"THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885."

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (49 Vict. WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it is provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order the following addition to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces made on the third day of December, 1888, that is to say:—

PART II., PERMANENT FORCES, SECTION V.—WORKING PAY.

In paragraph 3, after the words "The rate of working pay" add—"for officers shall be five shillings a day, for warrant officers three shillings a day, and" The paragraph, as altered, will therefore read—"The rate of working pay for officers shall be five shillings a day, for warrant officers three shillings a day, and for non-commissioned officers and men one shilling a day; but when the party is employed for less than four hours, only half-rate shall be issued."

And the Honorable Sir James Lorimer, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"THE IRRIGATION ACT 1886."

IN the matter of the Petition of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the shire of Echuca, praying for the constitution of certain lands situate in the parishes of Bonn, Nanneella, Echuca South, and Rochester, in the county of Rodney, and in the parishes of Diggorree, Rochester West, and Ballendella, in the county of Bendigo, in the colony of Victoria, as an Irrigation and Water Supply District within the meaning of the said Act, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust for such district:

Pursuant to Section 18 of the said Act, I hereby declare upon the said petition the matters following, viz.:-

1. That the scheme or plan of the proposed works is for providing a domestic, stock, and irrigation supply of water for an area of forty-four thousand acres of land, situate on the eastern and western sides of the Campaspe River, in the shire of Ichuca. The works shall comprise a weir across the Campaspe River, offtakes, regulators, main and distributary channels, drainage channels, bridges, crossings, and minor works.
2. That the whole of the works shall be Trust works.
3. That the amount which it is proposed that the Board of Land and Works shall advance for the purposes of such Trust works, by way of loan, shall be Forty-one thousand pounds.
4. That the rate of interest to be paid by the Trust upon such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.
5. That the source of supply will be the Campaspe River, and the quantities of water the Trust will be entitled to take therefrom in each year shall be from the first day of July to the thirtieth day of November, both days inclusive, 4,500 cubic feet per minute, provided that not less than 750 cubic feet per minute shall at all times be allowed to flow down the river past the Trust's offtake, and from the first day of December to the thirtieth day of June following, both days inclusive, 750 cubic feet per minute, provided that not less than 150 cubic feet per minute shall at all times be allowed to flow down the river past the Trust's offtake. The foregoing right will be subject to review and amendment whenever works of storage and regulation are constructed on the upper part of the river, so as to enable a continuous and uniform flow to be maintained therein.
6. That the powers of rating to be given to the Trust shall not exceed Four shillings in the pound on the annual value of the property rated.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF CERTAIN RESERVES FOR THE SUPPLY OF GRAVEL IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF DAYLESFORD.

 2. All gravel, stone, sand, earth, grass, or other material procured from the reserves shall be removed therefrom in such a manner as to leave the surface at a uniform level.

 4. No person shall roll or throw stones in the reserves, nor light fires thereon, nor deposit thereon any rubbish or debris of any kind.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after

he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

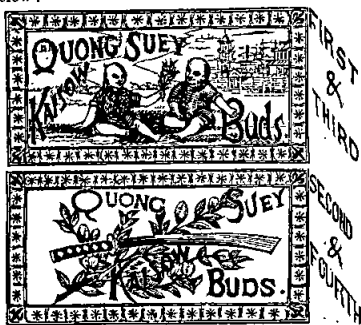
