SHEPPARTON WATER TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations, Nos. 4 and 5, made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Water Trust under the provisions of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 948.ALFRED DEAKIN,
Minister of Water Supply.Department of Water Supply,
Melbourne, 2nd September, 1889.THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Water Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do make the following Regulations:—

REGULATION No. 4.

1. The rates hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of the term of one year, from the 1st day of January to the 31st day of December, 1889, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure; such rates shall be payable in two equal instalments on the first day of January and the first day of July.

2. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings; on every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the time being, an amount equal to seven and a half per centum on the amount of the said municipal valuation.

3. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—One shilling per thousand gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs shall be sixteen thousand gallons for any trough not exceeding twelve feet in length, and eight thousand gallons for every additional five feet or fractional part thereof.

4. Every trough situated in a paddock shall be supplied through a meter, affixed by the consumer according to the directions of the Trust, provided nevertheless that the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall not be less than that charged for troughs supplied under the preceding clause.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per thousand gallons; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 8,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the largest cylinder.

6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon); and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre; for every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

7. In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses.

8. That each syphon-pump must have a meter affixed, and that One shilling per thousand gallons be charged for all water registered at such meter.

9. Stand-pipe or hydrant water—for each load of 100 gallons or under, One shilling; and for each additional 100 gallons, or fraction of 100 gallons, after the first or any one load, to be paid for at the time of taking, Sixpence.

All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly, except where otherwise provided in these regulations.

Every person who is supplied by the Trust with water by measure shall, at his own expense, provide a meter (which meter shall be submitted to and examined by the authorized officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect), which, when fixed, shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe leading from the service-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

All delivery cocks to be of high pressure and of strong hard brass, and in all exposed places to be open and shut by a moveable key or handle.

Plumbers or other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and fix meters, or to refix or relay the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.

No meter shall be fixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises or of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

No pipes shall be affixed to the main pipe, nor to any service-pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus, without notice in writing of the intention so to do being given to the Trust, and the consent of the Trust thereto first had and obtained.

Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet-pipes to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and the bath provided with a proper well-fitted and watertight ground outlet plug or cock.

All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing houses or walls, carriages or horses, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by measure.

Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any

person to take or carry away any such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall each have a stop-cock at the main, and shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds but not more than One hundred pounds annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding One hundred pounds annual value, 1-inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

If any person, whether supplied with water by the Trust or otherwise, shall commit a breach of these regulations, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence; and such person, if supplied with water by the Trust, shall be liable to have the supply of water cut off from his premises, either by cutting the pipes by or through which such water is supplied, or otherwise as the Trust may think fit, and such supply shall cease so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

In the foregoing regulations, wherever the words "officer" or "servant" appears, the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf.

REGULATION No. 5.

Regulation providing for the supply of persons with water by measure for purposes of irrigation of agricultural or other lands, and fixing scale of charges for water supplied:—

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. All measurements of water shall be by gauges of form and pattern approved by the Trust, and fixed under the directions and to the satisfaction of the officers appointed by the Trust for that purpose. The registration of quantities of water delivered shall be made by the Trust's officers.

2. No irrigation outlet or other outlet from any of the Trust's channels or works shall be constructed until the occupier of the land to be supplied from such outlet has entered into an agreement with the Trust for the purchase of water, and has received authority in writing from the Trust to construct such outlet.

3. Every outlet for the supply of water for irrigation shall be constructed under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Trust, or of its duly authorized officer; and shall have a proper gauge fixed thereto to indicate the quantity of water passing through such outlet.

4. One outlet will only be allowed for each property having a frontage not exceeding a mile, measured in a straight line, to any channel, and one additional outlet for each additional mile or fraction thereof. Before constructing any outlet, the owner of the land to be supplied therefrom shall give notice to the Trust's superintending officer, and receive his authority in writing to construct such outlet.

5. No person shall construct any outlet from the works of the Trust without its written authority or otherwise than under the supervision and to the satisfaction of its authorized officer. And any person who shall construct any such outlet without the authority of the Trust, or without the supervision of its authorized officer, or in any manner other than that authorized by such officer, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach.

6. The price to be charged and paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust shall be as follows:—For any quantity not more than 10,000 gallons per day, One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons; for any quantity more than ten thousand (10,000) and not more than twenty thousand (20,000) gallons per day, One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons; for more than that quantity, Five shillings per thousand gallons.

7. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a lesser quantity of water at one time than is equal to the value of Four pounds, and the delivery of water shall be continued on Sundays as well as ordinary working days.

8. Every person agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall receive notification of the dates and quantities in which it will be delivered to him.

9. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authorized officers of the Trust, and no persons other than such officers shall, under any circumstances, open any such outlet, or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works.

10. Any person, not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust, who shall open any irrigation outlets, or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the Trust's channels or works, shall be guilty of a breach of this regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach.

11. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or defile the water contained therein; and any

person who shall injure or damage such works or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein, shall be deemed to be guilty of a breach of this regulation, and be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach.

In the event of the Trust being unable, from failure of the works, or from any other cause, to deliver or supply water to persons whom it shall have agreed to supply, such persons shall be entitled to a rebate of the price agreed to be paid for such water. But the Trust shall not be answerable for any damage that may have been sustained by any person by reason of such non-delivery.

The foregoing regulations shall not apply to gardens of less than five acres in extent.

The foregoing Regulations, numbered 4 and 5, were made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Water Trust on the 12th August, 1889.

THE Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation No. 8, made by the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust in accordance with the provisions of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946.

REGULATION No. 8.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by, *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the Regulations following:—

The Regulations made by the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust on the 2nd day of March, 1889, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 19th day of March, 1889, is hereby repealed.

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district:—

(1) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual value and under, the amount which at the rate levied for the year would be payable in respect of a tenement of Twenty pounds annual value, provided that such charge shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

(2) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, the amount payable in respect of such annual value at the rate levied for the year, provided that such charge shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

(3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every one thousand gallons.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be:—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

3. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees or plants, or washing house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter.

4. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

6. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

7. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

8. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

9. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

10. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

12. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.

13. In the construction of these regulations, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the "Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust."

BYE-LAW No. 77.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law, and all previous Bye-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

FARES FOR CONVEYANCE BY PASSENGER TRAINS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. Students over 16 years and up to any age, attending School, College, or University, to be issued return tickets at two-thirds rate for the purpose of going home once a week, provided they are not in receipt of remuneration from any situation, on production of the usual certificate.

CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

2. Crude Glycerine to be charged 1st Class rates.
3. Coring from Castlemaine to Melbourne or suburbs to be charged 1d. per ton per mile in full truck-loads.
4. Empty Fruit Cases, new, to be charged Miscellaneous Class rates, with 1st Class minimums.
5. Out of the through rates for carriage of Fruit between Mt. Gambier and Melbourne, the proportion due to the Victorian Railways shall be as follows:—

10-cwt. to 1-ton lots	23s. 3d. per ton.
6-ton lots	19s. 7d. „

6. Out of the through rates for carriage of Fresh Fish and Game by passenger and mixed trains between South Australian and Victorian Stations, the proportion due to the Victorian Railways shall be as follows:—

7. Terra Cotta Lumber to be charged the same rates as Bricks, as set forth in Bye-law No. 28.
8. Mixed consignments of Hay or Straw, and Oats or Bran to be charged actual weight at Miscellaneous Class rates.
9. Beeswax, colonial, to be charged 1st Class rates on the up journey.
10. Woolpacks, in bales, to be charged and carried under Miscellaneous Class rates and conditions.
11. When milk is sent to a factory for cheese-making the skim-milk will be returned to the senders at half the ordinary rates as shown in Bye-law No. 67.
12. Hoop-iron to be charged special B rates in lots of four tons and upwards; less than four tons, Miscellaneous Class rates and conditions.
13. Asbestos and silicate cotton Steam-pipe Covering, in skeleton cases, to be charged 2nd Class rates.
14. The minimums on Firewood are fixed as follows:—For distances up to 13 miles, 10s; over 13 and not exceeding 20 miles, 12s. 6d.; over 20 and not exceeding 28 miles, 13s. 9d.; over 28 and not exceeding 36 miles, 15s. per truck-load of five tons.
15. Store sheep, cattle, and horses may be forwarded from stations on one line to stations on another line at the Store rates as set forth in the Goods Tariff for the whole journey, provided always that the trucks are required to load again from the line to which such store sheep, cattle, and horses are consigned. This rate will not, however, apply unless the stock is consigned to and discharged at stations 50 miles distant from Melbourne, and 30 miles distant from Sandhurst, Ballarat, or Geelong.
16. Two Entire Horses, two years and over, in one horse-box, for different owners, to be charged 9d. per mile each; minimum 20s. each.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF MYNSIA.

WE, William Day, William G. Boyle, George R. Beer, John Johnston, and David Rollinson, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for public recreation in the parish of Mysia, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*.—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or throw stones in the reserve.
 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
 6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
 8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
