I, THE Administrator of the Government of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act relating to Moneys recovered or recoverable for Breaches of *The Legislative Council Act 1881.*”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and in the fifty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.

THE Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation No. 8, made by the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust in accordance with the provisions of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946.

REGULATION No. 8.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by, *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the Regulations following:—

The Regulations made by the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust on the 2nd day of March, 1889, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 19th day of March, 1889, is hereby repealed.

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district:—

(1) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual value and under, the amount which at the rate levied for the year would be payable in respect of a tenement of Twenty pounds annual value, provided that such charge shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

(2) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, the amount payable in respect of such annual value at the rate levied for the year, provided that such charge shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

(3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every one thousand gallons.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be:—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

3. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees or plants, or washing house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter.

4. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, 3/4-inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, 1-inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

6. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

7. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

8. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

9. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

10. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

12. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.

13. In the construction of these regulations, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the "Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust."

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* it was amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council might from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and might from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act, and nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby diminish the common hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

10. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette* purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

SHIRE OF SHEPPARTON.

By-LAW No. 8.

A By-law of the Shire of Shepparton, made under section 213 of the "Local Government Act 1874," and numbered 8, for the control, management, and preservation of public gardens within the Shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1874, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Shepparton order as follows:—

That the following provision contained in subdivision 2 of part IV. of the thirteenth schedule annexed to the said Act are hereby adopted in and for and declared applicable, as By-law No. 8, to the said shire:—

1. The gardens under the management or control of the Council, and ground appertaining thereto, herein called "the gardens," shall be open from sunrise to sunset on each day of the week.

2. No person shall pluck any of the flowers, or walk on the beds or borders, or climb upon or get over the fences, or remove any of the tallies, or disturb, damage, or destroy any property or thing in the gardens.

3. No person shall carry firearms through the gardens.

4. No cart or other vehicle used for the conveyance of goods shall, without the authority of the proper officer of the Council, be driven through the gardens.

5. Such plants, seeds, or cuttings as are commonly purchasable at nurseries in Victoria, shall not be supplied from the gardens to any person unless in exchange, or for public institutions or for benevolent purposes.

6. No visitor shall interrupt the gardeners or labourers by conversation or otherwise.

7. Children under the age of ten years, not being under the control of some competent person, shall be removed from the gardens.

8. All dogs and goats, and all poultry found within the gardens shall be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any justice, for any damage done.

9. In addition to the provisions herein contained, it shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to make such regulations for the proper maintenance and management of the gardens as shall seem to them fit.

10. Any person offending against this by-law, or any such regulation, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.
