SCALE OF FEES FOR PRECEDENCE OF APPLICA-TION FOR ANALYSIS OF SOIL.

TIME Governor in Council has approved of the following scale of fees to be charged to persons desirons of having precedence given to their applications for analysis of soil by the Agricultural Chemist, namely:—

1. For report on soil or subsoil, showing the nitrogen, phosphoric acid, potash lime and chlorine, with advice as to treatment

2. For report on soil or subsoil, showing moisture, humus, nitrogen, soluble silica iron and alumina, lime, magnesia, potash, soda, phosphoric acid, sulphuric acid, carbonic acid, chlorine, sand and insoluble silicates

3. Mechanical analysis of soil or subsoil ...

4. For report giving information contained in Nos. 2 and 3, with report on ferrous oxide and nitrates 5, 5, 0 Special fees may be charged in special cases on the approval of the Minister of Agriculture.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following alterations in the Regulations for Volunteer Cadet Corps made on the 20th day of August, 1887, and published in the Government Gazette of the 2nd of September, 1887:—

Para. 3 is cancelled, and the following is substituted therefor:—No boy shall be enrolled under the age of 12 years in colleges or grammar schools. In State schools no boy shall be enrolled under the age of 12 years unless he is 4 feet 6 inches in height in his stockinged feet and is also physically fit. All enrolments shall be approved by the Commanding Officer, and each boy must have the consent of his parents or guardians to become a member.

have the consent of his parents or guardians to become a member. Para. 16 is cancelled, and the following is substituted therefor:—Cadets belonging to classes of military instruction (Senior Cadets) who have served not less than twelve months, are 17 years of age or upwards, and fulfil the regulations as regards height and physique, may present themselves at the recruits' examination for enrolment in any corps of Militia, Mounted Rifles, or Rangers. Every candidate must produce a recommendation from the Officer commanding his detachment as to general character, fitness for examination in drill, and certifying as to above-mentioned requirements. Cadets so enlisted, if passed by the Inspecting Officer, will at once be taken on the strength of the corps joined, but will be required to undergo the course of musketry for recruits.

FORAGE AND TRAVELLING EXPENSES TO POLICE MAGISTRATES.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has rescinded, from the 30th June instant, the Order, bearing date the 4th August, 1886, on the subject of allowances for Forage and Travelling Expenses to Police Magistrates, when travelling on duty, and has substituted in lieu thereof the Regulations relating thereto following, to take effect from and inclusive of 1st July proximo, that is to say:—

Clause 1. Police Magistrates shall travel by railway whenever possible, and will be supplied with forms of requisition for the necessary tickets.

Whenever railway communication is not available, they shall be repaid the actual cost of the necessary means of conveyance for the purformance of their official duties, or they may cause the claims for coach fare, or horse, or buggy hire to be sent to the Crown Law. Offices for payment.

Clause 2.—Police Magistrates shall, in addition to the above, be entitled to the following allowances for personal expenses and livery of horses, that is to say:—

livery of horses, that is to say:—

1. (a) For every day on which a Police Magistrate necessarily travels on duty within his district a journey of fifteen and less than thirty miles, returning the same day to his head quarters...

(b) The like thirty miles and over, or for every full day on which a Police Magistrate is necessarily absent on duty at any place within his district other than his head quarters and does not return to his head quarters the same day 0 10 0

during the daytime

Clause 3.—The Relieving Police Magistrate, or any other

Police Magistrate who is required to perform duty temporarily
outside his own district, shall in addition to the foregoing be paid
an allowance of Ten shillings for each full day during which such
Relieving or other Police Magistrate is doing relieving duty or
licensing duty in, or in charge of, or in travelling to and from the
district or districts other than his own.

Such daily allowance shall not be paid for any day for which
leave of absence may be granted, or for any other day which the
Minister may think proper to except, nor to the Relieving Police
Magistrate for relieving duty performed in a Melbourne or
suburban district.

Claims under this clause for travelling on licensing duty to an adjourned court, or other meeting of the members of the court, held at a place not being the place at which such court usually assembles, must be supported by a report from the chairman, informing the Minister of the special circumstances rendering such adjournment or meeting necessary.

Clause 4.—In a mountainous district, where horses cannot be easily hired, the Minister may, if he thinks fit, authorize a commuted allowance for the keep of one or two horses.

If the Police Maxistrate of such district is absent from duty

If the Police Magistrate of such district is absent from duty either on leave or through illness, for any period over a fortnight, such portion only of such commuted allowance shall be paid as the Minister may direct.

Clause 5.—Claims for refund of money paid for coach fares (unless where there is a published and regular rate of fares) for horse or buggy hire, or for livery of horses, or purchase of forage for the night, must be supported by vouchers.

Clause 6.—When the distance travelled or the state of the roads necessitates the use of two horses, a special report of the same must accompany the account.

Clause 7.—These regulations shall return be the same for the same must accompany the account.

Clause 7.—These regulations shall not apply to a Police Magistrate travelling on duty (with the consent of the Minister) for any other department, when the expenses are paid by such other department.

Clause 8.—All questions as to the interpretation and intention of these regulations shall be decided by the Minister.
