"THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT 1885."

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the 29th section of *The Factories and Shops Act 1885* (49 Vict. FACTORY OF MESSRS. ROBERT REID AND CO., HODDLE-STREET,

from the 26th August instant, for a period of three months, upon these express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than thirty females for more than fifty-four hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That none of such females shall be so employed without receiving payment for the extra work they are called upon to perform.
3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

The births of 1,581 children, viz., 779 boys and 802 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of July. In the month of June 1,348 births were registered, or 233 less than in the month under review. The births were 659 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 349 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in July numbered 851, viz., 477 of males and 374 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 730, or 86 per cent. The deaths were more numerous than those in June by 165, and were above the average of July during the previous ten years by 343. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by 172 only.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.61, and of deaths registered 1.94.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 62.1° on the 31st, and the lowest was 31.3° on the 12th. The mean temperature of the month (47.8°) was about the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (23.8°) took place on the 19th, and the least range (6.7°) was on the 29th. The mean daily range was 14.8°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.473 inches on the 13th, and the lowest was 29.656 inches on the 1st. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.158 inches) was a tenth of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on 8 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.64 inches. The average rainfall in July during the previous ten years was 1.43 inches, or slightly less than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 11 days during the month.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 37 per cent. to that mortality, as against 32 per cent. in 1888, 30 per cent. in 1887, 30 per cent. in 1886, 26 per cent. in 1885, 39 per cent. in 1884, 32 per cent. in 1883, 34 per cent. in 1882, 33 per cent. in 1881, 36 per cent. in 1880, and 29 per cent. in 1879.

Forty-six deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a gentleman, aged 75, died of influenza and heart disease; a female, aged 75, of cancer of the breast; a labourer, aged 75, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 75, of injuries, the result of being passed over by a vehicle; a salesman, aged 75, of bronchitis; a smith, aged 76, of syncope; a baker, aged 76, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 77, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 77, of bronchitis; a female, aged 78, of syncope; a carpenter, aged 78, of bronchitis; a female, aged 78, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 79, of cystitis; a farmer, a gentleman, and a female, each aged 79, of heart disease; a labourer and a governess, each aged 79, of pneumonia; a labourer, aged 80, of insanity; a woolclasser, aged 80, of syncope; a labourer, and a female, each aged 80, of bronchitis; a female, aged 80, of cardiac dropsy; a blacksmith, aged 81, of heart disease; a bushman, aged 82, of insanity; a mailer, aged 83, of

consumption; a labourer, aged 83, of bronchitis; a female, aged 84, of asthma; a female, aged 85, of bronchitis; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 85, of pneumonia; a labourer, aged 88, of insanity; a female, aged 88, of heart disease; three females each aged 75, a stonemason, aged 76, a labourer, aged 77, two females, each aged 79, a labourer, a carpenter, a male, of occupation unknown, and a female, each aged 80, a female, aged 83, a female, aged 84, and a female, aged 89, of old age.

Forty-one deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 32 resulted from accident, 3 from homicide, and 6 from suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A porter, aged 23, a bootmaker, aged 38, and a female, aged 51, were killed by trains; a labourer, aged 75, by a vehicle; a new-born male infant by a fall at birth; a clerk, aged 17, a carpenter, aged 20, a seaman and a bricklayer, each aged 24, a female, aged 68, a market gardener and a laundress, each aged 80, by falls; a stonemason, aged 44, by a stone falling on his head. A boy, aged 8, died of fracture of the skull—how caused not stated; a girl, aged 9, and a carpenter, aged 34, of traumatic tetanus; a female infant, aged 6 months, of burns; a cab-driver, aged 60, of an overdose of chloroform, taken to procure sleep. A female servant, aged 20, was drowned in Hobson's Bay; a journalist, aged 54, was drowned in a bath; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 55, and an inspector, aged 63, were found drowned in the River Yarra. A male infant, aged 4 days, was suffocated by turning over in bed; a male infant, aged 1 day, a female infant, aged 2 days, a male infant, aged 2 months, and two female infants, each aged 3 months, were overland; a grocer, aged 25, and a female, aged 67, were suffocated whilst intoxicated; a new-born female infant died of pressure during labour; and a female infant, aged 9 days, of umbilical hemorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of a male and a female infant, who were suffocated, and a female, aged 38, who died of criminal abortion—a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a female, aged 57, and a female, aged 58, who cut their throats; a clerk, aged 22, who poisoned himself with muriatic acid; a draughtsman, aged 45, who poisoned himself with "Rough on rats"; a female, aged 50, who poisoned herself with acetic acid; and a carpenter, aged 56, who hanged himself.

One hundred and seventy-seven deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—62 in the Melbourne Hospital, 27 in the Alfred Hospital, 8 in the Children's Hospital, 8 in the Lying-in-Hospital, 9 in the Immigrants' Home, 23 in the Benevolent Asylum, 11 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 13 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Austin Hospital, 5 in the Melbourne Gaol, 4 in the Pentridge Stockade, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, and 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 313, of which 173, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 140, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 207 were under one year of age, 49 were between one and two, 17 were between two and three, 21 were between three and four, and 19 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 538. Of these, 304, or 57 per cent., were males, and 234, or 43 per cent., were females; 48 were between five and ten, 12 were between ten and fifteen, 23 were between fifteen and twenty, 33 were between twenty and twenty-five, 46 were between twenty-five and thirty, 35 were between thirty and thirty-five, 32 were between thirty-five and forty, 38 were between forty and forty-five, 36 were between forty-five and fifty, 32 were between fifty and fifty-five, 37 were between fifty-five and sixty, 50 were between sixty and sixty-five, 34 were between sixty-five and seventy, 36 were between seventy and seventy-five, 25 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 21 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from typhoid fever, which attained their maximum in April, were fewer in July than they had been in any month since the beginning of the year. Deaths from diphtheria, on the other hand, continue to increase month by month, and, besides the deaths from true diphtheria, 16 deaths in July and 4 in the previous month were set down to diphtheritic croup—classified as a disease of the respiratory system. Other diseases of the same system were also very fatal in July; no fewer than 128 deaths having been set down to bronchitis and pneumonia, as against 74 in June. Phthisis, moreover, classed as a constitutional disease, caused 98 deaths in the month under review, as against 65 in the previous month.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each of the first seven months of the present and the two previous years:—

WHEREAS by *The Irrigation Act 1886* it is provided that any Municipal Council, or Waterworks Trust, or Irrigation Trust, or any two or more together of such Councils or Trusts, or the majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or the majority in number of the owners of land within any proposed district, may petition the Governor in Council to constitute such district an Irrigation and Water Supply District,

and to appoint and create a Trust therein. And it is further provided by the said Act that, before any district or Trust can be constituted or appointed under the said Act upon a petition from any Municipal Council or Waterworks Trust, or from any two or more together of any such Councils or Trusts, or from a majority in number of ratepayers in any proposed district, or upon a petition from the majority of the owners of land within any proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in the proposed district, that a petition from owners of land, being an absolute majority of the owners of land within the proposed district, such majority being owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, shall be presented to the Governor in Council praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first petition as set out in the declaration of the Minister, published under the said Act, may be adopted in part or in whole. And it is further enacted that, after compliance with the provisions in the said Act, the Governor in Council may approve of the scheme proposed, either with or without any alterations, additions, or restrictions, as he may think fit, or he may disapprove of the same; and if he approve of the same, either with or without alterations, he shall make an Order in Council accordingly. And it is further enacted that, if the Governor in Council approve of such proposed scheme, with or without alterations, or additions, or restrictions, he may, by Order in Council, constitute the proposed district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and appoint and create an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust to construct, maintain, and continue the works described in the Order.

And whereas the majority in number of the owners of certain land in the parishes of Kerang, Gannawarra, and Mucorna, in the county of Gumbower, in the colony of Victoria, and within the boundaries of a proposed district (shown upon the plan accompanying their petition), being the owners of at least half the land within such proposed district, have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, petitioned the Governor in Council to constitute the proposed district (as shown upon the plan accompanying their petition) an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein for carrying out the scheme or plan of works proposed in the said petition: And whereas all the provisions of the Act necessary to precede the declaration in writing of the Minister upon the said petition having been complied with, the Minister duly published his declaration in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth day of November, 1888, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act: And whereas, after due observance of the steps necessary under the said Act to precede such a petition, and on this twenty-sixth day of August, 1889, a petition of an absolute majority of the owners of land in the district proposed to be constituted, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, hath been presented to the Administrator of the Government in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first-named petition, as set out in the said declaration in writing of the Minister, might be adopted: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of, and in exercise of the powers conferred by, *The Irrigation Act 1886* aforesaid, doth declare, order, and direct:—

1. That the said proposed district shall be and the same is hereby constituted as, from the date of this Order, an "Irrigation and Water Supply District" under the said Act; and an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is hereby appointed and created to construct, maintain, and continue the works in this Order described, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, and of the said Act.

2. That the limits and boundaries of the district within which such Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall have authority, and which district shall henceforth be an Irrigation and Water Supply District, shall be those contained within the limits and boundaries of the area of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District hereby constituted, as such limits and boundaries are set out in the Schedule hereto.

3. That the name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District shall be the "Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply District," and the corporate name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be the "Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust."

4. That the scheme of the said Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be the construction of a supply channel to Kow Swamp, with head works, regulating works at the outlet of the Kow Swamp storage basin, a weir on the Pyramid Creek, a channel thence to the River Loddon, the improvement of the Box and Pyramid creeks, together with minor collateral works, channels for the conveyance and distribution of the water in the Trust district, and all minor works connected therewith. The Kow Swamp storage, with supply channels thereto and channels of conveyance therefrom and collateral works, shall be National works; the weirs across the Calivil and Pyramid creeks shall be joint works; and all other works shall be Trust works.

5. That the source from which the said Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is to obtain a supply of water shall be the River Murray, *via* Kow Swamp. The quantity of water that the said Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be entitled and required to take from the said River Murray, *via* Kow Swamp, shall be four hundred and twenty (420) cubic feet per minute from the first day of July to the thirty-first day of October in each year, and nine hundred (900) cubic feet per minute from the first day of November to the thirtieth day of April in each year.

6. That the rate of payment to be made by the said Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust for the water supplied shall be a proportion of the total charges for interest, maintenance, and management of the National works hereinbefore mentioned, equivalent to the proportion of the water from such works delivered from the said National works to the said Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.

. That the total amount of money proposed to be expended by the said Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust on Trust works and joint works is Seventeen thousand eight hundred and twenty-five pounds (£17,825) sterling.

8. That the amount of money proposed to be advanced by the Board of Land and Works to the Trust, by way of loan, is Seventeen thousand eight hundred and twenty-five pounds (£17,825) sterling; that the rate of interest to be paid upon such loan is Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, being one-half per cent. higher than the rate paid by the Government upon the public loan out of which such moneys are to be advanced; the rate of such interest to be subject to reduction in accordance with section one hundred and forty-six of the Act, in event of the interest paid by the Government upon such public loan being reduced.

9. That the number of persons to be elected as Commissioners of the Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be six, and the period for which such Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years.

10. That the amount of moneys which may be borrowed by the said Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall not at any time, together with any balances due from the Trust to the Board, or upon any Trust loan, exceed the sum of Seventeen thousand eight hundred and twenty-five pounds (£17,825) sterling; and no rate made by the Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall exceed the sum of Five shillings in the £ upon the annual value of the property rated within the Trust district.

11. That the maximum amount which may be paid out of a loan raised by the said Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in defraying the preliminary costs and expenses of application for this Order, shall be One hundred pounds (£100) sterling.

WHEREAS by *The Irrigation Act 1886* it is provided that any Municipal Council, or Waterworks Trust, or Irrigation Trust, or any two or more together of such Councils or Trusts, or the majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or the majority in number of the owners of land within any proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land of the proposed district, may petition the Governor in Council to constitute such district an Irrigation and

Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein. And it is further provided by the said Act that, before any district or Trust can be constituted or appointed under the said Act upon a petition from any Municipal Council or Waterworks Trust, or from any two or more together of any such Councils or Trusts, or from a majority in number of the ratepayers in any proposed district, or upon a petition from the majority of the owners of land within any proposed district, a petition from owners of land, being an absolute majority of the owners of land within the proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, shall be presented to the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first petition, as set forth in the declaration of the Minister, published under the said Act, may be adopted in part or in whole. And it is further enacted that, after compliance with the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may approve of the scheme proposed, either with or without any alterations, or additions, or restrictions, as he may think fit, or he may disapprove of the same; and if he approve of the same, either with or without alterations, he shall make an Order in Council accordingly.

And whereas the majority in number of the owners of certain lands situate within the parishes of Kerang, Macorna, and Gansawarra, in the county of Gunbower, in the colony of Victoria, and within the boundaries of a proposed district (shown upon the plan accompanying their petition), being the owners of at least half the land within such proposed district, have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, petitioned the Governor in Council to constitute the proposed district (as shown upon the plan accompanying their petition) an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein for carrying out the scheme or plan of works proposed in the said petition.

And whereas all the provisions of the Act necessary to precede the declaration, in writing, of the Minister of Water Supply upon the said petition having been complied with, the said Minister duly published his declaration in the *Government Gazette* on the 30th day of November, 1888, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

And whereas after due observance of the steps necessary under the said Act to precede such a petition, on this 26th day of August, 1889, a petition of an absolute majority of the owners of the land in the district so proposed to be constituted, such majority being owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, hath been presented to His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such first-named petition, as set out in the said declaration, in writing, of the Minister, might be adopted.

And whereas the Administrator of the Government in Council, having taken all the circumstances into consideration, and having ascertained and being satisfied that there has been a compliance with all the provisions of the said Act necessary to be observed before the approval of the scheme of the petition for the constitution of the proposed district as an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust therein, has determined to approve of the scheme proposed by such petition.

Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of, and in exercise of the powers conferred, by *The Irrigation Act 1886* aforesaid, doth hereby approve of the scheme of the said recited petition for the constitution of the proposed district as an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust therein, as such scheme is set out in the schedule hereto, in which also are set out the boundaries and area of the proposed district.

KERANG EAST IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS.

WHEREAS by section 63 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, No. 598, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any Irrigation and Water Supply Trust appointed and created under the said Act for the purposes, among others, following:—

- (a) For determining the period for which the commissioners of any trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office;
- (b) For determining the manner in which elections of any such commissioners shall be held, and the manner of voting thereat;
- (c) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners shall be filled up; and
- (d) For determining questions as to the due election of any such commissioner.

Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth, for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Irrigation and Water Supply Trust duly appointed and created under the said Act and known as the Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, make the regulations following, viz.:

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In these regulations, "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the trust" or "the said trust" shall mean the Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust; and "the district," "the said district," or "the irrigation district" shall mean the lands as defined by the Order in Council appointing and creating the said trust wherein the trust shall have authority.

2. *Period for which commissioners shall hold office.*—Subject to the provisions in reference to the first election of commissioners hereinafter contained, for securing the annual retirement of two commissioners, the period during which the commissioners of the said trust shall hold office shall be three years.

3. *Annual retirement of commissioners.*—Two commissioners shall retire annually, but the retiring commissioners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be eligible for re-election.

4. *Term of office of persons elected commissioners at first election.*—At the first election of commissioners, two of the persons elected commissioners shall hold office as such commissioners for the term of three years, two others of such persons shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two persons elected as such commissioners shall hold office for the term of one year; and the particular term for which each such person so elected a commissioner shall hold office shall be determined in manner following (that is to say):—

(a) *How term of office is ascertained when no poll taken.*—If the first election is made without a poll, as in the case in these regulations provided, then the particular term for which each candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office shall immediately upon such election be publicly determined by lot by the returning officer in such manner as to him may seem fit; and the returning officer shall thereupon immediately and publicly announce the term for which each individual candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

(b) *How term of office ascertained when poll taken.*—If at the first election a poll shall be held as in these regulations provided, then of the six candidates elected as commissioners the two candidates who shall have received the highest number of votes shall hold office as commissioners for the term of three years, and the two candidates who shall have received the next highest number of votes shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two candidates who shall have been elected shall hold office for the term of one year; and if two or more than two candidates elected shall have obtained the same number of votes, then the returning officer shall determine by lot (as herein before provided in the case of the first election if decided without ballot) the term or terms of three, two, or one year or years during which such candidates shall respectively hold office. But so that no candidate elected shall hold office for a shorter time than the term during which any other candidate who shall have obtained a less number of votes shall hold office. And the returning officer shall publicly declare the respective terms during which the several candidates shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

5. *Extraordinary vacancies, how filled, and term of office.*—Should any vacancy in the office of commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy; and the provisions contained in these regulations as to the nomination of candidates, the manner in which elections shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat shall apply to any election in respect of such vacancy; and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

6. *Date of first election of commissioners.—Date of ordinary annual election.*—The first election of commissioners of the said trust shall be held on the 12th day of October 1889, and the ordinary annual election shall be held on the 12th day of October in each succeeding year. Provided that whenever such date may fall upon a Sunday, or upon any day set apart as a public holiday, such election shall be held upon the day next following.

7. *Voters' list to be prepared.*—For the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the said trust, a voters' list shall be prepared by the persons upon whose petition the said trust has been appointed and created, and the said voters' list shall be forwarded to the Minister.

8. *Form of voters' list.—First Schedule.*—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname the christian name or names, surname, and address, so far as these may be known, of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of *The Irrigation Act 1886* or under the provisions of any Act amending the said *Irrigation Act 1886*, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such person, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such person is entitled.

9. *Voting in respect of lands jointly owned or jointly leased.*—In the case of joint owners of land, or in the case of joint lessees of land, the name of any one of such owners or lessees (as the case may be) shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned or leased solely by such one owner or lessee, and the owner or lessee so placed upon the said list or lists shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners or lessees jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners or lessees is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners or lessees in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners or lessees shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

10. *Copy of voters' list to be available for inspection.—Second Schedule.—Objections to list to be in writing, and forwarded to Minister.*—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, in some convenient place within or near to the district of the trust for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Second Schedule hereto, setting forth the times and place at which such voters' list may be so inspected, shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded, in writing, to the Minister within the time mentioned in the said notice.

11. *Grounds of objection to be stated.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the Minister within eight days after the first day of the publication of such notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

12. *Minister to revise and certify lists.*—The Minister shall revise the said list, and consider all objections thereto, and make such alterations and amendments therein as to him may seem just, and shall certify the list under his hand as correct; and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

13. *Certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the trust, but shall also be available for any election in respect of any extraordinary vacancy occurring within twelve months next after the date of the said first election.

14. *Voters' list to be prepared yearly.*—Before the first day of September in each year, the officers of the trust shall prepare a voters' list in the form of the First Schedule hereto; and such list shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and in alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of *The Irrigation Act 1886* or under the provisions of any Act amending the said *Irrigation Act 1886*, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty, the land of each such person, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such person is entitled.

15. *Voting in respect of lands jointly owned or jointly leased.*—In the case of joint owners of land, or in the case of joint lessees of land, the name of any one of such owners or lessees (as the case may be) shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned or leased solely by such one owner or lessee, and the owner or lessee so placed upon the said list shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners or lessees jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners or lessees is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners or lessees in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if

the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list or lists shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners or lessees shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

16. *Copy of list to be available for inspection.*—*Third Schedule.*—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day time, at some convenient place within or near to the district of the trust for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Third Schedule hereto shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district; and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded, in writing, to the chairman of the trust within the time mentioned in the said notice.

17. *Grounds of objections to list to be forwarded, in writing, to the chairman of trust.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded, in writing, to the chairman of the trust within the time mentioned in the said notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

18. *Special meeting of trust to be held to revise list.*—*List to be certified.*—In the month of September in each year a special meeting of the trust shall be held for the purpose of revising the said list; and all objections which may have been forwarded to the chairman under the preceding clause shall be considered by the commissioners then present; and the chairman may make such alterations and amendments in the said list as the commissioners or a majority of the commissioners present may determine to be just and necessary, or such as by these regulations are required to be made; and the list, when so revised, altered, and amended, shall be certified as correct under the hand of the chairman; and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

19. *Revised and certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) of trust commissioners to be held within one year from the twelfth day of October then next, the said day inclusive.

20. *Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.*—*Chairman of trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.*—For the purposes of the first such election, the Minister may appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the chairman of the trust for the time being shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of chairman of the trust should be vacant, the commissioners of the trust may, by resolution, appoint one of their number to be returning officer until the office of chairman shall again be filled; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election; and such deputy may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

21. *Notice of election.*—*Nomination of candidates.*—*Fourth Schedule.*—Fourteen clear days before any election of commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the said district, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said district to be named in such notice in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination-day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination-paper in the form of the Fourth Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said schedule; and such nomination-paper shall be signed by not less than three persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate in token of his assent to being so named; and such candidate or some person on his behalf shall, at the time when such nomination-paper is delivered to the returning officer, pay into the hands of such returning officer the sum of Ten pounds (£10), to be dealt with as by law provided. And no person who shall not have been so nominated, and by whom or on whose behalf such payment shall not have been so made, shall, within the subsequent provisions of these regulations, be deemed to be a candidate at any election of commissioners.

22. *Where number of candidates does not exceed number of commissioners to be elected.*—If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nominations of candidates, the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

23. *Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners to be elected.*—*Fifth Schedule.*—*Notice of poll.*—*Hours of polling.*—If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates the number of candidates exceed the number of commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full, in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto, and shall also forthwith give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the district stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place within the said area as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint; and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Ten o'clock in the forenoon and close at Four o'clock in the afternoon.

24. *Retirement of candidates before polling-day.*—If at any election after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid any candidate for such election and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer not later than four clear days before the day of polling a notice, in the form of the Sixth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires, and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the district a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election, shall on the day appointed for the election declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and if such papers are already printed shall erase such name therefrom, and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

25. *Polling-booth may be hired.*—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling-booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.

26. *Returning officer to preside at polling-booth.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall preside at the polling-booth for taking the poll.

27. *Scrutineers may be appointed.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling-booth, and the said returning officer, or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters, not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling-booth.

28. *Pencils to be provided.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall provide pencils in the polling-booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers; and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins, and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer, or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

29. *Mode of voting—Where voter is illiterate.*—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being in the form of Schedule five hereto, and initialed by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer, or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate, and after such name or names have been so struck out, the ballot-paper or ballot-papers, as the case may be, shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling-booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time, and no person, having once demanded and received any such ballot paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers or exercise any further right of voting.

30. *Ballot-papers to be numbered.*—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check-off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

31. *Informal ballot-papers.*—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

32. *What question may be asked.*—At any election of commissioners, the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

“Are you the person whose name appears as (A. B.) in the roll now in force for this trust, being enrolled therein in respect of land in the parish of _____, being (here specify land as described in the roll)?”

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

33. *False answer, polling twice, and personation.*—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

34. *Result of polling, how ascertained.*—*Returning officer to have casting vote.*—Immediately upon the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection

of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll publicly declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected commissioners of the trust; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote.

35. *Ballot-papers, how disposed of.*—The returning officer shall, in the case of the said first election of commissioners, forthwith after the declaration of the poll endorse with a description of the contents thereof and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Minister, who shall, as soon as may be after the first meeting of trust commissioners shall have been held, forward such sealed packet to the secretary of the trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him cause to be destroyed in the presence of three commissioners of the trust; but in all subsequent elections the parcel of ballot-papers so sealed, endorsed, and signed shall be delivered by the returning officer to the said secretary, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months after such delivery, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three of the commissioners of the trust.

36. *Minister to determine questions arising upon first election.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question, in writing, to the Minister, who shall decide the same; and such decision shall be final and binding.

37. *Questions arising upon subsequent elections to be determined by trust.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at any subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary), such question shall be determined by the commissioners of the trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a commissioner until such question shall have been so determined; and the majority of the commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

38. *Appeal to Minister from determination of trust.*—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the commissioners shall have determined the question; and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just; and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

39. *Failure to elect deemed to create extraordinary vacancies.*—If at any election of commissioners no vacancies, or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election, are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies, and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the commissioners eventually elected to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

40. *Expenses of election to be paid by trust.*—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connexion with any election shall be defrayed by the trust.

41. *Penalty for breach of regulations.*—These regulations shall also be deemed to be regulations under section 250 of *The Irrigation Act 1856*, and any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.

42. *Interpretation.*—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

WHEREAS by section 18 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time, after any Trust has by Order in Council been duly constituted, make additional Orders relating to such Trust not inconsistent with the provisions of the now in part recited Act, and that the Governor in Council may in such additional Orders in Council (among other things) increase or diminish the extent of the Waterworks district of such Waterworks Trust: And whereas by section 20 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946, it is enacted that when the Waterworks district of any Waterworks Trust has been or is about to be increased or diminished, the Governor in Council may make such Order as appears just for (among other things) determining what persons shall cease or continue to be Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust thereof, and for how long the same shall so continue, and for determining all other matters or things which it appears desirable or proper so to determine.

WHEREAS by section 250 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, No. 898, it is enacted that the Governor in Council shall have power from time to time, on the application of any Trust or any other body or persons authorized by the now in part recited Act, to construct waterworks, and after any such Trust, body, or persons has or have, by Order in Council, been duly appointed or authorized to make additional orders relating to such Trust, body, or persons not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act; but that no such additional order shall in any manner whatever lessen or diminish any liability or obligation previously incurred or imposed upon any such Trust, or body, or persons from any such liability or obligation, and that the Governor in Council may in such additional Orders in Council (among other things)—

Increase or diminish or otherwise alter, in accordance with and not inconsistent with the previous provisions of this Act, the extent of the district of such Trust, body, or persons; and

Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Trust, body, or persons.

And whereas by certain Orders in Council bearing date respectively the third day of September, 1888, the Governor in Council duly constituted and appointed a certain Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, known as the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust (hereinafter called "the said Trust"), and in and by the said Orders appointed and defined the limits and boundaries of the Irrigation and Water Supply district (hereinafter called "the district") of the said Trust.

And whereas the said Trust has applied to have the extent of the said district increased as hereinafter specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order as follows:—

1. That the district of the said Trust shall, as from the date hereof be increased by the addition to such district of all the lands comprised within the Waterworks district of the Shire of Wimmera Waterworks Trust, and of all that portion of the Waterworks district of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust now within the Shire of Dimboola and to the west of the Yarriambiack Creek, excluding the site of the Longerenong Weir and Regulator and the portion of the reserve within two chains thereof.

2. That the district of the said Trust shall, as from the date hereof, be deemed to include the lands comprised within the boundaries following, that is to say:—

Bounded by a line commencing at the most northern bend of the River Glenelg, county boundary of Lowan; thence south-westerly by said river to a point opposite the north-east angle of the parish of Daahl; thence by the north boundary of that parish to the east boundary of the parish of Toolondo; thence north by the east boundary of that parish and west by the north boundaries of said parish and the parish of Toolongrook to the east boundary of the parish of Turandarey; thence north by the east and west by the north boundaries of the said parish to the north-west angle thereof; thence north by the west and east by the north boundaries of the parish of Kalingar to the west boundary of the parish of Toocan; thence north by part of the west boundary of the parish of Toocan to its north-west angle; thence north-easterly by part of the boundary of St. Mary's Lake Run to the Wyn Wyn Run, and thence by the western and northern boundaries of Wyn Wyn Run to the Wimmera River; thence in a general northerly direction by the Wimmera River to its intersection with the high-water contour line of Lake Hindmarsh; thence further northerly by that contour line along eastern side of Lake Hindmarsh to its intersection with the northern boundary of the county of Borung; thence easterly along northern boundary of the county of Borung to its intersection with the Yarriambiack Creek; thence southerly up the Yarriambiack Creek to the Wimmera River; thence continuing southerly up that river to a point east of the northern boundary of the parish of Ledcourt; thence west by that boundary to the north-west angle of allotment 23; thence south by a one-chain road to its intersection with the two-chain road at the south angle of allotment 191; thence south-westerly by said road to the north-west angle of allotment 212; thence south-easterly by the south-west boundary of the said parish of Ledcourt to a point bearing north-east magnetic from Briggs' Bluff, Grampian Range; thence in a direct line to said bluff, and south along the watershed of the Grampians to the head of the Glenelg River; thence north-westerly by the Glenelg River to the commencing point; excluding the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust District, all of which boundaries are as shown on Order in Council plan, deposited in office of the Minister of Water Supply, Melbourne.

IN the matter of the petition of John McDonald and others, praying for the constitution of certain lands situate in the parishes of Murrabit and Murrabit West, in the county of Gunbower, in the colony of Victoria, as an Irrigation and Water Supply District within the meaning of the said Act, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust for such district.

Pursuant to section 18 of the said Act, I hereby declare upon the said petition the matters following, viz. :-

1. That the scheme or plan of the proposed works shall be a steam pumping plant on the left bank of the River Murray, to deliver water into a supply channel, which will convey it to the lands to be irrigated.

2. That all the works shall be Trust works.

3. That the amount which it is proposed the Board of Land and Works shall advance, by way of loan, to the Trust for Trust works shall be Three thousand five hundred (3,500) pounds sterling.

4. That the rate of interest to be paid by the Trust upon such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.

5. That the source from which the Trust is to obtain its supply of water shall be the River Murray, and the quantity to be taken therefrom shall not exceed three hundred cubic feet per minute at any season. Subject, however, to the conditions that the whole of the water so taken shall be used only for domestic, stock, and irrigation purposes within the Trust district. This right is to be for three years only, at the end of which period it will be subject to such modification, amendment, or reduction as may then seem expedient.

6. That the powers of rating to be given to the Trust shall not exceed the sum of Four shillings in the £ upon the annual value of the property rated within the Trust district.

RULES AND REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES.

THE subjoined Rules and Regulations have been submitted to the Administrator of the Government in Council, in accordance with section 9 of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864* (27 Vict. No. 201); and the subjoined Scale of Fees has been made in accordance with section 15 of the said Statute.

RULES and regulations made by Trustees, 3rd July, 1889, in pursuance of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*:—

- The Rules and Regulations numbered 1 to 30 shall be the Rules and Regulations of the Barma General Cemetery, after approval and publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*.
- The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- No burial shall, under any circumstances, be permitted in the cemetery until an application has been made, name, age, late place of residence, occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased given at the office of the Trust, an order in the form Schedule A obtained, and the fees (where not remitted) paid.
- The fees mentioned in Schedule B shall be the fees payable under the Act, and shall be paid at time of making application for any order.
- A burial right (Schedule C) shall give the holder and his representatives for ever the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining permission of the trustees as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
- A permit (Schedule D) will, on the application of the holder of a burial right, and deposit of a plan, designs, or drawing of the proposed erection, or a copy of the proposed inscription or epitaph thereon, be granted to construct a vault or grave, and to erect a monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection thereon if approved by the trustees, and subject to such terms and conditions as they may see fit to impose.
- Any application for ground exceeding ten feet in width shall be reserved for the special decision of the trustees.
- The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct same, subject to the approval of the trustees. Every coffin placed therein shall be bricked-in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.
- Any tomb, monument, or material requiring to be removed on re-opening a grave or vault must be removed and re-erected or replaced by the owner.
- No person other than the owner or his agent, duly authorized in writing, shall be permitted to interfere in any way whatever with a grave or enclosure unless by special direction of the trustees.
- Every grave, vault, tombstone, or other erection shall be maintained and kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.
- Any grave may, on approval of the trustees, be converted into a private grave on payment of the fees or balance of fees provided for herein.
- Every grave shall be six feet deep for an adult's body, and not more than two adults, unless the grave be of a greater depth or of extra width, shall be interred in each, two infants being considered equal to an adult.
- Notice of any burial shall be given at the office of the trustees eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial.
- Before a private grave shall be re-opened, the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same shall be given.
- No order for burial shall be issued until there has been deposited at the Trust office a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths; and in case of re-interment or removal from another cemetery, verified copies of such certificate, and of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and on payment of the usual fees.
- The hours for burial, unless by special permission of the trustees, shall be—On week-days, September to April inclusive, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August inclusive, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.; on Sundays throughout the year, from 8 to 10 a.m., or from 2 to 5 p.m.
- The time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

19. Hearses and mourning carriages only are allowed within the cemetery, and the drivers are to observe such directions of the trustees, their officers and servants, as may be found necessary from time to time in regulating the traffic.

20. No tree or shrub shall be planted in any portion of the cemetery except as approved by the trustees.

21. Licensed exhumations shall be made between the hours of 6 and 8 a.m.; and in all cases of exhumation the trustees may where necessary impose special conditions, any non-compliance therewith being a breach of these rules.

22. An additional fee, according to the circumstances of the case, shall be paid for any exhumation or sinking involving extra labour.

23. No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged, within the cemetery.

24. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery unless by authority of the trustees first had and obtained.

25. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

26. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from sunrise to sunset daily throughout the year, but the trustees shall have the right by themselves, their officers and servants, to remove from the cemetery all persons misconducting themselves or violating the rules of propriety or decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any erection or tree, shrub, flower, or border, or otherwise infringing the Act 201, or any Act made or to be made amending the same.

27. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or special authority from the trustees.

28. Any workman employed in the cemetery, though not in the employment of the trustees, shall be required to comply with such general directions of the trustees or their secretary as may be necessary for the control and good order of the cemetery.

29. Sculptors, stonemasons, and others desirous of erecting tombstones, monuments, tablets, or railings, or of constructing vaults, or of placing inscriptions and epitaphs, shall obtain licences, in the form of Schedule E, from the trustees.

30. All material required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery. Stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after the work is completed shall be removed at once by the person employed on the work.
