**BYE-LAW No. 81.**

**T**HE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Victorian Railways Commissioners Act 1883*, do hereby make the following Bye-law, and all previous Bye-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

**FARES FOR CONVEYANCE BY PASSENGER TRAINS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—**

1. Firemen travelling on duty to be charged Holiday Excursion Fares on production of the necessary warrant.
2. The price of Quarterly and Half-yearly tickets for all lines to be as follows:—  
Quarterly—First class, £21; Second class, £14.  
Half-yearly—First class, £40; Second class, £26 10s.
3. The Monthly Fares between Melbourne and Newport shall be 18s. First class, and 14s. Second class.
4. Fares from Melbourne to Bacchus Marsh Race-course by Special Race Trains—First Return, 7s. 6d.; Second Return, 4s. 6d.
5. Return tickets (suburban, and stations mentioned in Bye-law 42, clause 4, excepted) to be available for return for one month from date to date. For example, a ticket issued on 15th January is available for return on 15th February, and should the final day fall on a Sunday it will be available on the following Monday.

**CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—**

6. Horses going to Military Parades to be charged single rate for the return journey.
7. Fourpence per dozen to be charged for Returned Empty Fruit Buckets by passenger trains.
8. Returned Empty Pork Wrappers to be charged 1d. each by passenger trains for any distance; to be prepaid in stamps.
9. Sea-shells, for Garden Paths, in full truck loads, to be carried at Firewood Rates.
10. The minimum for Lime for Manure (A.P. class) is reduced to 5 tons.
11. Bulk Beer, Colonial, from Country Stations to Melbourne, to be carried under Special B Class Rates and Conditions; Returned Empties, same rate, with no minimum.
12. Rabbits, Dead, to be charged First class rates.
13. Starch, Colonial made, to be charged Second class rates, in lots of not less than 1 ton, if owners accept all risks, and consign on Form 86c.
14. Ice, by passenger trains, to be charged Second class rates, if in waterproof cases.
15. Glass, broken, to be carried at Firewood rates.
16. Coring, from Chewton to Melbourne and Suburbs, to be charged 1d. per ton per mile in full truck loads.
17. The minimums on Firewood set forth in Bye-law 77, clause 14, will also apply to Goods carried at Firewood rates.
18. Sulphur and Saltpetre, from the Port to Powder Factories in the country, to be carried under Special B class rates and conditions.
19. Poultry and Dogs will be returned free from Agricultural Shows, if the usual Show Conditions for Stock are complied with.
20. The minimum for a sheep truck to be 20s., exclusive of the 2s. terminal.
21. Bye-law 77, clause 15. The distance from Melbourne at which Store Sheep, Cattle, and Horses may be discharged is reduced from 50 to 40 miles.
22. Cheese, Colonial, from different Consignors to one Consignee, 10 cwt. to be considered the minimum.
23. Weighing charges on all Dray Weighbridges owned by the Department in Melbourne and Suburbs to be 2d. for every load of 2 tons and under, and 3d. for every load over 2 tons.
24. Preserved Fruits, Colonial manufacture, to be charged 4s. per ton from Melbourne to the Williams-town or Port Melbourne Piers for shipment.
25. Rice, *ex* vessels at the Port Melbourne Pier, to Port Melbourne Siding, to be charged 2s. per ton.
26. Wheat from Williamstown to North Melbourne to be charged 1s. per ton, if previously sent from country stations.
27. Agricultural and Vegetable Seeds, Barley, Beans, Canary-seed, Grass-seed, Linseed, Oats, Pease, Seed Potatoes, Rape Seed, Rye, and Seed Wheat to be carried at Agricultural Produce rates, with a minimum of 3s. 9d. for distances under 67 miles; 67 miles and upwards, minimum 10 cwt.; otherwise Miscellaneous class with First class minimums.
28. New Castings, manufactured at up-country towns and sent to Melbourne, Geelong, or Portland for exportation, or sent to Melbourne and thence to any station out of Melbourne, to be charged Special B class rates.
29. Goods Tariff, General Conditions, clause 9. The time after which Returned Empties may be sold is altered from 3 days to 1 month.
30. Out of the Through rate for carriage of Fresh Fish and Game by passenger and mixed trains from Kingston, South Australia, to Melbourne, the proportion due to the Victorian Railways shall be 8d. for each 28lbs or part thereof; minimum charge, as for 1 cwt.

## NOTICE TO PLUMBERS AND GASFITTERS.

THE attention of plumbers and gasfitters is directed to the following provisions of section 71 of the *Public Health Act 1889*:—

"The Board may from time to time make, alter, or rescind regulations providing for the registration of plumbers and gasfitters.

GRANT OF THREE HUNDRED POUNDS (£300) FOR  
INVENTION OF A CHEAP MEANS OF COOLING  
A CHAMBER FOR THE PRESERVATION OF MILK,  
CREAM, AND BUTTER.

## REGULATIONS.

1. A sum not exceeding Three hundred pounds (£300) may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce an improved cheap means of cooling a chamber for the preservation of milk, cream, and butter, such means to be suitable for use on farms and at butter factories during hot weather.

2. The reward shall be payable to the inventor (or his agent) of such appliances as shall efficiently, cheaply, and rapidly perform what is required, viz.:—Reduction of the chamber to a temperature of 50°, and to remain at that temperature not less than ten hours at a time, when the temperature outside the building is not less than 120°, without the aid of ice, chemicals or machinery.

3. A reward of such sum as may be approved by the Minister may be paid to the inventor, or his agent, who shall by chemical means produce the required temperature, provided the means used are of a cheap character, in proportion to the advantages gained, and such as can be readily applied.

4. A reward may likewise be paid to the inventor, or his agent, of machinery of a cheap character which shall produce like results.

5. All competitors shall cause to be constructed a chamber 10 feet long, 10 feet wide, and 10 feet high, within which such trials as may be considered necessary shall be made.

6. Trials shall be made at such times as may be approved by the Minister.

7. All costs and expenses connected with trials shall be paid by the persons competing.

8. The Minister may appoint two or more judges to report upon the merits of the appliances.

9. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts, the total of which shall not exceed Three hundred pounds (£300) to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful appliances, such amount or amounts to be apportioned according to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

10. Persons intending to compete must give notice, in writing, of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, not later than the fifteenth of February, 1890.

WHEREAS by section 63 of *The Irrigation Act 1886*, No. 898, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any Trust appointed under the said Act for the purposes, among others, following:—

For determining the period for which Commissioners of any Trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order—

That clauses 13 and 15 of certain regulations bearing date the 25th day of November, 1889, providing for the election of Commissioners of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 29th day of November, 1889, shall be and the same are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be and be deemed to be and may be cited as clauses 13 and 15 respectively of the said regulations:—

13. *Notice of election.—Nomination of candidates.*—Third Schedule.—Twenty-one clear days before any election of commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the said district, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said district, or at some place outside the said district not more than three miles from the boundary thereof, to be named in such notice, in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than seven nor more than ten days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination in the form of the Third Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than six persons duly qualified to vote at such election, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate in token of his assent to being so named; and such candidate or some person on his behalf shall, at the time when such nomination paper is delivered to the returning officer, pay into the hands of such returning officer the sum of Twenty pounds, to be dealt with as by law provided. And no person who shall not have been so nominated, or by whom or on whose behalf such payment shall not have been so made, shall within the subsequent provisions of these regulations be deemed to be a candidate at any election of commissioners.

15. *Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners to be elected.*—Fifth Schedule.—Notice of poll.—Hours of polling.—If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates the number of candidates exceed the number of commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full, in the form of the Fourth Schedule hereto, and shall also forthwith give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the irrigation district, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such places within the said district as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint; and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Nine o'clock a.m. and close at Four o'clock in the afternoon.

WHEREAS by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may proclaim any city, town, borough, or populous place comprising the whole or any portion of a Waterworks District to be an "Urban District" for the purposes of the said Act, and may name the limits thereof: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor of Victoria, and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and made in pursuance of the said Act, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, did proclaim the townships of Dimboola and Donald to be Urban Districts within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do, by this Proclamation, revoke the Proclamation aforesaid only so far as it relates to the township of Dimboola.

"THE IRRIGATION ACT 1886."

IN the matter of the petition of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, praying for the constitution of a certain portion of its Waterworks district as an Irrigation and Water Supply District within the meaning of the said Act, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust for such district.

Pursuant to section 18 of the said Act, I hereby declare upon the said petition the matters following, viz.:—

1. That the scheme or plan of works will comprise a storage reservoir at Lake Lonsdale, with channels from Fyans Creek, the Mokepilly Creek, and Pleasant Creek, to divert their waters into the basin; a main supply channel from the reservoir to the Glenorchy weir, which will be enlarged and strengthened to adapt it to act as the distribution head-work; a system of distribution and reticulation channels to convey and distribute the water throughout the irrigable area of the Trust district; and the existing channels, dams, tanks, and other works owned by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust.

2. That all the works shall be Trust works.

3. That the amount of money which it is proposed that the Board of Land and Works shall advance by way of loan, for the purpose of carrying out the said works, is Four hundred and twenty-five thousand pounds (£425,000) sterling.

4. That the rate of interest to be paid by the Trust upon such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.

5. That the sources from which the Trust will obtain its water supply will be the Fyans Creek, Mokepilly Creek, and Pleasant Creek, the waters of which will be stored in a reservoir to be constructed at Lake Lonsdale; and the Wimmera River at Glenorchy weir. From the reservoir the Trust will be entitled to take and use the whole volume of water stored therein. From the Wimmera River at Glenorchy, the Trust will be entitled to take and use two-thirds of the total natural volume at any time flowing therein, provided that no water shall be withdrawn from the river when its volume is less than three hundred (300) cubic feet per minute.

6. That the powers of rating to be given to the Trust shall not exceed the sum of Four shillings in the pound of the net annual value of the property in the Trust district.

**REGULATION No. 1.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust do hereby make this Regulation for annual rating and other charges and purposes as follows:—

1. For every house or tenement of £20 annual value or under, situated within the area supplied by the water mains of the Trust, the minimum sum of £1 per annum shall be charged.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, used partly or wholly as a domicile, 5 per cent. on the annual value.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, not being a domicile,  $\frac{3}{4}$  per cent. on the annual value; minimum, £1.

4. For water supplied from channels for irrigation purposes the rate shall be 1d. per 1,000 gallons, which is equivalent to 6d. per 1,000 cubic feet. Delivery shall be made of not less than 60,000 gallons at one time, and the water shall be delivered from the channels at such times and in such manner as may from time to time be directed by regulations made by the Trust.

5. All measurement of water for irrigation shall be by gauges, approved, fixed, and kept in repair at the expense of the owner or occupier of the land irrigated, and to the satisfaction of the Trust. The registration of the quantity supplied shall be made by an officer of the Trust, and the gauges shall not be removed or interfered with without the consent of such officer.

6. Delivery of water for irrigation shall be taken at such times and in such order as the Trust shall direct, and if absolutely necessary, shall be continued on Sunday. Every person shall receive notification of the time when water will be supplied to him, and to what extent.

7. Any person not being duly authorized who shall open irrigation outlets, or do any act that may cause damage to the works of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

8. Applications for water for irrigation shall be accompanied by cash for payment of same to the amount covering quantity required, but the Trust shall not necessarily deliver the full amount of any such order thus received. Any sum paid for water not supplied will be returned to the applicant.

9. For every water trough the sum of 10s. per annum shall be paid.

10. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, 10s. per annum on each inch of the diameter of the cylinder.

11. The rate to be charged for water supplied by the Trust from any standpipe shall be 1s. for one load of 200 gallons or less, and for each additional 100 gallons or part thereof, 6d.

12. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement from the mains (except a special agreement be made) 2s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons shall be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purposes of irrigation, or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

In cases of extensions of area supplied, or new applications from persons desirous of obtaining a supply of water by measurement, during the currency of the year, all such applications granted subsequent to 30th June in any year shall be entitled to a rebate of one half the annual charge.

In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 3,000 gallons per stall used for above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

13. For water supplied by the Trust to public parks, gardens, or show yards (except a special agreement be made), 6d. per 1,000 gallons shall be charged; and to market gardens, nurseries, and vineyards, cultivated for trade purposes, 1s. per 1,000 gallons.

14. In lieu of any of the measurement charges in this regulation, the Trust may, whenever it shall be deemed expedient, or any person obtaining water from the mains, may cause a meter or meters to be affixed; such to be provided at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at rates to be fixed by written agreement for a period of not less than six months. The annual water rate payable on shire assessment to go in liquidation of such charges by measurement, and be supplemented by any additional amount required. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons.

15. For a temporary supply during erection of buildings a charge of 5s. per week during period of erection, with a minimum of 10s., or by meter, as mentioned in clause 14. When a special connection with the main has to be made the applicant must pay the cost of such connection.

16. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stable, or a supply for any manufacturing purpose, or for irrigation of grass plots, gardens, or grounds, either by manual conveyance or mechanical

or artificial contrivance for transporting water to the roots of plants, or trees, or grasses, either with or without labour; or for water power; or for fountains or any ornamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants unless the water is supplied by measure, computed by acreage as above, or by meter.

17. If any meter should cease registering, from period of such cessation, and during the time when it is undergoing repair, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

18. Fire plugs shall not be used except for purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.

19. Any person receiving water from the Trust, who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

20. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe or channel, without being authorized by the Trust to do so, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

21. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or for the purpose of irrigating gardens, &c., without paying the charges imposed by these regulations, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each breach.

22. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

23. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

24. No person (whether a licensed plumber or not) shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust; nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust, appointed for the purpose. And any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such breach.

25. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention to do so, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, open, or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, weir, channel, reservoir, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £20.

26. Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for the purpose of laying on the water from the main to any house or premises, he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of £2, and in case he shall not, immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of £2 shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good or restoring the said footpath or otherwise as the Trust may deem best.

27. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, under a penalty of £5, and in the event of continuing the offence to a penalty of £2 for each day after notice from the Trust.

28. Overflow waste pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

29. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as the Trust may deem fit, unless the necessary repair shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipe, the occupier, if any, and if none, the owner shall, in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of £2 for each day after notice of offence from the Trust.

30. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of £2 for each offence.

31. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes, or permits to be done anything in contravention to these regulations or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charges imposed by the Trust, when due, or fails to do anything which, under any of these regulations, ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

32. In construction of these regulations the word "person" shall extend to and be deemed to include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.

The above-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st January, 1890, and ending on the 31st December, 1890, and shall be paid half-yearly in advance on the 1st January and 1st July, 1890; and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust may from time to time approve of for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

## REGULATION No. 4.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

## REGULATION FOR THE MAKING OF A RATE FOR THE YEAR 1890 ON ALL THE RATEABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE ST. ARNAUD SHIRE WATERWORKS DISTRICT.

The following rate for the year 1890, commencing on the first day of January, is made on the annual value of all the rateable property within the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being on such lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shire of St. Arnaud, that is to say, a rate of Sixpence in the pound on such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made payable on the first January, 1890.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may, from time to time, appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, clean white (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Botanic and Domain Gardens may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1890, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No. " endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. *Tenders are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.*

3. *The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.*

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, marked cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that the Department undertakes to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders are accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

Packets up to 3 lbs. in weight are conveyed by horseback services.

12. 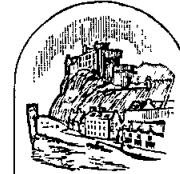

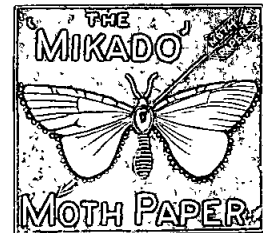
