PROBATE AND ADMINISTRATION IN CERTAIN CASES.—"IMPERIAL REVENUE ACT 1889."

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and a copy of sections 18 and 19 of the *Imperial Revenue Act 1889*, are published for general information.

SIR,

I have the honour to transmit to you a copy of the *Imperial Revenue Act of 1889*, and to request that you 52 & 53 Victoria, will cause sections 18 and 19 to be published chapter 42. for information in the colony under your Government.

During the sittings of the Colonial Conference in 1887, the attention of Her Majesty's Government was called to the *Companies (Colonial Registers) Act 1883*, which had the effect of requiring probate or letters of administration to be taken out both in the colony and in this country in respect of the wills or estates of colonial shareholders holding shares on the colonial registers of banks and other companies. The proceedings on the subject at pages 76 and 107 of Parliamentary Paper C. 5091, Volume I., and the papers then laid before the Conference, are printed at pages 47, 48, 49 of the Parliamentary Paper C. 5091, Volume II. The promise given in the former that this grievance should be remedied has now been redeemed by the passing of section 18 for the purpose.

A somewhat similar complaint was brought to the notice of Her Majesty's Government in connexion with policies of life insurance issued in the colonies by insurance companies carrying on business in the colonies, but having their head office in the United Kingdom. The sums recoverable under such policies were held to be assets situated in the United Kingdom; and under section 11 of the *Imperial Revenue Act 1884* the production of a grant of representation from a court in the United Kingdom, by probate, or letters of administration, or confirmation, was necessary to establish the right to recover or receive such amounts.

The hardship of this provision upon persons who had no real connexion with the United Kingdom has been recognised, and section 19 has been passed to remove it.

EXTRACTS FROM "IMPERIAL REVENUE ACT 1889" (52 AND 53 VICT., CH. 42).

18. *Amendment of 46 and 47 Vict. c. 30, s. 7, as to shares in colonial registers.*—Notwithstanding provision (b) in section seven of the "Companies (Colonial Registers) Act 1883," the share or other interest of a deceased member, registered in a colonial register under that Act, who shall have died domiciled elsewhere than in the United Kingdom, shall, so far as relates to British duties, not be deemed to be part of his estate and effects situated in the United Kingdom, for or in respect of which probate or letters of administration is or are to be granted, or whereof an inventory is to be exhibited and recorded.

19. *Amendment of s. 11 of 47 and 48 Vict., c. 62.*—The proviso to section 11 of "The Revenue Act 1884," is hereby repealed, and that section shall be read as if the following proviso were therein inserted in lieu of the repealed proviso:—

Provided that where a policy of life assurance has been effected with any insurance company by a person who shall die domiciled elsewhere than in the United Kingdom, the production of a grant of representation from a court in the United Kingdom shall not be necessary to establish the right to receive the money payable in respect of such policy.

**REGULATION RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS UNDER SECTION 2 OF 22 VICT. No. 86.**

**HIS** Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to rescind the following portion of Clause 25 of the General Regulations respecting Public Accounts, dated 26th May, 1874, namely:—

"As regards Expenditure other than Salaries, Wages, and Allowances fixed by Law—

"Heads of Departments shall, so soon as funds are legally available for the service of any financial year, and thereafter not later than the 15th September, the 15th December, and the 15th March in each year, prepare on the Form (K) annexed an Estimate of moneys likely to become due and payable during the ensuing quarter for their respective departments; and shall submit the same to the Minister for the purpose of obtaining his sanction to certify accounts for payment to the extent specified in such Estimate; only when absolutely necessary may Supplementary Estimates be submitted for the like purpose between the dates above specified. Copies of all approved Estimates shall be forthwith transmitted, under the signature of the Minister, to the Treasurer and the Commissioners of Audit."

PUBLIC HEALTH.—TOWN OF NORTH MELBOURNE.  
By-LAW No. 23.

For Regulating the Carriage of Meat through the Streets of the Town.

THE Local Board of Health in and for the Town of North Melbourne, in the colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, by virtue of the powers contained in *The Public Health Acts 1865-1888* and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 23 of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1st. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Central Board of Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2nd. From and after the date of this by-law coming into operation no person shall bring, or cause to be brought into the town of North Melbourne, or carry or cause to be carried through the streets thereof, in any cart or other vehicle, any butcher's meat or carcass of meat unless such cart or other vehicle be so constructed that the rays of the sun and the rain and dust are not allowed to fall on or be capable of reaching such meat or carcass of meat and that proper sitting accommodation be provided for the driver thereof, nor shall any person bring or cause to be brought or carry or cause to be carried through any street of the said town in any cart or other vehicle any butcher's meat or carcass of meat, the covering or screen for protection whereof from sun, rain, and dust, shall be in a foul or uncleanly state.

3rd. Any person guilty of any breach of this by-law shall for every such offence be liable in the discretion of the convicting justices to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds or less than Five shillings.

The foregoing by-law was duly made, ordered, and passed, by the said Local Board of Health, being the Municipal Council in and for the Town of North Melbourne, this twenty-third day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

## GRANT OF THREE HUNDRED POUNDS (£300) FOR INVENTION OF A CHEAP MEANS OF COOLING A CHAMBER FOR THE PRESERVATION OF MILK, CREAM, AND BUTTER.

## REGULATIONS.

1. A sum not exceeding Three hundred pounds (£300) may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce an improved cheap means of cooling a chamber for the preservation of milk, cream, and butter, such means to be suitable for use on farms and at butter factories during hot weather.

2. The reward shall be payable to the inventor (or his agent) of such appliances as shall efficiently, cheaply, and rapidly perform what is required, viz.:—Reduction of the chamber to a temperature of 50°, and to remain at that temperature not less than ten hours at a time, when the temperature outside the building is not less than 120°, without the aid of ice, chemicals or machinery.

3. A reward of such sum as may be approved by the Minister may be paid to the inventor, or his agent, who shall by chemical means produce the required temperature, provided the means used are of a cheap character, in proportion to the advantages gained, and such as can be readily applied.

4. A reward may likewise be paid to the inventor, or his agent, of machinery of a cheap character which shall produce like results.

5. All competitors shall cause to be constructed a chamber 10 feet long, 10 feet wide, and 10 feet high, within which such trials as may be considered necessary shall be made.

6. Trials shall be made at such times as may be approved by the Minister.

7. All costs and expenses connected with trials shall be paid by the persons competing.

8. The Minister may appoint two or more judges to report upon the merits of the appliances.

9. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts, the total of which shall not exceed Three hundred pounds (£300) to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful appliances, such amount or amounts to be apportioned according to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

10. Persons intending to compete must give notice, in writing, of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, not later than the fifteenth of February, 1890.

## DRAWBACK REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of January, 1890.

IN accordance with the provisions of, and in exercise of the powers conferred by *The Drawbacks Act 1872*, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby cancel all the Regulations relating to Drawbacks at present in force, and doth order that the subjoined Regulations be substituted therefor, and that they take effect from and after the first day of January, 1890, that is to say.

## DRAWBACK REGULATIONS.—ACT 36 VICT. NO. 434 AND ACT 41 VICT. NO. 594.

## I.—GENERAL.

1. A drawback of duty paid on importation into Victoria may be allowed on the exportation therefrom of the goods mentioned in Schedules Nos. 1, 2, and 3, hereunto attached, and at the rate therein respectively specified, provided that in no case the amount of drawback shall exceed the amount of duty paid on importation; and that Schedule No. 1 shall cease and determine on 31st December, 1889, except as to goods upon which a lower rate of duty has been paid than that shown in Schedules Nos. 2 and 3.

2. In order to entitle the exporter to claim any such drawback, he shall comply with the following conditions:—

Form A. (a) A notice in the Form A must be given to the Collector of Customs at the port of export, at least two working hours before, of the intention to pack.

(b) The usual export entry must be passed and security given by bond as provided by ss. 137 and 138 of the Act No. 768 (or, if desired, the said entry and bond may be deposited with the Inspector of Drawbacks before the vessel by which the goods will eventually be shipped has been entered out, the name of the ship being subsequently filled in prior to shipment of the goods), accompanied by invoices, distinguishing—

Goods—Free ;

„ Liable to *ad valorem* duty, specifying the rate of duty paid on importation;

„ Boots and shoes, specifying the sizes and rates of duty paid on importation;

„ Manufactured in Victoria from materials imported, and rate of duty paid on such material ;

„ Liable to fixed duties, specifying the rates of duty paid on same ;

such invoices shall set forth legibly in respect to each specific class of articles the quantities, qualities, sizes, values, and general description of same, the actual cost price received, or to be received, from the purchaser of the goods, and in respect to boots and shoes the respective sizes, number of pairs, &c. The entry having been passed or deposited (as required above), and invoices in duplicate as required having been stamped, said entries and invoices, together with the notice, Form A, must be presented to the proper officer of Customs, before whom or any justice of the peace such of the declarations contained in Schedule E hereto as will suit the circumstances of the case must be made and subscribed by the exporter or his duly authorized representative, and in case such goods shall be exported by a firm, by its duly authorized representative, or by a member of such firm.

In the case of fixed duty goods only, such of the declarations contained in Schedule E hereto as will suit the circumstances of the case can be used.

(c) The full amount of *ad valorem* duty paid upon importation may be allowed as drawback on the goods mentioned in Schedule No. 2, subject to the following conditions, viz. :—

1. The entry having been duly dealt with as hereinbefore provided (*vide* clauses 1 and 2), shall bear on its face the words "Full duty paid claimed as drawback," and shall show thereon also the original invoice values (with 10 per cent. added thereto), and the rate of duty paid, and the declaration on back of said entry shall be in accordance with the Schedule hereto (Form E).

2. The original invoices produced at the time the import entry was passed, and which must bear the Customs stamp and Landing Waiter's initials as evidence of such production, shall be shown to the proper officer.

3. Statement of original invoice values, &c., as per Form D, must accompany the entries.

4. The goods for export on which drawback is claimed must be capable of easy identification by the officers of Customs with the original invoices, either by showing the maker's marks, or numbers on such goods, or by being still in the original packages in which imported, or such other evidence as to the Collector of Customs shall seem satisfactory.

5. Export (or Purchaser's) invoices must accompany the entry (see Declaration, Form E).

6. Travellers' samples will not be allowed drawback under this clause.

Entries passed under clause (c) must bear on the face of same the following statement, viz.:—

Full duty paid claimed as drawback.

- (d) Drawback will be allowed on travellers' samples subject to the conditions that the usual export entry and invoices have been passed and dealt with as directed in clauses (a) and (b), and that the appropriate declarations as provided in Schedule E have been duly made and subscribed.

Entries passed under clause (d) must bear on the face of the same the statement as follows:—  
"Travellers' Samples."

- (e) Every facility desired must be given to the officer to enable him to superintend the examination and packing of the said goods, and to take a correct account according to the invoice thereof.
- (f) Upon the completion of the packing, the goods must be secured to the satisfaction of the Inspector of Drawbacks, and despatched in charge of a carrier duly licensed under the Customs laws into the Customs shed, or delivered to the custody of the export officer for shipment; or, if not so forthwith removed, they must be deposited in some secure room approved by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, under the lock of the Crown, until removal.
- (g) If the exporter cannot specify the number of packages in the entry, such may be inserted, and the officer in charge is hereby required to see that such is inserted, prior to the removal of the packages.
- (h) Such proof shall be given to the Inspector of Drawbacks as may be required that full duty was paid on importation.
- (i) Words and expressions used in these regulations and the schedules hereto shall have the meanings assigned to them respectively in any Act relating to the Customs.
- (j) The exporter may, in writing, authorize any of his clerks to pass drawback entries, and make the required declarations on same, and also to certify to the correctness of the invoices and statements; provided such authority is previously lodged with and approved by the Collector of Customs. (See Act No. 768, sec. 100.)

3. No drawback of duty will be due or payable unless the debenture (Form B or C) duly completed is received by the Collector of Customs, Melbourne, or Sub-Collector, Geelong, as the case may be, not later than the last day of the month following that in which the goods are exported, nor unless the total amount of drawback on such debenture is One pound or upwards, nor until such debenture has been examined by the Jerquer and found correct by him, and been approved under the hand of such Collector of Customs or other officer duly authorized by him.

4. Debentures may be paid one week after the shipment of the goods, but nothing contained in these regulations shall be held to compel the Collector of Customs to pay any claim for drawback which he may consider it inadvisable from any cause whatever to allow.

5. Exporters of goods for drawback of duty shall pay to Her Majesty a charge of Two shillings per hour, or any portion of an hour, during the time an officer is employed under these regulations, and any other expense incurred, as certified by the Inspector of Drawbacks, and no debenture shall be passed for payment until such expenses shall have been paid.

6. Exporters of goods for drawback of duty at any appointed Victorian port on the River Murray must specify on the entry the name of the consignee and final destination of the goods, and at each port on the River Murray the officer in charge will attend at his office, on such day and at such hour as may be directed by public notice from the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, to pass such goods for drawback in respect to which he may have received due notice.

Debentures under this regulation must be rendered to the Collector of Customs at Melbourne (see clause 3), who will, if they are correct, pay them at the Custom House, Melbourne, or remit the money to the claimant, less the cost of remittance.

7. No drawback of duty will be payable on goods except on packages re-packed in the presence of or inspected by an officer of Customs, who will in the latter case cause such to be examined as may be directed by the Inspector of Drawbacks, and certify on the entry, invoice, or statement, as the case may be, that such has been done, specifying whether the quantities, values, weights, &c., as the case may be, were correct or not on such examination.

8. The person before whom the declaration on the drawback debenture must be made shall be any justice of the peace; and all other declarations may be made before any such justice or an officer of Victorian Customs.

9. The hours of business for drawback officers are from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., closing on every Saturday at 12 noon. Should the exporters require an extension of time, an overtime application must be made to the Inspector of Drawbacks, on approval of which such extension will be allowed.

10. No drawback of duty will be allowed on second-hand goods subject to fixed rate of duty on importation.

11. Drawback of duty will be allowed upon second-hand goods liable to an *ad valorem* duty on importation (and enumerated in Schedule No. 2), but such drawback will be calculated only on the value of such goods at the time of export, such value to be specially approved by the Inspector of Drawbacks.

12. Should the Collector of Customs desire it, any goods may be re-opened or re-examined after having been passed by the drawback officer; and the unpacking or re-packing of such goods shall be conducted by or at the expense of the exporter.

13. The Commissioner of Trade and Customs is also hereby empowered, but subject to the provisions of the Act No. 768, to cause any debenture to be passed for payment though these regulations may not have been strictly complied with.

14. When there are a number of debentures for one exporter, the various amounts may be shown on a schedule (see Form F), and on such schedule (with the debentures attached) the one signature of the Jerquer and of the Collector and of the person receiving payment for said debentures shall be sufficient.

WHEREAS by the 78th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, or repeal regulations for any purpose whatsoever connected with the execution of the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order make the following regulation, that is to say:—As it is believed that the disease known as scab in sheep still exists in certain parts of the Colonies of New Zealand and Western Australia, the importation of sheep skins from New Zealand, the importation of sheep and sheep skins from Western Australia into Victoria is by this order prohibited on and after the 17th day of January, 1890.

And the Honorable John Lamont Dow, Her Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## MURCHISON WATERWORKS TRUST CONSTITUTED.

WHEREAS by *The Water Conservation Act 1887* it was amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application for the constitution of a waterworks trust should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act, have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should

(a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out such proposed waterworks, and of paying the cost and expense of preparing the general plan and description of the same, and the costs of the application for the constituting of such Waterworks Trust; and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted;

(b) Specify the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Waterworks Trust should have authority, to be called a Waterworks District;

(c) State what are the principal works to be constructed;

(d) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and

(e) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with this Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council thinks fit.

And it was further enacted that the Governor in Council might, where a Waterworks District is either wholly or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for such riding or ridings, together with any other person or persons, not exceeding three in number, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the councillors for the Eastern Riding of the Shire of Waranga, for a loan of Two thousand pounds sterling (£2,000) to carry out certain waterworks for the domestic supply of a Waterworks District under the said Act, embracing the township of Murchison, as shown on the general plan and description accompanying the said application, deposited in the Department of Victorian Water Supply, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1) The construction of the said waterworks, and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust.

No. 5.—JANUARY 17, 1890.—3.

(2) That the councillors for the Eastern Riding of the said Shire of Waranga Municipal District and three other persons shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.

(3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Two thousand pounds sterling (£2,000), for the purpose of constructing works for the supply of the township of Murchison with water, and also for paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payment of which interest shall be made half-yearly.

(4) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be the township of Murchison, as described in the *Government Gazette* of the 25th day of February, 1861, page 407, and as shown on an Order in Council plan deposited in the office of the Minister of Water Supply, Melbourne.

(5) The principal works to be constructed shall consist of a pumping plant on the bank of the Goulburn River at Murchison, a service tank, a main pipe, and the reticulation of the township of Murchison.

(6) The name of the Trust shall be the Murchison Waterworks Trust.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by section 18 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, No. 946, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Waterworks Trust has been by Order in Council duly constituted, make additional Orders in Council not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act relating to such Waterworks Trust, and that the Governor in Council may in such Order among other things repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Waterworks Trust:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 12th day of February, 1889, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 15th day of February, 1889, a Waterworks Trust, known and incorporated as the Ballan Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted:

And whereas it is deemed necessary to repeal clauses Nos. 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the said Order in Council.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth order—

That clauses numbered 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the said Order in Council shall be, and the same are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be, and shall be read as clauses numbered 2, 3, 4, and 5 respectively of the said Order in Council:—

2. The Councillors for the time being for the Central Riding of the Shire of Ballan and three other persons shall be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District.

3. That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be One thousand two hundred pounds (£1,200) sterling for the purpose of carrying out approved works and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.

4. That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the boundaries of the Township of Ballan, Parish of Gorong, Counties of Grant and Bourke, as described in the *Government Gazette* of 1861, page 401, and as shown on an amended Order in Council plan deposited in the office of the Minister of Water Supply, Melbourne.

5. That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Trust shall be the reticulation of the Township of Ballan.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Additional Regulations made by the Dental Board of Victoria, pursuant to the provisions of *The Dentists Act 1887* (51 Vict. No. 960).

ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF BOARD.

- 1. Appointment of returning officer.**—The Board shall from time to time appoint (and may remove) some fit and proper person, who is registered as a dentist, and not being a member of the Board, to be returning officer, and to conduct the election of members of the Board in accordance with the provisions hereinafter made in that behalf.
- 2. Expense of elections.**—The Board shall pay to the returning officer for his own use, out of the moneys accruing under *The Dentists Act 1887*, a fee of £2 2s. for each and every election conducted by such returning officer, together with a sum of money sufficient to recoup him all expenses incurred for the purpose of holding and conducting such election.
- 3. Election of eight members.**—In the month of February, in the year 1891, the returning officer shall proceed to the election of eight persons of whom four at least shall be registered dentists of Victoria, and three shall be legally-qualified medical practitioners registered under the *Medical Practitioners Act 1865*, and the persons so elected at such election shall serve as members of the Dental Board of Victoria for the respective periods as hereinafter provided.
- 4. Annual election.**—In the month of February, in the year 1892, and in the month of February in each and every next succeeding year, there shall be an annual election of as many persons to be members of the Dental Board of Victoria as there are vacancies created (not being extraordinary vacancies) in each of such years; and the persons so elected at such annual election shall hold office for a term of three years then next ensuing from the date of such annual election, and no longer.
- 5. Retirement of eight members elected in 1891.**—At the annual election in 1892, two of the members elected in 1891, being the two members who at such election received the fewest number of votes of the members returned, shall retire from office, and thereby create vacancies to be filled up at such annual election. At the annual election in 1893, the two members who at such election in 1891 received the next lowest number of votes above the members who retired in 1892, shall retire from office, and thereby create vacancies to be filled up at the annual election in 1893. And at the annual election in 1894 the remaining four of the eight members elected in 1891 shall retire from office, and thereby create vacancies to be filled up at the annual elections in 1894. In the event of any two or more of the members returned in 1891 having received an equal number of votes, and thereby creating a tie between or among them, the president shall, in the presence of the Board, determine by lot which one of such members shall be the member first to retire.
- 6. Returning officer to give notice of day of election and day of nomination, time and place when and where nominations will be received.**—At every election for members to serve on the Board the returning officer shall give twenty-one days' notice, by advertisement in the *Argus*, *Age*, and *Daily Telegraph*, or such other papers as may from time to time be approved of by the Board, of his intention to proceed on a certain day, to be named in such advertisement, to hold an election of fit and proper persons to serve as members on such Board; and he shall also in such advertisement name a day, being not less than twelve days nor more than fifteen days prior to the day named for holding such election, on or before which all candidates for election must be nominated, as hereinafter provided; and he shall also, in such advertisement, name the time and place when and where such nominations will be received, and shall sign such notice and affix the date it is given thereto.
- 7. Who may nominate, and how.**—Any person registered as a registered dentist in Victoria, desirous of nominating any other person as a candidate, shall fill up a nomination paper in the form of the first schedule hereto, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required by such schedule, and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than five persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also by the person therein named as a candidate accepting such nomination. Such nomination paper must be lodged or delivered by post before four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the day fixed for nominations.
- 8. When returning officer may declare members elected without a poll.**—When a poll shall be taken.—The returning officer shall, in the event of there not being a greater number of persons nominated than are required to fill the vacancies created, make a return to the registrar of the Board, and declare such person or persons to have been duly elected member or members of the Board; but if the number of persons nominated is greater than the number of persons required to fill such vacancies, a poll shall be taken, and he shall cause voting papers to be printed in the form given in Second Schedule hereto, and shall sign each of such

papers, and cause one to be enclosed in an envelope not fastened, with the name and address of the returning officer printed thereon, and one of such voting papers and printed envelopes shall be sent by post under a fastened cover to the address of each and every registered dentist of Victoria, and resident in Victoria.

**9. Returning officer to ascertain number of voters for each candidate, in presence of registrar and scrutineers.**—Candidates declared duly elected.—*Casting vote of returning officer.*—The returning officer shall, on the day named in such advertisement for holding any election, proceed, in the presence of the registrar and of any scrutineers appointed by any candidate, to open the envelopes with his printed address thereon, and which have been returned to him, and to take out the voting papers therein contained, and if he is satisfied after comparing each of the signatures in such voting papers with the signatures of the voters in the signature book, kept by the registrar, and that each vote is properly given, he shall proceed to ascertain the number of such votes for each candidate; and as soon as conveniently may be after the day of holding such election, the returning officer shall give public notice by advertisement of the number of votes given to each candidate, and shall declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to be duly elected as members of the Dental Board of Victoria, and if two or more candidates shall have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote.

**10. Voting paper may become invalid.**—*Voting paper to be posted to address of returning officer.*—If any voter shall suffer to remain not struck out upon any voting paper a greater number of names than the number of members to be elected, or shall fail to attach his signature thereto, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect; and shall not be counted by the returning officer. The voter shall enclose such voting paper in an envelope furnished to him with the printed address of the returning officer thereon; and shall post the same so that it shall be received by the returning officer in course of post before the day fixed for holding such election.

**11. How candidate may retire.**—If any person who shall duly have become a candidate for such election, and three of the persons having signed the paper nominating him shall be desirous that he retire before the day of holding such election from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid, not later than eight clear days before the day of holding such election, may sign and deliver a notice in the form of the Third Schedule hereto stating that such candidate so retires, and the returning officer on receipt of such notice shall omit the name of such person so retiring from the voting paper, and if the number of candidates shall by such retirement be reduced to the number of members to be elected, the returning officer shall declare the remaining members duly elected.

**Appointment of scrutineers.**—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint in writing one scrutineer, to be present when the returning officer shall open the envelopes containing the voting papers on the day of holding the election.

The Marine Board Act 1887.  
ADDITIONAL REGULATION FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF PILOTS.

WHEREAS by section 39 of *The Marine Board Act 1887* it is, among other things, enacted that subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Marine Board of Victoria may exercise the powers and shall perform the duties exercised and performed before the commencement of the said Act by the Pilot Board of Victoria; And whereas section 64 of *The Passengers Harbours and Navigation Statute 1865* provides, among other things, that the Pilot Board of Victoria may make and alter or repeal rules and regulations for the examination of persons as to their competency to act as pilots, and for the granting of certificates under the 62nd section of the said Act; and whereas the said Marine Board did, on the twenty-third day of May, 1889, make regulations for the appointment of pilots, and such regulations were approved by the Governor in Council on the twenty-eighth day of May, 1889; and whereas it is desirable to add to the same, now therefore the said Board, with the consent of the Governor in Council, doth hereby make the following additional regulation, namely:—

REGULATION 2A.

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1890 on the annual shire valuation of the said urban district.
2. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said urban district.
3. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the Trust works, Three shillings and fourpence for every thousand gallons shall be charged.
4. Such rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1890.

Such person or persons as the said Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges. REGULATION No. 1.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust, do hereby make the following regulations:—

The following charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by measure, that is to say—

1. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of Two pounds per annum.
2. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Ten pounds per annum.
3. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.
4. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when the water is supplied by measure shall be—

(1) If for domestic use and other than domestic use, the quantity for which the charge of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes only, thirty thousand gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{4}$ acre and less, 8,000 galls. per annum.	"	"	"	12,000	"	"

Livery and carriers' stables, for each stall or space of five feet 3,000 "

Stand-pipes or hydrant, water for each load of 100 gallons or under One shilling.

And for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first or any one load, to be taken at the time of taking Sixpence.

(3) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

5. Every person who is supplied by the Trust with water by measure shall, at his own expense, provide a meter (which meter shall be submitted to and examined by the proper officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in prop

working order, shall give his certificate to that effect), which, when fixed, shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the key of the meter shall be in the possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe leading from the service-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

6. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

7. All delivery cocks to be of high pressure, and of strong hard brass, and all exposed places to be open and shut by a movable key or handle.

8. Plumbers or other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to relay or refix the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.

9. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

10. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from the works of the Trust, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the purpose and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

11. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after receiving notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the Trust may see fit, until the necessary repairs shall be effected.

12. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, nor shall any person not supplied with water by measure at any time use water by hose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and also to have the supply of water cut off for a period not exceeding one month.

13. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

14. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that water cannot flow continuously, and not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

15. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take or carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

16. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

18. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of the customers shall each have a stop-cock at the main, and shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value,  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value,  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

19. No pipes shall be affixed to the main pipe, nor to any service-pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus without notice in writing of the intention so to do being given to the Trust, and the consent of the Trust thereto first had and obtained.

20. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet-pipe to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and the bath provided with a proper well-fitted and water-tight ground outlet plug or cock.

21. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

22. The water supplied in the Trust district shall be received and used under and in accordance with these regulations and *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, and such parts of *The Public Works Statute 1865* as are incorporated therewith.

23. If any person, whether supplied with water by the Trust or otherwise, shall commit a breach of these regulations, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence; and any such person, if supplied with water by the Trust, shall be liable to have the water cut off from his premises, either by cutting the pipes by or through which such water is supplied, or otherwise as the Trust may think fit, and such supply shall cease so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

24. In the foregoing regulations wherever the word "officer" or "servant" appears, the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf.

A Regulation of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, made under *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving a rate.

IN pursuance of the powers granted and conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, the Commissioners of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust make the following Regulation:—

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Winchelsea, in

which such lands and tenements are situated, for one year, commencing on the first day of January, 1890, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1890, provided that the sum of Ten shillings shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every owner or occupier of any such lands or tenements.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, marked cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. If any swine shall be found on any land within the municipality of Heathcote, such land being unenclosed by a fence, without any person having charge of such swine, the owner of such swine shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such swine, and any officer of the Council may seize such swine and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody, and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only without naming him or otherwise describing him, such swine and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases, and the justice may order the swine to be sold, and the money arising from the sale after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded, and reasonable expenses to be assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said swine, shall be paid, if demanded within one month, to the owner of the swine, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money be not sufficient for all purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short or if no sale be ordered, the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.
