REGULATIONS.

1. Any institution claiming to participate in the Grant must be a Free Library solely, or a Mechanics' Institute, Athenaeum, Country Museum, &c., as the case may be, and Free Library combined, or a Country Museum solely, but in any case condition II. of the Grant must be strictly complied with.

2. The Grant will be allotted for three purposes, viz.:-
 (a) Building, (b) Books, and (c) Maintenance.

(a) Building will comprise the erection of or repairs to and painting of buildings, fencing in of the land, and providing furniture.

(c) Maintenance will comprise salaries, fuel, light, water, cleaning, and incidental expenses; but not more than ten per centum (10%) of the sum allotted from the Grant to any Free Library or Country Museum, and not more than twenty per centum (20%) of the total revenue of any such institution shall be expended under this head without the special permission of the Chief Secretary.

3. All applications to participate in the Grant must be made on the forms provided for that purpose, and the correctness of the particulars furnished in support of any application must be verified by a statutory declaration to be made by the president or the secretary of the institution on behalf of which the application is made.

5. The Grant shall, excepting as provided in clauses 6, 7, and 8 hereof, be distributed amongst the institutions entitled to participate therein in proportion to the sums locally collected by them from all sources during the year 1889. Provided that in any case where the total collections of an institution from its commencement to the 31st December, 1888, shall have exceeded the total amount it has received from the Government up to the end of the financial year 1888-89, then, in such case, the amount of the difference between the sum it has collected and the sum it has received from the Government during the past four (4) years, terminating with the returns for the financial year 1888-89, shall be added to the amount of its local collections for the year 1889, and the proportion which such institution shall be entitled to receive from the Grant shall be computed upon the total amount of those two sums.

The Chief Secretary shall prescribe in what manner the sum allotted from the Grant to any institution shall be expended, and no deviation from the mode of expenditure so prescribed shall be permitted without the sanction of the Chief Secretary being obtained thereto.

6. In any case where an institution was entitled to receive a sum under the provisions of clause 6 of the Regulations for the distribution of the Grant of the financial year 1888-89, and continues so entitled to receive a sum, such institution shall, in addition to receiving such sum, also receive the amount it may be found entitled to receive under the provisions of the first portion of clause 5 hereof.

7. No institution shall receive from the Grant, under any circumstances, more than the sum of Three hundred pounds (£300), and no institution shall, unless with the special consent of the Chief Secretary, be entitled to share in the Grant, unless the total amount of its local collections from all sources from the commencement of the institution to the 31st December, 1889, shall, at the least, equal the amount it has received from the Government; and the Chief Secretary may, if he thinks fit, debar any institution from participating in the Grant.

8. No institution shall, excepting where there is an objection on the part of the Department of Mines or the Department of Crown Lands and Survey to the alienation of the land, be entitled to share in the Grant, unless it holds a good title to its land, i.e., the land must be the absolute property of the institution, or have been permanently or temporarily reserved for the purposes of the institution. Provided, however, that in cases where the building of any institution shall have been erected on private property, or on leasehold land, the Chief Secretary may permit such institution to receive from the Grant such sum as he may think fit, which sum shall be expended only under the provisions of paragraph 6 of clause 2 hereof.

forms will be forwarded to institutions that have shared in previous grants, and may, on application being made to the Under Secretary, be supplied to any institution that has not previously shared but desires to do so. The envelopes of all letters forwarded to the Chief Secretary's Office on Free Libraries business are to be endorsed "Free Libraries Grant."

10. Where a Free Library or Country Museum forms a portion of the municipal buildings, or where the land on which the library or museum building is erected is the property of, or vested in, the Municipal Council, an agreement must be executed by such Council, covenanting to keep and maintain the Free Library portion of the building open to the public, or to allow the use of the land for Free Library purposes (as the case may be) in perpetuity, before any sum can, unless with the special consent of the Chief Secretary, be allotted the institution from the Grant. A form for this purpose can be obtained on application to the Under Secretary. Where the land on which the library or museum building is erected is only permanently or temporarily reserved, steps should be taken by an application to the Honorable the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey to obtain the permanent reservation of, or a Crown grant for it, as circumstances require.

11. All applications for a share of the Grant made on behalf of institutions, which have previously received aid from the Government, must be accompanied by a balance sheet showing the receipts, under different items, from all sources, and the expenditure, also under different items, for the year ended the 31st of December, 1889; and the correctness of such balance sheet must be verified by a statutory declaration, to be made by the treasurer of the institution in the following form, viz.:-

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW SHIRE.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1874* (No. 506, sec. 46), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 44th section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Wannon which is described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Wannon and constituted a new shire under the name or title of "The Shire of Balmoral."

Area described in the petition :—
Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 45, parish of Pandyk Pandyk; thence in a line north to the River Glenelg; thence following the course of the River Glenelg to the Harrow bridge, in the parish of Murryrtym; thence following the road from Harrow South to Coleraine to the south-west angle of allotment 5 in the parish of Wategat; thence east to the south-east angle of the parish of Gringegalkona; thence north to the north-east angle of allotment 2 of the same parish; thence east to the south-east corner of the parish of Bil-bil-wyt; thence north to the north-west corner of the parish of Wookurkook; thence east to the starting point.

Petitioners state that their geographical position, on account of the long distance they are from any other seat of local government—it being 45 miles on the north to Horsham, 32 miles on the south to Coleraine, 41 miles on the south-east to Hamilton, and 40 miles on the west to Edenhope, together with not being able to get any local representative willing to travel the distance, and being entirely dependent on three representatives living in and immediately around the town of Coleraine, who are non-residents in their riding and electorate—warrants them in petitioning for a new shire.

They therefore pray that Your Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the said area from the Shire of Wannon and constitute it a separate municipality under the name and title of the "Shire of Balmoral."

GRANT OF THREE HUNDRED POUNDS (£300) FOR INVENTION OF A CHEAP MEANS OF COOLING A CHAMBER FOR THE PRESERVATION OF MILK, CREAM, AND BUTTER.

REGULATIONS.

1. A sum not exceeding Three hundred pounds (£300) may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce an improved cheap means of cooling a chamber for the preservation of milk, cream, and butter, such means to be suitable for use on farms and at butter factories during hot weather.

2. The reward shall be payable to the inventor (or his agent) of such appliances as shall efficiently, cheaply, and rapidly perform what is required, viz.:—Reduction of the chamber to a temperature of 50°, and to remain at that temperature not less than ten hours at a time, when the temperature outside the building is not less than 120°, without the aid of ice, chemicals or machinery.

3. A reward of such sum as may be approved by the Minister may be paid to the inventor, or his agent, who shall by chemical means produce the required temperature, provided the means used are of a cheap character, in proportion to the advantages gained, and such as can be readily applied.

4. A reward may likewise be paid to the inventor, or his agent, of machinery of a cheap character which shall produce like results.

5. All competitors shall cause to be constructed a chamber 10 feet long, 10 feet wide, and 10 feet high, within which such trials as may be considered necessary shall be made.

6. Trials shall be made at such times as may be approved by the Minister.

7. All costs and expenses connected with trials shall be paid by the persons competing.

8. The Minister may appoint two or more judges to report upon the merits of the appliances.

9. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts, the total of which shall not exceed Three hundred pounds (£300) to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful appliances, such amount or amounts to be apportioned according to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

10. Persons intending to compete must give notice, in writing, of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, not later than the fifteenth of February, 1890.

Commencing at a point on the Broken River due south of the centre of a road forming the eastern boundary of the parish of Pine Lodge; thence north by a direct line and said road to the north-east angle of that parish; thence east by part of the south boundary of the parish of Yabba Yabba, to the western boundary of the tramway from Dookie to Katamatite; thence following said western boundary southerly through part of allotments 212A, 211, 208, 205, 204, and A1, parish of Dookie, to the commencing point of said tramway near the northern boundary of allotment 237, same parish, near the terminus of the Shepparton to Dookie Railway; thence southerly by a line at right angles to the last line for a distance of one chain to the eastern boundary of said tramway; thence northerly by the said eastern boundary of said tramway through the allotments before mentioned to its intersection again with the south boundary of the parish of Yabba Yabba; thence east by part of the south boundary of that parish and of the parishes of Waggarandall, St. James, and Karabumet to the south-west angle of the parish of Boweya; thence north by the west boundary of the last-named parish to the north-west angle of allotment 26 in the said parish; thence east by a road to the west boundary of the parish of Killawarra; thence north, east, and north-easterly by the boundary of that parish to the Ovens River; thence southerly by that river and Fifteen-mile Creek to the north boundary of allotment 6 of section F, parish of Wangaratta; thence westerly by that boundary to the north-west angle of that allotment; thence southerly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 1; thence easterly by a road to the Fifteen-mile Creek aforesaid; thence southerly by that creek to a point true east of the summit of Fetter's Range where crossed by the Sydney-road; thence to that crossing and by that range to the summit nearest to the source of Fifteen-mile Creek; thence by a line direct to the eastern source of the King River as far as its western branch; thence south-westerly by that western branch to its intersection with McDonald's surveyed road, known as McDonald's track; thence westerly by that road to its intersection with Holland's River at McCormick's selection; thence westerly by that river to the south-east angle of the parish of Moorngag; thence west by the south boundary of that parish to the north-west angle of the timber reserve, being the north-east corner of the parish of Nillahcootie; thence south by the east

boundary of the parish last named to its intersection with the main branch of the Back Creek; thence west by that creek to its junction with the Broken River; thence southerly by that river to Sandy Creek and by that creek to its source; thence by a direct line to the nearest summit of the Strathbogie Ranges and westerly by the summit of those ranges to a point bearing true south of the south-east angle of allotment 121 in the parish of Warrenbayne; thence true north to that angle; thence by the eastern boundaries of allotments 121, 120, 116, 115, 112, and 111 to the north-east angle of allotment 111; thence west by the south boundary of allotments 108, 109, 83, 82, 67, and 66, parish of Warrenbayne, to the south-west angle of allotment 66; thence northerly by the west boundary of the parish of Warrenbayne to the south boundary of the parish of Upotipotpon; thence west by the south boundary of the last-named parish to its south-west angle; thence north by its west boundary to the north-east angle of the parish of Gowanardie; thence westerly by the Broken River, being the northern boundary of the parish of Gowanardie, to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS by an Indenture of Mortgage, bearing date the twelfth day of April, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, and Indentures of Further Charge, respectively, bearing date the nineteenth day of April, One thousand eight hundred and eighty, the ninth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-one, and the twenty-first day of February, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and made between the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of St. Arnaud, hereinafter called the Corporation of the first part, His Excellency the Governor of the colony of Victoria, for the time being, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, of the same of the second part, and the Board of Land and Works, hereinafter called the Board, of the third part, for the consideration therein mentioned, the Corporation did covenant to pay to the Treasurer of Victoria, for the time being, or to the Board, every sum of money which should be paid to the Corporation under the provisions of the Orders therein mentioned of the Governor in Council, with interest thereon in the meantime, at the rate of Six pounds per centum per annum at the time and in the manner in the said indentures mentioned. And whereas the sum of Twelve thousand pounds has been duly advanced and lent to the Corporation under the security of the said indentures: And whereas by *The Waterworks Act 1884*, No. 806, it is among other things provided that in any agreement made between any local governing body and the Board, by which it is agreed that out of the sum of Six pounds per centum per annum, payable by way of interest upon any loan the sum of One pound ten shillings per centum per annum, shall be set apart as a sinking fund for the liquidation of such loan, the Governor in Council may, upon application made by such local governing body showing cause to the satisfaction of the Governor in Council, suspend the payment of the said sum of One pound ten shillings per centum per annum for any term not exceeding seven years, and accept in full satisfaction of interest payable under such mortgage the sum of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum during the term for which such suspension shall be granted, and during such term

the covenants of such mortgage shall not be enforced so long as interest at the said rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum is paid, nor shall such covenants be enforced to any greater extent than is necessary to secure the payment of interest at the said rate; but at the expiration of the said term the covenants of such mortgage may in all respects be enforced, and all interest thenceforward accruing shall be calculated at the rate of Six pounds per centum per annum: And whereas it has been agreed between the Corporation and the Board that out of the sum of Six pounds per centum per annum, payable by way of interest on the said loan of Twelve thousand pounds, the sum of One pound ten shillings per centum shall be set apart as a sinking fund for the liquidation of the said loan. And whereas application has been made by the Corporation showing cause to the satisfaction of the Governor in Council for the suspension for seven years of the payment of the said sum of One pound ten shillings per centum per annum. Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of Section 11 of the said Act, doth suspend for the term of seven years from the first day of July, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, the payment by the Corporation of the said sum of One pound ten shillings per centum per annum, so as aforesaid agreed to be set apart as a sinking fund for the liquidation of the said loan of Twelve thousand pounds, out of the said sum of Six pounds per centum per annum, payable by way of interest on such loan, and order that in full satisfaction of interest payable under the said indentures on the said loan of Twelve thousand pounds, the sum of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum be accepted during the term of such suspension.

And the Honorable Alfred Deakin, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

AVENEL WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATION No. 1.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation No. 1, made by the Avenel Waterworks Trust under the powers conferred by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*.

REGULATION No. 1.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust, do hereby make the following regulations:—

The following charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by measure, that is to say—

1. For every water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of Two pounds per annum.
2. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Ten pounds per annum.
3. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.

4. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when the water is supplied by measure shall be—

(1) If for domestic use and other than domestic use, the quantity for which the charge of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes only, thirty thousand gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 8,000 galls. per annum.	12,000 "	"
" " " " "	16,000 "	"
" " " " "	28,000 "	"

Livery and carriers' stables, for each stall or space of five feet 3,000 "

Stand-pipes or hydrant, water for each load of 100 gallons or under ... One shilling.

And for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first or any one load, to be taken at the time of taking ... Sixpence.

(3) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

5. Every person who is supplied by the Trust with water by measure shall, at his own expense, provide a meter (which meter shall be submitted to and examined by the proper officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect), which, when fixed, shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto; the key of the meter shall be in the possession of the Trust. No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe leading from the service-pipe, unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

6. All service-pipes with the necessary stop-cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same, under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

7. All delivery cocks to be of high pressure, and of strong hard brass, and all exposed places to be open and shut by a movable key or handle.

8. Plumbers or other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to relay or refix the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner.

9. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

10. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from the works of the Trust, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the purpose and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

11. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after receiving notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the Trust may see fit, until the necessary repairs shall be effected.

12. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, nor shall any person not supplied with water by measure at any time use water by hose, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and also to have the supply of water cut off for a period not exceeding one month.

13. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

14. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main; but from a cistern only, so constructed that water cannot flow continuously, and not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

15. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take or carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

16. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

18. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of the customers shall each have a stop-cock at the main, and shall in no case exceed the following diameter:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

19. No pipes shall be affixed to the main pipe, nor to any service-pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus without notice in writing of the intention so to do being given to the Trust, and the consent of the Trust thereto first had and obtained.

20. Overflow-pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet-pipe to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and the bath provided with a proper well-fitted and water-tight ground outlet plug or cock.

21. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow.

22. The water supplied in the Trust district shall be received and used under and in accordance with these regulations and *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, and such parts of *The Public Works Statute 1865* as are incorporated therewith.

23. If any person, whether supplied with water by the Trust or otherwise, shall commit a breach of these regulations, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence; and any such person, if supplied with water by the Trust, shall be liable to have the water cut off from his premises, either by cutting the pipes by or through which such water is supplied, or otherwise as the Trust may think fit, and such supply shall cease so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

24. In the foregoing regulations wherever the word "officer" or "servant" appears, the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf.

The foregoing regulation, numbered (1) one, was made by the Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust under and by virtue of section 73 of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, this 21st day of December, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.

AVOCA WATER TRUST.—REGULATION BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

WHEREAS default has been made in payment by the Avoca Water Trust of the interest due by the said Trust on a loan of £15,630 granted by the Governor in Council to such Water Trust, and the said Trust has also failed to form a sinking fund for the liquidation of such loan in accordance with the Act of Parliament in that behalf: And the Board of Land and Works has, under the authority conferred upon it by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, entered upon and taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust: And whereas notice that the said water trust district is supplied with water has been duly given in the *Government Gazette*, in accordance with the provisions of the said *Water Conservation Act 1887*.

And whereas by a proclamation by the Governor in Council, bearing date the 10th day of March, 1885, a portion of the said waterworks district was proclaimed an urban district within the meaning of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*.

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 17th day of December, 1889, made under the authority of *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the said Board of Land and Works in respect of the said urban district should be made for the year 1890, and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Part 9 of the said last-mentioned Act.

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works do hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Water Conservation Act 1887*, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council

of the 17th December, 1889, in that behalf, make the following regulation in respect of the said urban district for the year 1890, that is to say:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1890 on the annual shire valuation of the said urban district.
2. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said urban district.
3. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the Trust works, Three shillings and fourpence for every thousand gallons shall be charged.
4. Such rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1890.

Such person or persons as the said Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges. The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf the twenty-third day of December, 1889.

SWAN HILL SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

Whereas default has been made in payment by the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust of the interest due by the said Trust on loans granted by the Governor in Council to such Waterworks Trust, and the said Trust has also failed to form a sinking fund for the liquidation of such loans in accordance with the Act of Parliament in that behalf, and the Board of Land and Works has, under the authority conferred upon it by *The Water Conservation Act 1887*, entered upon and taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust. And whereas notice that the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks District is supplied with water has been given in the *Government Gazette*, in accordance with the provisions of the said *Water Conservation Act 1887*.

And whereas by two Proclamations by the Governor in Council, bearing date the 18th day of December, 1883, certain portions of the Waterworks District (towns of Castle Donnington and Kerang) were proclaimed urban districts within the meaning of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*.

And whereas by an Order in Council, dated the 17th day of December, 1889, made under the authority of the said *Water Conservation Act 1887*, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the said Board of Land and Works in respect of the said urban districts should be made for the year 1890 and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Part 9 of the said last-mentioned Act.

Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Water Conservation Act 1887*, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 17th December, 1889, in that behalf make the following Regulation in respect of the said urban district for the year 1890, that is to say:—

- (1) A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1890 on the annual municipal valuation of all lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said urban districts.
- (2) The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said urban districts.
- (3) The rate to be charged for water supplied from the mains by measure shall be Three shillings and fourpence per one thousand gallons.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF CHILTERN WEST.

WE, John Hicks the elder, Peter Rüedi, and Edward Barrass the elder, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve for public recreation in the parish of Chiltern West, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 133 of *The Land Act 1884* :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding twelve (12) in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for the holding of fêtes or sports, as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, or other property in the reserve; nor leave, throw, or roll stones therein, nor pollute the water in the lake, nor remove any soil, sand, or manure from the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No persons, except labourers or workmen employed by the Committee of Management, shall enter any plots in the reserve which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

2. The following shall be the scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve on such days as the same may be set apart for fêtes or sports :—

For the admission of every adult a sum not exceeding One shilling (1s.).

For the admission of every saddle horse, exclusive of the rider, a sum not exceeding One shilling.

For the admission of every carriage, cart, or vehicle drawn by one horse, exclusive of passengers, a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

For the admission of every additional horse, Sixpence.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 133 of *The Land Act 1884*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence. And every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No. " endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.

3. The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.

4. Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, marked cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that the Department undertakes to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders are accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

12.
