Chinese Act 1890

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Chinese Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1073), it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of Part I. of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time or for any specified period apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such proclamation, and that any such proclamation may at any time be revoked by the Governor in Council by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation exempt John Tong Wai, and his wife and child, from the provisions of Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* aforesaid, and do declare that the provisions of the said Part of the said Act shall not at any time apply to the said John Tong Wai and his wife and child.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this third day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety, and in the fifty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

Exhibition of Flashing White Light on S.W. Maatsuyker Island, South Coast of Tasmania.

With reference to the preliminary notice issued by this Board, dated 11th July, 1890, it is hereby notified that, on and after the

1st day of April, 1891, a light will be exhibited from a light-house which has been erected on the S.W. Maatsuyker Island, the position and characteristics of which are as follow:—

The lighthouse is situated on the south side of the S.W. Maatsuyker Island, which lies off the south coast of Tasmania, in latitude 43° 39' 30" S., longitude 146° 17' 30" E. (approximate).

The tower is 42 feet in height from base to top of the lantern, and is painted white.

The light will be First Order, Dioptric Group—Flashing White Light, visible all round the horizon as far as the land will allow, giving a quick double flash at intervals of thirty seconds.

The light will be elevated 350 feet above the mean sea level, and, allowing 10 feet for the height of the eye, will be seen at a distance of 25 miles in clear weather, and at a lesser distance according to the state of the atmosphere.

Health Act 1890.
SHIRE OF MILDURA.

By-Law No. 4.

THE President, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Shire of Mildura, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, doth hereby make the following by-law being by-law No. 4.

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

“House” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

“Cesspool” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the surface of the ground.

“Street” shall mean and include any highway, and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

2. *Premises to be kept so as not to be a nuisance.*—Every occupier or person having the management or control of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

3. *Removal of refuse from houses.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall remove therefrom all dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, or such other refuse matter produced or accumulated thereon once every week, and in the case of the default of such occupier the shire council may remove the same at the expense of said owner and occupier to some place appointed by the council.

4. *Receptacles for house refuse.*—Every occupier of a house or premises shall provide and keep thereon a box or some other covered receptacle for the temporary deposit of house refuse, which box or receptacle shall be of such dimensions as that the same may, with the contents thereof when full, be readily and conveniently movable by one man, or so many such boxes or receptacles as may be necessary to contain all the house refuse produced or accumulated on such premises during one week; and shall cause all house refuse to be deposited as soon as conveniently may be in some such box or receptacle.

5. *Removal of refuse from places where animals are kept.*—Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals, shall from time to time remove from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon once at least every fourth day, and in the case of the default of such occupier the shire council may remove the same at the expense of such occupier.

6. *Power to use refuse as manure.*—Nothing contained in the foregoing sections shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil, or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on the premises to be at any time removed, or to be used as manure on any garden, or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any by-law of the shire council, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

7. *Removal of refuse from places where noxious or offensive trades are carried on.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture whatsoever, shall cause all rubbish, filth, soil, offal, or other offensive matters, and all waste products of such trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture from which offensive effluvia may arise to be removed from such premises once at least in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and so that no noxious or offensive effluvia arise therefrom; and if any such occupier or person shall neglect or fail to have removed any such offensive matter or waste products as aforesaid the same may be removed by the shire council at the expense of the occupier or person above-mentioned.

8. *Removal of blood from places where animals are slaughtered.*—Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all blood from the animals killed therein as soon as conveniently may be to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron, or chloride of lime in the proportion of one pound to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient to effectually deodorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within twenty-four hours after such blood is shed.

9. *Construction of privies.*—No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground; and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan of approved pattern for night-soil, the content whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof; and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

10. *Supply of deodorizing material to earth-closets.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes,

charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

11. *Emptying receptacles for night-soil.*—Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises once at least in every week shall empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

12. *Removal of night-soil to be by properly-constructed conveyances.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or of any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

13. *Hours within which night-soil may be removed.*—No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of Twelve midnight and Five a.m., or such other time appointed by the council, nor until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.

14. *Disposal of refuse and offensive matter.*—Individual householders shall not contract for removal of night-soil or other refuse or offensive matter, except in accordance with the by-laws and regulations of the shire council, and night-soil and other refuse or offensive matter shall only be deposited at the places set apart by the shire council for those purposes, except by special permission of the said council, and subject to such conditions as shall be determined on by the said council when granting permission.

15. *Night-soil and refuse to be deposited so as not to be a nuisance.*—No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil, or other offensive matter in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person, or injurious to health.

16. *Night-soil, &c., removed from any earth-closet, &c., and deposited anywhere, to be covered with earth.*—Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited, or assisting in placing or depositing, on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place of deposit, shall, immediately on the deposit thereof, cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness.

17. *Earth-closets, &c., not to be emptied into drains or sewers.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find their way, or be likely to find their way, into any drain or sewer.

18. *Prevention of pollution of water.*—No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in, or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into, any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy or any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any person using such water, or drinks, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

19. *Cesspools not to be emptied into water used for drinking or domestic purposes.*—No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents or any portion of the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any such water.

20. *Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or to be likely to find its way, into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within twenty-four hours of the notice given by the shire council or by one of its officers.*

21. *Keeping of animals.*—No person shall keep pigs or any other animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

22. *Animals not to be kept so as to pollute water.*—No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used, or likely to be used, by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

23. *Supply of water to slaughter-houses.*—Every occupier or licensee, or person having the management or control of a slaughter-house or abattoir shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

24. *Drainage of new buildings.*—Every person erecting or causing to be erected any new building shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground over which such building is to be placed to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water soakage or damp shall lodge there.

25. *Drainage of existing buildings.*—Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient

drains so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building, and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards are unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

REGULATION.—MAKING A RATE.

A rate of Two shillings in the £1 sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the waterworks district of the Nagambie Waterworks Trust liable in respect of rates levied by the said Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such rateable property is situated, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1891.

BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1891.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the subjoined Rating Regulation for 1891 made by the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, under the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*.

RATING REGULATION.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to five per cent. on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs shall be 16,000 gallons for any trough not exceeding 12 feet in length, and 8,000 gallons for every additional 5 feet or fractional part thereof.

4. Every trough situated in a paddock shall be supplied through a meter, affixed by the consumer according to the directions of the Trust, provided nevertheless that the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall not be less than that charged for troughs supplied under the preceding clause.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons; and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 8,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder.

6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon); and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purposes of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre; for every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery and carriers' stables and all other stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds, used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

That each syphon-pump must have a meter affixed, and that Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons be charged for all water registered at such meter.

That the occupiers of all tenements not already rated, situated within a distance of a quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe, shall pay a rate equal to one-half; and where such tenements are situated at a distance of more than a quarter of a mile therefrom, such occupiers shall pay a rate equal to one-quarter of the amount which would be payable if such tenements were supplied with water from service-pipes.

The before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July in such year. Such persons as the Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION No. 1.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulation following:—

1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust district, that is to say:—

- (1) For every house or tenement, used wholly or partly as a domicile, at a rate of One shilling in the £ on the shire assessment. Minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings.
- (2) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.
- (3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement by the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.
- (4) Any person who may or shall obtain water, or may be supplied with water, from the public stand-pipes, or any or either of them in the said district, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be:—

- (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) If for other than domestic purposes only, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

3. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1891, commencing from the 1st January, as also the charges for every steam boiler, and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable in one payment on the 1st of July, 1891.

4. All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July.

5. Such person or persons as the commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulation has been made by the Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, on the 17th day of October, 1890, and the seal of the Trust has been affixed hereto in the presence of—

REGULATIONS UNDER THE "LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1890."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the third day of

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1112), the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the subjoined Regulations for the issue of Licences for Unlocked Swing-gates under section 428 of the Act aforesaid, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Any owner, lessee, licensee of land from the Crown, or pastoral tenant of the Crown desiring the temporary erection upon any road, street, or highway of unlocked swing-gates shall make application to the council of the municipality in which such road, street, or highway is situated.

2. If the council of a municipality approve of the temporary erection upon any road, street, or highway of unlocked swing-gates it shall make application to the Honorable the Minister of Lands, in the form prescribed in Schedule A hereto, for the issue of a licence for the erection of such unlocked swing-gates.

3. Notice of each application for the issue of a licence for placing upon any road, street, or highway unlocked swing-gates shall be published in the *Government Gazette* and in a newspaper circulating in the district, once in each week for four (4) consecutive weeks prior to the application being made to the Minister of Lands, and such notice shall state the reasons for making such application, the situation of the road, street, or highway, and the period for which it is proposed to maintain the gate.

4. Each application for the issue of a licence for unlocked swing-gates shall be referred to a Local Land Board for consideration and report.

5. Each licence for an unlocked swing-gate shall be in the form and subject to the conditions prescribed in Schedule B hereto, and shall be for a period of not more than one (1) year, and each such period shall expire on the 31st day of December in each year: Provided that the licence may be renewed from year to year without further notice or application for the period specified in the first notice of application and in the approval thereof if such approval shall not have been revoked or varied.

6. The Governor in Council may from time to time, and at any time, revoke any licence for the erection of unlocked swing-gates upon a road, street, or highway, and immediately upon the publication in the *Government Gazette* of a notice of such revocation the licensee shall remove every gate specified in such notice.

7. The fees payable annually upon a licence for unlocked swing-gates shall be calculated at the rate of Five pounds per centum (5%) upon the capital value of the total area of road or roads enclosed by the gates specified in such licence. The fee for the preparation of a licence shall be Five shillings (5s.).

pence, together with the fee of Five shillings (5s.) for the preparation hereof, to the Receiver and Paymaster at full licence and authority to place upon the road unlocked swing-gates at the places described in the schedule hereto from the date hereof until the 31st day of December now next ensuing and no longer, subject to the following conditions, that is to say:—

1. That this licence may at any time be revoked by the Governor of the Colony of Victoria for the time being, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and the licensee shall not be entitled to any money or compensation for or in respect of by reason of such revocation. And the licensee shall, immediately upon the publication in the *Government Gazette* of a notice of the revocation of this licence, remove every gate erected under the authority hereof.

4. That the licensee will, at his own expense, during the currency of this licence, firmly erect, place, or fix at or on the said gates, in a conspicuous position, a good and substantial notice-board, on which shall be well and distinctly painted a notice setting forth that the gates are erected on a public road leading to and from the places to and from which the road does lead, and giving the names of such places, and indicating the directions, and stating the approximate distances each way to the next gates (if any).

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF THE GRANT OF £233,000 BY PARLIAMENT TO PROMOTE THE AGRICULTURAL, DAIRY, FRUIT, AND WINE INDUSTRIES

WHEREAS by the Act No. MXLIII. the sum of Thirty-seven thousand pounds was authorized to be spent in giving bonuses in respect of factories for fruit-canning, fruit-drying, dairying, raisin and currant making, vegetable oil making, preparing for the manufacturer flax, hemp, silk, and other products to be named in regulations.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the colony of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby amend the regulations made for the purposes aforesaid by Order in Council dated the 29th day of April, 1890, in manner following, that is to say:—

Subdivision No. 1. Item 2.

TOBACCO FACTORIES.

1. A bonus of Fifty pounds may be paid to any individual, association, or company, who produces evidence to the satisfaction of the Minister of Agriculture for the time being that he or they have between the 1st day of January, 1891, and the 30th day of June, 1895, manufactured in Victoria, exclusively from plants grown in the said colony, 2,000 lbs. weight of tobacco, of a good quality of current marketable value.

2. An additional sum of Five pounds may be paid to any such individual, association, or company for each 200 lbs. of such tobacco manufactured by him or them between the dates aforesaid in addition to such 2,000 lbs.

3. No individual association or company shall claim any bonus as proprietor of more than one factory in respect of tobacco manufactured by him or them, nor shall the amount of bonuses to be paid in respect of any tobacco manufactured by him or them to any individual, association, or company exceed Five hundred pounds.

4. Every individual, association, or company intending to commence or carry on the process of manufacturing tobacco, and who intends to claim a bonus for such manufacture shall, before commencing work, give notice in writing to the Secretary for Agriculture of his intention so to commence, and of the locality where the manufacture is to be carried on.

5. All factories in respect to which a claim for a bonus is to be made under these regulations must be shown to have been, together with the books thereof, open to inspection at all reasonable times by persons appointed for that purpose by the Minister, and the proprietors of such factories shall supply such information relating to the bonuses of such factories as may be required by the Minister.

6. If it appear to the Minister that any factory, buildings, machinery, or appliances are not of a suitable character, and in proper working order, he may direct that any bonus, which would otherwise be payable, shall be withheld either for a time or altogether.

WHEREAS by section 102 of the *Water Act 1890*, No. 1156, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time fix a sum which shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by any owner or occupier of property liable to be rated by any Waterworks Trust: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the now in part recited Act, doth order and direct that the sum of One pound sterling (£1) shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated by the Woodend Waterworks Trust.

WHEREAS by the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of Part I. of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out Part I. of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order the following alteration in and addition to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces made on the 3rd day of December, 1888, that is to say:—

Part I., Section V., page 10, paragraph 7, is to read:—The Council of Defence shall, on the nomination of the Commandant, recommend to the Governor in Council competent officers, who

have previously served in the Imperial Regular or Auxiliary Forces, or in any Colonial Militia or Volunteer Force, who may be considered suitable for appointment in the Victorian Military Forces. All such officers will be posted on probation for six months, during which time they must pass such practical examination as may by general order be directed, failing which their commissions will not be confirmed. The time of probation may be extended on the recommendation of the Commandant for a period not exceeding six months. Officers on probation (with the exception of those employed in the Permanent Forces) shall not receive any pay whilst on probation unless special authority be given. Upon the confirmation of their appointments pay will be granted to officers for all duties performed when on probation subsequent to the dates of their commissions, provided that the amount for the financial year does not exceed that laid down in Part III, section 3, paragraph 13 of the Victorian Military Regulations. In the case, however, of an officer whose probationary service has been extended no pay shall be given for a period of more than six months prior to confirmation.

WE, Robert Hood, Francis Tozer, James Astley Bromfield, Octavius Frederick William Palmer, and Robert Brand Paterson, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land at Warrnambool reserved for recreation purposes, having framed the following Supplementary Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The saddling paddock shall include the enclosure to the east of a line from the south-east corner of the stewards' stand to the nearest part of a picket fence surrounding the stewards' rooms and weighing enclosure.

2. No person shall, after the sixth day of November, 1890, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker on any portion of the reserve other than upon the said saddling paddock and upon the hill enclosure, and then only when he shall have obtained the consent in writing of the Committee of Management of the reserve, or the stewards of the Warrnambool Racing Club, or those authorized by such Committee of Management or stewards.

3. Every person carrying on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, whether in the saddling paddock or hill enclosure, shall, during the time he shall be so carrying on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, wear a ticket, to be supplied by the Committee of Management of the reserve, or the stewards of the Warrnambool Racing Club, or by those authorized by the said Committee of Management or stewards, which ticket shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
