The births of 1,540 children, viz., 749 boys and 791 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of March. In the month of February 1,401 births were registered, or 139 less than in the month under review. The births were 501 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 161 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in March numbered 995, viz., 538 of males and 457 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 545, or 55 per cent. The deaths exceeded those in February by 117, and were above the average of February during the previous ten years by 339. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have only exceeded that average by 125.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.36, and of deaths registered 2.17.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 94.6° on the 5th and 16th, and the lowest was 49.0° on the 1st and 2nd. The mean temperature of the month (66.6°) was 3 degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (36.6°) took place on the 5th, and the least (4.7°) on the 18th. The mean daily range was 15.3°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.294 inches on the 29th, and the lowest was 29.784 inches on the 5th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.005 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 10 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.62 inch. The average rainfall in March during the previous ten years was 2.18 inches, or half an inch more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 44 per cent. to that mortality, as against 43 per cent. in 1889, 44 per cent. in 1888, 44 per cent. in 1887, 46 per cent. in 1886, 41 per cent. in 1885, 42 per cent. in 1884, 37 per cent. in 1883, 43 per cent. in 1882, 43 per cent. in 1881, and 47 per cent. in 1880.

Thirty-eight deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these a labourer, aged 75, died of cancer; a washerwoman, aged 75, of apoplexy; a clerk, aged 75, of heart disease; an engineer, aged 75, of pneumonia; a labourer, aged 75, of injury to the leg, the result of being passed over by a vehicle; a solicitor, aged 75, of injuries caused by falling down stairs; 2 females, each aged 76, of syncope; a sea captain, aged 76, of pneumonia; a female, aged 76, of injury to the hip—how caused not stated; a gatekeeper, aged 77, of insanity; a stockman, aged 77, of heart disease; a teacher, aged 77, of jaundice; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 78, of heart disease; a bootmaker, aged 78, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 78, of ulcers; a baker, aged 79, of paralysis; a female, aged 79, of congestion of the lungs; a teacher, aged 81, of apoplexy; a female, aged 81, of paralysis; a female, aged 82, of insanity; a cabinetmaker, aged 82, of liver disease; a gentleman, aged 83, of inguinal hernia; a distiller, aged 88, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 88, of bronchitis; a female, aged 90, of apoplexy; a gentleman,

The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A groom, aged 20, a bricklayer, aged 23, a seaman, aged 28, a salesman, aged 29, a butcher, aged 30, a storeman, aged 31, a lumper, aged 38, a labourer, and a farmer, each aged 53, two bootmakers, aged 64 and 68 respectively, and a solicitor, aged 75, died of injuries consequent on falls; a boy, aged 8, was passed over by a tramcar; a boy, aged 2, a cellarman, aged 34, and a labourer, aged 75, were passed over by vehicles; a baker, aged 21, a shunter, aged 29, and a female, aged 51, were killed by railway trains; an engineer, aged 43, was killed by jumping from a train in motion; a female, aged 30, died of hæmorrhage from a wound in the vagina—how caused not stated; a boy, aged 6, of injury to the neck; a female, aged 76, of injury to the hip; a seaman, aged 29, of accidental death—how caused not stated; a female infant, aged 1 year, a firework-maker, aged 27, an actor, aged 32, and a carrier, aged 43, of injuries consequent on burns; a female infant, aged 10 months, a male and a female infant, each aged 1 year, and a labourer, aged 83, of injuries, the result of scalds; a female infant, aged 3 months, a draughtsman, aged 35, and a labourer, aged 58, of sunstroke; a male of occupation unknown, aged 45, of poisoning with chlorodyne; two boys, aged 10 and 12 respectively, were drowned in Lake Preston; a male child, aged 5, and a female, aged 31, were drowned in a waterhole; a stereotyper, aged 25, two males of occupation unknown, aged 35 and 52 respectively, and a female, aged 59, were drowned in Hobson's Bay; a female, aged 30, was drowned in the River Yarra; a male and a female infant, aged five days and two months respectively, were overlain; a female, aged 18, was suffocated during a fit which occurred whilst she was eating, and a bootmaker, aged 58, whilst intoxicated. The homicidal deaths were those of a male infant, who was suffocated at birth; a male infant, aged one month, who died of starvation—a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case; and of a carrier, aged 25, who died of fracture of the skull—a verdict of manslaughter being returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a plasterer, aged 30, who shot himself; a labourer, aged 50, who poisoned himself with "Rough on Rats"; and a railway foreman, aged 47, who hanged himself.

One hundred and seventy-seven deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—73 in the Melbourne Hospital, 35 in the Alfred Hospital, 15 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 5 in the Children's Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 11 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Austin Hospital, 6 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 2 in the Infant Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 439, of which 227, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 212, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 283 were under one year of age, 102 were between one and two, 24 were between two and three, 16 were between three and four, and 14 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 556. Of these, 311, or 56 per cent., were males, and 245, or 44 per cent., were females; 32 were between five and ten, 20 were between ten and fifteen, 28 were between fifteen and twenty, 53 were between twenty and twenty-five, 61 were between twenty-five and thirty, 47 were between thirty and thirty-five, 47 were between thirty-five and forty, 29 were between forty and forty-five, 31 were between forty-five and fifty, 40 were between fifty and fifty-five, 37 were between fifty-five and sixty, 40 were between sixty and sixty-five, 30 were between sixty-five and seventy, 23 were between seventy and seventy-five, 22 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 16 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from specific febrile or zymotic diseases, of which an increase of 12 was noted in the report for February, again increased by 5 in March. Under this head, deaths from diphtheria increased from 46, to 56, and deaths from typhoid fever from 73 to 89. On the other hand, deaths from scarlatina fell from 7 to 4, deaths from whooping-cough from 8 to 7, and deaths from diarrheal

diseases from 66 to 49. In addition to the deaths set down to diphtheria, 10 deaths from diphtheritic croup were recorded during the month, as against 2 from that complaint in both February and January. One death from influenza was reported in the month under review.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each of the first three months of the present and the two previous years:—

REGULATION IN RESPECT OF ALBERT PARK, IN  
THE CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE, AND THE  
BOROUGH OF SAINT KILDA.

WHEREAS by the Crown Grant issued in favour of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Saint Kilda, and the Board of Land and Works, and their successors in respect of Albert Park, in the City of South Melbourne, and the Borough of Saint Kilda, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being shall thereon be maintained and used as and for a Public Park for the recreation, convenience and amusement of the people, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria for the time being, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime until and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Saint Kilda, and the Board of Land and Works. Now, therefore, the Council of the City of South Melbourne, the Council of the Borough of Saint Kilda, and the Board of Land and Works do hereby make, in lieu of Clause 7 of the existing regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said Albert Park, the regulation following to be observed and enforced in respect thereof:—

REGULATION.

No person shall bring into the Park any dog for coursing or other sporting purposes or for bathing, and all dogs allowed in the Park shall be led by a chain or cord and shall be confined to the walks or drives. All goats and poultry found in the Park shall be liable to be destroyed.

Every person offending against the foregoing regulation shall on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such regulation, and who after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the Trustees or by any constable, does not desist from offending, shall be forthwith arrested and taken to any justice, officer, servant, or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace and shall on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The house coal must be the best of its kind, free from shale, small coal, dust, or other impurities. The smiths' coal must be free from dust, ashes, shale, or other impurities.

2. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies; and the requirements shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer issuing the order. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the supplies accepted and shall return the order to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such supplies may

be returned to the contractor. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned. Should an order not be complied with within forty-eight hours, it will be competent for the department concerned to purchase at the contractor's risk, and to deduct from the contractor's account or the security money the extra expense (if any) over and above the contract price.

3. The contractor will be bound to weigh the coal on delivery at such establishments as are provided with weighbridges. In other cases the tickets of the public weighbridges are to be accepted as the weight to be charged for. Coal to be delivered in the places set apart therefor.

4. As soon as the orders shall have been completed, the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supply as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

6. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

7. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of station, will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged, as in condition 6.

8. A refusal to execute orders, or a repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 6.
