VICTORIAN MILITARY FORCES.-REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fifteenth day of July, 1889.

WHEREAS by The Discipline Act 1870 it is provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or annead the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order the following addition to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces made on the third day of December, 1888, that is to say:— December, 1888, that is to say :

PART II., PERMANENT FORCES, SECTION V .- WORKING PAY.

In paragraph 3, after the words "The rate of working pay" add—"for officers shall be five shillings a day, for warrant officers three shillings a day, and" The paragraph, as altered, will therefore read—"The rate of working pay for officers shall be five shillings a day, for warrant officers three shillings a day, and for non-commissioned officers and men one shillings a day; but when the party is employed for less than four hours, only half-rate shall be issued."


