1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said mill any female or any male under the age of sixteen for more than fifty-four hours in any one week or more than ten hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That no female or male under the age of sixteen who is paid weekly wages shall be so employed without receiving overtime payment for the extra work she or he is called upon to perform.
3. That no female or male under the age of sixteen shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without her or his consent.
4. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such mill for the information of all concerned.

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government in the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Fisheries Act Act 1873 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, make proclamations to be published in the Government Gazette, prescribing for any species of fish a "close season" or "close seasons" in every year: And whereas by section 4 of The Fisheries Act Amendment Act 1878 any proclamation made under the Fisheries Act 1873 may be revoked by any other proclamation under the said Act or the said first recited Act: Now, therefore, I the Administrator of the Government in Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the proclamation dated the nineteenth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, prescribing the close season for English perch to be the period from the first day of May to the thirty-first day of October inclusive in each year.

The births of 1,348 children, viz., 691 boys and 657 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of June. In the month of May 1,513 births were registered, or 165 more than in the month under review. The births were 354 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 19 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in June numbered 686, viz., 384 of males and 302 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 662, or 96 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in May by 168, but above the average of June during the previous ten years by 196. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by only 31.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.08, and of deaths registered 1.37.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 66.0° on the 2nd, and the lowest was 37.6° on the 27th. The mean temperature of the month (52.5°) was slightly below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (17.6°) took place on the 5th. The least range (4.6°) was on the 13th. The mean daily range was 10.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.246 inches on the 25th, and the lowest was 29.218 inches on the 7th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.758 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on 16 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.78 inches. The average rainfall in June during the previous ten years was 1.90 inches, or .80 inch less than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 4 days during the month.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 37 per cent. to that mortality, as against 34 per cent. in 1888, 33 per cent. in 1887, 30 per cent. in 1886, 31 per cent. in 1885, 32 per cent. in 1884, 28 per cent. in 1883, 35 per cent. in 1882, 32 per cent. in 1881, 36 per cent. in 1880, and 27 per cent. in 1879.

Thirty-eight deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, an upholsterer aged 75, died of anæmia; a gentleman, aged 75, of cerebral hæmorrhage; a gentleman, aged 75, of heart disease; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 76, of hydatids; a gentleman, aged 76, of phthisis; a female, aged 76, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 77, of congestion of the liver; a female, aged 78, of paralysis; a female, aged 79, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 79, of heart

disease; a shipwright, aged 79, of congestion of the kidneys; a labourer, aged 81, of emphysema of the lungs; a professor of gymnastics, aged 82, of cerebral hemorrhage; a farmer, aged 82, of valvular disease of the heart; a blacksmith, aged 83, of dysentery; a labourer, aged 83, of heart disease; a clergyman, and a female, each aged 83, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 83, of gastritis; a female servant, aged 84, of apoplexy; a bricklayer, aged 85, of injuries received from being passed over by a dray; a female, aged 86, of cerebral congestion; a female, aged 76, a female, aged 77, a labourer, aged 79, a female, aged 80, a clergyman, a grocer, and a female, each aged 81, a government pensioner, aged 82, a female, aged 84, a female, aged 85, a gentleman, a gardener, and a female, each aged 87, a gentleman, aged 89, and a domestic servant, aged 99, and a female, said to be 100, of old age.

Thirty-five deaths were set down to external causes during the month, of which 26 resulted from accident, 2 from homicide, and 7 from suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A clerk, aged 17, two seamen, aged 19 and 21 respectively, a baker, aged 30, and a female, aged 59, died of injuries resulting from falls. A carter, aged 34, and a bricklayer, aged 85, were killed by vehicles; a female, aged 32, and an engine-fitter, aged 35, by railway trains; a cigarmaker, aged 35, in a railway accident; and an engineer, aged 23, by machinery. A bootmaker, aged 69, died of injury to the right thigh, and a female, aged 69, of injury to the hip—how caused not being stated in either case; a female, aged 64, of injuries consequent on being knocked down and trampled by a bull; a female, aged 35, of traumatic tetanus; a sawyer, aged 46, of injuries caused by a piece of wood striking him on the chest; a female, aged 37, of injuries resulting from burns. Two boys, aged 11 and 16 respectively, a farmer, aged 32, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 53, a female, aged 24, a sailor, aged 35, and a labourer, aged 49, were drowned—the two last in Hobson's Bay. Two infants, aged 1 month and 6 months respectively, were overlain. The homicidal deaths were those of two newly-born male infants, one of whom was strangled, the other received fatal injury to the spine—a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a sergeant-major, aged 41, who shot himself; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 48, who cut his throat; a station-hand, aged 60, and a female, aged 31, who poisoned themselves—the former with chlorodyne; a tailoress, aged 60, who drowned herself in the River Yarra; a female, aged 37, who placed herself in front of a passing train; and a female (an inmate of the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum), aged 36, who suffocated herself by thrusting a piece of sponge into her throat.

One hundred and fourteen deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—56 in the Melbourne Hospital, 10 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 7 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Lying-in-Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 9 in the Benevolent Asylum, 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, and 3 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 251, of which 133, or 53 per cent., were of males, and 118, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 160 were under one year of age, 47 were between one and two, 21 were between two and three, 14 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 435. Of these, 251, or 58 per cent., were males, and 184, or 42 per cent., were females; 31 were between five and ten, 21 were between ten and fifteen, 20 were between fifteen and twenty, 23 were between twenty and twenty-five, 39 were between twenty-five and thirty, 38 were between thirty and thirty-five, 33 were between thirty-five and forty, 26 were between forty and forty-five, 25 were between forty-five and fifty, 25 were between fifty and fifty-five, 37 were between fifty-five and sixty, 31 were between sixty and sixty-five, 23 were between sixty-five and seventy, 25 were between seventy and seventy-five, 14 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 24 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from whooping-cough, which rose from 12 in April to 14 in May, again rose to 19 in June; but deaths from typhoid fever, fell from 92 in May to 36 in June; and deaths from diphtheria fell from 35 in May to 30 in June. The mortality from typhoid fever in the month under review was the lowest in any month since the beginning of the year, but the mortality from diphtheria was higher than in any month except May. The following is a statement of the deaths from these two complaints in each of the first six months of the present and two previous years:—

**WHEREAS** by *The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1883* it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge) when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf upon the application of the council of the municipality in compliance with the provisions of the said Act, and with the rules and regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council : And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong has made an application, under the Common Seal of the said municipality, in accordance with the said Act and with the rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder, for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal district of the Municipality of the said Shire of Flinders and Kangerong : And whereas the Governor in Council, being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said council of the said municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said council to make the said application, in which notice the routes proposed to be followed were described, and persons objecting to same were called on to lodge their objections within the time required by the regulations, has been duly published as required by the rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and that no objections to the said application have been lodged within the

time provided in the said rules, and being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, make the Order following, that is to say:—

That the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong, shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the municipal district of the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong.

**Routes.**—That the route of such tramway shall be as follow:—Commencing at the Sorrento pier; thence in a south-westerly direction through Crown allotments 3, 4, 5, 6, and 8a of section 2, at Sorrento, in the parish of Nepean; thence across the Portsea-road to a point opposite the Continental Hotel; thence south-westerly along the Back Beach road to the Ocean park, and through that park to a point near the refreshment stall within the said park.

**Gauge.**—That the gauge of such tramway shall be three feet six inches (3' 6"), and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications, numbered from one (1) to three (3) inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are endorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works, identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

**Motive power.**—That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be steam or horses.

**Maximum speed.**—That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be ten (10) miles in the hour.

**Time of completion.**—That the said tramway shall be completed and open for traffic throughout its entire length within the period of eighteen months from the date of this Order.

**Passenger traffic only.**—That such tramway shall be used for passenger traffic only.

**Necessary precautions for safety.**—That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets or roads upon the routes of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said council of the said municipality.

**Stoppages.**—That, for the convenience of the public, the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the roads and streets and at such other points upon the route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic on such roads or streets or the safety of the passengers on the cars.

**Tolls and charges.**—That the charges to be made for every passenger on the said tramway may be, but shall not exceed, the following, that is to say:—

From Sorrento pier to Ocean park, or any lesser distance between—For every adult passenger, Sixpence. For every child under twelve (12) years of age, Threepence. And *vice versa* over said route:

**Land to be acquired.**—That the land to be acquired for the purpose of constructing the said tramway shall not exceed three acres.

**Governor in Council sole judge of breach of Order.**—That the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order; and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided by clause 26 of the regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the said Act, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the regulations in the said schedule.

If upon the report to the Governor in Council by the referee, made under the said clause 26 of the regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred, by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited or shall cease and determine or shall be suspended or shall be otherwise dealt with as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Council of the said Municipality of the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets or roads along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

And the Honorable David Mortimer Davies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## ADVANCE TO THE SHIRE OF YARRAWONGA TO CONSTRUCT A TRAMWAY FROM DOOKIE TO KATAMATITE.

WHEREAS it is provided by Act No. 915 that the sum of £200,000 shall be placed to the credit of an account to be kept in the Treasury, to be called "The Country Tramways Trust Fund," and that any moneys for the time being standing to the credit of such fund may be advanced by way of loan to the councils of shires for the construction of tramways in country districts, in such sums as the Governor in Council may by order to be published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time determine, subject to the conditions in the said Act contained, namely:—That no sum be advanced for any one tramway exceeding on an average Two thousand pounds for every mile of the length thereof; that the sum advanced, with interest at not less than Four per centum per annum, be repayable within a period not exceeding thirty years, and that a per centage not being less than Two pounds per centum upon the loan be repayable every year, and that no such advance be made unless an Order in Council has been made authorizing the construction of the tramway, and unless the Shire Council has either adopted a special order for borrowing, or has made a tramway rate under the provisions of the Act.

And whereas an Order in Council, dated the first day of October, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, was made, authorizing the construction of a tramway from Dookie to Katamatite, within the Shire of Yarrowonga; and whereas the Council of the Shire of Yarrowonga has made a tramway rate in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, sufficient to repay the advance hereinafter ordered, together with interest at Four pounds per centum per annum, within a period not exceeding thirty years; and whereas the Governor in Council has determined, upon the request of the said Council of the said Shire of Yarrowonga, to order an advance to be made to the said Council for the construction of the said tramway, out of the said Country Tramways Trust Fund, of Thirty-four thousand five hundred and twenty-five pounds (£34,225), which sum does not exceed on an average Two thousand pounds for every mile of the length of the said tramway, such moneys, with interest at Four pounds per centum per annum, to be fully repaid within a period of thirty years, by instalments, in manner hereinafter ordered, such instalments being at a rate as required in the Act of not less than Two pounds per centum upon the amount of the said loan in every year; the repayment of such moneys and interest to be secured by a mortgage to the Board of Land and Works by the Council of the said tramway, and of the said tramway rate, in accordance with the Second Schedule of the *Local Government Amendment Act 1883*, and with section eight of the said Act No. 915.

Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government by and with the advice of the Executive Council and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act No. 915, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the order following, that is to say:—

That the sum of Thirty-four thousand two hundred and twenty-five pounds (£34,225)—such sum being an amount not exceeding on an average Two thousand pounds for every mile of the said tramway—be advanced out of the said Country Tramways Trust Fund to the said council of the shire of Yarrowonga, for the construction of the said tramway, authorized by the said Order in Council of the first day of October, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, and doth further order that the repayment of the said loan with interest thereon at Four pounds per centum per annum shall be made in the manner following, that is to say:—The said Council shall repay to the said Board the amount of the said advance of £34,225, with interest at the rate of Four pounds per centum per annum, calculated on the balance from time to time remaining unliquidated by sixty equal half-yearly instalments of such principal monies and interest of Nine hundred and eighty-four pounds eleven shillings and eight pence (£984 11s. 8d.) each payable on the twenty-second day of January and the twenty-second day of July in each succeeding year, the first of such payments to be made on the twenty-second day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety, and doth further order that repayment of such principal monies and interest by the instalments as hereinbefore ordered shall be secured by a mortgage of the said tramway and of the said tramway rate by the said council to the said board in accordance with the Second Schedule of the *Local Government Amendment Act 1883*, and with section eight of the said Act No. 915, and doth further order that so much of the said instalments as consists of interest shall on collection form part of the Consolidated Revenue, and so much of the said instalments as consists of principal shall be placed to the credit of the Country Tramways Trust Fund.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Treasurer for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## PUBLIC HEALTH.—SHIRE OF GLENELG.

By-Law No. 3.

**T**HE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Glenelg, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Public Health Acts 1865-1888," and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following By-law No. 3 of the said Local Board, that is to say:—

1. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the townships of Casterton, Sandford, Merino, and all other townships in the said Shire of Glenelg.

3. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall once at least in every fortnight, or more often if required by the health officer or inspector, cause to be emptied and cleansed every earth-closet or privy on or belonging to such premises.

4. Nightmen licensed by the municipal authorities shall alone be employed for the removal of night-soil from any premises situate within the boundaries of the aforesaid townships of Casterton, Sandford, Merino, and all other townships in the said Shire of Glenelg, and no other person shall remove the same, nor shall it be deposited in any other place than in the manure depôts duly appointed for the said townships for that purpose.

5. No person shall bury any carcase or any dead animal, or place or deposit dust, filth, rubbish, offal, or other refuse or offensive matter in or upon any land, whether enclosed or otherwise, within the said townships, except only at the depôt for the time being provided by the said Local Board, or in or upon such other place as may be set apart from time to time for such purpose. And every carcase and all offensive matter liable to decomposition shall be buried at least two feet below the natural surface of the ground, and in all cases to the satisfaction of the Inspector of Nuisances.

6. Any person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this By-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Local Board has or has not taken advantage of such power.

*Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.*—Moneys obtained from sale, leases, or exchanges to be paid to the bishop to be dealt with for Church of England purposes as shall be directed by the said trustees, but to be subject nevertheless to the payment or deduction therefrom of all costs, charges, and expenses incurred by the trustees, or for which they shall be liable in respect of the trust estate.

**RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF KANIVA.—REGULATIONS.**

WHEREAS by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations heretofore made, for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering in or upon such public parks and reserves: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind clause 1 of the Regulations made by the said Board on the 1st November, 1886, in respect of the reserve for public recreation in the parish of Kaniva, and doth hereby make in lieu of such clause the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for sports or holiday amusements.

2. The scale of fees which may be charged and taken by the committee of management for admission to the reserve on any of the days it may be set apart for sports or holiday amusements shall be as follows:—

For every adult, such a sum as the committee of management shall determine, not exceeding	2s. 6d.
For every horse, such a sum as the committee of management shall determine, not exceeding	2s. 6d.
For every vehicle drawn by one horse, such a sum as the committee of management shall determine, not exceeding	5s.
For every vehicle drawn by two or more horses, such a sum as the committee of management shall determine, not exceeding	7s. 6d.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
