TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP, COMMERCE, AND NAVIGATION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND THE REPUBLIC OF PARAGUAY.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and its enclusure, are published for general information.

My Lord,—With reference to my Circular Depatch of the 2nd of July, 1886, and my Despatch "General" of the 4th of December, 1886, respecting the Commercial Treaty with the Republic of Paraguay, I have the honour to acquaint you that the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope having expressed the wish to adhere to the Treaty, but to be exempted from the operation of Article VIII., relating to military service, it was proposed to the Government of the Republic, who have consented thereto, that all the Colonies mentioned in Article XV., and adhering to the Treaty, should be exempted therefrom; and I now transmit to you, for the information of the Colony under your government, a printed copy of a Declaration signed at Assumption, on the 19th of July last, recording the accession of certain of the British Colonies, including that under your government, to the Treaty in question.

Whereas by Article XV. of the Treaty of Friendship, Commorce, and Navigation between Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and His Excellency the President of the Republic of Paraguay, signed on the 16th October, 1884, the ratifications whereof were exchanged on the 10th May, 1886, provision was made for the accession to the said Treaty of certain British Colonies; and whereas the Government of Paraguay have agreed that any of the said British Colonies may accede under the condition that, notwithstanding such accession, they shall not be bound by the stipulations of Article VIII. of the said Treaty, the undersigned, His Excellency Francis John Pakenham, Her Britannic Majesty's Minister Plenipotentiary to the Republic of Paraguay, and His Excellency Juan Crisostomo Centurion, Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Paraguay, have agreed as follows:—

The following British Colonies, that is to say:

Newfoundland, Victoria,
Western Australia,
Tasmania,
Queensland,
Cape of Good Hope, and
Natal,

accede to the said Treaty of the 16th October, 1884, under the condition that they shall not be bound by the stipulations contained in Article VIII. thereof; and the provisions of the said Treaty, with the exception of Article VIII., are hereby made applicable to the said Colonies from the date of the signature of the present

Interpretation of terms.—In the construction and for the purpose of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them:—"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises; "cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or other offensive matter below the surface of the ground; "street" shall mean and include any highway or any public bridge, or any lane, road, footway, square, alley, court, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

2. The construction in the future of any cesspool for the deposit of night-soil or other offensive matter is hereby prohibited.

3. The use of a closet-pan known as the Hesse Sanitary System is hereby adopted.

4. The Council will furnish a pan or pans at every dwelling or place where necessary upon the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—For one pan the charge will be Twenty-six shillings per annum, and for two or more pans the charge shall be Twenty-shillings each additional pan per annum, payable quarterly in advance, that is to say, on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, the 1st day of October in each and every year.

of April, the 1st day of July, the 1st day of October in each and every year.

5. The fees referred to in the preceding section must be paid to the person appointed by the Council to receive payment of the same within seven days when due or payable, or in default legal proceedings will be taken for recovery of the before-named fees.

6. Every closet must be constructed with a door or opening sufficiently large to admit of the removal of pan or pans, and shall be available for access for such removal whon required.

7. No person will be allowed to remove any night-soil, unless duly authorized by this Council.

8. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall once at least in every week, between the hours of sunrise and sunset, allow each pan to be removed for cleansing purposes.

the hours of sunrise and sunset, allow each pan to be removed for cleansing purposes.

9. Every person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings.

10. The foregoing by-law, number five, shall apply to and have operation in the part or in the place or places within the jurisdiction of the Wannon Shire Council as follows, that is to say, all that area comprised within the limits of the surveyed boundaries of the township of Coleraine.

11. This by-law shall come into operation from and after the date of publication in the Government Gazette.

The angle subtended by the extreme points of Bezout Island was 16 degrees, sounding 8 fathons, sand bottom. AMENDED REGULATIONS FOR THE CONSTITUTION OF LOCAL PROSPECTING BOARDS FOR RECOM-MENDING THE BETTER DISTRIBUTION OF THE MONEYS VOTED BY PARLIAMENT FOR PROS-PECTING FOR GOLD.

WHEREAS the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, did, by an Order made on the 3rd day of December, 1888, make amended "Regulations for the Constitution of Local Prospecting Boards for recommending the better distribution of the moneys voted by Parliament for Prospecting for Gold," which said Order was published in the Government Gazette of the 7th day of December, 1888: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the said Regulations: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth order that the fourth and sixteenth clauses of the said Regulations be and the same are hereby repealed and doth order that the following clauses be substituted therefor, that is to say:—

4. Tenure of office to be one year.—The members of each of such Boards shall hold office for the period of one year from the time of their appointment or election, unless disqualified, as provided in these properties.

(a) The Governor in Council will nominate a mining surveyor as a member of the Board.

(b) Election of representative of Mining Board.—The Secretary for Mines shall, ten days at least before the day of election, publish in the Government Gazette, and in the newspapers circulating in the district as he may consider necessary, a notice to the chairman of the Mining Board of each of the mining districts requiring him to take the necessary steps to convene a special meeting of the members of the Mining Board of which he is chairman, on the second Wednesday in the month of January next following such notice, for the purpose of electing one of the members of the said board as the member appointed by the Mining Board of the district upon the Local Prospecting Board of the district upon the Local Prospecting Board of the district upon the Local Prospecting Board of the district and the said Mining Board shall take the necessary steps accordingly, and shall, within three days after the day of election, forward to the Secretary for Mines the result of such election. such meeting to the police magistrate, and such police magistrate shall, within three days after the day of election, forward to the Secretary for Mines the result of such

(d) Election of representative of Miners' Association.—The Secretary for Mines shall, twenty-one days at least before the day of election, publish in the Government Gazette, and in such newspapers circulating in the district as he may consider necessary, a notice to the secretary of each of the branches of the Amalgamated Miners' Association within each of the mining districts, calling upon the members of such branch to attend upon the day of election at such place or places within the mining district, and at such hour as the Secretary for Mines shall in such notice appoint, to elect a person to represent the various branches of the Amalgamated Miners' Association within such district upon the Local Prospecting Board of the mining district, and each of such branches of the Amalgamated Miners' Association within each of such districts shall appoint a representative accordingly. Fourteen clear days before the day appointed for any election under this division any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall cause to be delivered to the police magistrate hereinafter mentioned, or his deputy, a nomination paper stating therein the Christian arms and sunday and such such such and seven and survance of such sendidate. pays appointed for any election under this division any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall cause to be delivered to the police magistrate hereinafter mentioned, or his deputy, a nomination paper stating therein the Christian name and surname of such candidate, and every such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than tem persons being members of the Amalgamated Miners' Association duly qualified to vote at such election, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate in token of his assent to being so named. Each representative of such branches of the Association shall be entitled to one vote at any such election and no more; and in the event of any question or dispute arising as to whether any person attending at any such meeting is or is not entitled to vote, or in any manner to interfere with or take part in such meeting, or in any other matter affecting such election, the police magistrate or deputy residing at such meeting shall decide such question or dispute and allow or refuse permission to such person to vote, and the decision of the said police magistrate or deputy shall be final and conclusive. In case any meeting is presided over by a deputy then such deputy shall forthwith report the result of the election at such meeting to the police magistrate, and such police magistrate of the police magistrate or deputy shall be final and conclusi

trate, and such police magistrate shall within three days after the day of election forward to the Secretary for Mines the result of such election.

(e) Election of representative of municipalities.—The Secretary for Mines shall, twenty-one days at least before the day of election, publish in the Government Gazette, and in such newspapers circulating in the district as he may consider necessary, a notice to each city, borough, and shire council (outside a radius of ten miles from the General Post Office) within each of the mining district, intimating that the council of each such municipality may nominate a person to be the representative of the several municipalities within such mining district. Fourteen clear days before the day appointed for any election under this division the council of any such municipality desirous of nominating a candidate shall cause to be delivered to the police magistrate herein-after mentioned, or his deputy, a nomination paper stating therein the Christian name and surname of such candidate, and every such nomination paper shall be authenticated by having the common seal of the municipality affixed thereto, and shall be also signed by the person named therein as a candidate in token of his assent to being so nominated. If on the expiration of the last day for nomination only one candidate is nominated by the municipalities within any mining district the police magistrate aforesaid shall declare such candidate to be, and such candidate shall he, the representative member for such municipalities upon the Board. If, on the expiration of the last day for nomination, more than one candidate to the non-instance of the such candidate shall he, the representative member for such municipalities upon the Board. If, an the expiration of the last day for nomination, more than one candidate has been nominated as aforesaid, a police magistrate (selected by the Governor in Council) shall for each such group repare a list of all persons so nominated, and shall send one of such lists to the council

#### EUROA WATERWORKS TRUST REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Euroa Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, hereby make the following regulation:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District, that is to say:—

- For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a donicile of Twenty pounds annual value, and under the amount which at the rate levied for the year would be payable in respect of a tenement of Twenty pounds annual value.
- 2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual value, the amount payable in respect of such annual value at the rate levied for the
- 3. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of Twenty shillings per annum.
- For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, l'ifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler.
- 5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, except in cases of special agreement by the Trust, One shilling for every thousand gallons.
- 6. That for a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. shall be charged on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or, in the absence of a contract, Twenty shillings per cent. upon the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be:—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per thou-sand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes only, thirty thousand gallons per half-year. No hose or pipe is to be supplied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees, or plants, or washing house, walls, or carriages, or for any similar purpose unless the water is charged for by meter.

Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five

Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

No person shall lay any pipe or communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

nation to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

The service pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of the consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, ½-in. diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, ½-in. diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust to the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe otherwise, as to the Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or

No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supply-ing the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than ten gallons can escape at each flush. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence will be One pound.

The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence will be One pound. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates, or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which, under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said regulations and not otherwise.

For the construction of these regulations, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Euroa Waterworks Trust.

3. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate

with the pipes of the Trust; nor shall make such communication with the pipes of the Trust; nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach

4. Where water is supplied for domestic use, except when paid for by meter or under special agreement, the supply shall be through service-pipes of the following diameter, according to the assessed annual municipal value of the premises supplied, viz.:—

5. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for any livery or carrier's stables, or for mannfacturing purposes, or for any other purpose not provided in these regulations.

6. No person shall apply a hose or pipe to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing the hours walls, or a carriage, or for any similar purpose, unless where the water is charged for by meter, between the hours of seven o'clock a.m., and five o'clock p.m., except by the written authority of the Trust, and any person committing a hreach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or after, or ropair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent person, and shall also hold a licence issued to him by the Public Health Department. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such first-named licence at any time.

9. The quality of materials required in laying private services shall be as follows:—

(1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles (except those connecting the service-pipes and the mains), bends, reduced

Il be as follows:—

(1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles (except those connecting the service-pipes and the mains), bends, reduced couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.

(2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.

(3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

threaded and capable of being science timbles, ees, &c.

(4) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet.

(5) All delivery cooks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and the mains to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows, bends, &c., all cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.

(6) No service-pipes shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than ten inches.

10. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust. Each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interered with except upon written application to, and with the

11. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to, and with the approval of, the Trust. Any person offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

13. No person shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrants and hose attached to fire-plugs. Any person offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

14. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

15. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or of any land and tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

16. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste. Any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes, or permits to be done anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which, under these regulations, ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

18. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all reasonable times to enter any house, building, or lands, to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied, or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and may from time to time enter any house, building, or lands for the purpose

of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Trust; and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection, or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceed.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Koroit Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act 1899, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulationaries.

1. The Trust may supply water for the making and mixing of concrete, and for masonry and brickwork, at the rate of Sixpence per cubic yard, as measured in the work.

2. Water supplied by the Trust by measurement will be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per One thousand gallons, and in cases where the supply is solely for purposes other than domestic the minimum charge will be for 25,000 gallons per quarter.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter, where water is supplied for domestic and for other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which, at One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure, and for domestic purposes solely.

4. The Trust may grant permission to persons requiring water for domestic and for other than domestic purposes to affix two service-pipes, one for domestic supply, without meter, for which the ordinary assessed rate shall be paid, and one for other than domestic purposes with meter, the water used therefrom to be paid for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons, but subject to such regulations as may be approved by the Trust against the use or re-use of water from the domestic. Provided, however, that when water is supplied under this regulation the regulations 2 and 3, hereinbefore contained, shall not apply, and the consumer shall, with respect to the water taken by measure, be only chargeable for the quantity actually taken, without respect to the minimum fixed by the said regulations 2 and 3 hereof.

5. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water from any drinking tapt

Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, attering, remiring, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

9. Such licence shall be for such period, and shall be from time to time renewable, as the Trust shall see fit, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employés, committing any breach of these regulations.

10. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for the same shall satisfy the trust that he is a competent plumber.

11. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days notice to the

Trust of his intention to do so, or who shall in any way tamper

Trust of his intention to do so, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open lock, cock, valve pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

12. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line, to be properly screwed and covered with approved cast-iron cap.

16. No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of Trust.

17. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe convenience from the unice of the Trust ire whether the property service person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe con-

16. No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of Trust.

17. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Trust may seem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes the occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall, in every instance in which after notice that service-pipe requires repairing any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

18. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

3. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or any garden, trees, or plants, or washing any house, walls, or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter. Any person offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises or who shall allow any

carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five

")

person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameter:

For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, \$\frac{1}{2}\$-inch diameter.

For the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, \$\frac{1}{2}\$-inch diameter.

For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by moter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

6. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust, to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

7. No person shall connect any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter. Any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Such meter shall be submitted to and examined by the authorized officer of the Trust who if he shall find the supercerest.

Such meter shall be submitted to and examined by the authorized officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect, and the meter when fixed shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection, and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the keys of the meter shall be in possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe leading from the service-pipe unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

7. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.
8. All delivery-cocks to be of high pressure, and of strong hard brass, and in all exposed places to be open and shut by a movable key or handle.
9. Plumbers or other persons amployed to lay on service places.

9. Plumbers or other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and fix meters, or to refix or relay the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.

10. No meter shall be fixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises or of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the -pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

12. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting

Any person who, having been served with the notice mentioned in clause 5 of this regulation, shall refuse or neglect to provide a meter within the time in such notice specified, shall be liable to a penaly not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall still refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such vertice.

14. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste.

15. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

16. No pipes shall be affixed to the main pipe, nor to any service-pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus, without notice in writing of the intention so to do being given to the Trust, and the consent of the Trust thereto first had and obtained.

17. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC REGREATION IN THE PARISH OF DOUTTA, GALLA, KNOWN AS THE WEST MELBOURNE REGREATION RESERVE.

REGREATION RESERVE.

WE, James William Peirce, Richard Bowen, John Lettey, Joseph McBride, Charles E. Hirst, and John Illman, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the parish of Doutta Galla, hereinafter designated West Melbourne Recreation Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the cate, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the Land Act 1890:—

- 1. The West Melbourne Recreation Reserve shall be divided
  - (1) The grand stand, pavilion, members', and ladies'

All persons shall be admitted to the third division, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on days whereon international, intercolonial, cup, and other important cricket or football matches shall be played, or on days on which sports shall be held in the West Melbourne Recreation Reserve, provided always that the number of days upon which fees for admission to the West Melbourne Recreation Reserve may be charged and collected shall not exceed more than fifty-two (52) in any one (1) year.
- 3. No person shall enter at any time into any part of the first division, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing such person in that behalf.

  4. Every person paying for admission to the third division, or any part thereof, or to the grand stand, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission which he shall upon demand produce, and, if required, surrender to any gatkeeper or other person having authority from the Committee of Management to demand production or surrender of same, and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.

5. Persons renting or hiring any stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any cricket or football match or sports may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), which the Committee of Management may determine, by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure, and the Committee of Management may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee of Management in reference to the West Melbourne Recreation Reserve, buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.

6. No person shall enter or remain in the West Melbourne Recreation Reserve, anguage, or conduct.

7. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the West Melbourne Recreation Reserve, norshall fighted therein.

7. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the West Melbourne Recreation Reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

8. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the West Melbourne Recreation Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones therein.

9. No person shall put in the West Melbourne Recreation Reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals.

10. No person shall bring into the West Melbourne Recreation Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord.

11. No person shall erect any dwelling in the West Melbourne Recreation Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.

12. No person, except workmen employed in the West Melbourne Recreation Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.

13. Any persons committing in the West Melbourne Recreation Reserve, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed from the West Melbourne Recreation Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased, and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto, or to any part thereof:—

(a) Being drunk or using any profane, indecent, or obscene

(a) Being drunk or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language.

(b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.

(c) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match or sports, or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground, would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.

(d) Being found in any part of the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd division of the West Melbourne Recreation Reserve and not producing on denand, or surrendering if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized, a ticket for the admission of such person to the place wherein he or she may be found, unless such person thall forthwith satisfy the Committee of Management, or any person deputed by it, that he or she has paid the proper charge for admission to such place, and that the ticket of admission supplied to such person has been lost.

Provided always that the Committee of Management may exempt any person wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such charges or fees.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 191, Local Covernment Act 1890, the President, Councillors, and Rate-payers of the Shire of Preston order as follows:—

1. Street musician to move on.—Any street musician or vocalist shall, when required by any householder or his servant, or by any member of the police force, depart from the neighbourhood of the premises of such householder.

2. Processions not to be held without consent.—No procession of persons or of vehicles, or both, for other than funeral purposes shall parade or pass through any of the streets or roads, unless with the previous consent in writing of the president, or, in his absence, the secretary of the shire, and only by the route specified in such consent, nor unless and until the recipient of such consent shall have given at the least twenty-four hours notice, with particulars of such consent and route, to the officer in charge of the police station.

3. Strects may be closed against traffic.—Whenever, for the prevention of accident, or the maintenance of order, and for such time as by notice in writing under the hand or by direction of the president, or, in his absence, or the case of sudden emergency, under the hand of the secretary of the shire, any carriage-way, foot-way, street, or other public place shall be declared to be closed against traffic of persons or of vehicles, or both, and all persons and all drivers of vehicles contemplated by such notice shall, when required by any member of the police force, obey and conform to such notice by abstaining from going to, or by withdrawing and removing from, the carriage-way, foot-way, street, or other public place declared by such notice to be closed against traffic. And the drivers of all vehicles, whether public or private, which may be there, whether plying for hire on any duly appointed stand or otherwise, shall, when so required by any member of the police force, remove their vehicles thence, and if desiring to remain in the vicinity, shall proceed to any other carriage-way, footway, street, or other public place that may be indicated by the police for that purpose, and there arrange and order their vehicles in the manner directed by any member of the police force.

4. Assembly of rehicles.—Upon any occasion when any number exceeding ten vehicles shall be assembled and waiting at any one and the same place, the driver of every such vehicle shall, as to the placing and otherwise thereof, comply with the directions given by any member of the police force placed on duty there for the preservation of safety and order.

5. Penalty.—Every person guilty of any breach of the provisions of the foregoing by-law shall be liable for such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Ten


