REGULATION RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

REGULATION RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS
UNDER SECTION 2 OF 22 VICT. No. 86.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to rescind the following portion of Clause 25 of the General Regulations respecting Public Accounts, dated 26th May, 1874, namely:—

"As regards Expenditure other than Salaries, Wages, and Allowances fixed by Law—

"Heads of Departments shall, so soon as funds are legally available for the service of any financial year, and thereafter not later than the 15th September, the 15th December, and the 15th March in each year, prepare on the Form (K) annexed an Estimate of moneys likely to become due and payable during the ensuing quarter for their respective departments; and shall submit the same to the Minister for the purpose of obtaining his sanction to certify accounts for payment to the extent specified in such Estimate; only when absolutely necessary may Supplementary Estimates be submitted for the like purpose between the dates above specified. Copies of all approved Estimates shall be forthwith transmitted, under the signature of the Minister, to the Treasurer and the Commissioners of Audit."

MURDER AT EAGLEHAWK.

TWO HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

TRANSMISSION OF TELEGRAMS BY TELEPHONE.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the following arrangements in connexion with the transmission of telegrams by telephone.

Subscribers to telephone exchanges in Victoria may, subject to certain conditions, transmit to any telegraph station which may be connected with any Telephone Exchange, messages intended to be further transmitted from the telegraph office to the respective destinations of such messages as postal telegrams.

Such subscribers may also, at their option, have postal telegrams, addressed to them, forwarded by telephone from the telegraph office of destination to their telephonic address, and copies of such telegrams will at the same time be posted for delivery to their address stamped on the face "Transmitted by Telephone."

Subscribers wishing to avail themselves of this system will be required to deposit with the Post Office and Telegraph Department an advance sufficient to cover their probable expenditure on such telegrams for one month, such account to be adjusted monthly (or more frequently if necessary) by the Telegraph Office, and reimbursement obtained.

The transcription of telegrams telephoned by subscribers will, so far as this Department is concerned, become the original telegrams, and it must be understood that such transcriptions would not be admitted as evidence in case of appeal to the Law Courts, and that the Department will not assume, or be subject to any liability by reason or on account of any failure, delay, or mistake in or about the transmission, receipt, or delivery of any telegram under this system, from whatever cause the same may arise.

The fee to be charged to subscribers desirous of availing themselves of this system will be Five pounds five shillings (£5 5s.) per annum.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the following:—

REGULATION No. 6.

Fixing the rates and charges which owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the Trust district.

Such rate being made for the year commencing on the first day of January and ending the thirty-first day of December, 1890.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust district shall be as follows, viz.:—

1. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, of the annual value of £20 and under, the sum of One pound one shilling per annum.

2. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, above the annual value of £20, and not exceeding the annual value of £200, the sum of 5s per cent. per annum on the valuation.

3. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel, above the annual value of £200, the sum of 4s 10s. per cent. on the valuation.

4. On every hotel of the annual value of £30 and under, a minimum rate of £2 per annum.

5. On every hotel above the annual value of £30, the sum of 6s per cent. per annum on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than 4s.

6. On unoccupied lands and lands on which no tenements are erected, the sum of 5s per cent. on the annual valuation.

7. On livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for the first stall, and Seven shillings and sixpence per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each six feet to be considered as one stall. For horses kept on private premises, Ten shillings per annum for the first horse kept, and Seven shillings and sixpence per annum for each additional horse.

Cows to be paid for at the rate of One shilling each per annum. Water troughs, Ten shillings each per annum.

8. Water supplied by meter to be at the rate of Two shillings per one thousand gallons, except to manufactories, aerated water-makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per one thousand gallons, provided that not less than 50,000 gallons per annum are consumed, falling which the charge shall be Two shillings per thousand.

9. Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per one thousand gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.

10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering; or should the Trust require a meter to be affixed, the rate shall be One shilling and sixpence per one thousand gallons.

11. For water supplied to steam boilers, the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per horse-power per annum.

12. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.

13. Where water is supplied by the Trust to any person, corporation, or company, by measure, or by special agreement, in no case shall any such person, corporation, or company pay less for the supply of water to any premises occupied by him or it than the amount for the time being payable under any rates and charges made by the Waterworks Trust in respect of such premises.

14. These rates and charges shall be payable by equal half-yearly instalments in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1890, except in cases where the Trust may have made a special agreement regarding the times of payment for water supplied by measure, or for mining purposes.

15. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.

THE Commissioners of the Euroa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, hereby make the following rating regulation:—

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Euroa Waterworks Trust, supplied other-wise than by measure and liable in respect of rates levied by the said Trust according to the valuation, for the time being, of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such rateable property is situate, for one year, commencing on the first day of January, 1890, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1890.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments, and the first instalment shall be due and payable on the first day of January, 1890, and the second instalment on the first day of July, 1890.

Such persons as the Commissioners of the Euroa Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

THE Commissioners of the Euroa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, hereby make the following regulations:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual value and under, the amount which at the rate levied for the year would be payable in respect of a tenement of Twenty pounds annual value.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, the amount payable in respect of such annual value at the rate levied for the year.

3. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.

4. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse power of such steam boiler.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement by the Trust), Two shillings for every thousand gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes, only thirty thousand gallons per half year.

No hose or pipe is to be supplied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter.

Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

No person shall lay any pipe or communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

The service pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty, annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

No person shall connect any service pipe or branch service pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence will be One pound.

If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said regulations and not otherwise.

In the construction of these regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bureau Waterworks Trust.

URBAN DISTRICTS OF CASTLE DONNINGTON AND KERANG.—RATING REGULATION.

SWAN HILL SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

Whereas default has been made in payment by the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust of the interest due by the said Trust on loans granted by the Governor in Council to such Waterworks Trust, and the said Trust has also failed to form a sinking fund for the liquidation of such loans in accordance with the Act of Parliament in that behalf, and the Board of Land and Works has, under the authority conferred upon it by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, entered upon and taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust. And whereas notice that the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks District is supplied with water has been given in the *Government Gazette*, in accordance with the provisions of the said *Water Conservation Act 1887*.

And whereas by two Proclamations by the Governor in Council, bearing date the 18th day of December, 1883, certain portions of the Waterworks District (towns of Castle Donnington and Kerang) were proclaimed urban districts within the meaning of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*.

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 17th day of December, 1889, made under the authority of the said *Water Conservation Act 1887*, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the said Board of Land and Works in respect of the said urban districts should be made for the year 1890 and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Part 9 of the said last-mentioned Act.

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Water Conservation Act 1887*, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 17th December, 1889, in that behalf make the following Regulation in respect of the said urban district for the year 1890, that is to say:—

(1) A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1890 on the annual municipal valuation of all lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said urban districts.

(2) The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said urban districts.

(3) The rate to be charged for water supplied from the mains by measure shall be Three shillings and fourpence per one thousand gallons.

(4) The rate to be made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1890.

Such person or persons as the said Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf the day of December, 1889.

THE WESTERN WIMMERA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION No. 5.

The Commissioners of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 95 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, do make the following regulations:—

Regulations of Proceedings of Meetings of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, Officers, &c.

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. *Minutes of meeting.*—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at such preceding

meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the chairman.

3. *Order of business at meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (ii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iii.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (iv.) Payments.
- (v.) Ordinary business.
- (vi.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (vii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (viii.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (ix.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any commissioner, the commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. *Address to Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

6. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of the meeting of the Trust, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of the Trust; and such secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. *Motion of motion to be given.*—No commissioner shall make any motion in initiating a subject for discussion, but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. *Petitions.*—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

9. *Motions to be moved in order in notice book.*—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. *Motion to be proceeded with by commissioner giving same, except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. *Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.*—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

14. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

15. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. *Mover of motion.*—A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. *Designation of commissioners.*—The commissioners in meeting of Trust shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.

18. *Priority of commissioners.*—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. *Chairman to rise when addressing Trust.*—The chairman shall rise in addressing the Trust to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. *Commissioner not to speak a second time on same question.*—No commissioner shall speak a second time on same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. *Points of order.*—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

22. *Commissioners not to digress, &c.*—No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. *Commissioners to apologize for disorderly, &c., expressions.*—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other

commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

24. *Commissioner called to order to sit down.*—A commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

25. *Commissioners twice offending guilty of an offence.*—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. *Strangers.*—Any person, not being a commissioner, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. *Commissioners not attending order for call.*—Any commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Trust, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be guilty of an offence.

28. *Commissioners may demand documents.*—Any commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

29. *Voting.*—The Trust shall vote by show of hands; and any commissioner present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. *Question, how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. *Motions, &c., to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the Trust all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. *No second amendment until previous one disposed of.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

33. *Effect of rejection of original motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. *If amendment be negatived, a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-named amendment was moved; but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Trust for discussion at a time.

35. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of any original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. *Motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. *Protests.*—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, the notice of intention to protest shall, in every case, be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such commissioner, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

38. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

39. *Lapsed order of the day may be restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust; and the secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of committees.

41. *Meetings of the committee.*—The secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

42. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

43. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision hereof.

44. *Commissioners to affix their names.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

45. *Petitions to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and shall be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

46. *To be signed by petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. *No letters, &c., to be attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

48. *Commissioners confined to statement of certain facts.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. *Appointment of officers, &c.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given, by advertisement, in one or more newspapers circulating in the waterworks district, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

50. *Salaries of officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall, in all cases, be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. *No commissioner, &c., to be surety for officer.*—No commissioner or officer of the Trust, and no assessor or auditor of the Trust, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the Trust, or for any work to be done by the Trust.

52. *Suspension of rules.*—Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose, on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Trust.

53. *Penalty.*—If any person shall be guilty of any breach of this regulation, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds for every such offence.

54. *Banking account and signing cheques.*—All moneys of the Trust amounting to twenty pounds and upwards shall, within twenty-four hours, or such shorter period as the Trust may direct, after they have come to the hands of the proper officer of the Trust, be paid into such bank, and in such manner as the Trust shall from time to time appoint and direct for that purpose; and no such money shall be drawn out of such bank save by cheque signed by any three commissioners authorized from time to time by the Trust in that behalf, and countersigned by the secretary.

The foregoing regulation, numbered five, was made by the Commissioners of The Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, this sixth day of December, 1889.

MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purpose of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, make the following regulation, viz. :—

RATING REGULATION.—REGULATION No. 9.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district :—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, used either partly or wholly as a domicile, an amount of five per cent. per annum on the annual value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, not being a domicile, an amount of three and a half per cent. per annum on the annual value of such property. Provided that in any case the charge shall not be less than the sum of One pound.

4. For every water trough One pound per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs shall be 8,000 gallons.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged to all owners or occupier of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes shall be as follows :—

Exceeding one quarter of an acre but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons; exceeding half an acre but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 24,000 gallons; for every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery, carters', and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.

6. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone work brick work, and plastering.

7. For water supplied to market gardens the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 40,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre.

8. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

9. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 4,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January, 1890, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1890, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and on the first day of July, 1890.

Such persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time approve of for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946, do hereby make the following regulations :—

I. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, Three shillings for every one thousand gallons shall be charged.

II. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when the water is supplied by measure shall be—

(1.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at Three shillings per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2.) If for other than domestic purposes only thirty thousand gallons per half-year, excepting as follows :—

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{4}$ acre and less,	8,000 galls. per annum.
" " $\frac{1}{2}$ " "	12,000 " "
" " $\frac{3}{4}$ " "	16,000 " "
" " 1 " "	28,000 " "
" " 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " "	40,000 " "

Livery and carriers' stables for each stall or space of five feet 3,000 " "

Stand-pipe or hydrant, water for each load of 100 gallons or under, Sixpence.

(3.) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid monthly.

III. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, chargeable with half-rate.

IV. Tenements exceeding one quarter, but not exceeding one half a mile distant from a stand-pipe, chargeable with one-fourth rate.

V. Every person who is supplied by the Trust with water by measure shall, at his or her own expense, provide a meter (which meter shall be submitted to and examined by the proper officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in a proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect), which, when fixed, shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

VI. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

VII. All delivery cocks to be strong hard brass, and in all exposed places to be open and shut by a moveable key or handle.

VIII. Plumbers or other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to re-fix or relay the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.

IX. No meter shall be fixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

x. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

xI. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

xII. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

xIII. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

xIV. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet-pipes to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and the bath provided with a proper well-fitted and watertight ground outlet plug or cock.

xV. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

xVI. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

xVII. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or washing houses and walls, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by measure.

xVIII. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his or her premises, or shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

xIX. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

xX. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without first receiving permission and giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each breach.

xXI. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall each have a stop-cock at the main, and shall in no case exceed one half-inch diameter for the supply of premises except where supplied by measure, and then not to exceed three-quarters of an inch.

xXII. The water supplied in the urban district of the Trust shall be received and used under and in accordance with these regulations and *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, and such parts of *The Public Works Statute 1865* as are incorporated herewith.

xXIII. If any person, whether supplied with water by the Trust or otherwise, shall commit a breach of these regulations, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and such person, if supplied with water by the Trust, shall be liable to have the supply of water cut off from his premises, either by cutting the pipes by or through which such water is supplied, or otherwise as the Trust may think fit, and such supply shall cease so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

xXIV. In the foregoing regulations, wherever the words "officer" or "servant" appears, the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE LEONGATHA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

- All the charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground is broken or vault re-opened.
- On application for permission to construct a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will, if the trustees are satisfied, be granted on the payment of the proper fees.
- Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees, that such person was a pauper and that the relatives of the deceased are unable to pay the usual fees.
- Notice of interment to be given to the Trustees at least eight hours previously, when a form of instruction must be filled up and given to the sexton.
- The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but when a brick or other grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees or some person duly appointed by them.
- The time fixed for funerals to be at the cemetery must be punctually observed.
- The usual hours for the performance of funerals shall be from 10 o'clock a.m. till 4 o'clock p.m., unless otherwise ordered.
- All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owner.
- Plan of every monument or headstone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
- Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
- A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined.
- No order for burial will be issued until there has been deposited at the office of the trustees a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths.
- The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alterations from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

CERTIFICATE OF RIGHT OF BURIAL IN THE LEONGATHA GENERAL CEMETERY.

On the application of _____ and upon payment this _____ day of _____ of the sum of _____ the trustees of the Leongatha General Cemetery, in terms of and as authorized by *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, have agreed to grant, and do hereby grant, unto the said _____ permission to dig or make a grave or vault on that piece of ground, _____ feet long by _____ feet broad, lying within the portion of the said cemetery appropriated for _____ burials, and marked No. _____, _____, _____, on the map or plan of the said cemetery, kept by the said trustees, with permission to erect or place on the said piece of ground, a monument or tombstone, on payment of such charges as may from time to time be established. Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oatn, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, clean white (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oatn or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1890, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

2. Tenders are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bond fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, marked cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that the Department undertakes to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders are accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

Packets up to 3 lbs. in weight are conveyed by horseback services.

12. Tenderers for services to and from Post Offices and Railway Stations are required to name a lump sum per annum for the number of trips specified in the call for tenders, and also state a rate per trip as a basis of payment for additional trips, or for reduction in the payment, should the number of trips be increased or lessened during the currency of the contract.

A "trip" to mean a journey from the Post Office to the Railway Station, and from the Railway Station to the Post Office, carrying mails each way.

The carriage of mails one way, viz., either from a Post Office to a Railway Station or from a Railway Station to a Post Office, shall be regarded as half a trip, and payment made accordingly. Where tenders are invited for a service to and from a Post Office and Railway Station "as often as required," tenderers are required to name a lump sum per annum for the work, and such sum shall not be liable to alteration either through increase or diminution in the number of trips. Contracts for services to and from Post Offices and Railway Stations are liable to be discontinued at one month's notice from the Department.

13. A separate *bond fide* tender must be sent in for each service.

14. The attention of tenderers is drawn to the condition which requires that in cases where vehicles are used, Members of Parliament shall be conveyed free of charge between the districts they represent and the districts in which they reside and Melbourne.

15. The contractor shall not be entitled to claim any extra payment on account of the establishment of any new Post Office, or the removal of any existing Post Office, during the term of his contract, unless such establishment or removal shall increase the distance to be travelled by such contractor on any one day to the extent of one mile.

16. No application for the transfer of a contract will be entertained until a fee has been paid of Ten shillings on a contract not exceeding £50 per annum, and Twenty shillings on a contract above £50 per annum.

17. The general conditions referred to in the printed form of tender, and upon which the tender is to be made, can be inspected by persons proposing to tender, either at the General Post Office or at any post office in the colony.

18. The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

SHIRE OF EUROA.

By-LAW No. 6.

A By-law of the Shire of Euroa, made under Part IX, Schedule 13, of the "Local Government Act 1874," for miscellaneous matters.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1874*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Euroa order as follows:—That part 1X. of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1874* is hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Euroa, excepting sections 4, 5, and 6.

1. *Regulations as to bathing.*—Where any part of the seashore or strand of any river or creek used as a public bathing place is within the municipal district or within three hundred yards of the boundary thereof, and not within any borough, the council may make regulations for and with respect to the time and place of bathing at or within such part and according to the sex of the persons bathing or otherwise, and also as to persons resorting to or passing by such part, whether by land or water, and for the stands of bathing machines, and otherwise for securing reasonable privacy for bathers and the observance of decency.

2. *Damaging trees.*—If any person shall wilfully and without the authority of the council cut, break, bark, root up, or otherwise destroy or damage the whole or any part of any tree, sapling, scrub, or underwood growing in or upon any street, road, or place under the management of the council, although the injury done shall not be to the amount of one shilling, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. *Removing soil, &c., from public places.*—If any person shall without the authority of the council break, displace, or remove the surface or soil of any land belonging to or under the control or management of the council, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

The foregoing by-law was made and passed on the ninth day of October, and confirmed on the 13th day of November, 1889.

By-LAW No. 3.

To regulate and fix the tolls and dues to be levied in the Cranbourne Municipal Market, and for the better regulation and government of the said Market.

BY-LAW of the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne, made under and in pursuance of the *Local Government Act 1874*. The Council of the Shire of Cranbourne order as follows:—

For every cart laden with green fodder, esculent roots or other goods, standing in the market 24 hours or part of 24 hours	6d.
For every dozen fruit trees, or less number	1d.
For every couple geese or turkeys	1d.
For every couple ducks or fowls	1d.
For every pair rabbits	1d.
Wild fowls or pigeons (per brace)	1d.
Eggs (per dozen)	3d.
Pork, bacon, cheese, butter (per stone)	1d.

For every horse, mare, gelding, foal, ass, or mule sold, or exposed for sale	3d.
For every calf sold or exposed for sale	1d.
For every head neat cattle sold or exposed for sale	1d.
For every pig sold or exposed for sale	1d.
For every 50, and not more than 100, sheep or goats sold or exposed for sale	1s.
For any number less than 50 sold or exposed for sale	3d.
Articles not provided, per load or less quantity	6d.
Bullock dray load	9d.

RULES FOR THE BETTER REGULATIONS AND GOVERNMENT OF THE MARKET.

The market shall be open for the receipt or sale of the before-mentioned marketable commodities on such days during the year, and for such hours during each day, as the Council may from time to time determine, from sunrise to sunset, excepting Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday, on which days no business shall be transacted therein.

That the market shall be open for the reception and sale of stock and produce of every description on every Monday in each week from 10 o'clock in the forenoon to 7 o'clock p.m. of the same day, and for the sale of stock on the first Friday in each month. Should any of the days hereby fixed for the sale of stock or produce fall on Christmas Day, Good Friday, or New Year's Day the market shall be open for the sale of stock or produce on the day preceding.

That all cattle yarded in the Cranbourne Market Yards for sale by public auction shall be divided into three classes, as follows:—

- No. 1. Shall consist of dairy cows, that is to say, cows in milk, cows with calf at foot, and springers.
 - No. 2. Shall consist of stores or other cattle, not exceeding five in number, the property of one owner.
 - No. 3. Shall consist of stores or other cattle, not exceeding five in number, the property of one owner.
- That all cattle shall be sold in classes. Class 1 shall be sold first, Class 2 second, Class 3 third. All the cattle in each class shall be sold or offered for sale before the sale of another class is commenced.

That all the cattle in Classes Nos. 1 and 2 shall be sold in the selling yard, and the cattle in No. 3 class may be sold in the pens or selling yard, at the discretion of the auctioneer having the sale of them.

That on each market day the auctioneers having the sale of cattle shall draw lots for priority of sale in each class, in the presence of the Market Inspector or other officer of the Council, and they shall sell or offer for sale the whole of the cattle in each separate class in the order of such drawing before another is commenced, and any person interfering with or in any way preventing such auctioneer from conducting such sale shall be guilty of an offence against this by-law.

That no two auctioneers shall sell or offer for sale by public auction at the same time any cattle in the market yard.

That all disputes as to the classification of cattle under the provisions of this by-law shall be referred to the Market Inspector, and his decision shall be final.

There shall be appointed by the Council, if necessary, an Inspector for the said market, whose duty shall be as follows:—

1st. To see that the market regulations are duly observed.

2nd. To preserve order and regularity in the market.

3rd. To inspect all articles intended for human food that may be brought to the market, and such articles as may be deemed unfit for use to report the same to the proper authorities, or take such measures as may be desirable to prevent the sale thereof.

All tolls and dues chargeable under the said schedule shall be payable and collected on the entrance of the articles into the market, or prior to their being sold and leaving the market, in the discretion of the Inspector.

Any person who shall place anything or any matter so as to obstruct the thoroughfare in the market, and shall refuse or neglect to remove the same on being required by the Inspector to do so, or who shall place any cart, or carriage, or wheelbarrow in any part of the said market contrary to the direction of the Inspector thereof, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this by-law.

No person shall place or drive any hook, nail, or peg, or other instrument into any part of the wood, stone, or brickwork of any shed or stall, or shall in any way fit up or enclose any stall, without the consent of the Council in writing.

Any person resisting, or obstructing, or interfering with the Inspector in the discharge of his duties shall, independently of any penalty he or she may incur for assault or otherwise, be deemed to have committed a breach of this by-law.

No person shall offer for private or public sale in any part of the market any produce, goods, horses, or cattle, &c., before the hour of opening or after the hours of closing said market, nor upon any day not fixed by the council as a day upon which the market will be open, without the sanction of the Council in writing.

All produce or implements must be removed out of the yards before 12 o'clock noon on the following day, otherwise a rent of 1s. (One shilling) per week must be paid to the Council for a space not exceeding 200 superficial feet.

All horses or cattle must be removed out of the market before 12 o'clock noon on the day following the day of sale, provided that all horses or cattle sold or offered for sale at the monthly sales on Saturdays shall be removed from the market yards before 8 o'clock p.m. on the day of sale.
