PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir WILLIAM CLEAVER FRANCIS ROBINSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the eighty-eighth section of *The Public Service Act 1883*, and in the fifth section of *The Bank Holidays Act 1873*, I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation appoint

WEDNESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Telford;

FRIDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Shire of Benalla, and as a Bank Holiday at Benalla;

WEDNESDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT, to be observed as a Public Holiday at Shepparton, and as a Bank Holiday at Bridgewater;

THURSDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT, to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Shire of Yarrawonga, and as a Bank Holiday at Telford.

IT is hereby notified that a Petition, of which the following is a copy, has this day been presented to the Honorable the President of the Legislative Council.

To the Honorable Sir James MacBain, Knight, President of the Legislative Council of Victoria.

The humble Petition of Nathaniel Levi, of Melbourne, in the Colony of Victoria, Advertising Agent,

SHOWETH—

1. That on the twentieth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, an election was held for One Member to serve in the Legislative Council of Victoria to represent the South-Western Province.

2. Your Petitioner was a Candidate at the said election.

3. Donald Smith Wallace, Esquire, and Thomas Russell, Esquire, were the only other candidates at the said election, but your Petitioner showed that the said Thomas Russell was not duly nominated as a candidate, in as much as he did not, together with the nomination paper required by *The Electoral Act 1865*, to be delivered to the Returning Officer, deliver to him a declaration in writing, or partly in writing and partly in print, made

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and subscribed by the said Thomas Russell, to the effect that he was legally or equitably seized of or entitled to lands or tenements in Victoria, sufficient to qualify him under the provisions of *Legislative Council Act 1881*, to be a Member of the said Council.

4. As the result of the said election, the Returning Officer announced that the said Donald Smith Wallace had received two thousand two hundred and eighty-seven votes; that the said Thomas Russell had received one thousand one hundred and ninety-two votes; and that your Petitioner had received two hundred and forty-six votes; and on the twenty-second day of June, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, the said Returning Officer publicly declared that the said Donald Smith Wallace had received the majority of votes at the said election, and was duly elected a Member to serve as aforesaid, and such Returning Officer made his return accordingly.

5. Your Petitioner has been informed and believes, and now alleges that the said Donald Smith Wallace was at the time of the said election incapable of being lawfully elected a Member of the Legislative Council of Victoria, and is incapable of sitting or voting in the said Council by reason of his not having possessed at the time of his election the qualification required by law to be necessary to render him capable of being elected as a Member of the said Council, in that the said Donald Smith Wallace had not, for one year previous to the said election, been legally or equitably seized or entitled to an estate of freehold in possession for his own use and benefit in lands or tenements in Victoria of the annual value of One hundred pounds above all charges and encumbrances affecting the same other than public or parliamentary tax or municipal or other rate or assessment within the meaning of the eleventh section of an Act of the Parliament of Victoria entitled "*An Act for the Reform of the Constitution*," No. 702.

6. Your Petitioner is advised and believes that, by reason of the premises, the said Donald Smith Wallace is not entitled to be declared a duly elected Member of the Legislative Council for the said South-Western Province.

7. Your Petitioner is informed and believes that the said Thomas Russell does not allege or claim that he was duly nominated or duly elected for the said province, nor has he taken any action or proceeding in the matter of the said election.

Your Petitioner therefore respectfully prays—

That you will communicate the matter of this Petition to the Legislative Council of Victoria, in order that the case of your Petitioner may be referred to a Committee of the said Council duly authorized to receive, inquire into, and report upon the same according to law.

That the return of the said Returning Officer be declared void as respects the said Donald Smith Wallace.

That the said Donald Smith Wallace be declared disqualified to have been so elected as a Member of the said Legislative Council, and that he be declared not to have been duly elected.

That in the event of the said Donald Smith Wallace being declared not to have been duly elected, the Return of the said Returning Officer be amended by striking out the name of the said Donald Smith Wallace and inserting in its place the name of your Petitioner, and that your Petitioner be declared duly elected as a Member of the said Legislative Council of Victoria for the said South-Western Province.

That it be declared that the sum of One hundred pounds paid to the said Returning Officer by or on behalf of your Petitioner at the time of his nomination should be repaid to your Petitioner.

And that your Petitioner may have such further or other relief as the circumstances of the case may require or as to the said Committee may seem meet.

And your Petitioner will ever pray, &c.

This light, which was exhibited on the 2nd instant, is 122 feet above the sea level, and will be visible, at the height of 10 feet, 16 miles in clear weather.

The light is fourth order dioptric fixed, and will show seaward bright over an unbroken arc of 105°, and a red ray of 35° is exhibited at either extremity of the bright arc. This will warn Mariners when they are within one mile of the outer extremity of the Horseshoe Reef to the eastward, and within five-eighths of a mile outside the extreme of the sunken rocks off the Don Bluff to the westward.

PROPOSED CARRUM IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

IN the matter of the petition of Alfred Francis Bradshaw and others, being the owners of land situate within the parishes of Dandenong, Bunemmerring, Lyndhurst, and Mordialloc, in the counties of Bourke and Mornington, in the colony of Victoria, praying for the constitution of an Irrigation and Water Supply District, in respect of such lands within the meaning of the said Act, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust for such district.

Pursuant to section 18 of the said Act, I hereby declare upon the said petition the matters following, viz.:-

1. That the scheme or plan of the proposed works shall comprise a system of drainage channels for the conveyance of the surplus waters of the Dandenong and Bunemmerring Creeks to Port Phillip Bay, without, as at present, spreading over and submerging the low-lying lands of the Trust district, and for the removal of other surplus waters therefrom; and a system of irrigation channels to divert and convey water from the Dandenong Creek to the cultivated lands of the Trust area.

2. The whole of the works shall be Trust works.

3. The amount it is proposed that the Board shall advance for the purposes of Trust works, by way of loan, is Twenty-seven thousand one hundred and forty-two pounds (£27,142) sterling.

4. The rate of interest to be paid by the Trust upon such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.

5. The source from which the Trust is to obtain its supply of water is the Dandenong Creek, and it will be entitled to take therefrom one-half of the natural discharge of the creek, so long as that discharge does not exceed two thousand four hundred (2,400) cubic feet per minute it will be entitled to take one thousand two hundred (1,200) cubic feet per minute.

6. The powers of rating to be given to the Trust shall not exceed the sum of Five shillings in the pound upon the annual valuation of the property within the Trust district.

REGULATION No. 8.

The Chairman and Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of *The Water Conservation Act 1857*; do hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1857*; make the Regulations following:—

The Regulations made by the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust on the 2nd day of March, 1889; and approved by the Governor in Council on the 19th day of March, 1889; is hereby repealed.

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district:—

(1) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual value and under, the amount which at the rate levied for the year would be payable in respect of a tenement of Twenty pounds annual value, provided that such charge shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

(2) For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, the amount payable in respect of such annual value at the rate levied for the year, provided that such charge shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

(3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every one thousand gallons.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be:—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half year.

3. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees or plants, or washing house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter.

4. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person; shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value; $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value; $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

6. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

7. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

8. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

9. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main; but from a cistern only so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

10. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

12. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said regulations and not otherwise.

13. In the construction of these regulations, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the "Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of September, 1889.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act 1865* it was amongst other things enacted, that no election should be void in consequence only of there having been no Returning Officer at the time of the issue of the writ or of any delay in the return of the writ; and where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission should have happened, the Governor in Council might take all such measures as might be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance, or omission, or might declare any or all of the proceedings at or for any election valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission; and that every such Order in Council should state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and should be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas an accidental omission has happened at the election for the North Yarra Province held in pursuance of a writ dated the twenty-third day of August ultimo, such omission being that the Returning Officer did omit to include the nomination paper of the candidate for election for the said Province in the sealed parcel to be transmitted to the Clerk of the Legislative Council, as directed by the said Act: And whereas it is expedient that such accidental omission should be rectified: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and under the authority given in and by the 131st section of *The Electoral Act 1865*, No. 279, doth hereby order that such accidental omission be rectified accordingly, and doth direct the Returning Officer for the said North Yarra Province to transmit to the Clerk of the Legislative Council in a separate sealed parcel the nomination paper so omitted as aforesaid, and doth likewise declare valid all the proceedings at or for the aforesaid election for the North Yarra Province, notwithstanding such accidental omission.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS UNDER "THE LAND ACT 1884"—ALTERATION OF CERTAIN SCHEDULES.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the

Executive Council, doth hereby rescind Condition 2 of Schedule L, Condition 1 of Schedule LI., and Condition 1 of Schedule LVI. to the Regulations under *The Land Act 1884*, made on the first day of May, 1888, and with this advice aforesaid doth hereby make the Conditions to the said Schedules, as specified hereunder, in lieu thereof respectively, that is to say:—

Schedule L. (Chap. XVI. s. 3.)

CONDITIONS OF LICENCE TO FELL EUCALYPTUS TIMBER IN A STATE FOREST OR TIMBER RESERVE FOR SUPPLY OF SAWMILL.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid to the sexton when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Notice of any burial shall be given at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for burial.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.
4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
5. The usual hours of interment will be from 10 o'clock a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m., except on Sundays, when the hours will be from 2 o'clock to 5 o'clock p.m.
6. The charge will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced before two of the trustees that the relatives or friends of such persons are unable to pay the costs and charges.
7. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate for permission will be granted to persons applying.
8. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them; or in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent, in writing, of such person must be left with the order.
9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
10. The fees mentioned in Schedule A shall be the fees payable under the Act, and shall be paid at time of making application.
11. A burial right, Schedule B, shall give the holder and his representatives for ever the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining permission of the trustees as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection thereon.
12. Any application for ground exceeding 12 feet in width shall be reserved for the special decision of the trustees.
13. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
14. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, to be submitted to the trustees for approval.
15. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the office of the sexton.
16. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

- 17. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
- 18. The cemetery will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
- 19. No grave to be of less depth than 5 feet. The trustees reserve the right to make any alteration from time to time in these regulations.

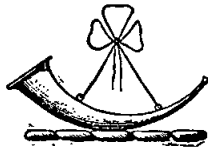
