The births of 1,540 children, viz., 749 boys and 791 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of March. In the month of February 1,401 births were registered, or 139 less than in the month under review. The births were 501 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 161 above that average, if allowance be made for the increase of

The deaths registered in March numbered 995, viz., 538 of males and 457 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 545, or 55 per cent. The deaths exceeded those in February by 117, and were above the average of February during the previous ten years by 339. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have only exceeded

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3'36, and of deaths registered 2'17.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 94.6° on the 5th and 16th, and the lowest was 40.0° on the 1st and 2nd. The mean temperature of the month (66.6°) was 3 degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (36.6°) took place on the 5th, and the least (4.7°) on the 18th. The mean daily range was 15.3°. The highest atmosonipheric pressure recorded was 30.291 inches on the 29th, and the lowest was 29.784 inches on the 5th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.005 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 10 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.62 inch. The average rainfall in March during the previous ten years was 2.18 inches, or half an inch more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. One hundred and seventy-seven deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—73 in the Melbourne Hospital, 35 in the Alfred Hospital, 15 in the Homocopathic Hospital, 5 in the Children's Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 11 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Austin Hospital, 6 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 2 in the Infant Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 439, of which 227, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 212, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 283 were under one year of age, 102 were between one and two, 24 were between and three, 16 were between three and four, and 14 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 556. Of these, 311, or 56 per cent., were males, and 245, or 44 per cent., were females; 32 were between five and ten, 20 were between ten and fifteen, 28 were between fifteen and twenty, 53 were between twenty and twenty-five, 61 were between twenty-five and thirty, 47 were between thirty and thirty-five, 47 were between forty, 20 were between forty and forty-five, 31 were between fifty-five and fifty-five, 37 were between fifty-five and sixty, 40 were between sixty-five and sixty-five, 30 were between sixty-five and seventy, 23 were between seventy and seventy-five, 22 were between seventy-five and 6 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from specific febrile or zymotic discases, of which an increase of 12 was noted in the report for February, again increased by 5 in March. Under this head, deaths from diphtheria increased from 46, to 56, and deaths from typhoid fever from 73 to 89. On the other hand, deaths from scarlatina fell from 7 to 4, deaths from whooping-cough from 8 to 7, and deaths from diarrhocal

diseases from 66 to 49. In addition to the deaths set down to diphtheria, 10 deaths from diphtheritic croup were recorded during the month, as against 2 from that complaint in both February and January. One death from influenza was reported in the month under review.

REGULATION IN RESPECT OF ALBERT PARK, IN THE CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE, AND THE BOROUGH OF SAINT KILDA.

BOROUGH OF SAINT KILDA.

WHEREAS by the Crown Grant issued in favour of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizons of the City of South Melbourne, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Saint Kilda and the Board of Land and Works, and their successors in respect of Albert Park, in the City of South Melbourne, and the Borough of Saint Kilda, it is provided and 'declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being shall thereon be maintained and used as and for a Public Park for the recreation, convenience and amusement of the people, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria for the time being, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Saint Kilda, and the Board of Land and Works. Now, therefore, the Council of South Melbourne, the Council of the Borough of Saint Kilda, and the Board of Land and Works do hereby make, in lieu of Clause ment of the said Albert Park, the regulation following to be observed and enforced in respect thereof:—

REGULATION.

No person shall bring into the Park any dog for coursing or other sporting purposes or for bathing, and all dogs allowed in the Park shall be led by a chain or cord and shall be confined to the walks or drives. All goats and poultry found in the Park shall be liable to be destroyed.

Every person offending against the foregoing regulation shall on conviction before any justice forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such regulation, and who after he has been warned by any officer or servant of the Trustees or by any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such officer, servant, or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace and shall on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
