaining their rank. No extra pay will, however, be granted to them.



Upon the horseshoe-shaped ribbon are the words "The Invincible Blend"; upon a tablet at the bottom of the compartment are the words "Specially Selected Pure Teas." The fourth compartment contains the representation of a river, and also the device of a diamond, the latter bearing an arched band, upon which are the words "Invincible Blend." Beneath this band is an oblong tablet bearing the words "Pure Teas"; above the band are the words "Specially Selected," and beneath it the words "Possessing Great Strength combined with Delicate Flavor." Said trade-mark is represented in the margin.
