IT is hereby notified for general information that, in accordance with the provisions of section 4 of *The Fisheries Act Amendment Act 1878*, it is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to move His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council, by proclamation appearing in the *Government Gazette*, to vary the proclamation dated the 29th September, 1879, defining the limits of, and what waters shall be deemed to be, and what shall be deemed the mouth or other boundary of the rivers Mitchell, Tambo and Nicholson, and fixing the distance from the mouth of the said rivers within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used as follows, viz.:—

PUBLIC HEALTH.—SHIRE OF TOWONG.

BY-LAW No. 2.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Towong, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Acts 1865-1888* and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within the jurisdiction of the said local board, doth hereby make the following By-law No. 2 of the said Local Board of Health:—

Prevention of Pollution of Water.

1. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed, in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by the public for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of the public, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks or milk or other produce of such dairy.

2. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used or likely to be used by the public for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of the public, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into such water.

3. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way or be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by the public for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within twenty-four hours of notice given by the local board or any of its officers.

4. No person being the owner thereof shall permit geese, ducks, or swine to have access to any water used, or likely to be used by the public for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of the public, or likely to be used in any dairy.

Penalties.

5. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law, shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for any such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than five shillings—to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing by-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the Local Board of Health (being the Municipal Council in and for the Shire) this eleventh day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

PUBLIC HEALTH.—SHIRE OF LOWAN.

BY-LAW No. 3.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Shire of Lowan, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Acts 1865-1888*, and every other power enabling the said local board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board of Health, doth hereby make the following by-law, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Lowan; excepting clause 19, which shall apply to and have operation in all portions of the said shire not included in a proclaimed or surveyed township.

Definitions.

4. In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

“House” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

“Cesspool” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

“Earth-closet” shall include a pan closet of any description.

“Street” shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word “person” shall include a corporation.

5. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the local board may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of any land on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to one cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the local board at the expense of such occupier.

7. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every 24 hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said local board at the expense of such occupier.

8. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide a sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for an application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, workroom, or common lodging-house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half an inch to the foot.

9. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered charcoal for earth, ashes, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

10. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly rivetted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, and provided with a closely-fitted cover of pattern to be approved by the Inspector of Nuisances.

11. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

12. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, or walls, or linings of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., and provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of lime, chloride of lime, or some other efficient deodorizer—sufficient in quantity and quality to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

13. Every occupier and every person having management and control of any premises shall (unless otherwise expressly permitted as hereinafter mentioned) once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for

the reception of night-soil or belonging to such premises. Where such premises are situated in a sparsely populated portion of the shire it shall be sufficient if such earth-closet, privy, or place is emptied once in every fortnight, provided the written permission of the local board or health officer or secretary is obtained at such times and for such periods as the local board may direct.

14. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

15. Where any nightman is duly licensed by the Local Board of Health or the municipal council, such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same; and the said licensee shall be entitled to demand and receive for such service such sum of money for each pan or service as above-named as the local board may from time to time fix or determine.

16. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing, except night-soil or any solution, or mixture of the same, used as provided by *The Public Health Act 1888*, section 18, shall (unless otherwise expressly permitted in accordance with law, of which the proof shall lie upon the person proceeded against) be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the local board from time to time for the final reception of the same.

17. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., unless otherwise permitted by the local board (of which the proof shall lie on such person), or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed as soon as the same is emptied.

18. No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

19. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

Penalties.

20. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Local Board of Health may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such local board has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

WHEREAS by *The Discipline Act 1870* it is provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order the following additions to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces made on the third day of December, 1888, that is to say:—

PART I., SECTION V.—COMMISSIONS AND PROMOTIONS OF OFFICERS.

The following new paragraph is added at the end of the section:—

19. When officers are transferred from one corps to another, or from the reserve to a corps, their relative positions in the corps to which they are transferred will be determined by the Order in Council appointing them. Officers attached to a corps will rank regimentally as junior in their respective ranks.

PART I., SECTION VIII.—DRESS REGULATIONS.

In paragraph 5, sword knots for officers, in the second line, after the word "undress," add—

Officers of Infantry, Mounted Rifles, and Victorian Rangers, will wear a brown leather whistle sword-knot.

And the Honorable Sir James Lorimer, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Schedule LII.—(Chap. XVI. s. 6.)

CONDITIONS OF LICENCE TO CUT, SPLIT, AND TAKE AWAY IRONBARK AND OTHER KINDS OF EUCALYPTUS TIMBER EXCEPT RED GUM, FROM STATE FORESTS AND TIMBER RESERVES.

1. No live tree which at a height of two feet from the ground is less than twenty-four inches in diameter shall be cut down.
2. Not more than three trees shall be felled prior to the cutting and splitting up of such trees.
3. No logs shall be cut for supply of sawmills.
4. No live tree shall be used merely for the purpose of obtaining bark therefrom.
5. No tree shall be felled so as to obstruct any path in use for transport of timber or stores.
6. Within the period of one month from the felling of any tree, the portion thereof not required for slabs, palings, shingles, posts, rails, props, or manufacturing purposes shall be so disposed of by the licensee as not to encumber the ground.
7. This licence is personal, and must be produced by the holder thereof when asked so to do by any bailiff of Crown lands or police constable.
8. This licence is not available for any area over which an exclusive right to cut timber shall have been granted.

Schedule LXIII.—(Chap. XVIII. s. 2.)

CONDITIONS OF LICENCE FOR FELLING IRONBARK AND OTHER KINDS OF EUCALYPTUS TIMBER EXCEPT RED GUM.

1. That payment of fee shall be made by licensee in advance.
2. No timber shall be cut or taken away with the exception of ironbark or other kinds of eucalyptus, not including red gum.
3. Not more than three trees shall be felled before they are cut up.
4. One person only shall cut or take away timber under this licence, and the interest of the State in such timber shall not cease until it has been transported from the place wherein it has been cut to the nearest main road.

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5. This licence shall be liable to revocation at any time by the Board of Land and Works without any liability to satisfy any claims by the said licensee for compensation.

6. This licence is personal, and must be produced by the licensee upon the request of any bailiff of Crown lands or any police constable.

7. This licence is not available for any area over which an exclusive right to cut timber shall have been granted.

8. Timber cut under this licence shall not be removed to a saw-mill except on a licensed jinker or log carriage.

9. No tree shall be felled merely for the purpose of obtaining bark therefrom.

10. No live tree which at a height of two feet from the ground is less than twenty-four inches in diameter shall be cut down.

11. Within the period of one month from the felling of any tree the portion thereof not required for slabs, palings, shingles, posts, rails, props, or manufacturing purposes shall be so disposed of by the licensee as not to encumber the ground.

12. This licence is not available for lands leased under section 32 of *The Land Act 1884*, except by express permission of the Minister of Lands.

And the Honorable John Lamont Dow, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CHETWYND COMMON REGULATIONS.

THE Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the management of the Chetwynd Common.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to commons made by the Governor in Council on the 1st May, 1888, the council of the shire of Glenelg, as managers of the Chetwynd Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one (1) additional head of large cattle or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October, in every year:—For every horse or mare, 12s. per annum; for every head of other large cattle, 8s. per annum; for every head of small cattle, 2s. 8d. per annum; progeny under six months old of stock legally depasturing on the common, free.

3. No bull or entire horse over the age of nine months shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the permission in

writing of the managers, who may refuse to allow thereon any beast or animal which in their opinion would be dangerous to stock on the common.

4. The herdsman shall, with the assistance of the owners, muster during the last week of every quarter all stock on the common, and shall, during the same week, take delivery of stock that may be placed on the common. And the managers shall on payment of the prescribed fees on stock, of which the owners shall have furnished in writing the number and description, give a receipt for the same. And the herdsman shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owners or persons in charge, brand such stock in a conspicuous place with the common brand which shall be of pitch or tar or a mixture of both.

5. All stock on which the prescribed fees shall not be paid within ten (10) days of the beginning of each quarter shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall be liable to be impounded.

6. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bond fide* owner.

7. No stock registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common unless notice of intention to do so be first given to the herdsman who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock removed.

8. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of, or injury to, stock depasturing on the common, save as provided in clause No. 9.

9. The herdsman shall, on any stock straying from the common, or on being removed therefrom without the consent of the owners, notify them within three days thereof; and if the herdsman fail or neglect to give the owners notice in writing within the time specified, the former shall, should the stock be lost, be held responsible for the loss, which shall not exceed five pounds for every horse and three pounds for every head of other large cattle.

10. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common; and as soon as the herdsman shall discover that any stock legally depasturing thereon is infected with any such disease, he shall forthwith give notice thereof in writing to the owner or owners of such stock, and to the managers of the common, and shall at once take steps to remove such stock therefrom, and shall not be responsible for any loss the owner or owners thereof may suffer.

11. Sheep shall be allowed to depasture on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for that purpose.

12. The herdsman shall assist the owners of stock legally depasturing on the common to separate any that they may require to remove.

13. All carcasses found on the common which the owner or owners thereof may refuse or neglect to remove, after receiving twenty-four hours' notice in writing from the managers or the herdsman, may be removed or destroyed by burning or otherwise at the expense of such owner or owners.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty (20) pounds for each offence.

No. 201).

By virtue of the powers conferred by *The Cemeteries Statute 1864* (27 Vict. No. 201), the Council of the Shire of Mornington, as

Trustees of the Frankston Cemetery, on the 15th day of September, 1888, adopted by resolution the following Rules and Regulations for the proper control and management of the Frankston Cemetery, that is to say:—

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. Application for such permission to be made to the trustees at the cemetery. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the Schedule marked B, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the charges in the Schedule A.

3. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of any two of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

4. Orders for interment to be given either to the secretary or at the office of the trustees on the previous day; that six working hours' notice, from Seven a.m. to Six p.m., be given of each interment, or in default thereof an extra fee be charged of Five shillings and Seven shillings and sixpence for a public or private grave respectively, except when the necessity of immediate interment shall be certified by a legally qualified medical practitioner.

5. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five p.m. throughout the year.

7. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and in proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.

8. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered by slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

9. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, must be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the eighth section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in appropriate manner. In erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

10. The plans of all fences to be submitted to the trustees. All wooden fencing must be after a mode to be seen on application.

11. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

12. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

13. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule.

14. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument to be made to the trustees at the cemetery. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the Schedule marked B, will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in Schedule A.

3. The charges to be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion or any other evidence proving to the satisfaction of any two of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

4. Orders for interment to be given either to the sexton, or at the office of the trustees, on the previous day. That the six working hours' notice from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. be given of each interment, or in default thereof an extra fee be charged of Five shillings and Seven shillings and sixpence for a public or private grave respectively, except when the necessity of immediate interment shall be certified by a legally-qualified medical practitioner.

5. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed. Unless otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. the other four months.

7. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.

8. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

9. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet, proposed to be erected to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 8th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

10. The plan of all fences to be submitted to the trustees. All wooden fencing must be after a model to be seen on application.

11. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in the duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

12. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

13. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule.

14. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

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AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS.

MEMORANDUM.—At the early date at which the Agricultural Statistics are collected, it is impossible to obtain a reliable estimate of the produce of Hops, Tobacco, or Vines. The following information has been collected by circulars addressed to the growers by the Government Statist. In most cases these circulars have been responded to, but where no replies have been received, the produce has been estimated according to the average yield of the same crops prevailing in the district.
